# Kruys to howl for the Wolves

Brisbane Lions' midfielder Fred Kruys will play in the NSL next season, but not with Brisbane United.

The talented 21-year-old Dutchman has signed with the Wollongong Wolves and is lost to Queensland Soccer for the time being.

The move has come as a surprise to many who believed Kruys would stay in the Sunshine State for the summer season.

Eye on Soccer caught up with the likeable Kruys in our State of Origin bumper issue last month and at that stage the writing was on the wall.

"I want to play for United but they must come quickly," Kruys said at that time.

"My goal is to play in the NSL and if I have to move interstate to play I will."

Kruys is a former Dutch Premier League player having played with De Graafschap for 10 years.

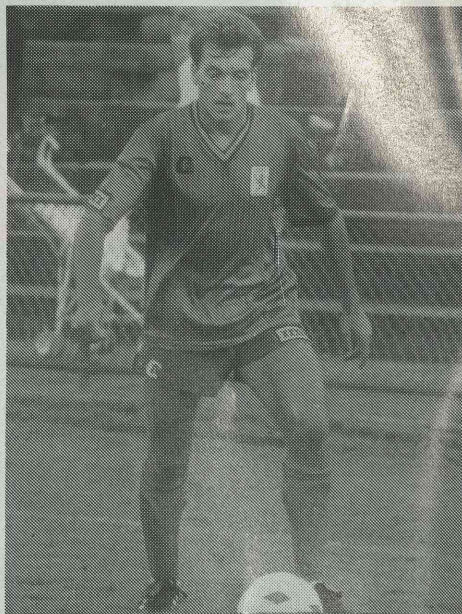
He also represented Holland at Youth Level at the European Youth Championships.

Wollongong coach David Ratcliffe said he was pleased to secure Kruys for the 93/94 NSL season.

The Wolves coach flew Kruys to the Steel City after impressive reports on the left sided midfielder.

"I had a couple of scouts watch him and he sounded ideal so we brought him down to play in a trial match," Ratcliffe said.

"Fred had a good game.

# Blues take NIB series

Queensland ended their 1993 representative season on a low note with a hard fought 2-0 loss to New South Wales at Mitre 10 Stadium in Newcastle last weekend.

The Maroons headed south with a 1-0 lead and turned in a gutsy performance in a match that was forced into extra time.

New South Wales captain Marshall Soper put the Blues ahead just before half time after latching onto a loose ball inside the Queensland penalty area.

Midfielder Gary Van Egmond headed down to Soper who controlled with his back to the goal before executing a perfect overhead kick that gave keeper Robbie Farrow no chance.

Queensland suffered a cruel blow at the break when captain and playmaker Frank Pimblett withdrew with a thigh injury.

The Maroons rallied after the break and were unlucky not to score on several occasions with Nick Meredith and Brian McNicol coming closest.

With the score remaining at 1-0 the match was forced into extra time.

Midway through the first half of extra time, midfielder Craig Collins had to leave the field after a tackle by Mathew Bingley left him with a nasty gash in his right shin.

With both subs already used, Queensland played the next 20 minutes with 10 men.

Despite the handicap, the Maroons almost forced the game into a penalty shootout until two minutes before the final whistle when Soper again found the net.

The lanky striker pounced on a loose ball in the box to toe home the winner.

Queensland coach Juan Cutillas praised his players, most of whom had played three games in seven days.

"It was a tremendous effort," Cutillas said.

"Everybody tried very hard but they were just too good on the night."

"We only arrived a few hours before the match and had little rest which did not help our cause, especially since we played extra time," he said.

The players were playing for the NIB Series which will be decided between the two sides every year.

In the curtain raiser, the Queensland Academy of Sport women's team played out a spirited 1-1 draw with the New South Wales Open side ■

## Rovers regain lead with sterling win

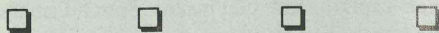
## EDITORIAL.....

I read with interest earlier in the week that tennis star Monica Seles is still not able to hold a racquet, at least 10 weeks after she was tragically stabbed by a spectator at a major tennis tournament. If Seles never plays again it will be a great loss to the sporting world because champions like her don't come around too often. Sure she has been unpopular but her ability has never been questioned. It makes you wonder just how safe anyone is playing sport these days and whether anything can be done to stop this violence.

I remember watching the box as a kid and seeing Tony Pezzano running for his life in an NSL match after hostile spectators had invaded the pitch. He did manage to get away but not until he was tripped and roughed up. He still has nightmares about that match. Players will be interested to know that they are covered by insurance for such instances but that is all. There is simply no way, apart from barricading off the pitch, to stop spectators invading the playing area. Hopefully we won't see anything like the Seles incident in Queensland.

The tour to New Zealand squad was certainly an experience and a half and I'm sure all the players will benefit, especially the debutantes. Brisbane Lions midfielder Wayne Hinton, Taringa striker Andy Lees, North Star's Danny Lobwein and Rochedale's Graham Ross all performed well and can look forward to big futures in the game. Ross was called upon once on tour after Rob Farrow limped off midway during the match against Auckland. Put under enormous pressure, he came through with flying colours and played the best I have ever seen him play. Hinton and Lees also looked sharp in that match and they must now go on with the job. Lobwein played his usual solid game and will be a vital cog in North Star's finals' aspirations.

In the XXXX League it is now down to business end of the season and it was interesting to see the Rochedale result last week. After a short slump they seem to have regathered form and that is bad news for the likes of Taringa and North Star.

## NZ tour hailed a success

Queensland's tour to New Zealand has been hailed as an overwhelming success, despite the fact that the Maroons failed to register a win in their two matches.

QSF General Manager Alan Vessey said the tour was a vital part of the future of Queensland Soccer.

"While some tours are measured solely on results there are often other benefits that are equally as important," Vessey said.

"The establishment of a regular representative program introduces matches of a quality that fill the void between club and national team football.

"In those terms, the tour has been successful in that many of the younger players demonstrated that they have the attitude and ability to take that step," he said.

"It should also be noted that senior personnel with Qantas, the Travelodge and the Radison Hotel all complimented the group and the manner in which they conducted themselves and this in itself confirms the players approached the tour in a professional manner which augurs well for the future of representative programs."

The players also gave the tour their seal of approval with captain Frank Pimblett saying the trip would be a huge boost to Brisbane United's bid for the NSL title.

The 35-year-old midfielder, who played his last game in a maroon jersey last weekend, believes the younger players in the touring party benefited most.

The squad contained eight players who were 25 or under and gave them valuable experience playing in trying conditions.

The six day tour involved matches against Canterbury and Auckland and it was the game against Auckland where the youngsters shone.

After going down 3-1 against Canterbury in minus four conditions at English Park, Queensland hit back with venom against an Auckland side that had beaten Canterbury a week before.

Midfielder Chris Slater opened the account for Queensland after the Auckland keeper had

misjudged a through ball from defender Ibro Cahut.

With the keeper beaten, Slater was able to nod into the empty net.

Auckland equalised five minutes later after Farrow was beaten by a ball that took a nasty bobble at the last second.

Queensland almost stole the lead after the break when a 30m drive by Slater cannoned off the Auckland cross bar.

With the scores locked at 1-1 and the Sir Robert Muldoon Memorial Trophy up for grabs, the game was forced to penalties to decide the issue.

With the penalties locked at 3-3, controversy struck when Queensland keeper Graham Ross, who replaced the injured Farrow in the first half, saved two attempts but was penalised for moving on both occasions.

With Auckland ahead 5-4 and Queensland needing to score, Pimblett's attempt hit the bar and appeared to cross the line but was denied by the referee.

After the match, embarrassed Auckland officials apologised to the Queensland players for the debacle.

The tour was not all hard work with time taken out in both venues to see some of the fabulous scenery on offer in New Zealand.

# Capalaba honours Jimmy

The Queensland Soccer team will face a XXXX League select side at Capalaba next Wednesday night in honour of the late Jimmy McMillan.

Sadly, Jimmy died suddenly at the age of 37 on Saturday May 29 during a game for the Capalaba First team.

According to Capalaba's Ewen Anderson, Jimmy had come on as a substitute and had been playing for around 12 minutes when he collapsed.

He is survived by his wife Agnes and his two children, Ross aged 10 and Jill aged 4.

He and his wife Agnes emigrated from Scotland in the late 1970's and settled in the Redlandshire area just outside Brisbane.

During their time in the area they both became heavily involved with many aspects of the Capalaba Soccer and Recreation Club.

Jimmy was involved as a player and subsequently as a committee member, which included a term as Vice-President.

He also coached and managed junior teams and worked as a groundsman.

Agnes has put many hours into the club canteen, organising bingo sessions and is currently holding down the position of Club Secretary/Manager.

More than 300 people attended his funeral in early June.

Earlier in the week, Eye on Soccer caught up with some of Jimmy's closest friends who paid tribute to a man who will not easily be forgotten.

Someone who got things done. In many ways he was a dreamer with goals that to most seemed unreachable. He was very committed to the cause and had lots of passion in anything undertaken. He gave a level of commitment to the kids which was second to none. He included everyone, he never left anyone out.

Jimmy was a tremendous help to myself and would never say "no" to any request for help - nothing was too much for him.

Perhaps he did too much and I was sometimes hesitant in asking for his help. But that was the sort of person Jimmy was - he thrived on doing something for others. His death is a great loss to me and everyone at Capalaba and all others that he was associated with."

I always found Jimmy to be a very genuine person. Whatever task he undertook he gave his full effort and wouldn't rest until the goal was achieved.

In more recent years he turned his hand to coaching and achieved a high level of expertise through coaching schemes and showed total commitment through his endeavours with Capalaba's junior sides. The benefits are there to be seen.

We used to talk in depth about Capalaba becoming a XXXX League club and to have quality XXXX League players at the club.

To have XXXX League players at the club on July 21 would give Jimmy a great thrill. He would be even prouder to know they were there in his honour.

Not only has Capalaba lost a great leader but I have lost a great friend."

He passed on his experience and knowledge to players coming up through the ranks. He constantly encouraged and praised them on to greater levels of achievement.

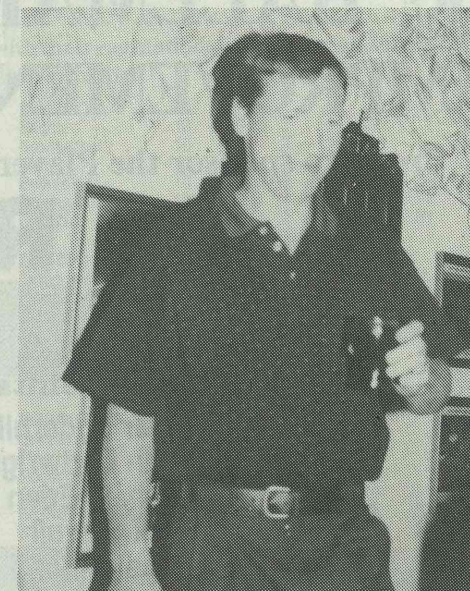

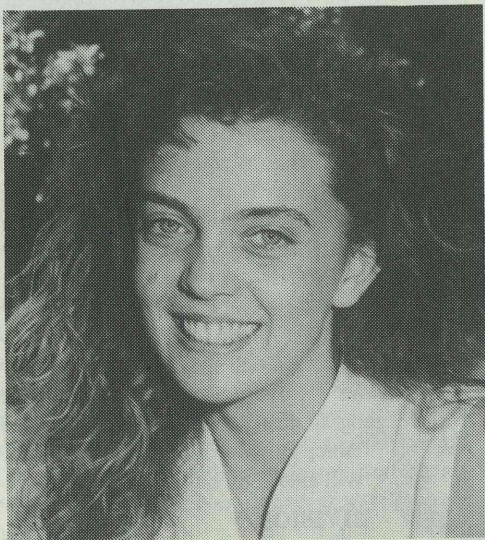




# Amy an avid fan

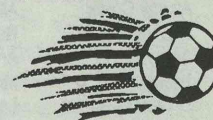
