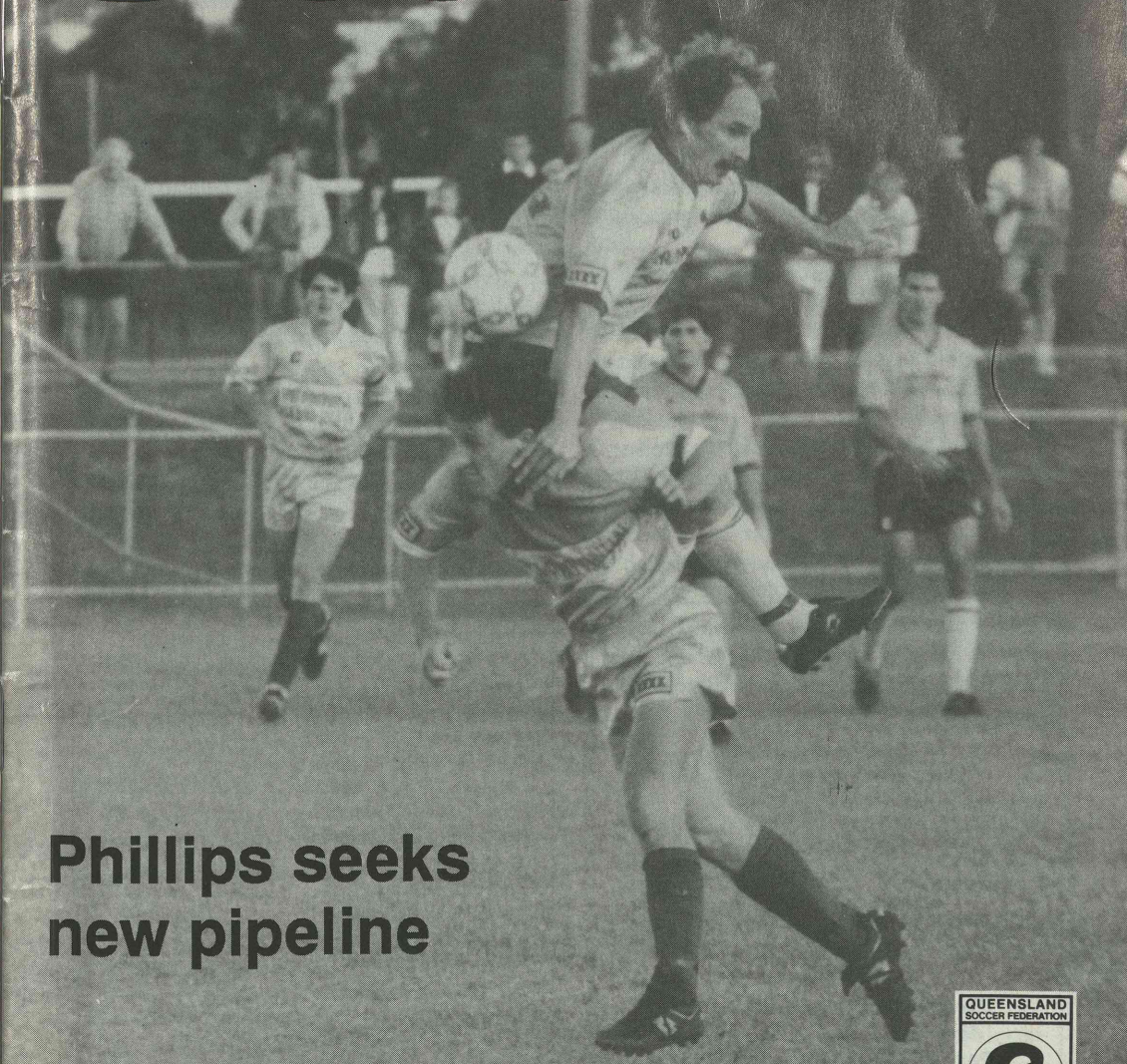

# Stars and Aces set for duel

Coalstars and the North Brisbane Aces will meet in the final of the Queensland Cup after dramatic victories in the semi-finals at Perry Park last week.

North Brisbane were the first to qualify with a nail biting 1-0 over Brisbane Lions.

With Lions having the better of the scoring chances it was the Aces who took the initiative when Brisbane United striker Chris Slater slotted the ball past keeper Rob Farrow with five minutes remaining.

While Slater scored the goal, it was team mate Barren Bender who created the opportunity with a storming run down the left flank before firing in a low cross.

Bender, who had a strong match, almost scored a second with a minute remaining but was denied by a good save from Farrow.

In the late match, it was Coalstars who took the initiative from the first whistle.

Midfielder Michael Babic almost scored in the opening minutes with a curling freekick that all but beat Taringa keeper Clint Dal Santo, crashing onto the crossbar.

But it was Taringa who opened the scoring in the second half after defender Cameron Pearse played a dangerous ball into the Stars' penalty area.

Midfielder Darren Hillier was the first to the

ball, controlling it before slamming past Kevin Farrar.

With Taringa now back in the game, Coalstars responded in the best fashion with defender Pat Boyle heading home from a Wes Park cross.

Boyle almost sealed the result with 10 seconds remaining but was denied by the Taringa crossbar.

With scores level after 90 minutes, the match was forced into extra time.

Still full of running, Coalstars came close on several occasions and were expertly lead by captain Alan McFarlane.

With time running out, both sides were resigned to a penalty shoot-out until Wes park snatched the victory with 30 seconds on the clock.

A long ball into the box was met by Park who headed home from 15 yards in what must go down as one of the best goals this season.

The final will be played at Perry Park August 7 ■

# Phillips seeks new pipeline

Queensland Soccer has received a major boost with the employment of Gary Phillips as QSF Director of Schools' Development.

Most in Queensland will know Gary as the pocket midfielder dynamo who plays for Sydney Olympic in the Coca-Cola National Soccer League.

With more than 280 NSL games under his belt, Phillips is one of the most experienced players in the league at the moment, having spent the past 12 years with the Sydney based club. But a job that was too good to pass by, and the temptation of the sun and surf lifestyle, has seen Phillips transfer his base to the home of the big pineapple.

He comes north with plenty of experience having worked in a similar capacity with the Australian and New South Wales Soccer Federations.

A three year stint as Development Officer for Sydney Olympic also stands him in good stead.

Under the job guidelines, Gary will be responsible for the development and implementation of the QSF School Development Program with participation and enjoyment the main aims. The other key aim will be to improve the overall standard of soccer in schools.

Phillips said he was looking forward to the challenge.

"Obviously I am coming to the end of my playing days and I have to think of my career," Phillips said.

"This job is a great opportunity do that and I am excited about the challenge."

QSF General Manager Alan Vessey said he was delighted to have Phillips aboard.

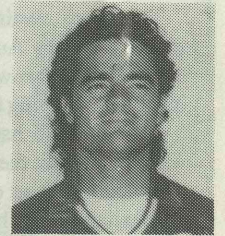
"Gary's appointment is a positive step for Queensland Soccer," Vessey said.

"It is recognised by the QSF that schools' development is essential in the long term planning to maintain and increase the participant base of soccer."

He said the State Government had played a major role in the appointment.

"Such positions have only become available through the funding program of the State Government and it is important we acknowledge that," Vessey said.

And while the QSF will be the main benefactor, Brisbane United could also scoop the pool with Phillips indicating he is keen to continue playing.

The likeable 30-year-old is still owned by Sydney Olympic but said he expects to be released for a small sum of around \$3 000.

"I still have a few good years left in me yet and am hoping to be able to play with United," Phillips said.

"I haven't spoken to anyone yet because at the moment my job is my number one priority."

And while Phillips is working hard at the office, he is enjoying the more relaxed lifestyle of the Sunshine State.

A former pro-surfer on the Australian circuit, he spends his weekends riding the waves at the Gold Coast. Once ranked 7th in Australia in the pro-am ranks, he has no regrets about his decision to concentrate on soccer.

"Surfing is too risky because you have to be winning to make the money," Phillips said.

"The best I ever did was third behind Shane Horan and Gary Elkerton at Burleigh heads."

# Easts closer to relegation

Whatever magic words Easts Coach Calvin Daunt said, together with the positional changes he made, it had a remarkable difference on his team in their second half against North Brisbane.

They appeared to be a lot more organised both in mid-field and at the back, however the damage was already done as the half-time score-line was 3-0 to North Brisbane.

As early as the sixth minute Kevin Meacock had a fairly innocuous cross come shot which East's Keeper Chris Roche dropped as he hit the ground, and 18 year old Brendan Haywood starting his first XXXX League match, stabbed home for his debut goal in the League. The retarding effect this early goal had on Easts was quite remarkable, as not only did they appear disjointed positionally, but also seemed to lose heart. Despite many probing runs by overlapping full-back Mark Geritz, and astute distribution by Steve Perry in mid-field, Easts forwards appeared to have little cohesion or team work.

On the half-hour Easts went further behind when Paul Fegan crossed a deep pin-point centre to the penalty area and Chris Slater rising high did the rest. As if this wasn't bad enough within a matter of minutes, Kevin Meacock had, what at best could be described as, a hopeful 35 metre

However it was to no avail, as the forwards Makridakis, Whitfield and to a lesser degree Patterson were well contained by Alan Hunter, David Vincenzino and George Whyte.

# Stars' dazzling double

Coalstars rounded off a perfect week of football with a powerful 1-0 win over Pine Rivers at Bundamba last weekend.

Following their impressive extra-time win over Taringa in the Queensland Cup Semi-Final midweek, the boys from Ipswich completed dominated proceedings in one of their best performances this season.

Coalstars coach Wayne Warren summed up the performance after the match.

"We were a three goal better side out there," Warren said.

"But that's been the story all year, we just haven't been able to finish sides off."

The win lifted Coalstars to 21 points on the XXXX League table, just four outside the top five, and Warren believes they have the potential to go all the way.

"We've got the players and we're doing well," he said.

"I think we can make the five."

He said his sides destiny was in their own hands.

"Four of our last five games are at home so it's up to us," Warren said.

"If we're good enough to be in the five we will be."

Striker Darren Freiberg paved the way for a dominating opening 45 minutes from Stars with some deft touches and accurate crossing.

Their first real chance came in the 19th minute after Freiberg found Tony Cotton at the far post.

The former Toowoomba youngster met the cross perfectly but was denied by a great save from Rivers' keeper Peter Underhill.

Seconds later Wes Park whipped back in another cross which Cotton again met with well placed header.

This time Underhill was beaten but Cotton was denied by a timely goal line clearance from Graham Eden.

Minutes later it was the post that denied Coalstars after Freiberg skilfully rounded two Rivers defenders before rifling off a powerful drive.

Rivers also had their chances with striker John Preston glancing a header wide after good lead up work by Dene Almond and Stars' keeper Kevin Farrar did well to deny a Noel Carroll header soon after.

The goal finally came for Coalstars in the 36th minute after Cotton found Michael Babic in space on the right.

Babic, who had an outstanding match, played the perfect ball for defender Pat Boyle who rammed his header past Underhill.

Rivers could have equalised straight from the kick off after Andy Strickland played a searching ball into the box.

With Farrar stranded, Carroll and Preston collided and the opportunity was missed.

Cotton should have made it 2-0 for Coalstars just before the break after good service from Mark Gilbert and Brendan Eastwell.

With the goal at his mercy he blasted over.

The second half brought much of the same with Park, Eastwell and Gilbert all coming close.

Pine Rivers coach Frank Pimblett conceded after the match that the better side had won on the day.

"They thoroughly deserved the win and in the end it could have been embarrassing," Pimblett said.

"They were more committed and I don't think we even created one chance in the second half," he said.

"Once you've got commitment you've got a chance in this league but we didn't have it out there today." ■

# Read ready to rumble

If somebody had asked you who Brent Read was three years ago, you could have been forgiven for replying with a "Brent who?"

Playing for Goodna in the 2nd Division, Read was always a solid performer, but never a player who received rave reviews.

Then came along a man who would change Read's future overnight. A man who would propel him into the elite of Brisbane soccer.

That man is Taringa Rovers captain John Ogden. But don't ask Ogden to collect any accolades because he knows it was only a matter of time before Read made a name for himself.

Ogden, who was then coach of the Coalstars XXXX League side, had watched Read and liked everything he saw.

"John is the reason why I came to Coalstars and the reason why I am where I am," Read said.

Read rejoined his old club a few months ago after a stint in the NSL with Brisbane United and is now a stand out performer in the XXXX League.

He cites his stint in the NSL as the reason for his much improved performances this season.

"I credit a lot of my improvement to my stint in the NSL," Read said.

"You play with better players and have more intense training sessions and of course you improve.

"The games are much faster than the XXXX League and it's more intense - you can't afford to relax for a minute," he said.

While he admits to his shortcomings in the game, you get the impression that Read's rise to fame, in a soccer sense, is because he works hard, he knows his strengths, and he plays to them.

A university student, the likeable 23-year-old is on the verge on completing an Arts degree at the University of Queensland and has just finished his first semester of a Communications degree at the Queensland University of Technology.

"I'd like to be a sports Journalist," he quips.

But for now he is sitting back waiting on word for the upcoming NSL season.

"I definitely want to get back into playing in the NSL but we'll just have to wait and see," he said.

"My whole game has improved since playing there, my first touch, my vision, everything."

One aspect of his game that was impressive last season was his overall fitness, with end of season tests showing he was one of the fittest players at the club.

Apart from that, a highlight for the youngster was scoring his first NSL goal against Preston at Perry Park last year.

Whether or not he plays for United this season is yet to be determined, but one thing is for sure.

He'll definitely give it his best shot if given the chance ■
