



EDITORIAL....

The article on the back page of last Friday's Courier-Mail certainly raised a few eyebrows in the soccer fraternity and justifiably so. The idea of turning Perry Park into a cricket field doesn't do too much for most local soccer players who have grown used to playing on the arguably the State's best playing surface. Word is that no official proposal has been lodged with the QSF and until one has been lodged it is purely speculation. Covering around 2.8 hectares, Perry Park is a prime piece of real estate. It is only five minutes from the city and is serviced by excellent public transport. That makes it a prime target for developers.

All attention turns to Perry Park this weekend when Coalstars and North Brisbane clash in the Queensland Cup Final. Coalstars reached the final with an impressive win over Taringa Rovers while North Brisbane did the same against Brisbane Lions. Coalstars must go into the match as firm favourites after thrashing Rochedale Rovers on the weekend while North Brisbane's form has dropped off of late. The

statewide Cup started in March with 20 teams, including 8 country regions. The winner will take home a cheque of \$7 000 while the runner-up picks up \$3 000.

Rochedale Rovers, who were in the lead by three points, were shock 4-1 losers to Coalstars and are now ahead by goal difference only.

Taringa Rovers maintained their drive for their first ever XXXX Soccer League Premiership with a narrow 1-0 win over North Brisbane at Prentice Park last weekend.

Miracle goal saves Tigers

Eastern Suburbs youngster Robert Le Cocq chimed in with some divine intervention at Heath Park last Saturday night to earn the Tigers a valuable point in their bid to escape relegation.

With his side trailing 1-0 against Mt Gravatt, the talented midfielder scored the equaliser that may well save his side from relegation.

With both sides adopting a win-at-all-costs attitude, it was Mt Gravatt who dominated early proceedings.

Midfielder Sean Armstrong gave the Hawks a dream start in the 6th minute after they were awarded a freekick inside the Tigers' half.

Captain Jarrod Austin laid off for Armstrong who smashed his 35m drive past keeper Chris Roche and into the back of the net.

Roche, who had a solid match, appeared to get a hand to the ball but the sheer power of the shot saw it clip the underside of the bar and bounce in.

Le Cocq almost equalised for Easts minutes later after his shot beat Hawks' keeper Robert Harrison.

Luckily defender Ty Bannister was on hand to clear the ball away.

Mt Gravatt almost scored from another freekick in the 17th minute but this time Rochewas up to the task palming Austin's curling shot around the post. Brisbane United midfielder Danny Stowers also came close with a powerful strike that beat Roche slamming onto the cross bar.

Easts reversed the trend after the break with Steve Perry, Stein Grodum and Chris Fegan dominating play.

The pressure finally told in the 62nd minute when Le Cocq latched onto a through ball and found the net with a fortunate strike.

His low shot appeared to hit Harrison's feet and loop up over the defence and into the net.

Willie O'Neale could have stolen the match for the home side but was denied by Harrison in the 69th minute and the cross bar in the 81st.

Easts coach Calvin Daunt was happy with the point and accredited a blast to his players at half-time as the turning point.

"What I said is unrepeatable but it's amazing what half time talks can do," Daunt said.

"I thought in the end we could have won it but it's just no good playing for 45 minutes."

He said he was confident of avoiding relegation despite having to play Pine Rivers, Rochedale Rovers, Taringa Rovers and Lions in their last four matches.

"I'd rather have it that way," Daunt said.

"The players to do the job are here in the club, it's just a matter of doing it on the park."

"It is unfortunate that we have had to apply to FIFA requesting that the rule be enforced." Australian Soccer Federation chief executive Ian Holmes on the ASF's decision to ask FIFA to suspend goalkeeper Mark Bosnich from playing for English Premier Division club Aston Villa. The request follows Bosnich's withdrawal from the Socceroo side to play against Canada in the World Cup qualifiers. Under FIFA rules, clubs must release players for World Cup matches.

"These officials are supposed to be figures of respect but then they go and do things like this. It seems like they are a law unto themselves." An angry Pine Rivers coach Frank Pimblett after linesman Gordon Nicholson allegedly gestured to the Rivers supporters after their 1-0 loss to Rochedale.

"We were leading 4-1 with about 10 minutes to go, so I just forgot about playing and stuck with Pele like a glove. As soon as the final whistle blew I had his jersey. It was a great thrill - Pele was a magician with the football." Former Brisbane Lions striker John Lowey remembering how he got the most sought after soccer jersey in the world. Lowey played for the Chicago Sting against the New york Cosmos back in his professional days in America in 1976. He was also a pro at English giants Manchester United.

"Our fitness was right to the fore. We were too strong, too dominant, too fit and too keen." Coalstars coach Wayne Warren after his side won through to the Qld Cup Final with a extra-time 2-1 win over Taringa.

"Steve Perry is probably the player that stands out more than anybody else. Not only is he a quality player, he is a quality person as well and that is rare." Brisbane Lions coach John Sime – pondering on one of the best players he has ever had the pleasure of coaching.

"I still have a few good years in me yet and am hoping to be able to play with United." Former Sydney Olympic midfielder Gary Phillips. Now the QSF Director of Schools' Development and hoping with link up with Brisbane United this summer.

"To have XXXX League players at the club would give Jimmy a great thrill. He would be even prouder to know they were there in his honour." Former Capalaba coach Bob West talks about the late Jimmy McMillan and the testimonial match that was arranged in his honour. The match was a great success with the XXXX League select side defeating Queensland 4–3 on penalties after the match finished at 1–1.

"It already has excellent facilities and the shape of the ground would make a goodcricket oval possible. If it was required for Shield cricket we'd probably have to build only another grandstand to make Perry Park an ideal venue. The other positive aspect of the site is it is well served by public transport." Queensland Cricket Association Chairman Allan Pettigrew on the idea of using Perry Park as a back-up venue to the Gabba. A sub-committee met earlier this week to decide whether to lodge a formal proposal with the Queensland Soccer Federation.

"Speaking personally, I must say it surprises me. The Perry Park area is quite an odd shape, one which I would not have thought would be suited to cricket." QSF General Manager Alan Vessey on the Perry Park cricket issue. The QSF has no formal policy on the issue as yet.






