Inala seal Hawks' fate

Mt Gravatt will be relegated to the Second Division next season after they were held to a 2-2 draw by Inala City at Dittmer Park last weekend.

Needing a win to stay in the hunt, the Hawks surrendered two goals in the first half to bury their survival chances.

Craig Thompson and Brett Wilkinson did the damage for Inala on a day that will long be remembered at the Mt Gravatt headquarters.

Ironically, it was Inala who sealed the Hawks' fate.

Already assured of relegation, the Bulldogs were playing for pride and took it to Mt Gravatt from the opening whistle.

Midfielder Jarrod Austin restored some respect for the home side with two goals in the second half.

1993 has been a rocky year down at Klummp Road with original coach Barry Guyett sacked after Mt Gravatt's 2-1 win over Inala back in round 10.

Former Brisbane Lions defender Col Bennett took over the reigns but had little effect on the Hawks' slide as they slipped from third place deeper into relegation trouble.

In Bennett and Guyett's defence, the club has simply lacked the depth to stay in the XXXX League and will have to spend the off season

Excitement rises at Taringa

Taringa Rovers are ready to clinch their first ever XXXX Soccer League Premiership when they clash with Inala City at Freeman Road this weekend.

The Blue Machine jumped to a three point lead on the table last weekend after they narrowly defeated Easts 2–1 at Heath Park.

Danny Whitfield got the Tigers off to a dream start in the first half outjumping Taringa defender Cameron Pearse to head home a cross from Chris Fegan.

With an upset on the cards, Greg Swadling evened the scoreline five minutes into injury time after Easts' keeper Chris Roche had done well to parry an Andy Lees volley.

Easts continued to frustrate Taringa after the break with defenders Stein Grodum, Mark Geritz and Steve Perry repelling wave after wave of attack. The pressure finally told with five minutes remaining when Andy Lees rose above the pack, latching onto a Darren Hillier freekick.

With his goal exposed, Roche could do little but watch the ball slam into the back of the net.

With Brisbane Lions hosting Rochedale Rovers two days later, the 2-1 result meant Rochedale had to win to stay in the hunt for the title.

Despite playing well for the 90 minutes, luck did not fall the Rovers way and they bowed out of

the Premiership race with a 1-0 loss.

Taringa now need only a draw to secure the title while Rochedale would have to beat Acacia Ridge on Saturday night and hope Inala beat Taringa

Division Two down to the wire

Brisbane City and Wynnum will put 21 rounds of football on the line Sunday when they clash at Spencer Park for the right to re-enter the XXXX League.

With Toowoomba-based Willowburn already assured of promotion, the second spot is up for grabs with Brisbane City just three points ahead of Wynnum.

City, who defeated Willowburn 2-1 in Toowoomba last week, go into the match knowing a draw will assure them of second place. For Wynnum, who have a slightly better goal difference than City, it is a must win affair.

The two sides last clashed in the final of the Queensland Soccer Club Cup with City winning

4-3 after leading 3-0 at one stage in the game. Meanwhile, Slacks Creek and Nerang will be relegated to the Third Division with latest rumours suggesting that Nerang could move back into the Gold Coast competition.

In Division Three it is a similar story with Newmarket the only team assured of promotion to Division Two.

The University of Queensland (37 points), Goodna (36), Annerley (36) and Mitchelton (35) will all fight it out with the University v Annerley match a highlight.

Darra will move back to the Fourth Division with either Redlands United or Logan City taking the second spot

EDITORIAL

Courier-Mail soccerwriter Garry Leggraised an interesting issue in his column last Monday about the use of penalty shoot-outs to decide the winner of a match. The issue arose again two weeks ago when Australia bundled Canada out of the World Cup by the shoot-out method. Basically, most people watching the game had to feel for Canada. They had spent nearly two years playing numerous matches to get as far as they did and to lose on penalties does seem pretty cruel. Some called for a rematch, others believed another period of extra-time should have been played. From a players point of view, I know how hard it is to lose by such a method but I believe it is the only way to go. The system is the same for both sides and basically it's up to the individuals to beat the keeper. If they can't do that then they lose. Maybe one day they will find a better system but for now I think the shoot-out is the best solution.

We are once again at the pressure stage of the season and it always amazes how results pan

out. A month ago I had my basic top five planned out but that has all changed. Teams won matches they weren't supposed to and lost ones they should have won. I know most are surprised that Rochedale Rovers probably won't be hoisting aloft the Premiership trophy this season. After falling short at the death in the past, it looked like 1993 was going to be their year. They started the season like a house on fire beating North Star 8-1 and moved seven points clear at the top of the table after going undefeated in the first round. But since then the wheels have fallen off a bit with just three wins in their last ten matches. Their leading scorer Keiran Cooper has failed to find the net regularly in the second round. After scoring an amazing 12 in 11 matches, he has only managed 5 in the last 10 and this may be one reason why the Rovers have lost their momentum. If Cooper can regain his touch in time for the finals, they will definitely be a show for the title. Still, 17 goals in 20 games is a marvellous effort and he must be congratulated for that. Hopefully for Coops, there are still more to come

Brisbane Lions once again stamped their authority on the XXXX Soccer League Premiership race with a 1-0 win over Rochedale Rovers at Richlands last Sunday.

"We knew before the game what we had to do but unfortunately it just didn't work out that way."


Stewart disagreed with the notion that the loss would be a huge psychological blow to his side after failing for the second time to maintain their Premiership lead.
