Youth League boost

Queensland could soon have a team in the National Youth League, according to State Director of Coaching Jim Selby.

Selby, who is also head coach of the soccer component of the Queensland Academy of Sport, said he had held preliminary talks with ASF and QSF officials on the issue of placing a side in the National Youth League.

"It's just an idea at this stage but we are hoping to get a QAS team into the NSL Youth League," Selby said.

"It would be a great boost for Queensland soccer in general," he said.

At the moment promising youngsters throughout the State are limited in their options with no Queensland team playing at this level.

They can either head to Sydney or Melbournetoplay in the National Youth League or hopefully get accepted into the Australian Institute of Sport which already has a team playing in that competition.

"This would give us an advantage over the AIS because our players could go straight from the Youth League into the National League whereas AIS players can only play in the Youth League." Selby said.

"Unfortunately at the moment many of our youngsters are heading south to play with clubs who can offer them a place in the youth side."

QSF General Manager Alan Vessey also confirmed the issue had been raised with officials at the Australian Soccer Federation.

Further discussions would be held with the QAS to confirm their support.

Brisbane United Secretary Lawrence Oudendyk welcomed the idea.

"Queensland Soccer and indirectly Brisbane United would surely benefit from such a move as this," he said.

"It would probably be the most important thing in the development of Brisbane United and our future in the National League."

"It would give the QAS a chance to attract youngsters throughout the state and provide Queensland with a chance to give youngsters valuable National League experience.

CRANNEY ON TARGET

Queensland's number 1 youth player Sean Cranney is on target for the World Youth Championships next month following his serious ankle injury three weeks ago.

The attacking midfielder was rushed to Adelaidelast week to join fellow Young Socceroo Mark Wingell who is also in doubt.

The pair will train under the watchful eye of West Adelaide coach Raul Blanco, who is also the Young Socceroos' assistant coach.

Blanco, who is known in soccer circles as a fitness fanatic, has the job of bringing the pair to match fitness in time for the Championships.

They are believed to have a week to prove their fitness.

Speaking at the WYC Press Conference with Pele a week ago, Cranney said he was ready for the Championships.

"Obviously I have to prove myself but I feel the ankle will be okay," Cranney said. Soccer fans throughout Queensland received a shot in the arm last week with the announcement of a revamped Queensland Cup.

The Queensland Cup, which was won by Rochedale Rovers last year, will double in prize money with the winner earning \$7000 and runner-up \$3000.

QSF Secretary Jim Gilbert said 21 teams would be involved in the cup including nine regional sides.

All twelve of the XXXX League sides will make at least one trip to the country with the final being staged at Perry Park on August 8.

"The new concept emerged after a meeting we had with country affiliates in November," Gilbert said.

"It is a great boost for Queensland Soccer to get all the XXXX League sides to the country and will make the Cup all that more prestigious to win.

"It will also give Brisbane coaches a chance to look at some of the top talent we have in the country areas throughout Queensland," he said.

"It will be a tough cup to win."

Local XXXX League coaches gave the thumbs up to the revamped Cup.

Will 1993 bring glory for Taringa?

If you were a Taringa supporter in 1991, you could be forgiven for thinking they were on the way out. With a win in their round 22 match against Acacia Ridge needed to ensure XXXX League survival, things looked as bleak as they had ever been since the club's formation back in 1949.

But a win in that match and some good, old fashioned hard work has seen Taringa lose their easybeats tag and become a real title contender.

Last season was the turning point for the Blue Machine as the Glen Davis coached side reached the finals for the first time in the club's history.

Led by youngsters Glenn Gwynne and Troy Cranney, Taringa started slowly but finished strongly, bowing out in the Preliminary final to eventual winners North Star.

And the momentum should continue in 1993.

The club pulled off a coup in December last year by signing Spanish maestro Juan Cutillas as coach and has added to that by signing Darren Hillier, John Ogden and Eddie Lees.

Although they seem certain to lose Brisbane United players Glenn Gwynne and Chris Slater, Cutillas has assembled a squad that could bring the much sought after Championship to Speare Park.

"I was very impressed with the set-up at Taringa and with everyone I've dealt with since joining the club," Cutillas said.

"They are professional, unselfish people who have an aim to improve the club in every single aspect of the game and their facilities are very good."

Cutillas' last foray into the XXXX League was back in 1990 when Taringa was the last thing on his mind.

That year heled Brisbane City to their emphatic 2–0 victory over Brisbane Lions in a Grand Final reply.

For the past two seasons he has had great success as coach of the Oueensland side and made

Willowburn a consistent performer in the Second Division.

But can he bring glory to Taringa?

"I was brought to the club with an aim to the future and I am working very hard towards that," he replies.

"The chances to win the Premiership are there. We will go for everything as much as we can and I think we have the capabilities to go to the top this year."

He sites Rochedale and North Star as the biggest threats but steers clear of any major predictions, preferring to concentrate on his own players.

"We have three or four players that could emerge from this years side as players of the future," he said.

"Andrew Philp, Michael Collicoat, Willie Carter and Colin Gwynne all have the potential to be good players and this year will be their chance to prove it."

Only time will tell as to the quality of the Blue Machine but on paper they look real title contenders. They first test comes this weekend when they take on Brisbane CSC at Dunn Road. The Frank Liddell coached side finished a credible second last year but will face an uphill to repeat that feat this season. The loss of Robbie Harrison, Kevin Meacock and Joe Stipancic has left CSC lacking depth.

The club signed former Rochedale keeper Andrew Hobbs late last week and is also trying to lure former NSL midfielder Martin Kirsopp from Grange Thistle.

Feast of Football

It's been a long haul since Australia last hosted the World Youth Championships in 1981 but this years tournament promises to be better than ever.

The next month will see 32 world class matches played in 5 venues across the countr - Brisbane, Sydney, Adelaide, Canberra an Melbourne.

Brisbane has arguably the best group with Germany, Uruguay, Portugal and Ghana al vying for a quarter-final berth.

Portugal are the holders of the Championship after narrowly defeating Brazil in the final in Portugal in 1991.

Tickets for the event are selling fast with Lang Park a perfect venue for viewing soccer.

There is also a good chance we could see the Australian boys in town. If they finish second in their group they will play in the quarter-final in Brisbane on March 13 against the winner of the Brisbane Group.

So be part of this big event. It is a once in a lifetime chance to see the world's best young soccer players in action.

SELBY IS NUMBER 1



If you'd asked Jim Selby in 1990 how his job was going he'd have given you one answer - fantastic.

He was working on the Gold Coast as their Regional Director of Coaching and seeing fantastic results in the development of both their Junior and Senior Soccer organisations.

Sitting on the golden sands of Surfer Paradise during one of his rare day's off he thought things couldn't get any better – but they did.

Two years later Selby is Queensland's number one Development coach after being appointed as the State Director of Coaching for the Queensland Soccer Federation.

In addition to this, he is also the head coach for the Soccer part of the Queensland Academy of Sport which was formed last year.

The position is a busy one which requires administration, coaching, and plenty of travelling.

He has been spending up to 60 hours a week on the job and went for two-and-a-half months last year without a day off.

But as Selby says, that sort of lifestyle comes with the territory.

"I think it's part of the job in the first few

years you're involved," he said. "You try and put in as much work as you possibly can to get as much going as you possibly can."

And it's a theory that's worked for a man who has seen success with every appointment he's had.

He was a Regional Director of Coaching at Bundaberg for five years before leaving to take up an appointment on the Gold Coast.

While in Bundaberg he led their representative side to an Ampol Cup Semifinals berth and lost only six matches out of 56 in his five years at the helm.

He finally won the Ampol Cup with the Gold Coast in 1988 and added the Inter-City Series to his honours list before moving to Brisbane in 1991.

"My main aim when I first came to Brisbane was that no-one should be disadvantaged in the services they receive in relation to the area they come from," he said.

"I thought I'd have most of it organised within a year or so. Other people told me it would take 18 months and I'm starting to believe that. It will probably be around two years before everything is where I like it."

In his time at the QSF Selby has introduced

selective coaching courses for elite players, instructor courses for coaches, Strike-Force clinics for players and implemented a school coaching program.

"I'm not spending as much time on the park as I used to," he admits. "It's more co-ordinating and organising programs and letting me say, this is what I think should be happening throughout the State. Having said that I think the administration side of things is only a major issue for the next couple of years until the whole program is implemented throughout the State."

Newcomers do it tough

Newcomers Acacia Ridge and Inala City are in for a baptism of fire this weekend with the commencement of the XXXX League.

For Inala, it is their first time in the league and coach Ian Seeley has a tough job ahead of him. Acacia Ridge, on the other hand, have had a rollercoaster ride in the XXXX League over the last 5 years, being promoted in 1989, relegated in 1991 and promoted again this year.

But if you speak to President Mark Brigden, things are about to change down Acacia Ridge way.

"A former president of Rochedale Rovers said to me that when he was president their aim was to be as big as Acacia Ridge," Brigden said.

"This club was at the top in many ways and now that we're doing up the club house and getting the pokies in we'll eventually be as big as anyone, both on and off the field."

"We'll do a lot better than people think this season and next year we'll win the League," he said.

It's a big prediction for a newly promoted club, but if North Brisbane's performance in their first year is any indication, then Brigden's prediction could well come true.

If it does happen, you can be sure player/coach David Richardson will have something to do with it.

Richardson was appointed at the end of the 1991 season, with the Ridgethen well on their way to relegation. He nearly saved them that season and led them to promotion at the end of last season as runners—up in the Second Division.

"In one-and-a-half years he has lost only four games and that was at a time when we didn't have a lot of money to buy players, so he's done an exceptional job," Brigden said.

"I've got no doubt he gets more out of certain players, he's a thinking coach and without a doubt the best coach in Brisbane," he said.

"He's got a job here as long as he wants one."

Although flattered by Brigden's remarks, Richardson has a more down to earth approach to the upcoming season.

"This year we're not looking to do anything, only staying in the XXXX League," Richardson said.

"Anything else above third-last place is a bonus."

"I've no doubt in my mind that in 3-5 years Acacia Ridge will be one of the biggest and best clubs in Brisbane, whether I'm here or not," he said.

Acacia Ridge have recruited several players to the club including Michael McCarthy, Fred Stone, Michael Butchard, Brett Wass and possibly Craig Lowe.

"We would love to go out and but the cream of Brisbane but obviously that costs," Richardson said.

"We think we've bought wisely for the amount of resources that we had."

Richardson will be ably assisted throughout the season by assistant coach Fred Robins and reserves coach Colin Burley.

They face a toughtest this Sunday when they take on Brisbane Lions at Richlands Stadium at 4:00pm.

The recent appointment of leading XXXX league striker Kieran Cooper as a full-time Development Officer is a positive step and one that has increased interest in the game in the local area.

Cooper has been one of Queenslands top strikers over the past 10 years and has made the leading scorer title his own winning it an amazing 5 times.

"I've been very, very busy," Cooper said.

The Rochedale Soccer Club now have their own community newspaper, known as the Rochedale News, which has a circulation of around 13,000 and is receiving a good response from the locals.

"We're not just promoting Rochedale Rovers, we're promoting soccer in general," Cooper said.

"We hope that in five years we can be in a position that if a place becomes available in the NSL, under the banner of Logan City, we would have an opportunity to go in."

And while Rochedale are looking long term their major concern is 1993.

"We are promoting all our home games and this Saturday night against North Star should be fantastic," he said.

"We've got two VIP tickets to the Michael Jackson concert to give away and plenty planned for the day so we're expecting a good crowd.

"We've also got plenty planned for the year so it should be great."

Rochedale host last years Premiers and Grand Final Winners North Star at Underwood Park, Rochedale, 7:00pm Saturday night.

On a personal note, Selby is prepared to put his coaching aspirations on the backburner.

"It's always good to coach at the highest level but I don't see that as a major priority in my first few years of taking over the State Director's job. I would find it very difficult to justify watching XXXX League matches every weekend when country areas are asking me to be visiting their areas as well," he said. "We also have to be careful that we don't take all the jobs

over and don't allow anyone to develop through the scheme we're implementing."

QSF General Manager Alan Vessey had nothing but praise for Selby.

"Jim is an asset to the QSF having been appointed firstly in Bundaberg and then transfering to the Gold Coast before graduating to his present position as State Director of coaching," Vessey said.

"There is no doubt in my mind that Jim will ultimately be appointed as National Director of Coaching for the Australian Soccer Federation."



The Bleiberg Factor

Thanks to the Editor for giving me the opportunity to act as a Journalist. I always though that being a media man would be much easier than being a coach, mainly for the reason that you never lose.

As part of my duty as Brisbane United coach I follow the competition very closely and I'll try through this column to share with you my thoughts and predictions on teams and players without hurting anyone.

Since arriving in Brisbane 3 years ago I learnt to like the XXXX competition for its quality and for the smooth way it runs, but especially for the strong rivalry and serious manner that those involved take.

To get straight to the point and without running from responsibility, I will put here my prediction for the 1993 XXXX League season (A professional Journalist would not commit himself!).

As usual, at least one of them will surprise and will be up there with the best of them at the end of the season.

The two newcomers to the league, Acacia Ridge and Inala City, will be full of spirit and enthusiasm which will only help one of them. One will end up mid-table and the other will struggle.

All I can wish to all the administrators, players, and mainly the coaches, is to have a better season than I have had in 1993. Good luck!

Best chance for United

Brisbane United travel to Adelaide this weekend knowing it will be their best chance to register an away win this season.

United take on the Raul Blanco coached Vest Adelaide at Hindmarsh stadium on Sunday esperate to restore some pride after a sappointing season marred by injuries.
