Coaches give League face lift - eight clubs make changes

The XXXX League takes on an exciting new look in 1994 with eight clubs boasting new coaches.

Only Premiers Taringa Rovers (Juan Cutillas), Coalstars (Wayne Warren), Eastern Suburbs (Calvin Daunt) and Acacia Ridge (David Richardson) have the same coach, with Rocklea United's Frank Liddell moving to Grand Final winners Rochedale Rovers.

Former Brisbane United coach Miron Bleiberg heads the list of newcomers with his appointment at North Star with Wayne Gracey (Wynnum), Gary McDowall (North Brisbane), John Caric (Rocklea) and Dave Scriggins (Pine Rivers) all entering the XXXX League coaching ranks for the first time.

Billy Williamson, former North Star coach, and Gordon Arrowsmith make their return to the XXXX League with Williamson taking over from John Sime at Brisbane Lions and Arrowsmith guiding Toowoomba-based Willowburn into the XXXX League for the first time.

Phone: 252 5327 - Fax: 252 5047 Exiting from the XXXX League coaching ranks are: Peter Bannon - former North Star coach now assistant coach at the Brisbane Strikers, John Stewart - former Rochedale coach now a player at the same club, Alan Hunter - former North Brisbane coach now playing with the Brisbane Strikers, Frank Pimblett - former Pine Rivers coach also playing with the Brisbane Strikers, and John Sime - formerly with Brisbane Lions, now out of the game due to work commitments.

On the player front there have been a few movements with Lions' signing of Mt Gravatt striker David Munn one of the best of the season.

Premiers Taringa have recorded some of the biggest player movements with eight of last season's squad absent for numerous reasons and six newcomers bolstering their squad.

These include 1992 Rookie of the Year Andrew Brayshaw who returns to Speare Park after another stint in Scotland.

North Star have secured the services of Striker Mark Battistin and goalkeeper Robbie Harrison while Willowburn's new striker Anthony Brown will be a player to watch.

Wynnum's signing of keeper Kevin Tatton and defender Danny Valle augers well for their chances while Rochedale will be ruing the loss of Nigel McClure who tragically broke his leg in a trial against Brisbane Lions.

But perhaps the major signing in the offseason was the return to Pine Rivers of striker Clayton Koch.

A regular in the NSL before this season, Koch is expected to shine at Rivers with a stint in next season's NSL his main target. The Queensland Cup will again be one of the major events on the 1994 soccer calendar with the revamped format a huge success in 1993.

The Cup, which was won by North Brisbane last year after a narrow 1-0 win over Ipswich club Coalstars, will again be worth \$10 000 with the winner earning \$7000 and the runner-up \$3000.

QSF Secretary Jim Gilbert said 20 teams would be involved in the Cup, including eight regional sides.

All 12 of the XXXX League teams will make at least one trip to the country with the final being staged at Perry Park on August 13.

"Once again it is a great boost for Queensland Soccer to get all XXXX League sides to the country and it is a very prestigious Cup to win," Gilbert said.

> "It will also give Brisbane coaches a chance to look at some of the top talent we have in the country areas throughout Oueensland," he said.

> Three of the country areas reached the quarter final stage last year (Bundaberg,

Toowoomba and Far North Queensland) with Toowoomba beating eventual winner North Brisbane 4-1 in their Group 4 match.

Toowoomba will again provide a highlight in this years Cup with their clash with local club Willowburn on Monday May 2 expected draw one of the biggest crowds in the history of Toowoomba soccer.

Last season it was Acacia Ridge who performed well while Inala City fell in a heap, winning just one game from the 22 on offer. Hopefully that will not be the case this season. Early indications are that both Willowburn and Wynnum have strong squads and this should be a sign to the other clubs to get their house in order.

While there was no XXXX League launch midweek it was good to see the media was well and truly looked after by Queensland Soccer. A special luncheon with all local media was held and was a resounding success. 1993/94 has been a major developmental period for Queensland Soccer with the World Youth Championships, the Queensland tour to New Zealand, and the emergence of the Brisbane Strikers all helping consolidate Soccer's standing in the Sunshine State. Here's hoping the future is just as bright.

This weeks sees some interesting clashes with the Grand Final replay between Taringa Rovers and Rochedale Rovers on Friday night a real highlight. Pine Rivers striker Clayton Koch will make his much awaited return to the XXXX League against Acacia Ridge on Saturday night while Willowburn kick-off their first match in the League against Eastern Suburbs on Sunday. North Brisbane host newcomers Wynnum at Prentice Park on Sunday with the Brisbane Lions - North Star clash the pick of the matches. Coalstars, who are celebrating their 30th anniversary this year, should account for Rocklea at Eric Evans Reserve.

Queensland set for big season

Queensland will again continue it's commitment to representative football with three matches set down for 1994.

The Maroons, who will be sponsored by XXXX, will again take part in the NIB State of Origin Series with their third match against New Zealand side Auckland, whom they will play for the Sir Robert Muldoon Memorial Trophy.

The first match of the program is against the NSW Soccerblues in New South Wales with the return leg to be played at Perry Park on June 11.

After going 1-0 up in the first match at Perry Park last season, Queensland lost the series 2-1 on aggregate, after extra-time was needed in

the return leg at Newcastle which ended 1-0 to NSW after normal time.

The Maroons then embarked on a two match tour of New Zealand which saw them lose their first match 3-1 in Christchurch to Canterbury in minus four degrees temperatures at English Park.

They fared slightly better in the second match losing 5-4 on penalties to Auckland after the match ended at 1-1.

Magpies spread their wings

Toowoomba's first XXXX League team, the Willowburn Magpies, are set to take the XXXX League by storm with their off-field promotions streets ahead of any other club in the competition.

With benefits similar to the Brisbane Strikers, Willowburn has been adopted by the Toowoomba media and is expected to play their first home match in front of a packed house.

Already the club has secured \$34, 000 dollars worth of media sponsorship with WIN TV (\$26,000), The Toowoomba Chronicle (\$4,000) and Radio Station 4AK (\$4,000) pledging their support to the club.

Their first home match is on February 27 against Coalstars and is being promoted by WIN TV, with all gate takings going to the Endeavour Foundation.

Gordon Arrowsmith, the man who guided the Magpies into the top competition, will again be at the helm this season.

"Off the field things are going well and we've already got 30 sponsors," Arrowsmith said.

But while things off the field look guaranteed to work, it is on the field where the Magpies realise they have perform.

"Our aim is obviously to consolidate our position in the league but the players in Toowoomba are pretty competitive," Arrowsmith said.

"Our preparations have been excellent - we started before Christmas and the boys are ready to go."

Eight trial matches have enabled Arrowsmith to settle on his squad with a 2-1 loss to Taringa Rovers an indication they will be competitive this season.

The Magpies play Easts, Coalstars and

North Star in their first three outings and Arrowsmith knows the importance of getting off to a good start.

"Potentially there's nine points up for grabs and the whole club is rearing to go," Arrowsmith said.

He said players negotiations had gone well with Anthony Brown's signing from local rivals St Albans a coup.

The club has also secured local Troy Hews who returns after a stint with Brisbane Lions.

"Obviously we are hampered by the fact that we are a Toowoomba club in terms of signing players," Arrowsmith said.

"The boys are looking good but it's just a matter of whether they can perform at the next level.

"Hardly any of our players have played in the XXXX League so it will just be a matter of how they adapt."

We wish Willowburn all the best for their first year in the XXXX League.

New goals for Rovers' star

When Rochedale Rovers' striker Justin Playle takes the field against Taringa Rovers on Friday night, it will be the seventh time the so-called youngster has played in a XXXX Soccer League season.

At just 22, Playle is one of the most experienced players at the Underwood-based club and, along with Keiran Cooper and Frank Cole, is expected to provide a high percentage of the clubs goals this season.

Playle (pictured) made his debut in the XXXX League playing with Eastern Suburbs in 1988, then just a baby at 15 years old.

Since that time has scored plenty of goals and played with some of the best in League.

Playle has won three Grand Finals, the first with Easts in 1989, the second with Brisbane Lions in 1991 and the third with Rochedale last season.

He has also won a Premiership and a Pre-Season Cup with the Queensland Cup the only honour left for him to grab.

With so much achieved already, Playle could be forgiven for wanting a change, or for playing simply for the love of the game with no real goals in mind.

"I want to win the Premiership this season and the Oueensland Cup," Playle chips in.

Last season yielded 9 goals from 22 league games from Playle with another four coming from his boot in the finals' series.

"My aim this season is to score three goals less than Keiran Cooper does," Playle said.

"He scored 19 last year so I've got a pretty tough task ahead of me."

And while the League is firmly on A



Playle's mind, he hasn't given up hope of playing in the National League or wearing a Queensland strip again.

According to Playle, Rochedale Rovers have settled in well under new coach Frank Liddell but were shocked to lose midfielder Nigel McClure who broke both bones in his right leg during a recent trial match.

"I couldn't believe it when Nigel broke his leg," Playle said.

"He will be a huge loss."

So for now Playle is hard at work achieving his goals - and who knows? With so much achieved already, he might just do it.

Wolves hungry for success

Wynnum could be one of the early movers in this year's XXXX Soccer League after winning the North Star Pre-Season Challenge last Saturday night.

The Wolves beat North Star to win the Challenge and can look forward to taking their form into the League.

Eye on Soccer caught up with coach Wayne Gracey last week and he was confident his side would make the Wynnum region proud.

"Things couldn't be better," Gracey said.

"We beat North Star and Brisbane City in the North Star Challenge so things are starting to look up.

"We lost to Brisbane Lions but we learnt a fair bit from that game," he said.

Traditionally a family club, the Wolves have stuck together through the off season losing no players and signing three.

"I can't fault the attitude of the players," Gracey added.

"They seem ready, willing and able to be a force in the League."

The club has signed defender Danny Valle from Rocklea United, keeper Kevin Tatton from Taringa Rovers and veteran defender Phil Kerr who played with Brisbane City in their NSL days.

"We've been a soft touch for too long so to have Danny will hopefully bolster the squad." Gracey said.

He said Tatton had been playing superbly and would take on the number one role at the club with Dave Mewburn suspended for the opening fixture.

"The number one would have to be Kevin at the moment," Gracey said.

"It looks as though he'll help with height at the back which has been a problem in recent years."

While the three signings have bolstered the squad, Gracey hinted there could be more from overseas in coming weeks, but declined to name names.

Even if they fail to sign any more players, Wynnum are still looking good with former Queensland representative Billy McDermott and experienced XXXX League striker Geoff Maltby ready to fire.

Soccer thrives under Selby

When it comes to Soccer, Queensland is fast becoming a role model for the other States, even though they hate to admit it.

The Brisbane Strikers have paved the way for an increased profile of the round ball game in the Sunshine State, and those who know will tell you that it is the structure which has provided the platform for the success.

No matter where you come from in this great State of ours, the chances of being a good footballer and being missed by the coaching scheme is virtually non-existent.

Although it is not perfect, Queensland Director of Coaching Jim Selby says the system in Queensland is fast becoming the best in the country.

Already we have Directors of Coaching in seven zones across the State, and judging by the talent coming through, Brisbane will be a force in the Coca-Cola Soccer League for many years to come.

"Tasmania's Director of Coaching recently attended a coaching course in Queensland and he was very impressed," Selby said.

"He believes we are the best State for development in the country."

Selby has been at the helm of Queensland Soccer since 1991 and is well aware of the



importance of getting the structure right.

This year he will implement two new programs into the State's structure which will should see Queensland into the next century.

The first is the TAPS 2000, the Talented Athletes Program Soccer 2000.

This program will be conducted and organised in all regional areas throughout Oueensland with the 2000 Olympics in Sydney the aim.

Basically it will allow the OSF to identify talented athletes, develop these athletes and evaluate their performances, thus providing our players with the best possible chance of reaching the 2000 Olympics.

"This sort of program provides a pathway for our kids to the top level," Selby said.

"They can see this pathway and I think that's very important."

The second program is the Talented Coaches Program, which has been introduced to provide for the needs of coaches throughout the State.

It is based on providing coaches with a pathway to develop their skills outside of the club environment.

> Selby said the Talented Coaches Program was a vital part of developing the overall game in Oueensland.

"Coaches might want to take another pathway other than coaching a club so we're training them to do that," Selby said. >

He said coaches could choose career paths that involved being coaching instructors in the TAPS 2000 program or might want to conduct coaching clinics themselves.

"There are plenty options outside the club arena," Selby said.

"For instance a coach could become an expert in working with special age groups or specialised positions like goalkeepers.

"Just because they've finished their original coaching course doesn't mean they can automatically work in other areas so that's what this program is for," he said.

Outside the two programs Selby has plenty of other ideas which are being put to use.

One such idea is getting all XXXX League clubs to list their background and current status so players discovered in the country can take a on the transfer list for \$20,000. It seems they could be at their respective clubs for a very, very long time!

Biggest question for 1994 is will the XXXX League clubs keep their player lists updated and will players wear the number they are allocated in the program? Some clubs did it week in week out last year while others didn't seem to care what numbers the players wore. Surely your average supporter who pays \$5 to watch your team play deserves to know which player is wearing which jersey. Is that too much to ask?

Finally, who was the XXXX League coach who last year predicted that Mt Gravatt would make the top five. With Mt Gravatt now relegated to the Second Division, lets hope the coach has not told his own players he thinks they will make the five this season!

A list of all quality country players will also be provided to XXXX League clubs.

"If there's talent out there it's not going to be missed - whether you're a player or a coach." Selby said.

Despite the success of the program in material terms, Selby said he was in need of people to assist on the administration side of things.

"If there's anyone out there with the computer expertise who knows how to put together a program to record all our coaching information we would love to hear from them." Selby said.

"We will always need help in the administration side of the game."
