

Koch throws down gauntlet

Pine Rivers striker Clayton Koch has thrown down the gauntlet to Rochedale Rovers striker Keiran Cooper, scoring five goals in his first two games back in the XXXX League.

Koch returned to the XXXX League this season after spending last years XXXX season resting. The talented playmaker spent three years in the Coca-Cola Soccer League, transferring from Rivers to Sydney United (then Sydney Croatia) before the 1990/91 season.

After a year in Sydney he returned to join Brisbane United for their 1991/92 and 1992/93 campaigns before damaging muscles in his stomach which saw him out of the game for six months.

Koch then trialed with the Brisbane Strikers earlier this season but was overlooked and returned to Pine Rivers where he played all of his junior football.

Eye on Soccer spoke to Koch's rival Keiran Cooper earlier in the week and he said he was looking forward to the challenge of matching Koch.

"Clayton is playing very well and looked

sharp against us last week," Cooper said.

Cooper has made the leading scorer title his own since joining Brisbane City in 1987 winning it an amazing six times.

Their backline of Mark Gilbert, Alan McFarlane and Pat Boyle will be hard to penetrate at Bundamba and could provide the platform for a home win.

Quick strike boosts Lions

The fastest goal of the season paved the way for a Brisbane Lions 2-0 win when they clashed with the Wynnum Wolves at Carmichael Park last weekend.

Alan Hilton made it 1-0 on the 30 second mark, pouncing on a loose ball after Kevin Tatton had charged down a Warren Allen shot.

In what turned out to be a most subdued performance by the Wolves, particularly in view of the fact they had a quite vociferous crowd in their first night match, they were never effectively in the game and the shots at goal statistics (12-6) are a testament to that.

Lions completely dominated the first half and Man of the match Craig Priddy had a telepathic understanding with striker Warren Allen, feeding him time and time again.

But the Lions shooting was not what it should have been, otherwise they would have enjoyed a substantial first half lead.


Twice mid-way through the first stanza, Priddy fed Allen with a superb placement of pass but on each occasion nothing eventuated.

Just before the half hour in only the third corner of the match, Frank Mengotti in his usual inimitable way, soared high off the ground to head Lions second goal.

To underline Wynnum's ineffectiveness, their first actual shot on goal did not come until the 30th minute, with Billy McDermott being thwarted by Rob Farrow's dive at his feet.

McDermott was without a doubt Wynnum's only effective striking weapon, as the burly Geoff Maltby, whilst showing strength in patches, faded rapidly as the game wore on.

The best shot on Farrow's goal came from Lions' own defender Mark Williamson when he went in for a do or die block tackle, only to see the ball fly past a stranded Farrow and over the crossbar.

Ipswich boys grab spotlight

Coalstars jumped into equal first place on the XXXX Soccer League table after a patchy 2-1 win over Willowburn in Toowoomba last weekend.

With the Magpies putting on an excellent opening match day program, the Ipswich boys grabbed the spotlight although Willowburn certainly showed they have the potential to do well this season.

Coalstars coach Wayne Warren was pleased with his sides start to the season.

"We'll take the three points up here gladly," Warren said.

"There'll be a lot of sides who come up here (Toowoomba) and struggle.

"There's still a long way to go but I think we'll be very competitive," he said.

Coalstars dominated early proceedings and took the lead in the 11th minute after their defence allowed a long Darren Freiberg throw-in to bounce in the six yard box.

Midfielder Tony Cotton, who starred with a dominating performance, rose well to head past Trevor Gilliland.

New signing Anthony Brown struck back for Willowburn within 10 minutes, steering home a spectacular diving header after a Gavin Freier cross took a deflection off team mate Troy Hews.

Tragedy struck just before half time when Willowburn's Laurence Inunciago was stretchered from the field after a challenge from Coalstars' Wes Park.

Park appeared to bump Inunciago off balance causing him to fall and crash his head into team mate Mick Young's knee.

Play was held up for several minutes with





an extended half time taken to allow the Ambulance to take the unconscious Inunciago to the local hospital.

Coalstars picked up the tempo after the break with Cotton and Freiberg both denied by good saves from Gilliland.

The pressure eventually told in the 60th minute when Cotton scored with a brilliant curling freekick after Willowburn were penalised for an infringement on the edge of their area.

From that point on Willowburn pressed hard with striker Troy Hews peppering the Coalstars' goal with shots.

The Magpies best chance fell to Paul Daly after a neat through ball left him with only the keeper to beat but Farrar did well to smother his shot.

Shane Biber also had a chance right at the death but pushed his shot across the face of the goal.

Coach Gordon Arrowsmith was justifiably hard on his players after they failed to capitalise on their 19th minute equaliser.

"We didn't deserve to win," Arrowsmith said.

"We're not tough enough mentally or physically.

"There are players out there that just go through the motions."

The home side looked dangerous from the outset with Mark Battistin and Nick Seeley coming close in the opening minutes.

Young Easts' keeper Chris Roche, who cost his side the win against Willowburn at Heath Park last week, redeemed himself with a solid performance including a point blank save to deny Ian Hutchison from five metres.

Easts came out more organised after the break and deservedly got on the score sheet when Paul Georgiou pounced on the ball after goalkeeper Jason Parks failed to hold a Denny Whitfield shot.


