In other matches, Rochedale Rovers and Brisbane Lions will also clash on Friday night at Underwood Park. Rochedale can extend their unbeaten run to three with a win in the match and coach Frank Liddell will welcome the news that defender Paddy Dillon is available for the clash.

Dillon recieved a one week suspension after his sides match against Pine Rivers and was due to miss the clash with North Brisbane last week but recieved a reprieve when that match was called off due to wet weather.

On Saturday, Rocklea United will be looking to open their account against an everimproving North Brisbane while Acacia Ridge and Eastern Suburbs meet at Proud Field.Both sides are yet to record a win with Acacia Ridge still searching for their first goal of the season.

The two newly promoted teams, Wynnum and Willowburn go head to head at Boundary Street in what should be a close encounter.


Wynnum's game against Easts was washed out last week with Willowburn gaining plenty

Koch kicks Rivers to top spot

Pine Rivers striker Clayton Koch is enjoying his successful return to the XXXX League but believes there is plenty of work ahead of him before the season is out.

The livewire 23-year-old has already scored 7 goals in his side's opening three matches, three ahead of Rochedale's Keiran Cooper who has a game in hand.

Last weekend he added another two to his tally but was quick to point out that five of his goals had come against lesser teams.

Renowned for his quiet nature, Koch wasn't giving too much away but took time out to heap praise on rival Cooper.

"I've set myself three goals, one of which is to beat Keiran Cooper," Koch said.

He said he believed he would need to be at his peak to achieve that aim.

"I still believe I'll need more than 20 to beat Coops," he said.

"He looked magnificent against us when we played them and he's very good at exploiting week backlines."

Pine Rivers play current Premiers Taringa Rovers at Jack Speare Park this Friday night and go into the match without a loss.


"We haven't really reached our peak fitness yet," Koch added.

"Our start has been pretty good but we've played two of the bottom sides so we'll see how we go."

Koch played all of his junior football at Pine Rivers and helped the club earn promotion into the XXXX League back in 1989.

After a successful stint in the League he was signed by CCSL club Sydney United (then Croatia) in 1989 where he spent a season before returning to link up with Brisbane United.

That year he scored 6 goals in the CCSL and seemed set for a big career in the National competition.

But injury plagued his second year with United and he opted to miss last years XXXX League to ready himself for another shot in the National League.

Division 5

Bayside United will look to have a big year this year, they are fielding two teams for the first time in a long time and that, combined with the official opening of their new clubhouse, and it appears everything is right off the pitch, but can they produce the goods on the pitch?

Deception Bay never really got off the ground in 1993, with only one win to their credit all season, and it will take a massive injection of morale to lift them out of Division 5, the main thing going for them is the area in which they are located, with plenty of potential for support.

Goodna is another team with lots of ups and downs, two seasons ago they were championship material, last year very ordinary, maybe this is the year in which everything Goodna touches, turns to gold. For Latrobe Athletic, this will be very much a proving year for them, as their amalgamation in the off season with Toowong will see an influx of players spread over many teams, expected to do well. Leichhardt Eagles had a very ordinary year last year, it started badly by losing a team from division 7, and turned out to be ordinary for their Division 5 side, should and could do better. But for some administrative irregularities, Loganholme could well have been pushing for a semifinal place last year, they will do better and are fully expected to finish in the top half. For once-proud Oxley United, this is getting to be almost habit forming going between Divisions 4 and 5, it is to hoped for the proud heritage of the club that they can get back up to the higher divisions sooner - rather than later.

Slacks Creek are not enjoying the best of fortunes, their top side were relegated, and this team also had some misfortune in 1993, player departures from the club are expected to affect the standing of this team. The Gap having yet again attained promotion, may find this Division a bit hot to handle for their "veterans", however they should do well, as talent knows no age restrictions. The students at St Lucia had an excellent year in 1993, promotion of their top side could reflect on this team, however. For the last two (alphabetical listing) teams in this division Western Suburbs and Woodridge, it will be very much a "toss the coin" job as far as predictions are concerned, both clubs have lost players and officials in the off- season, it will be interesting to see how they fare this

Division 6

Annerley were relegated 5 last year, and will probably struggle in this one, whilst for Beenleigh this will be more of a social outing for some of their players. Bethania Rams, on the other hand, have been trying to get out of this division for the last two seasons, and been getting pipped each year, maybe this is their year. For Brisbane City this will be a division in which their players will undoubtedly just enjoy themselves.

The two promoted clubs from division 7 last year, Browns Plains and Greenbank, may well find the step up difficult to adjust to in the early stages, however both sides have good players and are fully expected to do well. Capalaba were relegated from Division 5, and this will be very much an outing for these players. Grange Thistle on the other hand, always take points off the more fancied

teams, and shouldn't be underestimated. Jimboomba upset a number of clubs last year, and finished in a very creditable fifth placing, they are expected to be in the semis at the end of the year. Logan. City Kings also enjoyed fluctuating fortunes last year, but with the extra importance given to their top side this year, this is the team which will probably suffer. Olympic, who only just held their status in this division last year, will probably not fare much better, likewise for Souths United, at least for them they were nine points adrift of relegation.

Division 7

Albany Creek will probably have another good year in this grade, which is probably a little bit more than could be said for Annerley. Clairvaux, playing on Friday nights, will probably have a better year, whilst for Darra they will struggle. Deception Bay are new to this grade and are therefore unknown, the same can be said for Inala City. Mitchelton have just come down a peg, so they may be looking for top half consolidation, Olympic United are the Premiers from Division 8 and will do well. Redlands United should also do well, as will St Helens who were promoted from Division 8. Western Suburbs will probably struggle in this grade.

Division 8

Bayside are an unknown quantity, therefore predictions are difficult, Beenleigh can expect mid-table status, as can Bethania. For Jimboomba, hopefully their top side enthusiasm will rub off on them. Latrobe Athletic very ordinary last year should do better. Loganholme suffered from their top side's "points lost" syndrome, but should do well in this grade, Mooroondu have been promoted and may struggle in their first year. Mt Gravatt are new to this division therefore unpredictable, Newmarket flattered to deceive but could only finish fourth - should do better. Oxley and University could well end up at the opposite ends of the spectrum, based on last year's performances.

Division 9A

Last year's second placed team, North Star has already fallen by the wayside, however it is expected that the fifth "social" teams from the XXXX League clubs will all do well again in this year. For the only new club in this division - Park Ridge - hopefully they will have learned from last year and will be finishing up in a semifinal placing.

Division 9B

There are two changes to the originally published list in this division, with Pine Hills replacing Samford, and Rochedale replacing Acacia Ridge. Nearly all of the teams in this division are brand new to the competition, therefore predictions will be nigh on impossible, however all eyes will be on the two new clubs in this division - Kingsridge and Margate, and we bid them welcome.

For those who wondered why these lower divisions are numbered in this way, ask some of the players if they wish to be playing in Division 10!

Brisbane's only concern is a minor injury to captain Steve Jackson who strained his calf muscle midway through the first half in the clash with West Adelaide.


The Sharks got off to a dream start with striker Pablo Cardozo netting in the 13th minute after good lead-up work from Greg Brown.

Replacement goalkeeper Graham Ross will admirably fill the hole left by Clint Bolton.


In the National Youth League, the QAS remained in the hunt for a finals berth with a hard fought 1-0 win over the Marconi Academy in Sydney.






