

Strikers beat Breakers three year bogey

The Brisbane Strikers ended their 1993/ 94 Coca-Cola Soccer League campaign on a winning note last weekend with a tidy 1-0 win over rivals Newcastle BHP.

The Strikers had never beaten the Breakers in the three years since they returned to the CCSL but never looked like losing the match.

The three points from the clash left Brisbane's season tally at 36 points, double their intake in the 1992/93 CCSL season.

Newcastle started slightly better than the Strikers but failed to get past keeper Graham Ross who finished the season in outstanding form.

After a below par first half coach Bruce Stowell gave the side a quick pep talk at the break and the move paid wonders with Danny Wright (pictured) snatching the winner straight after the break.

Sean Cranney provided the platform for the goal with a surging run down the right flank. The 20 year old beat his marker before sending

Late penalty robs Rocklea

A controversial last minute penalty was enough to deny Rocklea United their first win of the season when they drew 2-2 with Easts at Dunn Road last weekend.

In a dour affair, Easts opened the scoring late in the second half when Makridakis's freekick found Carson, who headed home.

With only minutes of normal time remaining, Rocklea's Anthony Cule equalised from close range.

Revival for Blue Machine

Taringa Rovers stormed back into form with a determined 1-0 win over Brisbane Lions at Speare Park last weekend.

The Blue Machine were handed a humiliating 6-1 defeat by North Brisbane last weekend but showed tremendous fighting qualities to take the points against Lions.

Andy Lees (pictured), gave the home side the lead in the 16th minute after Eddie Lees and Brent Read had worked a neat short corner. Eddie's near post cross found his brother Andy who was on hand to deflect a shot over the line.

A minute later it was Lions' turn to pepper the goals with Queensland striker Warren Allen pushing the ball wide with just Jason Lucas to beat.

However it was Taringa's night with the Lees brothers tormenting Lions' backline with their telepathic understanding. The pair almost extended the lead in the 26th minute after a cross from Andy was headed goalwards by Eddie.

Only a great save from Robbie Farrow denied the goal. Farrow, who has bounced back well after breaking his wrist late last year, was in fine form and saved his side from a bigger defeat.

The 31 year old was involved again in the second half, using his legs to deny a point blank strike from Eddie Lees.

Lions did have one chance to equalise after the break when Frank Mengotti unleashed a powerful drive from the edge of the area.

This time it was Farrow's counterpart, youngster Lucas, who was on hand to deny a goal.

Lions coach Billy Williamson was disappointed with the loss but disagreed with Cutillas.

"I thought a draw would have been a fair result but I've got no complaints."
