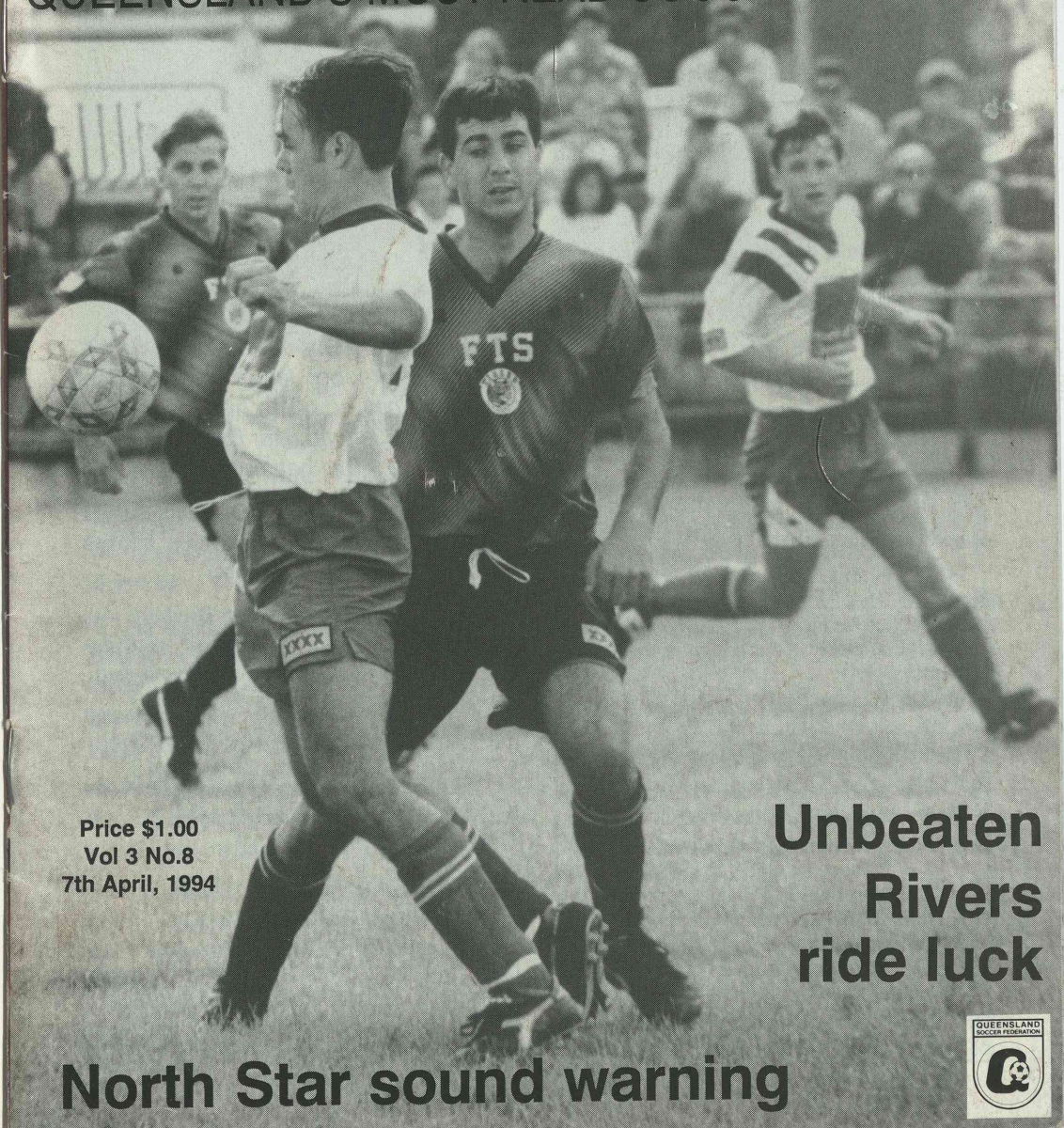

North Star sound warning



North Star sound warning

North Star expressed their dominance of this year's XXXX Soccer League with a convincing 3-1 victory over Championship trophy holders Rochedale Rovers at O'Callaghan Park last Saturday night.

Miron Bleiberg's boys started nervously and found themselves 1-0 down just before the break after a mistake by keeper Jason Parks.

Rochedale striker Kieran Cooper won possession of the ball in North Star's box before tapping a neat pass back for Kieran Galloway, whose strike was not held by Parks. Craig Walsh cleaned up to give the visitors a half time lead.

North Star's youngsters came out with renewed confidence after the break however, and soon equalised through a powerful Mike Brockwell drive.

The home side took the lead midway through the second half when striker Mark Battistin headed home.

Rochedale's enthusiasm went downhill from there and it seemed as though the boys were keen for an early shower.

North Star kept the pressure on for the rest

Pine Rivers were lucky to come away with a win at Brisbane Lions last round and will be looking to fire up over the next two rounds in preparation for their top of the table clash with North Star.

Rivers have kicked on well since the loss of the in-form Clayton Koch, who had scored seven goals this season before succumbing to injury, but have been less than impressive in recent rounds.

They will be relying heavily on keeper Peter Underhill, who was in scintillating form last week, as well as Queensland defender Mark Greer, and young midfielder Damien Waugh.

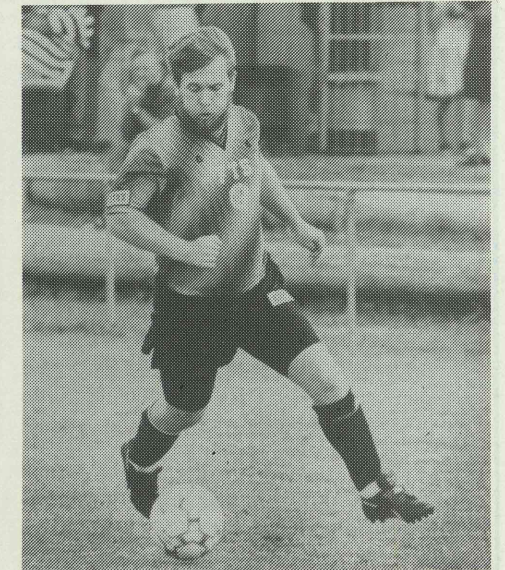
Strikers Lindsay Dines and Dene Almond will have to take any opportunities that come their way.

For Easts, sweeper Chris Fegan will be called on to stop Rivers' goal scoring chances, and youngster Ben Mannion will have to do a lot more in the midfield to help create a few more chances for his strikers.

Taringa moved into outright third place on the XXXX League table after last week's victory against Easts.

The Rovers will be well served by the Lees brothers, who have been combining well lately, and an in-form Danny Stowers could be a daunting prospect.

Willowburn have been strengthened by the return of NSL star, Darren Hillier, who will add

a lot to a side that is looking to stay out of the relegation zone.

Queensland Cup kicks off

The 1994 Queensland Cup begins this Wednesday 13 April, and should once again be one of the highlights of the season.

The Cup has \$10 000 up for grabs, with the eventual winner collecting \$7000 and the runner-up earning \$3000.

QSF Secretary Jim Gilbert said 20 teams would be involved in the cup, including eight regional sides.

All 12 of the XXXX League teams will make at least one trip to the country with the final being staged at Perry Park on August 13.

"Once again it is a great boost for Queensland soccer to get all XXXX League sides to the country and it is a very prestigious cup to win," Gilbert said.

"It will also give Brisbane coaches a chance to look at some of the top talent we have in the country areas throughout

Queensland," he said.

Three of the country areas reached the quarter final stage last year, with Toowoomba defeating eventual winners North Brisbane 4-1 in their Group 4 match.

Toowoomba will again provide a highlight in this years cup with their clash with local club Willowburn on Monday May 2. This is expected to draw a big crowd.

The cup kicks off with Coalstars taking on North Brisbane and Easts meeting Willowburn at the Eric Evans Reserve. Rochedale play North Star at Underwood Park, Lions meet Rocklea at Lions Stadium, and Wynnum clash with Acacia Ridge at Carmichael Park.

Two games are also being played in the country. Toowoomba take on Taringa at the Toowoomba Athletic Oval, and Pine Rivers travel to the Beerwah Glasshouse Soccer Club to do battle with the Sunshine Coast.

EDITORIAL

Clubs have a responsibility with respect to consumption of alcohol at their ground. Some have accepted that responsibility, clearly defining the area in which alcohol is to be consumed. Too many clubs are however failing to accept the policy requirement, for which they are solely responsible when a match is being played at their ground. Officials of the home team are responsible in every sense. If your club is not providing a defined area for the consumption of alcohol and policing it, then it is acting contrary to this Federation's accepted code of behaviour. Remember, as an official of that club, you are collectively responsible for ensuring such matters are given the priority they rightly deserve.

Clubs that have capitalised on having an entrant in the Miss Queensland Soccer Quest will need no reminding of the need to begin the internal process of determining the entrant for the function Saturday August 6th, 1994 at the Greek Club where Miss Queensland Soccer 1995 will be crowned. Last year in excess of 400 people supported 30 entrants during a magnificent evening. Qantas provide \$5000 of airline travel to the winner plus a further \$2500 for Miss Fundraiser. This activity provides an excellent opportunity for your club to conduct their own quest or simply nominate your entrant, to be received no later than Friday July 22. Remember it is a means of involving your club in a great fundraising program. *

Own goal sinks Stars' hopes

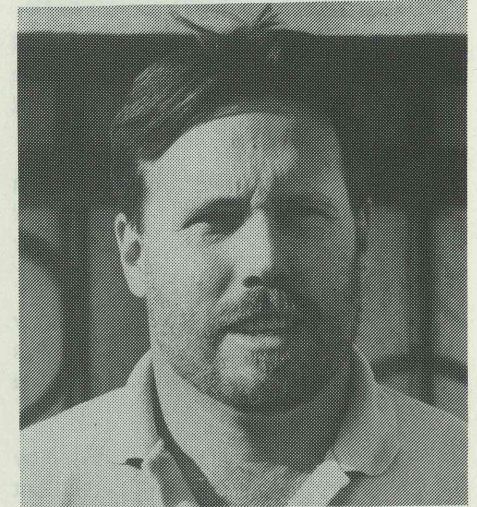
An under strength North Brisbane fought back to hold Coalstars to a 1-1 draw at Eric Evans Reserve last Sunday.

In a determined second half performance, North Brisbane put aside its injury woes to come back from a 1 goal deficit and steal a draw.

Coalstars were coming off a 1-0 win against Wynnum the previous week and began in aggressive fashion, opening the scoring in the 31st minute.

Midfielder Darren Freiberg did some good lead up work before executing a quality cross for David Guest, whose right foot volley found the net.

North Brisbane had a couple of chances immediately afterwards but rock solid defence by Coalstars' back four denied any score.

North Brisbane continued to mount pressure in the last period but their plays consistently broke down when it mattered.

Coalstars had a chance to take the lead with only a few minutes remaining when a searching corner kick found Darren Freiberg, whose strike went past the keeper and to the right of the post.

North's coach Gary McDowall was disappointed with his team's performance but was happy to come away with one point.

"We had a bad one but it's good to get a point when you look at the injury problems we've been having," McDowall said.

Coalstars' Wayne Warren said his team was unlucky not to get the three points considering the own-goal that was scored.

"I was quite pleased with the first half but disappointed with our second half performance," Warren said.

Coalstars continued on the attack after the half-time break, when in the 51st minute, North's keeper Wayne Evans was left stranded only to see Peter McKendrick tap the ball wide of the post.

North Brisbane then went up a gear through some great skills from Willie Carter. Midway through the second half the striker played a great ball to David Miller, who pushed the ball down the line for Michael Lane. Lane's cross eluded all, before getting a lucky touch from Coalstars' defender Pat Boyle and dribbling into the goals.

Unbeaten Rivers ride luck

Pine Rivers consolidated their second placing on the XXXX League Soccer table with a 2-1 win against Brisbane Lions at Lions Stadium last Monday.

In a game of missed opportunities from both teams, Rivers, inspired by keeper Peter Underhill, rallied to survive a late charge by Lions and take maximum points.

Lions had the first scoring opportunity in the 8th minute after David Munn was brought down by Rivers' Graham Eden in the penalty area.

Frank Mengotti's penalty was saved by Underhill, who failed to hold the ball but recovered to stop Warren Allen's strike.

Rivers then lifted and in the 17th minute Lions' keeper Robbie Farrow failed to secure a Lindsey Dines thunderbolt. Andrew Strickland was on the spot and slotted the ball to give the visitors a 1-0 lead.

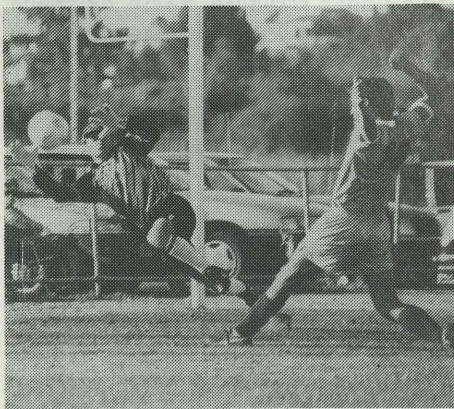
Lions hit back in the 29th minute when Munn was again brought down in the penalty area, this time by Underhill. Warren Allen converted to make it 1-1.

This was Allen's last joy however as the Queensland striker's game ended late in the second half after he was sent from the field by referee Steen for dissent.

Four minutes after Lions' equaliser Rivers took the lead once again when the home side failed to clear a corner kick and Dene Almond found the net.

In the second half Lions' had a couple of early chances but Peter Underhill (pictured), kept superbly to keep his side in front.

Rivers had a chance in the 60th minute to go two ahead of Lions when David Hunter handballed in the penalty area. However



Damien Waugh's penalty attempt was nothing short of woeful as he lifted the ball some five feet over the crossbar.

Lions tried desperately to equalise in the dying minutes of the match with shots from Mengotti, Munn, and Hunter all going wide.

Rivers coach, Dave Scriggins, was not pleased with his side's performance but was glad to get the three points.

"We played badly and we won," Scriggins said.

"I think it's shocking that sides can't capitalise on our bad play, but we got the points anyway and I'm happy about that."

Lions' captain, Frank Mengotti, expressed disappointment about his team's missed chances.

"You had two attacking sides out there and both teams had a lot of opportunities," Mengotti said.

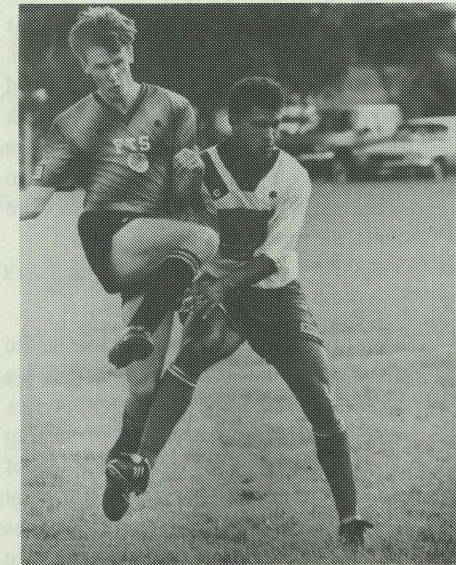
"We probably created chances to score three or four more goals but were unable to finish.

DIVISION 4

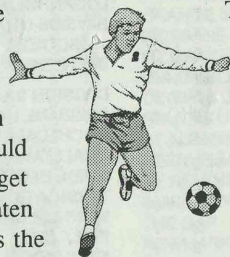
Believe it or not there were thirty goals scored in this Division last weekend, it might be some time before we see that exceeded.

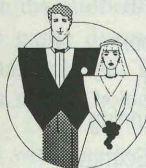
