# XXXX League at a glance

Two major upsets were the highlights of Round nine of the XXXX Soccer League last weekend.

Acacia Ridge handed out a merciless 5-1 thrashing to Rochedale at Proud Oval last Saturday night, while Willowburn broke Pine Rivers' undefeated record with a 1-0 win in Toowoomba.

Player-coach Davey Richardson led by example, taking the Rovers' defence apart.

Willowburn stole the points away from Pine Rivers courtesy of a Darren Hillier penalty. The boys from atop the Range were strengthened by the additions of QAS players, Chey Hews and Ben Wood, who both combined well with Hillier.

Rivers had many opportunities but failed to convert, highlighting their current need for a good striker.

Brisbane Lions moved to outright fourth on the league ladder with a 1-0 win over Coalstars at Bundamba.

In a boring match, where possession was not valued by either team, Warren Allen slotted a first half penalty to give his team the win.

There were no surprises at Carmichael Park, where an injury-ridden Wynnum defeated Rocklea 2-1.

The return from injury to NSL player Stein Grodum was the highlight for Easts during their 1-0 loss to North Brisbane at Heath Park. Coach Calvin Daunt was pleased with his team's revived commitment.

In the match of the round, North Star scored an impressive 3-1 win over the in-form Taringa.

North Star dominated the aerial battles and their pace proved too much for a Taringa side that lost heart midway through the second half. North Star will again be the centre of attention when they clash with Pine Rivers at Wendy Allison Park in this week's match of the round.

In other games North Brisbane meet Willowburn in the first match of Saturday night's Perry Park double header, while Rochedale and Coalstars do battle in the second. Acacia Ridge travel to Dunn Road to face Rocklea on Sunday, while on Anzac Day, Lions play host to Easts, and Taringa go up against Wynnum. \*

# Front runners finally meet

**Competition front runners North Star and Pine Rivers do battle at the Wendy Allison Park this Saturday night, in a top of the table clash everyone's been waiting for.**

Both teams have taken a massive leap on the rest of the field, with North Star amassing 25 points after only nine matches, and Rivers on 20 points.

Their nearest rivals, Taringa Rovers and Brisbane Lions, are five points behind on 15.

North Star have an unblemished record so far this season, with their only real scare coming in the third round when they held on for a 1-1 draw against an enthusiastic Willowburn in Toowoomba.

The club has had very few injury problems and coach Miron Bleiberg attributes this to some good planning early in the season.

"I think we have been better prepared than most other sides in the competition," Bleiberg said.

"We set out with a 20-man squad and even though we have had no real problems with injuries, I believe we can draw upon our squad if necessary."

North Star are boasting many fine players, and their combination mixed with the speed of men like Brockwell, Cuba, and Rosenthal, along with the aerial power of Battistin, has seen them score 28 goals at an average of just over three per game.

Coming off a good 3-1 win against Taringa last week, Bleiberg's boys will be hard to beat. However the coach remains wary.

"I give full respect to Pine Rivers and their coach because they have achieved more than they should have in terms of quality of players," Bleiberg said.

"I think we are a better side and we have

an advantage in that we are more experienced.

"They are only a young team... when I saw them playing against Eastern Suburbs, despite their winning that game, I feel they still have a lot to learn."

Bleiberg was not impressed with the recent off-field happenings between the two clubs and young striker Ian Hutchison however.

## "...very unsporting behaviour"

"I think the approach to Ian Hutchison by Pine Rivers, one week before the two sides are playing is very unsporting behaviour," he said.

"I give Pine Rivers no respect for this, and I feel the whole thing will do relations between the two clubs no good at all."

Pine Rivers' coach Dave Scriggins believed North Star would try to hold off the signing of Ian Hutchison before the match was due to take place.

"I think they'll (North Star) try to stall us in this matter, which is understandable really," Scriggins said.

"So that leaves us in the position whereby we're still in the hunt for a striker."

However Scriggins maintained that the match would be won on the field and not off.

He showed some concern over the pace and height advantage North Star would enjoy.

"I've got full confidence in Mark Greer's ability to handle Battistin, but they have another 6'2" man in Danny Lobwein," said Scriggins.

"We'll just have to hope Lindsay Dines grows a few more inches.

"But seriously, if we are to win, we'll just have to deny them the ball." \*



## EDITORIAL . . . . .

One item discussed by the Management Committee of the Queensland Soccer Federation at its fortnightly meeting last week should provoke some interest within clubs, particularly at the higher level. This relates to the criteria and its updating/upgrading for future seasons.

As a matter of policy the Federation is most concerned at the requirements for the clubs, upon receipt of promotion, to reach the specified criteria of their "On and Off" field facilities.

A number of matters will be reviewed in future criterias for both XXXX League and Division 2. These matters are in relation to grounds, both its standard and facilities, ground sharing, and other items that require reviewing, especially in light of the recent updating by both Council and State Government of sporting club requirements.

In the meantime, many clubs, are failing miserably in their attitudes towards the

current specified standards, possibly a case of familiarity breeds contempt.

Some prime examples. Where are the ball boys? Are club names on score-boards?, Is the public address system being used frequently and correctly, to mention but a few.

Maybe the current quota of XXXX League clubs should be looking to themselves, and not waiting for the review procedures to possibly "let them off the hook". They should remember they are being re-assessed and should not rest on their laurels.

The criteria, incidentally, applies to a number of Divisions, not only the XXXX Soccer League and Division 2.

All clubs need to take the initiative and instigate some forward planning and goal settings to a realistic time table. By doing this you will be looking to the future, not the past.

## Will the Queensland Cup go to the country this year ?

The first round of the 1994 Queensland Cup has come and gone with some interesting results.

Toowoomba once again proved they will be tough to beat when they narrowly went down 3-2 against Taringa Rovers.

The boys from the Downs were extremely competitive in 1993, defeating eventual winners, North Brisbane 4-1 when the two teams met in the early rounds of last year's competition.

Toowoomba sits atop an extinct volcano and the city is expected to explode when their Queensland Cup team clashes with their XXXX League side Willowburn on May 2.

The match is expected to draw one of the biggest crowds in the history of Toowoomba soccer and if this be the case, then the rumblings and tremors could well be heard and register on the Richter Scale here in Brisbane.

The Sunshine Coast were no match for Pine Rivers, losing 4-0 in a one-sided affair. Rivers' Dean Almond scored twice for his team.

The "Coasties" will have to wax their game to get a better hold on the competition if they are to ride the crest to the finals. Another dumper could well leave them beached.

North Star suffered their first defeat of the season, going down 3-2 to Rochedale Rovers.

The win came at a cost for Rochedale however, as they had several key players

injured during the match, including star striker and the XXXX League's leading goal scorer Kieran Cooper.

In other matches Brisbane Lions handed out a 6-1 thrashing to Rocklea, with Frank Mengotti getting a double.

Coalstars were 3-1 victors over North Brisbane, Easts went down 3-2 to Willowburn, and Wynnum downed Acacia Ridge 2-1.

Matches continue this week with two games being contested in the country, while Pine Rivers must back up from a tough weekend match with North Star to take on Wynnum on Wednesday night.

The two country matches to be played on Anzac Day are Mackay versus Rockhampton, while Maryborough clash with traditional rivals Bundaberg.

# North Star halts Taringa

XXXX League leaders North Star brought Taringa Rovers' winning streak to an abrupt halt last Saturday night with a powerful 3-1 victory.

Pace and height were the deciding factors in a free-flowing match, as Miron Bleiberg's boys took control of the second half to take the three points.

Taringa came out with great purpose in a torrid but goalless first half, dominating field position and creating more scoring opportunities than the home side.

The visitors were unlucky not to take a 1-0 lead ten minutes into the match when John Ogden's strike off a free kick, alluded North Star's keeper Jason Parkes, only to hit the crossbar.

North Star coach Miron Blieberg's half time talk sparked his side into immediate action, when only a minute after the break striker Mark Battistin headed home from a long Michael Mulvey cross.

Taringa fought back midway through the second half when replacement striker Danny Stowers slammed the ball into the net after keeper Jason Parkes failed to secure a cross. However this was the only joy for the visitors, who seemed to lose heart and give the game away - Brenley Jefferd being the exception to the rule.

North Star began to wreak havoc in the midfield and took the lead in the 80th minute after Mike Brockwell sent a long throw into the box for Battistin, who headed on for replacement Frazer Cuba to tap in.

Replacement striker Damien Rosenthal made some incisive runs for the home side. In the 84th minute Rosenthal beat the defence with sheer pace and crossed for Danny Lobwein to seal the 3-1 victory.

Taringa coach Juan Cutillas expressed disappointment with his side's performance, maintaining that North Star made full use of their obvious height advantage.

"The boys didn't live up to expectations," Cutillas said.

"But North Star are a very good team that can score goals at anytime. They will be very hard to catch."

North Star's Miron Bleiberg was pleased with his team's second half performance.

"There was not much difference in these two teams," Bleiberg said.

"But they had a big weakness and we capitalised on this." \*

# Eric Evans Snr. passes on

There was a tinge of sadness mixed with the celebrations last weekend when Coalstars soccer club held their "Back to Coalstars" 30th anniversary at Eric Evans Reserve, Bundamba.

The man after whom the club's ground is named, Eric Evans senior, died following a long battle with cancer, just three days before the festivities to honour the club he gave so much for were due to begin.

Mr Evans was Coalstars' club secretary for more than 20 years, taking over soon after the club was formed in 1964 following the merger of Blackstone and Bundamba.

"He was a great worker for the club. What a pity he couldn't be here for the celebrations," said life member Mick Kassambos.

Club president David O'Leary reiterated Mr Kassambos's sentiments maintaining Mr Evans had put his heart and soul into Coalstars.

"When the celebrations were planned, Eric was really foremost in our minds as being one of the guests of honour for the weekend," Mr O'Leary said.

"He was tied up with the club for such a long time and did a vast amount of work for us."

Mr Evans' funeral was held at St Paul's Anglican Church, Ipswich, last Friday, providing a sad lead in for the club's biggest weekend.

On Friday evening Coalstars held a ceremonial switch-on of their new \$50,000 floodlights.

As part of the program, two old boys games were staged, featuring past Coalstars' greats such as Kevin Caldwell, Ian Johnston, and Bruce Penman.

More than 250 people attended the club's



reunion dinner under a huge marquee at Eric Evans Reserve on Saturday night.

Overall the celebrations were very successful, with good crowd attendances across the weekend.

There was further disappointment Sunday however, when the first side was beaten by Brisbane Lions 1-0 at the Reserve.

In a scrappy affair, Lions took the three points courtesy of a Warren Allen penalty in the first half.

Coalstars' coach Wayne Warren was not happy with his side's first half performance.

"Lions had by far the better of the first half, and we were fortunate to go into the break only one goal down," Warren said.

"We played much better in the second half, but the game was not a great spectacle... it was more like an old style pinball machine.

"A lot of possession was given up by both teams."

Lions' coach Billy Williamson believed it was a hard match and was happy to move into outright fourth on the ladder following the win.

"This was a good result for us," Williamson said.

"There's not too many teams that come away from Coalstars with three points." \*

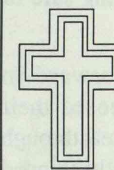
A leading top grade coach brought up the subject of inadequate fencing around fields and the lack of "ball boys" provided by clubs. The experienced coach made some worthwhile remarks, arguing that teams who were in front in the latter stages of a match could stoop to time wasting methods by kicking balls out and delaying the game while balls were retrieved. He also said there must be plenty of kids who would enjoy being ball boys, and who would enjoy the thrill of taking the field with their heroes. He said that in a nutshell, the real loser was soccer as a game. Queensland Soccer Federation regulations stipulate that clubs provide

adequate fencing around fields as well as a sufficient number of "ball boys". In the end it is up to the clubs to do what is right. But just remember, people notice these things!

Eighteen year old Young Soccerroo Craig Moore made his first team debut with Rangers in the Scottish Premier Division earlier this month. The youngster was selected courtesy of injuries to key players, but took on the challenge as his side played out a tedious draw with Dundee United at Tannadice. Rangers' had further worries when international goalkeeper Andy Goram had to leave the field in the 67th minute with a leg injury.

Home grown Soccerroo Steve Corica has been tipped to become Australia's first \$1,000,000 transfer overseas. The Innisfail product is looking at several obviously wealthy clubs in France and Germany, and as such may also be unavailable for Queensland in the up and coming State of Origin series against traditional rivals NSW.

# Ridge roll depleted Rovers

In a huge upset, Acacia Ridge thrashed a depleted Rochedale Rovers outfit 5-1, at Proud Field on Saturday night.

Richardson scored two of his side's goals, and was heavily involved in all of Ridge's raids on goal.

Ridge took the lead after only three minutes courtesy of Jason Eacott, following good work from Brett Hamlett on the left.

Good lead-up work again on the left saw Ridge go further ahead in the 22nd minute.

Paul Davidson floated a ball over to Richardson, who rifled his shot past Rochedale and State keeper Graham Ross.

Ridge could have sewn up the game before half time if not for some great work shown by Ross, who twice denied Richardson in the space of a minute.

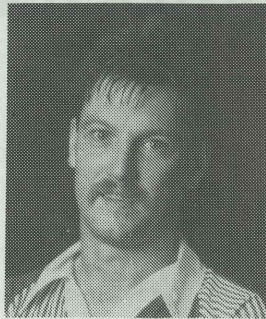
Rochedale came out attacking in the second half knowing they had to score the next goal to have any hope.

They did so in the 49th minute through Lee Pashley, after tall striker Craig Walsh had flicked on a long throw.

Just when it seemed Rochedale were coming back into the game, Ridge scored twice in the space of ten minutes, making sure of their first win of the season.

With Rochedale pushing forward in numbers, Michael Butchard exposed their defence in the 55th minute with a great through ball to Adrian Thompson, who neatly chipped Ross from the edge of the box.

Only three minutes later a near post ball

from Thompson was deflected into the net by Rochedale defender Paddy Dillon.

Appropriately Richardson scored Ridge's fifth goal with eleven minutes to go. His beautiful first time shot left Ross with no chance after more good work on the left by Hamlett.

Richardson was happy with his team's dominance of the game.

"It was a good win, but it's only three points."

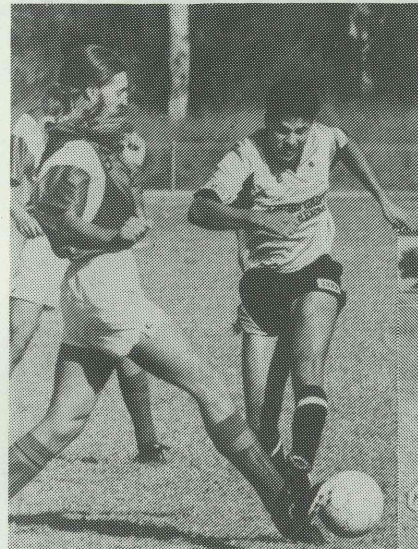
In a disappointing Rochedale performance, midfielder John Stewart stood out with a polished display in the midfield.

He had no excuses to offer after the drubbing that the Rovers had received.

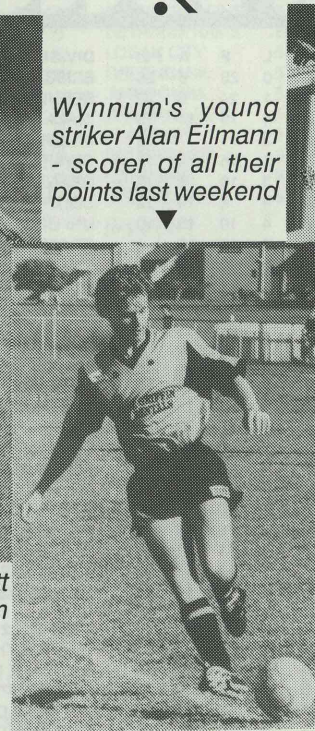
"They were very competitive, and wanted it more than we did," Stewart said.

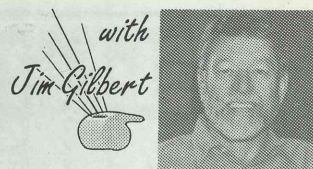

# Easy road for Socceroos

The decision to allow Oceania, Australia's football confederation, direct entry into future World Cups has left Australian soccer officials and players alike with a sense of recognition and satisfaction.

No longer will our National players have to travel to all the corners of the Earth to qualify for the world's largest sporting spectacular.

The decision also means we may see local talent such as Sean Cranney, Clint Bolton, and Brad Ditton representing Australia at the next World Cup.

At a meeting of FIFA Confederation Presidents held in Zurich recently, the unanimous decision was announced by FIFA President Dr Joao Havelange as a result of an increase in the number of countries participating in World Cups, from the current 24 to 32.

Chairman of the Australian Soccer

Federation John Constantine said he believed the decision was primarily due to Australia's outstanding achievements at all levels of football.

"FIFA could no longer ignore the strength of football in Australia," Constantine said.

"The world has obviously taken notice of the Socceroos' performances against Canada and Argentina.

"It now means that we can plan our World Cup campaigns well in advance without having to wait for FIFA to decide what to do with us.

"This is something we have fought hard for, and to get a result is just fantastic."

The World Cup will now see eight groups of four teams playing off, with the top two from each group qualifying for the final 16.

The time frame of the tournament will not change.

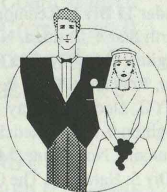
