Tigers reassess commitment

Eastern Suburbs' rough patch in the XXXX League could be nearing its end according to coach Calvin Daunt.

The Tigers have struggled in the first nine matches of the season, scoring only eight goals, while conceding a massive 27.

This poor showing has left Easts with only one win and two draws, placing them in second last position on the ladder on only five points.

Rocklea is the only team behind Daunt's side on the table, and with just one point to their name, look certain for relegation at the end of the season.

With Acacia Ridge (10 points), Willowburn (12 points), and Wynnum (13 points) all finding some recent form by upsetting a few of the League heavyweights, Easts are in the relegation hot seat.

However Calvin Daunt was not to concerned about the prospect of relegation at this stage.

"There's still 13 games to go, and if the players show the same sense of pride and commitment they showed at the weekend, then I think we will be fine," Daunt said.

Daunt was speaking about his side's Queensland Cup performances against

"The players took it upon themselves to have a sorting out session last Tuesday night, deciding that they needed to give more of themselves on the field," Daunt said.

"And they went out and did a lot of good things on the weekend, which was pleasing to see.

"Now we have to continue with the same attitude every weekend and take every game week by week.

"It's no good us starting to worry about other teams. The minute we start doing this, we'll become our own worst enemies.

Concentration the key

"We have to just concentrate on our own players and our own game Everything else will then fall into place."

Daunt said his younger players also felt it was time for them to stand up and be counted.

You can take the young thing only so far, but they too are beginning to realise their responsibilities on the field.

When asked if he would take to the field again, Daunt replied, "It's always a possibility."

Daunt stressed that Easts had been XXXX League regulars and club tradition and pride in past achievements would ensure they would come out of their current rut.

"Easts have been around for a long time," Daunt said.

"When a player puts on an Easts' shirt he must take pride in what he's wearing.

"This is what pulls all good clubs out of these situations."

If North Queensland defeats Far North Queensland the former will be the eighth quarter finalist, but if they lose, North Brisbane will sneak in.


North Queensland had a 2-1 victory against last year's XXXX League champions Rochedale Rovers, while Mackay's wins against Rocklea and Rockhampton have virtually assured them of a quarter finals spot.

Rockhampton too looked promising after their 5-1 thrashing of Rocklea and a 2-2 draw with Lions, but failed to qualify for the final eight when they went down 2-1 to Mackay.

Wanted - Striker for Rivers

A 2-0 defeat of Pine Rivers on Monday completed a successful Queensland Cup weekend for Acacia Ridge.

Coming back from a successful trip to Caloundra, Ridge's ability to capitalise on their chances told the story of the match.

The lack of a quality striker proved costly for Rivers, who dominated for most of the game, only to be let down in front of goal.

Rivers' coach Dave Scriggins lamented his side's missed chances.

"It's the same old story. We need a class striker," Scriggins said.

We will hopefully sign someone this week, but we can't expect one player to do everything."

Four minutes into the game Pine Rivers' midfielder Damien Waugh hit the post, following a good exchange with Stephen Starr.

Dene Almond should have given Rivers the lead in the 11th minute after he broke away, but his shot went wide of the post with only Ridge goalkeeper Adam Lebihan to beat.

Lebihan, in for regular keeper Andrew Hobbs, showed his worth 15 minutes later when he parried away a Waugh effort from the edge of the box.

Against the run of play Ridge went ahead from their first real chance, when a long throw eluded the Rivers defence, eventually falling from Damien Bitzious, who made no mistake from six yards.

Norm Bell could have increased Ridge's lead twice within the next ten minutes, but both his headers from Martin Kirsopp corners went wide.

Two minutes before half time selfish play cost Rivers an equaliser, with Starr shooting

over the bar instead of laying the ball to an unmarked John Cartwright.

Five scoring opportunities went begging for Rivers in the first eight minutes of the second half.

The best of those chances fell for evergreen Frank Pimblett in the 52nd minute, whose shot from point blank range was denied by an outstanding save from Lebihan.

Ridge again scored from their first attack of the half four minutes later, when Peter Underhill's punch from a Martin Kirsopp corner fell for Martin Rudge, who buried his volley in the back of the net.

Rivers' frustration continued when a shot from substitute Adam Kinsela hit the post in the 61st minute, with Lebihan well beaten.

Rivers lack of penetration in front of goal seemed to rub off on Ridge in the next twenty minutes, with Rudge and Jason Eacott missing great chances to enhance the scoreline.

Two chances for Starr in the last five minutes summed up a disappointing day for Rivers.

Following a good run in the 87th minute, he blasted his shot from the edge of the box way over the bar.

One minute from time another fine save from Lebihan in a one-on-one situation thwarted Starr's effort for a consolation goal.

Acacia Ridge coach Davey Richardson was satisfied with the win.

"The game's about putting the ball in the net, and we did that," Richardson said.

He also conceded Lebihan was now putting Hobbs under pressure.

"He's got the jersey now, put it that way." *


