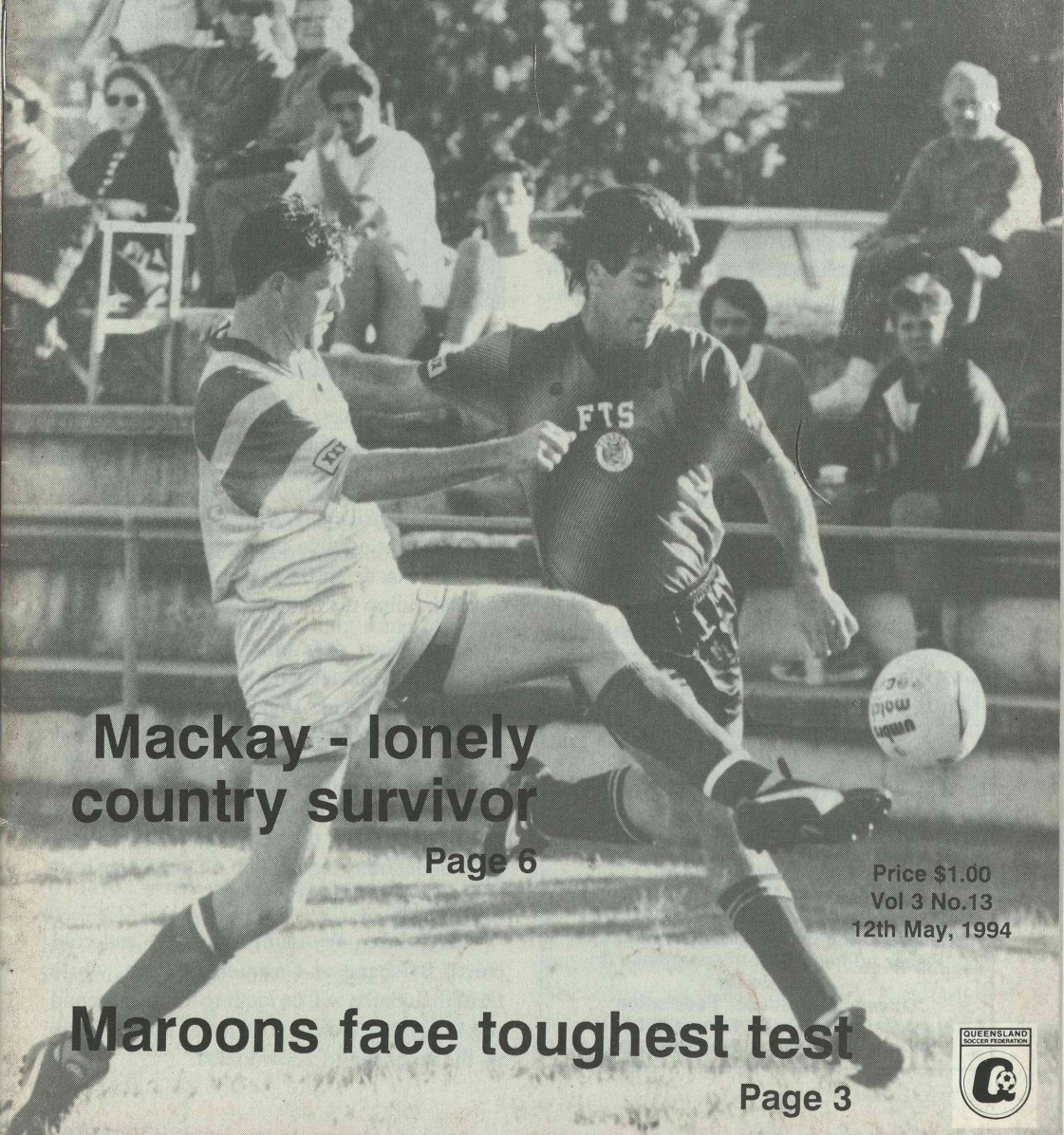

Catch-up match leaves President's Cup in limbo

North Star's quest to snare all the silverware for the 1994 season could go on the line this Saturday night when the league leaders host Brisbane Lions at Perry Park.

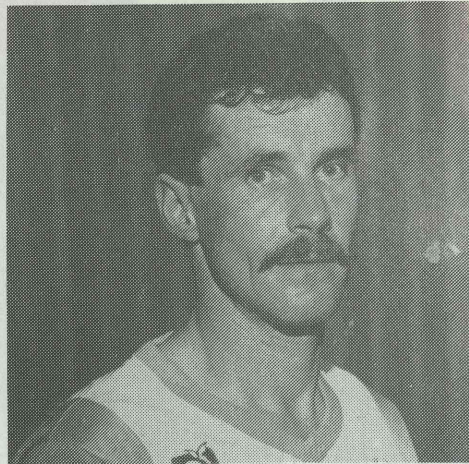
According to QSF rules, the President's Cup is awarded to the winner of the second round clash between the teams sitting first and second on the XXXX League table at the end of the first round.

With North Star clearly first, their opponents will be either Pine Rivers (23 points from 11 matches) or Lions (21 from 10) with Lions still to play their match against Acacia Ridge which was washed out on March 6.

Unfortunately, that postponed match will not be played until next month, leaving this weeks clash between Lions and North Star as a possible President's Cup decider.

Meanwhile, the match between two of the league's heavyweights will be one that local soccer fans have been looking forward to for a long time.

North Star won the first encounter 1-0 at Lions Stadium and have only lost one match



since that time, a 3-2 Queensland Cup defeat at the hands of Rochedale Rovers.

Lions however, started slowly but have rallied in recent weeks winning their last four matches as well as qualifying for the Qld Cup.

In-form strikers Warren Allen and David Munn should provide plenty of headaches for the North Star defence while Frank Mengotti will be a handful in the middle.

North Star defender Paul Worroll and midfielder Michael Brockwell will again be called on to provide some spark with Michael Mulvey, Shane Haddow, Mark Battistin and Jim McDonagh (pictured), expected to do the rest.

In other matches, Coalstars and Rocklea United will fight it out in the early one at Perry Park on Saturday night while Acacia Ridge host Pine Rivers at Proud Oval.

On Sunday, Wynnum host a hot and cold North Brisbane at Carmichael Park, while Eastern Suburbs will be looking for their second win in as many matches when they make the trip up the mountain to Toowoomba. *

Maroons face toughest test

The Queensland State of Origin team will face one of their toughest tests since the inception of the State of Origin Series when they play the New South Wales Soccerblues at Perry Park on June 11.

The Maroons face the daunting task of playing against a NSW squad that has been assembled for two months and one that is full of Young Soccerroos, Olyroos and former Soccerroos.

Queensland, on the other hand, is yet to announce its squad, and is likely to be without any of the players who are contracted with CCSL side, the Brisbane Strikers.

Eye on Soccer caught up with coach Juan Cutillas (pictured), during the week and confronted him with the daunting task ahead of him.

Cutillas said he was considering using some of the Strikers' players but realised that most of them had been in recess since their March 27 encounter with Newcastle at Perry Park.

"Unfortunately the National League players have not been playing and this is the first time Queensland has been in this position," Cutillas said.

"We are looking at training some of them three nights a week for the next month but it all depends on their availability."

Interstate players have also been contacted regarding their availability with Nick Meredith (Marconi), Ibro Cahut (Brunswick Pumas) and Brian McNicol (Heidelberg) all confirming their availability to play.

Jason Polak (South Melbourne), Steven Corica (Marconi) and John Koch (Parramatta Eagles) have also been approached but the QSF is currently waiting on their reply.

It understood Polak and Corica will be doubtful with Corica expected to head overseas



and Polak booked to play for his club South Melbourne on the same weekend as the Origin clash.

The Soccerblues, on the other hand, will have an immaculate preparation with a tour of China and matches against Tasmania and South Australia lined up before the Origin clash.

"They will be super-tough," Cutillas said.

"It's just a pity that we cannot put the best team, fully prepared, on the paddock for Queensland."

The Queensland squad is expected to be announced next week and will play against the Blues at Perry Park on June 11 and at Dubbo on June 18. They will also clash with New Zealand heavyweights Auckland at Perry Park on July 8.

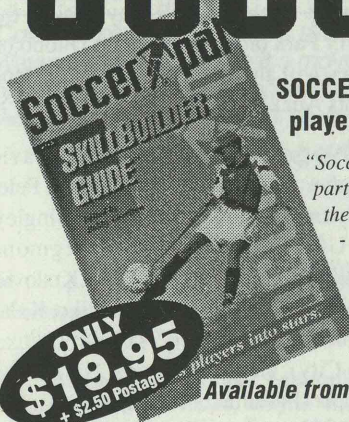

MACKAY - lonely country survivor

Mackay is the only country team to qualify for the 1994 Queensland Cup Quarter-Finals after North Queensland were held to a 2-2 draw by Far North Queensland last weekend.

Needing a three goal winning margin to qualify, North Qld seemed on track leading 2-0 at half-time in Mareeba, but the locals stormed back in the second half to draw the match 2-2.

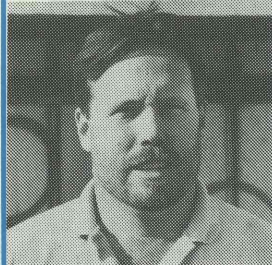
With five groups containing four teams, Queensland Cup rules state that the five group winners plus the next best three runners-up make up the Quarter Finalists.

Group winners Brisbane Lions, Coalstars, Taringa Rovers, North Star and Wynnum make up five of the spots with Mackay, Rochedale Rovers and Acacia Ridge filling another two.

Mackay (+1 goal difference) were the last placed qualifier, finishing one goal ahead of North Brisbane who one the Cup for the first time last season.

Rochedale Rovers (+2) and Acacia Ridge (+3) were the other two best runners-up.

Mackay defeated neighbours Rockhampton 2-1 in a tough encounter and then edged out Rocklea United by the same

margin to seal their berth.

Their only loss was against Lions who dominated a rain-sodden match to win 2-1.

Former Taringa Rovers midfielder Colin Meitzel, who returned to the sugar city at the start of the season, proved to be the difference with a dominating man of the match performance against Rocklea United and solid hit outs against Lions and Rockhampton.

The talented 20 year old said he was delighted to help his side to their first appearance in the Cup Quarter-Finals.

"We knew if we could beat Rockhampton we would be a show for a berth," Meitzel said.

"Rocklea were tough but that was the game that got us to the quarters."

Alleged "hacking" basis of clubs complaint

North Star will lodge an official complaint to the QSF after their torrid encounter with North Queensland in Townsville two weeks ago.

The Zillmere-based club won the match 2-1 but lost exciting young midfielder Damien Rosenthal (pictured) with a broken leg and several other players due to injury.

Club Vice-President Neil Kirk confirmed that a complaint was being made to the QSF and blamed the North Queensland side for Rosenthal's loss.

"Damien got hacked. They treated us very badly and we ended up having to fly another player up to cover our injury losses," Kirk stated.

The break means Rosenthal will miss the remainder of the season and leaves North Star without one of its most potentially dangerous players.

"Damien's absence will be a huge blow. We used him as a super sub to shock teams but now our shock treatment is gone," Kirk said.

North Star have lost two of their most promising players in Rosenthal and Ian Hutchison who was sold

to Pine Rivers last week for \$2000.

Despite this they are still eight points clear at the top of the XXXX League table after going undefeated for the whole first round.

Their big test will come this Saturday night when they host an in-form Brisbane Lions outfit who have won their last four league matches. *

Hutchison starts with a bang

An early goal from new signing Ian Hutchison paved the way for Pine Rivers' 3-0 defeat of Wynnum at Carmichael Park on Sunday.

Hutchison, in his first game since his controversial departure from North Star, scored with virtually his first touch in the 7th minute.

Damien Waugh's corner was punched away by Wynnum goalkeeper Kevin Tatton, only to fall at the feet of Frank Pimblett, whose shot was intercepted by Hutchison to slot the ball home.

Rivers dominated in the first half, especially through the midfield where Waugh and Pimblett reigned supreme.

Stephen Starr almost gave Rivers a two goal advantage in the 27th minute, when his long run on the right ended with his shot being tipped over the bar by Tatton.

A disappointing Wynnum side had few first half chances, with their best being in the 43rd minute from Danny Valle's header off a Tony McKinless free kick, which just floated over the bar.

The home side came out in a more determined mood in the second half, and could have equalised in the 47th minute through Billy McDermott, who put his shot wide with only Rivers' goalkeeper Peter Underhill to beat.

Only eight minutes later Wynnum blew another golden opportunity, when Duncan Andrews received a through ball from Tony McKinless, only to see his attempted chip over Underhill end up way over the bar.

Underhill came to the fore in the 64th minute in a one-on-one situation with McDermott, who looked certain to level the scores.

The Wolves lack of finishing proved to be costly, as Rivers wrapped up the game in the 75th



minute when Tatton misjudged a cross from substitute Adam Kinsella.

The Wynnum custodian let the ball hit the post, with the rebound falling for Dene Almond who made no mistake from 10 yards.

Tatton's horror day continued in the 83rd minute when he spilt a seemingly comfortable floated ball, which was cleaned up by Kinsella to make it 3-0.

While happy with the win, Rivers coach Dave Scriggins was upset his side relaxed early in the second half.

"We started off pretty well, but then we let them back into it," Scriggins said.

"But at least we are back scoring goals."

He was also happy with the performance of new boy Hutchison.

"It was a great start for him. His first touch brought us a goal."

Wynnum coach Wayne Gracey (pictured) was disappointed with the Wolves' performance, conceding the pressure was on.

"We played poorly in the first half, and we didn't finish in the second. We had four one-on-one's that weren't taken," Gracey said. *

Samford defeats Clairvaux

It was the intention of Eye on Soccer to do a wrap-up of matches at the top of Division 4 last weekend, with first playing third and second playing fourth, however the washout at Cleveland Showgrounds placed all the emphasis on the one v three clash at Samford.

There was a very tight top three prior to last weekend, and Clairvaux, in pole position, completely shattered their image of unflappability, when only eight minutes into the game a combination of miss-hits by the Clairvaux defence enabled the first (and only) goal to be scored by. One missed header by a central defender fell to the keeper who also miss-kicked, this fell into the path of number 11 Michael Franks who promptly side-footed home to open the scoring.

As it turned out, this was one of very few mistakes made by the Clairvaux defence, in particular Keeper Nathan Taylor, who had a quite superb game throughout. For the majority of the first half Clairvaux's defence was drastically over-worked, as a good understanding by Daniel

Norlander and Michael Franks for Samford up front gave them curry, to the extent that it could easily have been 3-0 not 1-0 at half-time.

Most of Clairvaux's attack was going through veteran mid-fielder David Heley, who fed some good passes through to Malcolm Stanley up-front, but to no avail, their shooting was either astray, or mopped up by a fairly tight back - four.

But for the wayward shooting of both sets of forwards, and in particular Michael Franks for Samford, it could have been almost any score-line, having said that Samford were mainly on top throughout the match and Norlander's understanding and feeding of ball to speedster Franks created havoc in the Clairvaux defense.

Keeper Nathan Taylor had a quite superb second half, and pulled off some brilliant saves and tips over the cross-bar, but for him, it could have been a very lop-sided score-line.

At the final whistle it was 1-0 to the home side, to put them back on top of the table for yet another week. *

East's scampering away from relegation

Eastern Suburbs kept alive their hopes of XXXX League survival with a gutsy 2-1 win over Coalstars at Heath Park last Sunday afternoon.

In a game full of action the Tigers came up trumps, maintaining their reputation as a bogey side for the Ipswich-based club.

Coach Calvin Daunt was jubilant after the win and said his players had thoroughly deserved the three points.

The Tigers' win was only their second in the League this season and leaves them just two points behind an inconsistent Acacia Ridge, who were thumped 6-0 at home by fourth placed Taringa Rovers.

"The win was excellent," Daunt said.

"The boys showed plenty of courage and lots of heart."

He paid tribute to youngster Denny Whitfield who had an outstanding match but was quick to mention the performances of the rest of his winning side.

"We had our bad moments but we lived up when we needed to," Daunt said.

The four goal haul was that much more impressive when you take into consideration that two weeks ago Cooper was on the operating table receiving treatment for a depressed fracture of the cheekbone.

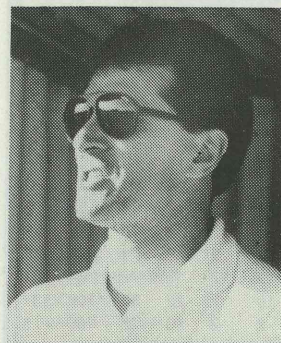
The agile 31 year old defied doctors orders to rest for six weeks and has scored 9 goals in his last three outings, including five in his side's two Queensland Cup matches up north.

"We're a good team out of form," Cooper said.

"But we've qualified for the Qld Cup and are now back in the top five so things are looking good."

The news of North Qld's 2-2 draw with Far North Qld last Saturday night was music to the ears of the playing and coaching staff at Underwood Park and justified their commitment

"We played in front of 1000 people in Mareeba and the response we had from the promotional work was excellent," Cooper said.

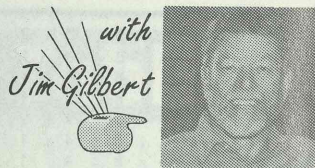
"Apparently no other clubs have done that sort of thing before so hopefully we may have started something new."

If you were watching the game, you could have been forgiven for thinking Whitfield was a kicking bag.

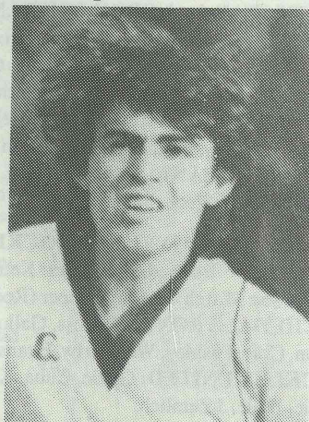

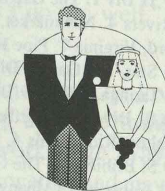
