## Cranney paves the way for Olyroos draw

A dominating second half performance from Brisbane Strikers midfielder Sean Cranney was enough to help steer the Olyroos to a respectable 1-1 draw with touring English Premier Division side Sheffield United.

The explosive 20-year-old dominated the rugged stanza with several surging runs down the right flank and can count himself unlucky not to have earned a penalty late in the game.

Australia started the match slowly with Sheffield pouring on the pressure early.

Striker Nathan Blake, who was purchased from Cardiff City for \$600,000 in February, caused plenty of headaches for the Australian defence in the first half.

The robust playmaker almost gave Sheffield the lead in the 3rd minute after latching onto a cross from Glyn Hodge.

With goalkeeper Ante Juric stranded he forced his header wide.

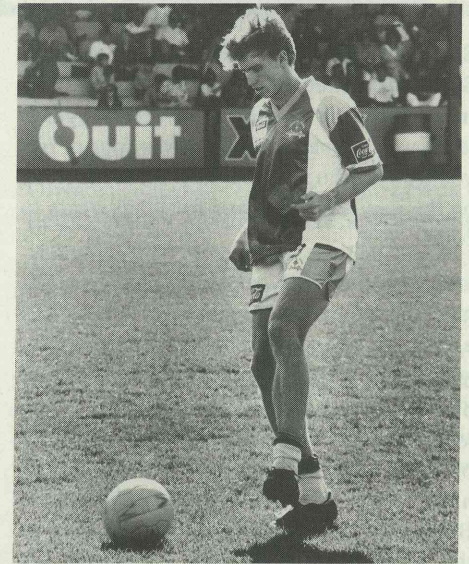
Controversy struck minutes later when the Olyroos were awarded a penalty after striker Paul Agostino was brought down inside the area by Sheffield keeper Billy Mercer.

Referee Rob Davies was swamped by Sheffield players arguing against the decision and later overturned the decision after consulting with his linesman who had earlier flagged for offside.

Blake finally gave the English side the lead in the 25th minute, heading into an empty net after outjumping Juric to a Mitch Ward cross.

Australia stepped up a gear after the break with moves by coach Raul Blanco reaping dividends.

The astute South American replaced

Dimovski and Buljbasic with Tsekenis and Mendez and moved Cranney from the centre of the midfield to wide on the right.

With minutes remaining Agostino found the net, hammering home from the edge of the six yard box after Tsekenis headed down a cross from Adelaide City's Goran Lozanovski.

Blanco praised his players for their second half effort after the match.

"The boys came back well and I thought we dominated in the second half," Blanco said.

"They are a very good side and were obviously not here for a holiday.

"The game was a good guide for us as we had some new boys in the squad and it is good they came up against such an aggressive side," he said.

Queensland's other Olyroo, Clint Bolton, took no part in the match due to a shoulder injury aggravated during training.

I ventured down the Gold Coast last Saturday night to watch the Olyroos and Sheffield United do battle, and came away impressed with what I saw. While the game itself was no master piece it was four of our youngsters who showed they will be a force on the international scene for many years to come.

Without sounding too one-eyed, I thought Sean Cranney was by far the pick of the Australian players. His pace on and off the ball proved to be a real handful for the Blades' players and he can count himself unlucky not to have been awarded a penalty after he was brought down in the box late in the second half. It was surprising to see coach Raul Blanco play the 20 year old in the centre of the midfield in the opening 45 minutes and moving him back into his usual role was the best decision he made all night.

Another to impress was Parramatta's Chi Chi Mendez. The livewire midfielder came on

after the break and certainly made his presence felt. He and team mate LukeCasserley, who also came off the bench, looked all class and sparked up the somewhat uninspiring match.

The last player to catch my eye was Paul Agostino. Agostino is a true finisher who always seems to bob up with a goal just when his country needs it. Last year he restored the scoreline for the Young Socceroos against Uruguay in front of 18,000 screaming fans at Lang Park. With he and Mark Viduka coming up through the ranks, it certainly looks like Australia will have plenty of firepower over the next decade.

Finally, it will be good for all the XXXX League teams to get back on the playing field this weekend. The table is certainly starting to sort itself out. Rochedale, with Keiran Cooper leading the way, are back into finals contention and looking good with Pine Rivers and Brisbane Lions hot on the heels of North Star.

The save seemed to inspire Roche's younger brother Anthony who began to get more involved in the action, heading wide of the post only minutes later.

Roche had another opportunity immediately afterwards, when Wayne Corbett put him through, however excitement got the better of the young man, who blasted his shot over the top of the crossbar.

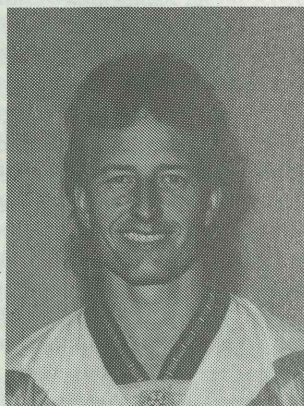
East's finally broke the deadlock in the 35th minute courtesy of a gutsy Denny Whitfield effort.

Whitfield took control of the ball just inside the penalty area and overcame two challenges before smashing a low shot past Wynnum keeper Kevin Tatton.

East's sweeper Chris Fegan had two shots at Tatton, with his first going over the bar but his second having no problems finding the net.

## Nations gearing up for Cup

The XV FIFA Soccer World Cup commences next month in the United States of America.

The host nation, along with reigning World Cup champions Germany, will do battle with 22 other nations which have all entered the tournament from a record 141 entrants contesting 497 qualifying matches.

Held every four years, the World Cup is the largest single sporting spectacle in the world, with an estimated 1.3 billion people watching Germany defeat Argentina in the last final in Italy in 1990.

It was estimated the last tournament had a cumulative world-wide television audience of over 26 billion.

Viewing figures for USA 94 are expected to go even higher.

Matches will be played at nine huge venues across the country, including the Rose Bowl in Los Angeles, which will host the final on July 17, and Giants Stadium in New York.

Sentimental favourites Brazil, Cup holders West Germany and their old rivals Holland have been installed as favourites for the tournament.

Columbia, who beat Argentina 5-0 to qualify for USA '94, Italy and Spain are three other teams expected to do well.

Italy's Roberto Baggio, Holland's Dennis Bergkamp, Brazil's Romario and Columbia's Carlos Valderama have been touted as the potential stars of the tournament.

SBS will televise all the action with guest commentators bringing you up to date with all the events taking place in America.

The first matches will be played on June 17 and come from Group C as Germany clash with Bolivia and Spain go up against South Korea.

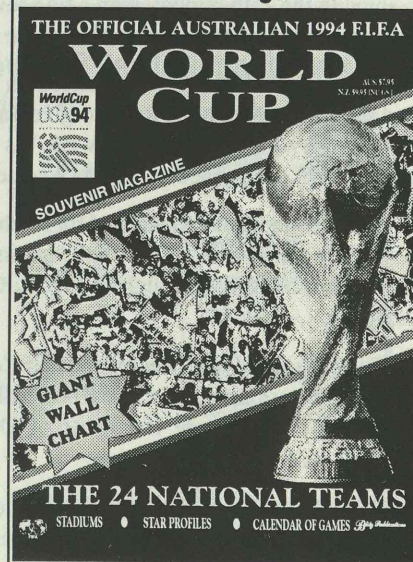

# Cooper magic inspires win

In a replay of last year's grand final, Rochedale came from behind to defeat Taringa 2-1 at Underwood Park last Saturday night.

Two early second half goals from Kieran Cooper enabled Rochedale to overturn a 1-0 half time deficit.

Cooper has now scored 10 goals in his last three games since coming back from having a fractured cheekbone.

Fellow team-mate Frank Cole nearly gave Rochedale the lead after only five minutes, with a fierce 20 yard shot bringing out the best in Taringa custodian Jason Lucas.

Lucas again denied the home side in the 13th minute, saving brilliantly from Demetri Theochari, who looked certain to give Rochedale the lead.

It was Rochedale's keeper Graham Ross' turn to shine in the 25th minute, with a fine save off an Andy Lees volley from the edge of the box.

Younger brother Eddie capitalised on good lead up work from Brent Read to give Taringa the lead five minutes later, with his shot deflecting in off Rochedale's John Weatherby.

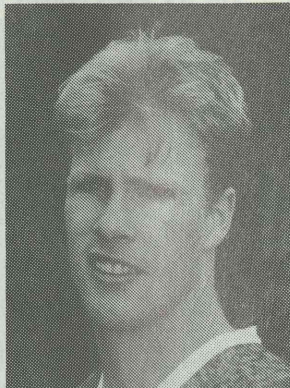
Cooper should have equalised for Rochedale in the last minute of the first half, putting his shot wide after a fine through ball from Kieran Galloway.

Twenty seconds into the second half Cooper made amends, slotting home a near post ball from Theochari, who made the most of Danny Stower's loss of possession.

Eddie Lees nearly restored Taringa's lead in the 51st minute with his chip being wonderfully saved from a fully stretched Ross.

Rochedale took the lead in the 59th minute after a Cole shot was tipped onto the bar by

Andy Lees missed a golden opportunity to equalise for Taringa three minutes later, putting his shot wide with only Ross to beat, after beating the Rochedale offside trap.

In injury time Cooper almost had his hat-trick after rounding Lucas, only to see his shot cleared off the line.

Rochedale coach Frank Liddell was satisfied with his team's performance.

"We had the best of the first half. Their keeper made three saves that kept them in the game," Liddell said.

"I told them at half time just to keep on playing the way they had been."

Taringa coach Juan Cutillas was disappointed his side failed to take their chances.

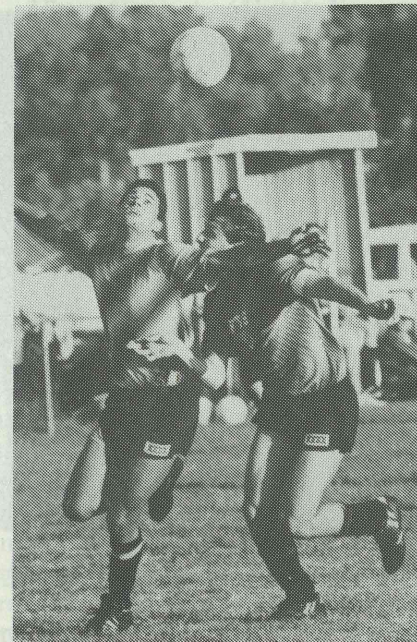
"They scored the goals and we didn't," Cutillas said.

"Rochedale were very dangerous on the counter attack, exposing us at the back."

He was very impressed with the home side's display.

"I haven't seen Rochedale play that well for a long time," Cutillas said.

# Socceroos to play Proteas

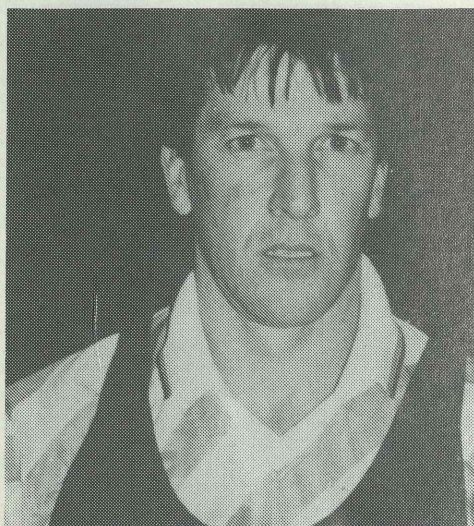
Australia's Coca-Cola Socceroos will contest a two-match series against a touring South African side next month, in what will be the first time the teams have met since 1955.

The tour is set to re-establish soccer ties between the two countries.

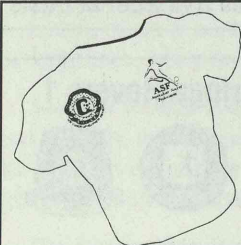
It is also the first time a fully integrated South African sporting team has toured Australia since the breakdown of Apartheid and the subsequent multiracial elections which swept Nelson Mandela to power.

Former Socceroo Captain and SBS presenter Johnny Warren said, "Soccer is the number one sport in South Africa and the only truly representative sport of the people."

"There has always been a perception that cricket and rugby union were South Africa's top sports, but soccer, which never received funding or promotion under the old regime, is the true sport of the vast majority of the people." \*

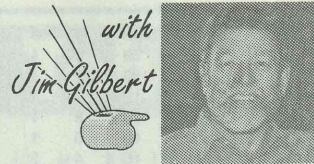

# FIFA ratifies Aussie deal

The qualification path for the 1996 Australian Olympic soccer team was ratified at a meeting of the FIFA Executive last Friday in Zurich.

Chairman of the Australian Soccer Federation, John Constantine, confirmed that the Oceania winner would play the third placed Asian team on a home and away basis.

"Ideally we would have liked automatic qualification for the Oceania winner, however we are more than happy with this result," Mr Constantine said.

"Playing the third Asian country was our next best scenario.

"FIFA were impressed with our submission and full credit must go to Charlie Dempsey, President of Oceania and Josephine King, Secretary of Oceania."

The decision on the Olympic team follows the decisions made on the qualifying paths for

both the under 17 and under 20 teams.

Both World Championships for these age groups would be held next year, with the Oceania entry having gained direct entry to both competitions.


FIFA also confirmed that the Confederation which hosts an Olympic Games would not lose an allotted qualifying position. As a result, the 2000 Olympics in Sydney could well have two Oceania teams, with Australia automatically qualifying as host and one other team given the chance to qualify.

The FIFA Executive at the same meeting also ratified that the 1998 World Cup to be held in France, would be increased to a 32 team competition.

The actual break up of the additional eight positions is yet to be finalised, however Oceania representatives remain confident one of the eight additional places would be allocated to the Oceania winner.

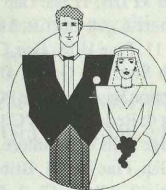
