Lions coach Billy Williamson may make changes to his side after a below par performance against Acacia Ridge at Proud Field last weekend.

Lions struggled up front throughout the match and will welcome back wide midfielder Warren Allen from State team duties.

League legend lifts Maroons

Two goals from Mark Battistin and an inspiring pre-match talk from Rugby League legend Bob Lindner were enough to steer Queensland to an emotional 2-1 win over the New South Wales Soccerblues in Dubbo last weekend.

Going into the game trailing 4-1, the Maroons were expected to struggle with nothing but pride to play for.

Queensland coach Juan Cutillas had boldly dropped NSL players Clint Bolton, Ibro Cahut and Nick Meredith for the clash, choosing to rely on Socceroo Jason Polak and an inexperienced midfield to steer the Maroons home.

The move seemed to have gone horribly wrong in the 23rd minute as Marshall Soper gave the home side the lead, rushing the ball over the line during a goalmouth scramble.

Five minutes later the never say die attitude of the Queensland side came to the fore when striker John Brown was brought down inside the box and denied what looked a certain penalty.

Queensland anger turned to joy in the 33rd minute after Polak and Brown combined to find Battistin, who controlled before calmly slipping the ball past keeper Mike Gibson.

North Star's Michael Brockwell again played strongly and was unlucky not to snatch the lead just before half time after a neat move with Battistin.

The lightning quick 23-year-old got in behind the NSW defence but was denied by a great save from Gibson, who somehow managed to parry the ball over the bar.

Queensland continued to dominate after the break but can thank keeper Graham Ross for keeping them in the match.

Ross pulled off three world class saves during the clash, narrowly missing the man of the match award.

Battistin scored his second in the 66th minute after a good lay-off from team mate Craig Collins.

The big striker again controlled inside the area before slamming the ball past a stranded John Gibson.

Coach Juan Cutillas leapt with joy after the final whistle and was happy with the form of his side.

"We played for pride today," Cutillas said.

"The young boys passed their test with flying colours.

"All the things we did clicked today and we shut up the critics for once and for all. I said last week that the 4-1 loss at Perry Park never reflected our play and I think we proved that," Cutillas said.

It was a pleasure to travel with the Queensland team to Dubbo last weekend and their performance was nothing short of amazing. To lose 4-1 at home and then bounce back to win 2-1 is fantastic, but to do it in Dubbo was even better. The Maroons were more controlled in their play and coach Juan Cutillas must take a lot of the credit. To drop three regular NSL players must have been a tough choice for Juan but the result showed he got it right on the day. Socceroo Jason Polak showed his class with an inspiring performance. Jason did not even know the names of his team mates until he hopped on the plane to Dubbo and that shows just what a player he is. What impressed me most was his ability to play the simple ball and take control of the midfield. Brenley Jefferd and Craig Collins played alongside him in the engine room and his confidence seemed to rub off. Mark Battistin also stood out and is one player who improves with every game. Battistin took the game by the scruff of the neck and scored two classy

goals. All in all, it was a total team effort and it's just a shame we played so poorly at home. Maybe next year we can win the NIB Origin Challenge but for now we must concentrate on beating Auckland at Perry Park on July 8.

A special thanks should also go to XXXX's Ray Phillips and Queensland Crusher's Bob Lindner. The pair were a delight to travel with and genuinely seemed to fire up the players. Unfortunately for NSW they were missing playmaker Gabriel Mendez and captain Tony Popovic but that doesn't detract from Queensland's win. They were simply awesome.

Finally, attention now turns back to the XXXX League with the top five battle hotting up. Any one of eight teams can still make the five with North Star, Lions and Rivers the only certainties, barring of course a complete reverse in form. The relegation battle is also intense with Easts and Acacia Ridge to clash this week. Willowburn and Wynnum are still not out of the woods, while Rocklea are doomed.

Magic Aces rock Rochedale

North Brisbane surged back into top five calculations with a gutsy 1-0 win over Rochedale Rovers at Underwood Park last Saturday night.

The win has moved them into equal fifth spot with Rochedale and Coalstars.

For the second time within a week Rochedale were unable to penetrate the North defence, who were well marshalled by player-coach Gary McDowall.

A through ball from McDowall almost led to Paul Hagenson giving the visitors the lead after only two minutes, with his chip over Rochedale keeper Mark Haynes going wide.

Rochedale could have gone ahead in the 8th minute through an unmarked Demetri Theochari, who put his shot past the post.

Five minutes later Haynes who brilliantly denied Shaun Sleep's volley following a Steve Peto corner.

The end-to-end action continued in the 17th minute when Keiran Cooper hit the bar from six yards, following good work from Theochari on the right.

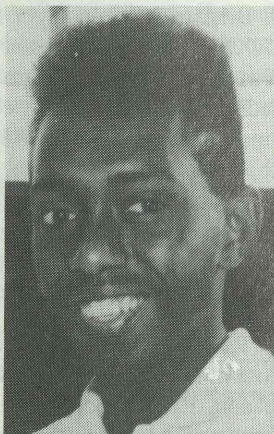
Cooper repaid Theochari in the 28th minute, with his work on the edge of the box leading up to the young midfielder's shot, which was well saved by North keeper Wayne Evans.

Rochedale continued to attack for the rest of the half, but for all their dominance the home team couldn't take advantage of opportunities created.

The second half opened in much the same vain as the first had closed, with Rochedale attacking strongly without any great reward.

Against the run of play North took a shock lead in the 68th minute through Sleep, whose fierce shot seemed to take a slight deflection

on its way to the back of the net.

North nearly increased their lead only two minutes later through veteran Gerry Lindsay, after earlier work between himself and substitute Gary Thompson.

The recent tension between the two clubs threatened to break out in the last 20 minutes, with heavy challenges coming in from both teams.

For the visitors, Willie Carter was full of running in his sole role up front, with Alun Evans shining in a disappointing Rochedale effort.

McDowall was an elated figure after the game.

"It was a great win, especially considering that we only had half a team on Wednesday and Thursday," McDowall said.

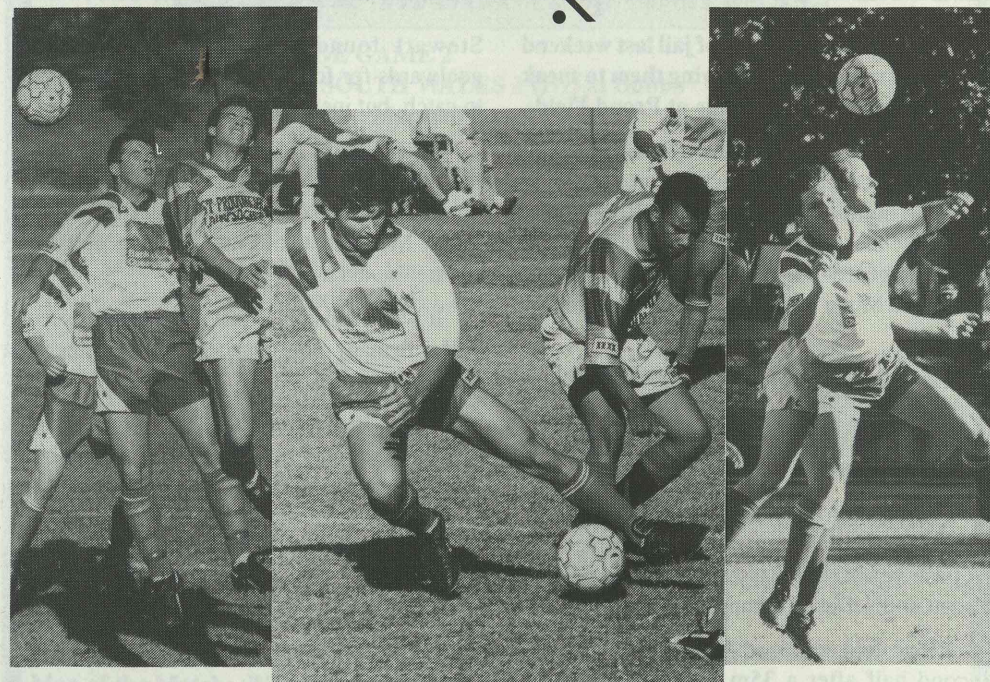
Rochedale coach Frank Liddell was full of praise of North Brisbane's effort.

Late goal spoils Ridge party

Brisbane Lions got out of jail last weekend with a last minute goal allowing them to sneak home 2-1 over Acacia Ridge at Proud Field.

Both sides spurned chances in the first half, with player-coach Dave Richardson and striker Adrian Thompson guilty for the Ridge, with Lions defender Jeff Lombardo heading wide with the whole goal at his mercy, and Frank Mengotti and David Munn both blasting over towards the end.

The safe hands of Andrew Hobbs kept Ridge in the match, with saves from Alan Hilton and two from Chase Bursnell leaving the score 0-0 at the break.

The addition of John Stewart in midfield for the Ridge paid dividends, as time and time again he gave penetrating passes to co-strikers Jason Eacott and Adrian Thompson.

It was a pulsating, fast and eventful second half with many more chances going begging from both sides.

Just as it appeared as if a draw would be the final score, Mengotti blasted a loose ball home from 30m to give Lions a 2-1 lead with a minute to play.

The Ridge could feel justly aggrieved for not retaining at least one point from this match, however luck favours the brave and Lions played the full ninety minutes and went home with three points in the bag. *

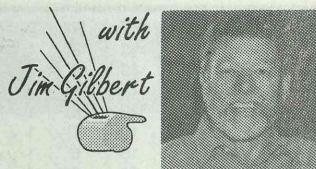
