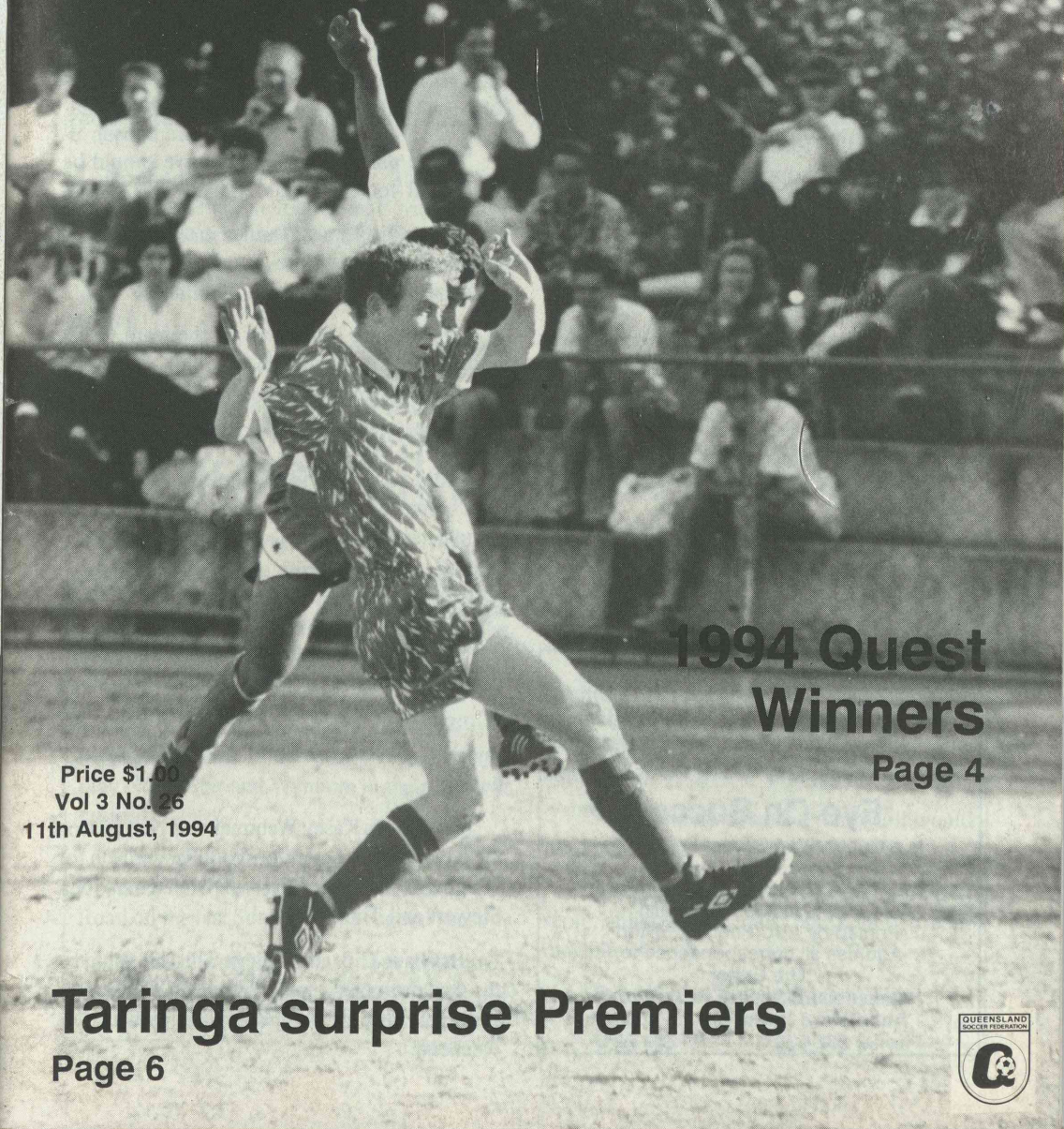

# Ridge struggling to survive as Easts take points

Acacia Ridge look set to return to the Second Division next year after watching their rivals Eastern Suburbs destroy North Brisbane at Prentice Park last Sunday.

Needing a win to haul in the Tigers, the Ridge succumbed 3-0 to Rochedale Rovers at Underwood Park on Friday night.

Three goals from leading scorer Keiran Cooper set up the Rovers win, leaving the Ridge hoping for an Easts loss against the Aces.

However that result never looked likely as Easts went to the break leading 2-0, courtesy of goals from Anthony Roche and Denny Whitfield.

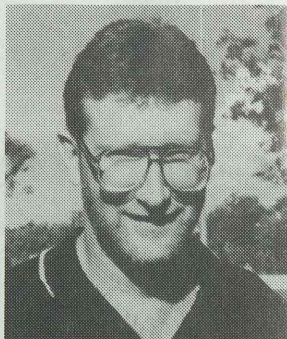
Chris Fegan added a third in the second half, virtually consigning the Ridge back to the lower grade.

Easts' coach Calvin Daunt was delighted with the win but was not ready to concede that his side is safe.

"I am happy and I'm not - funny things happen in soccer," Daunt said.

"They play Rocklea next week and should

get three points while we play Brisbane Lions.

"If we play the way we can we should be alright but you can never tell," he said.

Acacia Ridge meet Taringa in the final round while Easts travel to Bundamba to play Coalstars.

"If anything Lions will be the team to get points off," Daunt added.

"I'd hate to have to go to Coalstars on the last Sunday of the season to stay in the League."

Ridge coach David Richardson admitted his side's chances of remaining in the League were remote.

"You've got to be realistic," Richardson said.

"We didn't do well at the start of the season but we've had the opportunities since then.

"We just haven't had the depth when the injuries have come around and it has cost us," he said.

Youngsters Kasey Wehrman and Neil Pascoe recieved a special mention from Richardson for their performances, along with late comers John Stewart and Tim Brown.

Brisbane City and Grange Thistle should be the two promoted teams to the XXXX League next year after Thistle disposed of City last weekend.

# North Star Cup underdogs

North Star have thrown doubts over their favouritism for the Queensland Cup final after a shock 2-0 loss to Taringa Rovers at Jack Speare Park last weekend.

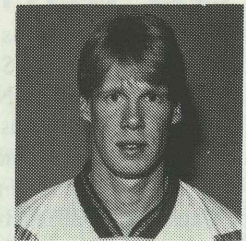
The Zillmere-based club had only lost two games before the Taringa clash but must now face the prospect of entering a game as the underdog for the first time this season.

Since going undefeated for the entire first round, the Miron Bleiberg coached side have lost their drive but still seem to produce when it is needed most.

Rochedale, on the other hand, have maintained their drive for the finals with another easy win against Acacia Ridge last Friday night, bringing their unbeaten run to four since going down in a shock loss to Willowburn back in Round 17.

The addition of Kevin Meacock, the return to form of Keiran Cooper and the running game

## Rovers still with slim chance

**Rochedale Rovers and Pine Rivers are locked in a battle for fifth place on the XXXX League ladder after Rivers were surprisingly held to a 2-2 draw by Willowburn at Wendy Allison Park last weekend.**

That result means only three points separate the two sides with Rivers drawn to play North Star and Wynnum in their last two outings.

Rochedale meet Coalstars at Bundamba in Round 21 and finish off with Rocklea at Dunn Road on the last Sunday of the regular season.

Having won their last four matches, Rochedale would be expected to win the Rocklea clash leaving their season hanging on

# Taringa surprise Premiers

**Taringa maintained their challenge for the coveted finals double chance with a solid 2-0 victory over North Star at Jack Speare Park on Sunday.**

The win has seen them move back into third place, having a superior goal difference to Coalstars who are equal on points.

North Star, who sealed the Premiership by virtue of Lions loss on Friday night, were never in the hunt against a determined Taringa side.

Taringa coach Juan Cutillas was happy that his side had put behind them the disappointment of losing to Willowburn the previous week.

"The boys knew that they had to win today," Cutillas said.

"We always play well against good teams. North Star are a kind of team that let you play."

The home side started well and were unlucky not to go ahead in the 11th minute through Andrew Brayshaw, who placed his shot across the face of goal, just past the post.

Five minutes later Taringa did go ahead through Eddie Lees, who ducked in behind the North Star defence to head home a Brayshaw cross.

It could have been worse for the visitors in the 18th minute, if not for a great save by keeper Robbie Harrison from a stinging Glen Kolpak strike.

An unmarked Frazer Cuba missed a golden opportunity to equalise for North in the 24th

minute, heading a Nick Seeley cross high over the crossbar.

Just four minutes before the break Shane Haddow almost drew North level with a 30 yard shot that cannoned against the bar.

Haddow was again involved in the 51st minute crossing for Michael Brockwell who put his header wide.

Taringa sealed the three points six minutes later through Brayshaw who curled a 25 yard free kick around the North Star wall into the bottom right hand corner of the net.

Kolpak could have made it three for the home side in the 69th minute, just failing to reach Brenley Jefferd's far post cross.

The visitors had a couple of chances to pull one back in the last five minutes through Haddow and Jim McDonagh, but never looked like penetrating the Taringa defence.

North Star coach Miron Bleiberg said his side were not interested, and were thinking about this week's Queensland Cup final against Rochedale.

"They were much hungrier and it reflected in the result," Bleiberg said.

"It was hard today. Next week we will have our full team back."

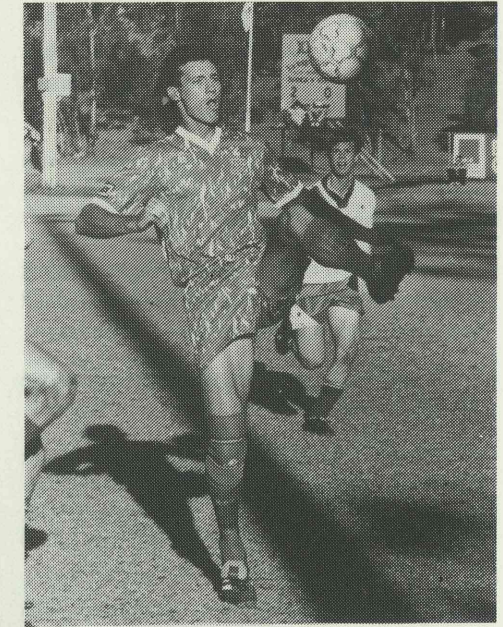
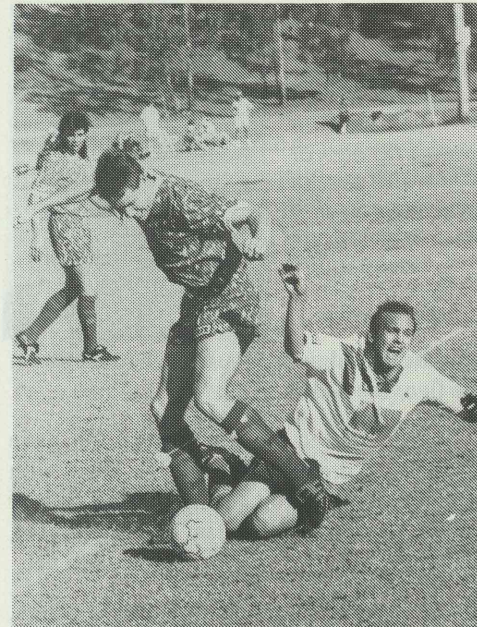
Cutillas was pleased with his side's display, especially that of the defence.

"The backline played exceptionally well today," Cutillas said.

He was confident that Taringa had the capabilities to reach and win the grand final regardless of where they finished in the final five.

"Third place would be better, but it would still be a good effort to come fourth or fifth."

# Coalstars continue charge

Coalstars moved a step closer to guaranteeing a place in the top five with a determined 2-0 win over Brisbane Lions at Richlands last Friday night.

The win keeps them on level pegging with third-placed Taringa, who lead the Ipswich based side on goal difference only.

Rejuvenated defender Andy Ogden heaped praise on his players after the match but added they were far from assured a place in the five.

"This was a must win game for us and we did it," Ogden said.

"We've only let in one goal in five games and we've been scoring a few.

"We had a bit of luck but worked very hard and you need luck to win games," he said.

Ogden has been enjoying his return to the top grade and is now a vital member of their side.

"I didn't expect it and I'm really enjoying being back in the top side," Ogden said.

"I've got a new lease of life."

Playing in the sweeper position he has marshalled the Coalstars defence well with Pat Boyle, Mark Gilbert and Alan McFarlane all outstanding in recent weeks.

And it is that defensive pattern that has proved to be the rock behind their charge into the five, with the goals coming more freely since their defence tightened up.

Ogden believes the Stars can go all the way but it realistic enough to know their biggest hurdle is their next match against Rochedale.

"Obviously Rochedale are a better side on paper but I believe we can beat anybody on our day.

With minutes remaining Coalstars caught an attacking Lions on the break with David Guest slipping a neat ball behind the defence for Tony Cotton.

Cotton, who has 11 goals this season, controlled before drawing Farrow and slipping the ball into the net.

Best for Coalstars were Ogden, Cotton and McFarlane while David Hunter, Jeff Lombardo and Lowey stood out for Lions.

Lions coach Billy Williamson was not too disappointed after the match but said he was concerned with the state of Frank Mengotti who may be out for the season with a knee injury.\*

# Shailer Park puts Grace under fire

Shailer Park State High School became the first school to win the Queensland section of the Commonwealth Bank Bill Turner Cup for a second time. In difficult conditions at Chris Green Park, Beenleigh, on July 31, the Logan City School defeated Grace Lutheran College of Redcliffe 2-0 to emulate the success of its 1991 team in this school's competition for under 15's.

Strong and gusty winds had a very unsettling affect on both as the game began, with an early defensive lapse by Shailer Park almost leading to a goal, a Grace shot hitting the post with the keeper well beaten.

Grace never really recovered from this miss and failed to produce the excellent team work shown in its semi-final win over Ipswich

Grammar. Shailer Park, on the other hand, gradually came back into the game, its more physical approach producing chances, one of which was converted by Brendan Travers-Jones to give his team a lead of 1-0 at the break.

Grace had more of the game in the second half, with midfield general Grant Ahier prominent, the Shailer Park defence stood firm, with stopper Neil Cardow especially strong. Shailer midfielder Craig Barnes, later selected as player of the match, continued good service to his forwards, with wings Shannon Gray and Adam Bolt making several incisive runs.

Bolt finally put the game beyond doubt, his strong challenge on the keeper producing a loose ball which he promptly dispatched into the net making it 2-0.

Shailer Park now travel to the Coffs Harbour area to play Woolgoolga Central School with the winner of this game progressing to the national semi-finals in Newcastle on September 6. Shailer will hope to improve on the record of its 1991 side which finished as National runners-up in the Commonwealth Bank Cup which in 1994 had 577 entries.

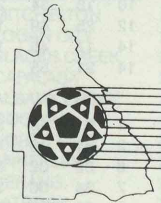

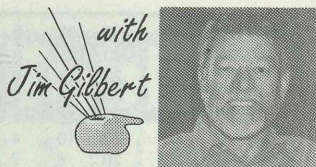

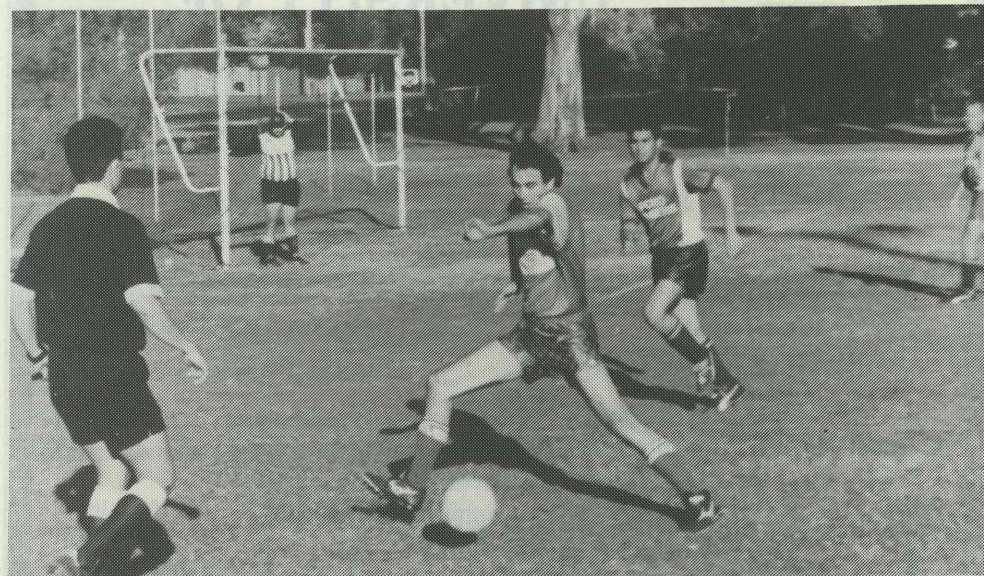
strong, having held up the other ten sides all season, with quite a remarkable goals for and against column.

"Coaches are able to lock into overseas clubs that they never dreamed of being able to coach at."

Selby added that all coaches attending the tour will receive Australian Coaching Council points towards their accreditation.

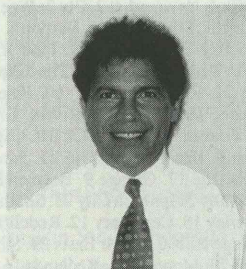

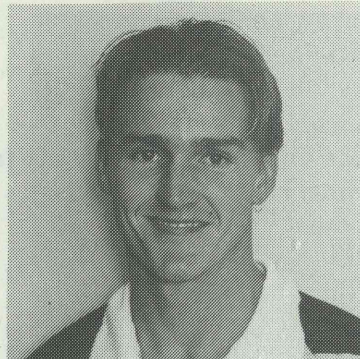
