

Coaches play musical chairs

This year's XXXX League has undergone a substantial facelift with some major changes in coaching staff.

Six clubs have taken on new coaches for the upcoming season, with four of the new faces in their first stint in the XXXX League.

Former Willowburn coach, Gordon Arrowsmith has moved to Brisbane Lions, where Billy Williamson (pictured) left a vacancy to take on the duties at North Star.

Steve Pennells resumes at Willowburn, while Walter Oldenburg takes over from Calvin Daunt at Eastern Suburbs, and Gerry Lindsay replaces Dave Scriggins at Pine Rivers.

Promoted Grange Thistle make their comeback minus the services of last year's coach Ken Stead, who left a hole for player/coach Danny Docherty to move into.

Last year's XXXX League finalists Taringa (Juan Cutillas), Coalstars (Wayne Warren), North Brisbane (Gary McDowall), Rochedale (Kim Wishart), and Wynnum (Wayne Gracey) have all been able to retain their coaches from last season, as have the other promoted side, Brisbane City (Bob Hamilton).

Exiting from the XXXX League coaching ranks are former Eastern Suburbs coach Calvin



Daunt, last year's Coach of the Year Miron Bleiberg (North Star), and Dave Scriggins (Pine Rivers), along with John Caric and Dave Richardson from relegated teams Rocklea United and Acacia Ridge.

Clubs should be mindful of player insurance cover

Following advice given in an early edition of Eye On Soccer last year, confirming clubs' obligations to tell players in writing the extent of insurance taken out by them on players' behalf.

Clubs again are reminded of the necessity to undertake the same action to protect their legal interests.

The Queensland Soccer Federation insurance cover has been circulated separately to clubs and affiliates, with provided benefits including death and total or partial disability, loss of income, public liability, and non-

medicare expenses for players and officials, while involved in active association with the sport.

QSF General Manager Alan Vessey said, "Clubs must again realise they are obliged to inform players, in writing, of the level of insurance cover taken out by the club.

"Players can not be left to assume they are fully conversant with the degree of cover taken out on their behalf."

Players can however chase their clubs up to get the information they are entitled to.

Lions wear the Silverboots

Host club Lions needed a penalty shootout to defeat a gallant Taringa side in the final of the Powerade Silverboot pre-season cup at Richlands on Sunday.

Soccer's dreaded version of Russian Roulette was required to separate the sides, who were level at 2-2 at the end of extra-time.

Misses from Brent Read and Wade Cannon proved costly for Taringa, who deserved to win the game in normal time.

Juan Cutillas' young guns showed they will again be a force this year, with Read, Cannon, and man-of-the-match Joel Douglas excelling throughout the match.

Surprisingly it was Lions who took the lead a minute before half-time, through captain Frank Mengotti, who capitalised on good work from Trent Able to head the ball home past an outstretched Jason Lucas in the Taringa goal.

Substitute Cannon almost equalised for Taringa six minutes after the break, having taken advantage of a huge Lucas clearance. His shot, however, hit the post, with Adam Lebihan well beaten in the Lions goal.

The equaliser eventually did come in the 66th minute, when new signing Steven Starr set up Douglas, who ran at the Lions defence before burying his shot in the corner of the net.

The game opened up after Douglas' goal, with both sides having opportunities to win the game.

Lions substitute David Munn was denied brilliantly by Lucas in the 71st minute. Lebihan in turn showed his worth seven minutes later boldly saving from Danny Stowers, who looked certain to score.

Bosnian import Zelko Vrbanjac could have settled the issue for the hosts in the 83rd minute, but his powerful header rocketed against the crossbar, after lead-up work from Simpson.

The scores were locked at one-all at fulltime, with both sides, especially Lions looking extremely weary at the end of a torrid 90 minutes.

It was therefore no surprise to see Taringa take the lead three minutes into the first period of extra-time, when Starr and Read combined on the right to set up youngster Cannon, who calmly guided the ball past Lebihan, into the net

Starr could have settled the issue for Taringa three minutes later after being set up by Read. His shot, however, with only Lebihan to beat sailed well over the bar.

Taringa were made to pay for missed opportunities when Trent Abel equalised for Lions in the 113th minute. Anthony Cotton chipped the ball over an oncoming Taringa defence, which fell beautifully for an unmarked Abel, who showed maturity beyond his years to tap the ball over Lucas, and slot it into the empty net.

Lions almost stole the game in the last minute of extra-time, with Vrbanjac producing a curling free-kick which brought out the best in Lucas.

His counterpart Lebihan starred in the shootout, denying both Read and Cannon to give Lions victory.

Lions coach Gordon Arrowsmith was disappointed with his side's showing.

"We played poorly. We weren't supporting the players on the ball," Arrowsmith said.

Cutillas, while upset to lose in such a way, praised his players.

"I'm very happy. I have a lot of youngsters who are very fast and fit," Cutillas said.

"We should have won easily, and we were missing players such as captain John Ogden."*

Qld Cup '95 bigger & better

The Queensland Cup keeps getting bigger and again will be one of the major events on the 1995 soccer calender, following 2 successful years incorporating the revamped format.

The Cup, which was won by Rochedale Rovers last year, will again have \$10,000 prize money up for grabs, with the winner earning \$7,000 and the runner-up pocketing \$3,000.

> OSF Secretary Jim Gilbert said there were 21 team involved in this year's competition, including ninregional sides.

> > This is one more team than last year, the additional side coming from the Gold Coast, while promoted sides Brisbane City and Grange Thistle make their first appearances in the revamped Cup.

> > All 12 of the XXXX League clubs will make at least one trip to the country, with the final being staged at Perry Park in mid August.

"The Queensland Cup is a very prestigious Cup to win and it's a good thing for people in the country to see the XXXX League sides in action," Gilbert said.

"The Cup is also a great opportunity for Brisbane coaches to take a closer look at some of the excellent talent we have to offer in country areas throughout Queensland."

Indeed the country areas are getting more and more competitive each year, with Toowoomba and Far North Queensland particularly strong in recent years.

Brisbane City and Grange Thistle make their respective comebacks to Queensland's premier League this weekend, and coaches Bob Hamilton and Danny Docherty are extremely confident their players will do the job for them this season.

The "brains" behind the return of Thistle was last year's coach Ken Stead.

Stead has since stood down from the coaching position, making way for Danny Docherty to take over as player/coach.

Docherty believes his team can and will make this year's top five.

"I think if we keep on battling throughout the season, we should be able to make the top five," Docherty said.

"We'll be relying a lot on our more experienced guys like Darren Bender, Shaun Sleep, and Steve Love, because naturally they've played in the XXXX League before.

"Because I have a lot of younger players I'll be bringing on throughout the season, I'm hoping these guys will be able to impart their experience and knowledge on these younger lads."

Docherty said he was not worried about the transition from Division 2 into the XXXX League.

Certainly, results in pre-season tournaments and trial matches indicate he has no cause for concern.

Besides copping a 7-0 thumping by the classy Russians in the North Star pre-season tournament, Grange have faired very well.

They thrashed the relegated Acacia Ridge 6-1, downed Gold Coast side Palm Beach 2-1,

and held last year's XXXX League finalists Taringa to a 0-0 draw, only to go down on penalties to miss out on a semi-finals spot in the Silver Boot Cup at Brisbane Lions.

City too has enjoyed a healthy preparation to its 1995 XXXX League campaign.

Early losses to Grange and Taringa were put aside, as Bob Hamilton's boys showed what they could do in the Silver Boot Cup, when they defeated Coalstars and Inala to reach the semifinals, before bowing out to Taringa 2-1.

In another trial last Friday night at Spencer Park, City held Rochedale Rovers to a 2-2 draw.

Coach Bob Hamilton said he was extremely optimistic about the forthcoming season.

"We've been training well and despite a couple of interruptions with minor injuries, I believe we have a very promising season ahead," Hamilton said.

City have picked up some quality new faces this year, including Nick Seeley and Shane Haddow from North Star and Mark Greer and Damien Waugh from Pine Rivers.

Giant Striker Mark Battistin has also returned to his home club after a season on loan to North Star.

"The players we've picked up in the offseason combined with what we had, will stand us in good stead," Hamilton said.

"I'll be pretty disappointed if we don't finish in the top four of the competition.

"Our primary goal is to become one of the prominent state league side again.

"The club's simply aiming to just get back on the map again, but it would be nice to pick up some silverware on the way.

"In any case we're out to show people this year that we're back to stay."

"I was very confident I would get the position because it was performance-based.

"Naturally I have made some mistakes in that time also, but the Queensland coaching job is very important to me, and I will be looking to learn from these."

Cutillas said he would be looking not only to get the desired results on the paddock, but also to introduce some younger talent into the State squad, and ensure the Queensland side played attacking, entertaining soccer so crowds would get their money's worth.

Wallace Dann, echoed Cutillas' sentiments.

"The state coach really has a 3-part role to play," Dann said.

"Firstly to get results, secondly to ensure people are treated to good entertaining football,

Endeavouring to forecast the fortunes of Clubs is always difficult, but to endeavour to look into the crystal ball for an entire season, is fraught with danger. However the major purpose of this column, is to identify all clubs, and if, in some instances, it causes those members to chuckle at my predictions, then so be it.

Due to the loss of a number of clubs through lack of senior representation or merger, has made it even more difficult in some Divisions, and it will be, in some instances, a case of using the proverbial pin to predict. However, nothing ventured, nothing gained.

DIVISION 2

Acacia Ridge having had a difficult 1994, will be anxious to regain XXXX League status at the first attempt, Beenleigh are always a tough nut to crack, will this be their year for promotion? Inala City, on paper, appear to be, vet again, a team destined for just outside the five, whilst newly promoted Logan City Kings will be out to impress, particularly seeing they now have new flood lights.

Mt Gravatt, are a question mark this year, whilst the same can be said for Nerang, very much an unknown quantity. For Olympic United, there are always on the fringe of promotion, yet not good enough to obtain that status. With Rocklea United, it could be a year for survival only, whilst Souths United could not possibly have such a traumatic year again.

In Toowoomba, St Albans, always in the shadow of their XXXX League neighbours, will be out to show that they too, should be up with the big ones. Whilst in Ipswich the newly



formed Ipswich St. Helens, could well be a force to be reckoned with in this Division, last (alphabetically) University due to its fluctuating membership, could again be a surprise team, but can they achieve their 1994 position?

DIVISION 3

This will be an even tougher Division predict, due to the influx of a number of high quality players into some clubs.

Albany Creek will be tough this year, and should reach the Semi's again, Annerley is an unknown quantity, and should be mid-table. The big movers in this Division will be Capalaba, their early results will definitely be a pointer to their long-term ambitions. Clairvaux may well find the step up a bit much, whilst Goodna look to be a good bet for mid-table yet again. Latrobe Athletic may struggle, whilst Mitchelton may not quite reach the heady heights of '94. Newmarket relegated from Division 2 could find Division 3 equally as difficult, as will promoted Redlands United, however for the latter club their new impetus from within may well sustain a Semi-Final challenge.

Slacks Creek may not necessarily reach a Semi-Final position but will be a tough nut to crack, whilst The Gap may surprise a few despite losing some players. North Pine only remained in this Division through the loss of Virginia, and may still find the step up too much.

DIVISION 4

Brothers, now back at Kangaroo Point, may trouble a few sides this year, whilst Darra United will have to prove themselves in the first three or four matches to justify their retention. Ipswich City could not be any worse than last year, whilst promoted Loganholme may find this a totally different proposition to Division 5. At Bellbowrie, Moggill United could well obtain mid-table status, whilst Southside Eagles may

even pick up the coveted second position this year. Oxley United, who obtained promotion by surprise, may find this a difficult year as will Pine Hills who only narrowly retained their status. On the Peninsula, Redcliffe City will do well this year, unlike last year's perpetual struggle, whilst in Samford, they may not be quite as successful. For the two South American clubs, South Star will struggle yet again, and the same could be said of Western Suburbs.

DIVISION 5

At Lota, Bayside United will do well this year as will newly promoted Browns Plains, who could surprise a few in their early matches. For Bethania and Greenbank the step up may well be a little high for them, however enthusiasm may carry them through the first Round. Goodna will probably struggle in this Division yet again, while the same certainly won't be said of Jimboomba or Olympic United, with the latter particularly out to impress. For Slacks Creek it could be another long year, whilst for Ipswich St. Helens this should be a good Division for them. Both The Gap and University will also have a good year yet again, whilst Woodridge, hopefully, have recruited since last season.

DIVISION 6

No specific previews at this stage, as this entire Division is made up of lower grade teams from Clubs in the higher Divisions.

DIVISION 7

New clubs in this Division involve Margate, Mooroondu and Park Ridge, with the team from the Peninsula expected to do well, despite a jump of two Divisions. For Mooroondu who certainly won well in Division 8 last year, this could well be a difficult year for them, however I feel they will have learnt a lot, and they are expected to do well again. For the team from Hubner Park, Park Ridge this could well be one Division too high at this stage, however time alone could prove me wrong, but to all of the these three clubs, the kudos in receiving promotion could be enough to entice their players to reach new heights, consequently good results, at least in the first round.

DIVISION 8

This is a difficult Division for any form of prediction, Kingsridge are the sole first team aspirants in this Division, and their promotion from sixth place in 9B last year maybe a little ambitious, but knowing the club as we do, they should do well. For the other teams, very much a lottery considering where the teams come from within their respective clubs.

DIVISION 9A

In the main, this consists of the fifth team from the XXXX League clubs, however Capalaba, Kingsridge, Margate and Pine Hills should certainly not feel outclassed, as many of the players in this Division are what could be termed as in their "veteran years".

DIVISION 9B

With Brisbane Lions almost having a mortgage on the two Division 9's, one would have to assume they will be taking out some form of honours in either of these, having said that, the mere social aspect and beforementioned veteran stage, could well preclude anything of the sort. Nevertheless it is to be expected, and indeed hoped, that all teams participating in these two Divisions are playing for the sheer joy of the game, and not specifically playing for Premierships - Championships or Wembley Cup Finals, in every fixture.

POST SCRIPT

As mentioned at the head of this column, tipping is always a hazardous business, and judging by 1994's records, I probably won't be much better this year. As I have always stated, the major purpose of this column is to fully acknowledge and recognise the clubs in our so called "Lower Divisions" and to ensure that, whilst they are not necessarily getting metropolitan paper recognition, they are members of this Federation and do deserve recognition.


