Top teams in close calls

Round two of the XXXX League further proved this year's competition would not be a runaway for any one team as was the case last season.

A minor upset and a number of extremely close matches highlighted the weekend's play.

City are starting to strike fear in a lot of teams in the League, after their good start to the season.

Outside of that, the best one could say, was that both teams could only improve.

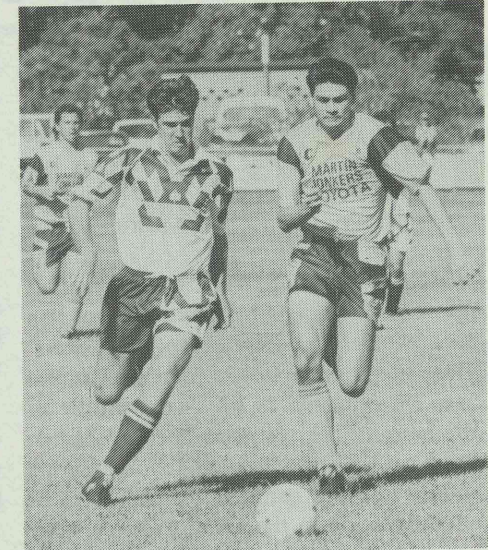
This match whilst disappointing from a playing point of view did have one bright note.

EDITORIAL

Those who have always been aware of Ian Brusasco's passion for the code were probably not all that surprised when they read about his decision to nominate for the Australian Soccer Federation's Board of Commissioners last week, possibly with a view to the Chairmanship of the ASF. As Chairman of the ASF from 1988-90, Brusasco's business prowess turned a huge deficit into a surplus as he established a long term development plan for Australian soccer. As part of the Strikers' Trust Management Group, Brusasco has also been instrumental in lifting the profile of Brisbane in the National Soccer League. Brusasco said he was interested in ensuring stability in the game at the top level of administration in the country. Three other nominations for the remaining position on the Board of Commissioners have been received by the ASF, from the President of the NSW Soccer Federation Peter Gray, former Managing Director of the ABC David Hill, and former Australian goalkeeper Jack Reilly. The

decision for the position will be announced on April 1.

It was great to see FIFA ensure the 8th World Youth Championship for the FIFA/Coca-Cola Cup would be staged next month. The ruling not to hold the championships in Nigeria came late last week, following a further inspection of facilities in the country. However FIFA decided earlier this week that the Championships would go ahead and that Qatar in the Persian Gulf, would be a suitable venue. It would have been a tragedy for the Young Socceroos including our own Clint Bolton and Jon Carter, had the Championships been cancelled. Many months of preparation have gone into Australia's 1995 World Youth Cup campaign and age restrictions may have meant a lot of these players would not have received another opportunity to play in the Championships again. Australia has proved itself to be a nation rising in the world soccer rankings, especially in the Youth teams. The Young Socceroos leave on Monday.

City continues good form

Brisbane City made it two from two in their return to the XXXX League, coming from behind to defeat Coalstars 2-1 at Spencer Park on Sunday.

Second half goals from Stephen Glockner and Mark Battistin secured the three points for City, who look the goods early in the season.

The home side dominated in the first half, with Glockner unlucky not to give them the lead after 11 minutes, when his fierce 25 yard drive slammed against the crossbar.

The luck again fell for the visitors when they took the lead four minutes later, after City midfielder Simon Eslick inadvertently deflected a Troy Hews free kick into his own net.

The woodwork further aided Coalstars one minute later, as Battistin took advantage of neat work from Warren Cooley, to steer his shot past Stars custodian Kevin Farrar, only to see it hit the bottom of the post.

Farrar denied City an equaliser in the 19th minute, brilliantly saving from Cameron Pearse in a one-on-one situation.

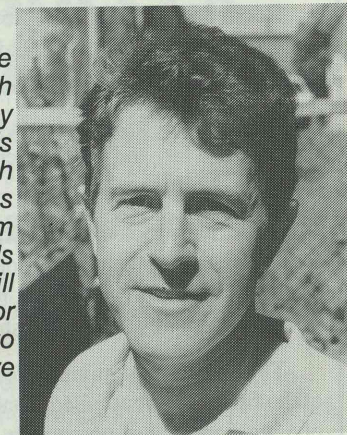
He seemed all that stood between City and their almost inevitable equaliser, again excelling to this time thwart Cooley nine minutes later, who appeared certain to level the scores.

The equaliser did come six minutes after the break, after Cooley got behind the Coalstars defence, cutting back a dangerous cross which fell for Glockner, who made no mistake from 12 yards.

Continued pressure took its toll on the boys from Ipswich, who were prised open at back by Glockner and Pearse, laying the foundation for Battistin's winner in the 66th minute. Taking advantage of the space created, the tall striker's shot cannoned into the roof of the net.

Coalstars pushed out after that, in search of the equaliser, and very nearly had it in the 88th

minute, when substitute David Guest headed the ball past Daniel Duke in the City goal. The equaliser was disallowed however, due to a disputed offside decision.

While disappointed with the adjudication, Coalstars coach Wayne Warren put the offside down to the uncertainty of the new law interpretation.

"I hope it will even itself out during the season," a philosophical Warren said.

He conceded his side were under a lot of pressure in the first half from the home side, and held a high opinion of the City line-up.

"I think they'll be fairly strong this season. They've bought well."

City coach Bobby Hamilton was happy with the win, especially after the missed chances in the first half.

"At half-time, I tried to make sure we didn't lose patience. We needed to keep probing away," Hamilton said.

While pleased to have two wins in a row, he was not becoming overly excited.

"The players want to remain competitive. There is plenty of improvement left in the side."

Rovers repel gutsy Grange

Rochedale fought hard to overcome a very determined Grange Thistle 3-2 last Saturday night at Rochedale.

Both teams played some encouraging football, in a fast and open match which made for some quality goals.

The Rovers took a 1-0 lead in the opening ten minutes of the match after John Weatherby was left in space down the left, making a nice run and an equally superb finish.

The home side dominated for the majority of the first period but failed to take advantage of a huge amount of possession, and an array of chances went begging.

In contrast Grange had very few chances in the opening stanza but made the most of what they created.

The visitors spent about 30 per cent of the first half in Rochedale's territory and only troubled keeper Martin Simpson two times during the opening 45 minutes.

Rochedale paid dearly for their wasted efforts eight minutes before half time however, when Grange equalised after a clever move by Darren Bender.

Bender made an incisive run through a couple of defenders and into the penalty area before sending a short cross to Steve Love, who tapped in from just a few yards out.

A few minutes later Rochedale were left with a man short after Craig Wass was sent from the field for his second bookable offence.

Wass became the third player from Rochedale to be sent from the field of play in just two matches.

This seemed to spur Rochedale on however, as the home side regained the lead just after the break through Nigel McClure.



Rochedale's Kieran Cooper scored the winning goal in side's hard fought win over Grange Thistle last Saturday night

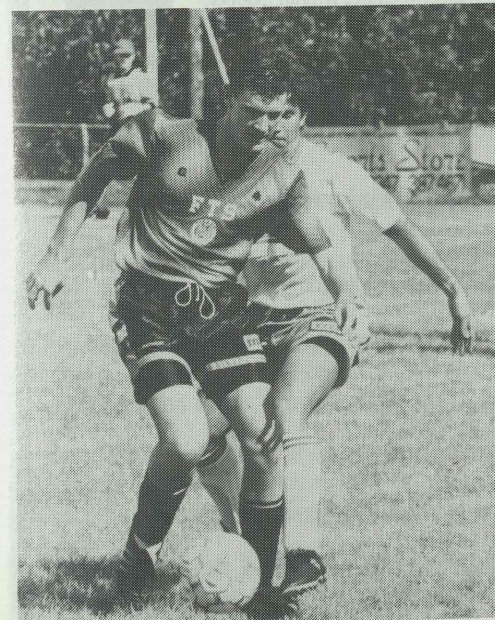

Darren Bender came through for the visitors again mid-way through the second half, after he got himself into a one-on-one situation with Rochedale custodian Martin Simpson and guided the ball past the outstretched keeper.

At 2-2 Grange looked ready to snatch the three points with some quality strikes forcing the best out of Simpson, who kept superbly in the closing stages.

However it was Rochedale to claim the victory with just minutes remaining when John Weatherby sent a cross for Kieran Cooper at the far post to head home. *

Qld Referee on FIFA panel

Following the 1990 World Cup finals in Italy, FIFA introduced the concept of the FIFA Linesman's Panel, in response to the inept displays of many of the world's top referees.

Promising linesmen in all member countries would be encouraged to develop their skills towards becoming specialist linesmen.

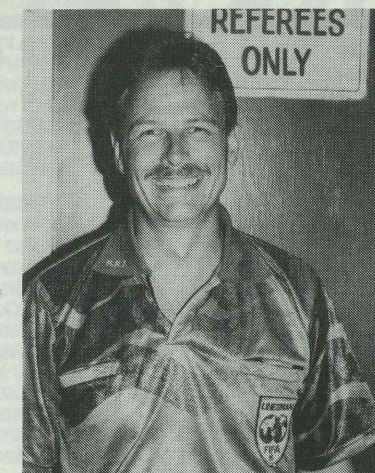
The reward, if successful, would be inclusion on the new panel, from which linesmen would be chosen for future internationals and major tournament finals.

One local referee has good reason to be thankful for FIFA's initiative, as Rob Eedy has just become Queensland's first FIFA linesman.

Rob (pictured) has been involved in soccer from an early age, kicking off with the Taringa Rovers' Under 7's, before moving onto Bardon Junior SC, and returning again to Taringa again at Under 16 level. Moving onto the seniors, he played "once or twice" in the XXXX League, but appeared mainly for the Reserves and 3rd Grade as a striker. He also had a spell of 12 months as player/coach with the Reserves. One of his team mates on occasion was his brother Alan, still a regular in 3rd Grade.

In a playing career which spanned more than 20 years, Rob was only sent off once and cautioned three times. It was his only red card, allegedly for foul and abusive language, which prompted him to consider refereeing. "I thought it was a terrible decision," he said. "I believed I could do a better job than some of the referees around at the time."

In 1987 Rob qualified as a Grade 3 referee, winning the "Rookie of the Year" award at the end of his first season. It was the first of a number of highlights as he worked his way through the refereeing ranks.



In 1989 he was upgraded to Grade 2, scoring a perfect 10 in his field test. Such a mark is virtually impossible now, under the new method of grading. After two years at Grade 2 he succeeded in reaching Grade 1 in 1991.

His abilities as a linesman were first recognised with his appointment to the NSL Linesman's Panel for the 1991-92 season. After three successful seasons on the NSL he was nominated for the FIFA Panel at the start of the 1994-95 season, and on December 31 last year his appointment as a FIFA linesman was confirmed. He had less than six weeks to wait for his first International, Australia v Colombia at Lang Park.

Obviously reaching this level has not come without a lot of effort and commitment on Rob's part, but he is quick to acknowledge the assistance he has received from others over the years. "People like Dieter Klose for instance, who puts in a tremendous effort behind the scenes," Eedy said. "My close friends Ted Kearney and Derek Crawford have also helped enormously. But most important of all has been my wife Cheryl - without her support very little would have been achieved in my career as a referee." *

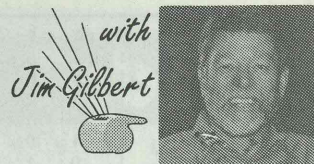

New Substitute Laws

LAW THREE - NUMBER OF PLAYERS

When the change in the Laws of the game was implemented at International level, NSL level and now through the QSF, it was designed to allow the goal keepers to enjoy the same opportunity as field players.

The intention and spirit of this Law means that a goal keeper *shall* replace a goal keeper.

Any team that has a field player changing places with a goal keeper, with intention of circumventing the Law and therefore gaining an additional field player, would be clearly operating against the spirit of the Law.

This change does not remove the right of the team to have a field player to change places with a goal keeper, but it does present an opportunity for teams to move outside the spirit of the Law.

In brief, the change that was made to the QSF Rules and Regulations referred to the substitution of two field players and a goal keeper, with the strong inference that the named substitute goal keeper may be used only as a goal keeper.

As the season has only just commenced, it is to be hoped that all participants will observe the above, the operative phrase being "the spirit of the Law".

The above clarifications have come from the State DOC of the ASRF (Qld Division), and the appropriate interpretations and coaching intention is, quite naturally, being passed on to their members.

It is now hoped that there will be no further confusion in matches ahead.

DIVISION 7

For the four day games in this division, the reverse appears to be on the cards with the away sides looking too strong. Darra to defeat Bayside, Mt Gravatt to take the points home from Jimboomba, Newmarket to be too good for University and Mooroondu to defeat Clairvaux. At night Albany Creek and Parkridge will be a much tighter affair with the home side slightly in front. Only one match on Sunday, but a most important one as it is the local derby between Redcliffe and Margate, and there wont be any favours asked, or given, in this one, visitors the tip.

DIVISION 8

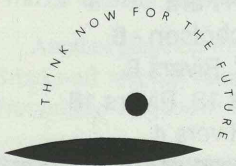
