The home side came out firing and went into the break with a 1-0 lead. However the Pirates regrouped at half-time and found the equaliser through Kieran Cooper.

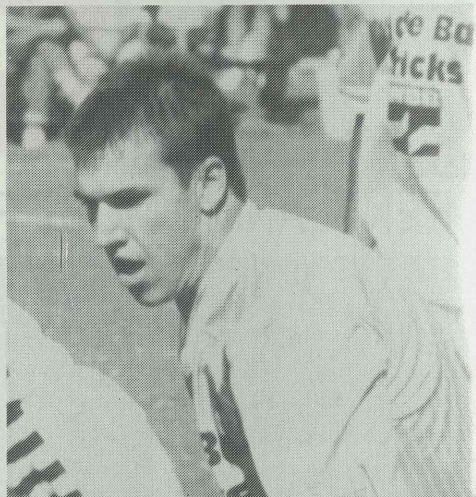
Chances went begging for the visitors, who were denied maximum points, by some great Peter Underhill saves.

In the local derby between Grange Thistle and North Brisbane, Thistle took the three points winning the match 2-1.

ASF warns clubs & players

The issue of players' agents has recently been addressed by FIFA. publicise this matter to both clubs and players.

Distributed FIFA regulations on this issue have been followed by a request from FIFA to Australian Soccer Federation and ask that its contents be noted by all concerned.

PLAYERS' AGENTS REGULATIONS

We refer to previous correspondence on this matter, in which we have forwarded copies of the FIFA regulations governing Players' Agents.

FIFA has written to National Associations advising that it has been repeatedly drawn to FIFA'S attention that there are scores of unlicensed agents acting on behalf of players.

We need to point out that if a club is interested in procuring the services of a player, it may negotiate only with an agent who holds a license that has been issued in accordance with FIFA'S regulations.

Any club or player that contravenes one or more of the interdictions (cf. Art. 17 and 18) will be liable to sanctions.

One of the objectives of these regulations is that FIFA intends to give as much support as possible to licensed players' agents only, thereby rejecting any players' agents not recognised by FIFA and any clubs which negotiate with non-licensed agents.

We ask all National Soccer League Clubs to take note and We ask State Federations to notify their clubs of the FIFA regulations.

Players' attention should also be drawn to the FIFA regulations. Separately, we will also bring the matter to the attention to the Australian Unity Soccer Players Association.

EDITORIAL

Congratulations to the XXXX Queensland Bulls after their comprehensive display in the Sheffield Shield Final at the Gabba earlier in the week. Queenslanders have waited a long time for the "Holy Grail" to take rest in the Sunshine State, and it was excellent to see the Queensland team dominate the way they did. The outright win against the "Crow-Eaters" was the perfect way to finish off a highly successful season and shake off Sheffield Shield cobwebs that have accumulated over the past 68 years.


Let's just hope that it won't be a similar period of time before Queensland grabs a National Soccer League title. Many people may have written the Brisbane Strikers' finals aspirations off after recent losses to Morwell and Adelaide City. The fact is however that the Strikers still have a chance of making the top six. There is only two more rounds to go in this year's NSL competition. The best the Strikers can hope for is 5th or 6th, as the top

four positions are now out of their reach. Currently the Strikers are in 8th position on 36 points, nine points away from 4th placed West Adelaide, three points from 5th placed Morwell, and just two away from Wollongong and South Melbourne (38). It would be safe to say Morwell will make the top six. The Falcons have been in great form recently and will be hard to knock out, although they are still yet to play 2nd placed Sydney United. Wollongong have hit a severe form slump and must play Adelaide City and Sydney Olympic in the last two rounds. South Melbourne have two very tough matches to play against an inform Melbourne SC and League leaders Melbourne Knights. The Strikers meet Sydney Olympic at Perry Park this Saturday night and follow up with a trip to Marconi for the final round. Two wins or even a win and a draw could see the Strikers realise a historic finals berth in the National Soccer League. 

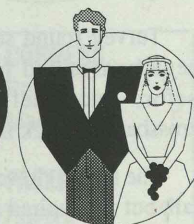

Taringa notches its first win

Taringa Rovers opened their account for the season and left Willowburn anchored to the foot of the table with a dominant 2-0 win over the Toowoomba side at Jack Speare Park on Sunday.

Two second half goals from Stuart Collins and Greg Swadling provided last year's grand finalists with their first win in a disappointing start to 1995.

The home side dominated the first half in atrocious conditions but failed to take the lead due to a combination of errant shooting and some good goalkeeping from Willowburn custodian Trevor Gilliland.

Taringa were unlucky not to open the scoring in the 23rd minute when Anthony McCulloch shot wide after a good cross from Stephen Starr.

Rovers continued to attack and were almost rewarded soon after when Greg Swadling and Stephen Starr both had good opportunities but shot wide.

It was the Toowoomba side who almost opened the scoring early in the second half with midfielder Mick Turvey deprived a goal by a great save from Taringa keeper Jason Lucas.

Turvey found some room in the Taringa penalty area and his shot was goal bound before Lucas deflected the ball onto the crossbar and back into his hands.

The match slowed as the rain continued to fall, but an inspired substitution from Taringa coach Juan Cutillas turned the tide in his team's favour.

Stuart Collins was only on the field a matter of minutes when he ghosted into the Willowburn penalty area and calmly slotted the ball into the corner of the net.

The home side put the match beyond doubt in the last minute when Greg Swadling chimed onto a ball from John Ogden and spectacularly volleyed the ball past Gilliland from thirty yards.

Cutillas was happy his side recorded their first win of the year but disappointed with the finishing that allowed the visitors to stay in the match.

"We showed perseverance and dominated the game, but the score should have been much higher," he said.

"There is big room for improvement and we will be a better side when (Glenn) Kolpak and (Reece) Tollenaere return from the QAS."

Willowburn coach Steve Pennells believed the turning point of the game was his side's missed opportunities after the break.

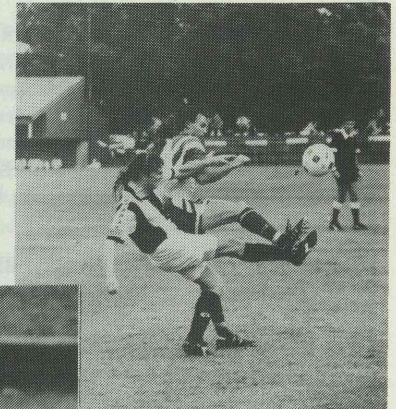
"I think if we had of scored either of those two goals Taringa may have folded," he said.

"Ultimately it was inexperience that cost us the game."

This weekend's fixtures are spread over the entire weekend with many more matches than usual scheduled for Friday night. For those that don't look beyond their own club's activities, the reason for the Friday night scheduling, is that the last home game of the Strikers is being played on Saturday night at Perry Park.

DIVISION 2

Neighbours on the South-side of town, Souths and Beenleigh not having much luck of late, looks to be an away result on Friday at Runcorn, whilst up at the Ridge, it looks to be a home win when Logan City come visiting.

Remaining matches are on Sunday with, co-leaders Nerang and St Helens clashing down the coast with Nerang cock-a-hoop after last week's victory over Olympic, they look to continue in this one. Eddie's brother Andy wasn't spared either on this auspicious occasion. After scoring, he was forced to leave the field with an injury to his knee.

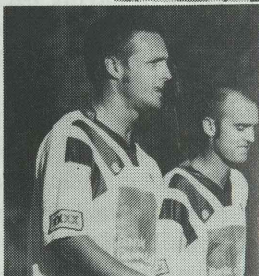
Sources at Rochedale say the injury could have occurred during Andy's trademark goal celebration involving something resembling a triple roll in the pike position with a three point degree of difficulty.

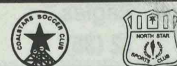
