

Perry Park hosts first double

header

This weekend sees the first of the Perry Park double headers for this season, when four teams meet at Queensland's soccer headquarters Saturday night.

In the opening match at 5.00pm Pine Rivers clash with League leaders Brisbane City, while Brisbane Lions and North Brisbane do battle straight afterwards at 7.00pm.

The double headers have certainly proved to be crowd pleasers in the past, with spectators able to look at four of the State's premier teams in the one night.

In other matches this weekend, Thistle meet the inform North Star, Easts play host to Rochedale, Wynnum take on Willowburn, and Coalstars travel to Taringa.

Last week's matches saw North Brisbane and Willowburn open their season accounts with both sides fighting hard to force draws against Pine Rivers and Coalstars respectively.

The 2-2 result at Willowburn was particularly impressive considering the Magpies were without a number of their key players for the match.

North Brisbane would have been relieved after securing a point against Pine Rivers during their 1-1 result. Rivers have now drawn three of their four matches.

The match of the round between Rochedale and Brisbane Lions also ended in a 1-1 draw and whilst full of action, was disappointing from a goal-scoring perspective.

North Star proved too good for Wynnum, dominating the first half to secure a comfortable 3-1 victory over the Wolves.

Taringa continued their early struggle for form with an extremely hard-fought 1-0 win over Eastern Suburbs at Heath Park, while at Spencer Park Brisbane City maintained their unbeaten run with an emphatic 5-2 thumping of Grange Thistle.

Ipswich St Helens - aiming to rekindle the days of old

If teams were promoted to the Premier League on confidence alone, then Ipswich St Helens would certainly be the next team from Division Two to move into the XXXX League. The club's current confidence is not just a lot of hot air however, as it stems from years of tradition in Queensland Soccer circles and has been enhanced by a strength in their Juniors that has rekindled memories of "the good old days".

The Ipswich club has enjoyed a host of Premierships, Championships, and Ampol Cup victories since its formation in 1912, and at the height of its success in the mid 1980's, also took out a couple of Club Championships.

The tradition is further strengthened when considering the calibre of player that has come out of the club, including current XXXX League coaches Kim Wishart and Wayne Warren, and Queensland legend Brian (Chooky) Vogler, who made 13 appearances for the State.

After seven years in Division 2, Club President Mike Donohue believes 1995 will be the year Ipswich St Helens takes those first steps back to "the good old days" by gaining promotion into the XXXX League.

"We've acquired some quality young players in the off-season, and are attempting to mix them with some of the more experienced players at the club," Donohue said.

"We believe that this will give us a nice depth for promotion into the XXXX League at the end of the season.

"We're also banking on the youth and enthusiasm of these players to keep us in the top division for many years to come."

Donohue maintained top team coaches Alan Hughes and Rod Mackenzie had also brought a lot of experience to the club and had been given the players that could do the job this year.

Among the new signings are former QAS player Christian Rook, former Premier League

player Tommy Novack, Damien Butler from Inala, Lee Kool from Goodna, and Damien Conquest, whose interest in the indoor game will be taking him to Brazil at the end of the season.

Donohue believes the club's junior base is strong enough to maintain a steady flow of quality players into the top senior teams.

Currently Ipswich St Helens has more than 200 registered junior players making up 20 teams and another 60 to 70 players in five senior teams, some of which came over during the recent merger with Leichardt Eagles.

Women have also made a return to the club for the first time since 1979, with a team currently in the Atlanta Cup's Sixth Division.

Players at the club are enjoying their football at the moment according to Donohue, and it is this factor that may just see Ipswich St Helens reclaim what many of the club's supporters believe to be their rightful place in the State's top League.

It has been disturbing to see that just four weeks into the Queensland Soccer season, the number of matches not completed has already run into double figures. Whilst some of these matches were called off for legitimate reasons such as poor weather, it appears a small number have been abandoned due to teams lacking a full complement of players. It is becoming more and more obvious that some team officials are stretching their credibility a bit far and are not really playing within the spirit of the laws of the game. With this happening so early in the season, questions must be asked as to how stringently club officials will take care of other internal matters such as player registrations and the like. Do club officials really care, or are they looking to blame others for their lack of sensitivity? It's time clubs cleaned up their own back yards and stopped trying to apportion blame elsewhere.

Queensland's most capped soccer player Gary Wilkins turns 50 this weekend and **Eye On Soccer** would like to wish Gary a Happy Birthday with many more to come. Renowned for being able to strike a ball with tremendous power, Gary's illustrious career included 34 appearances for his State, the majority as captain, and 12 for Australia. Gary first played for Redbank Seekers, later transferring to Hollandia, as Lions was first known. After his soccer days Gary's interest in the game focussed on his two sons Troy and Jay as they followed in their father's footsteps with an interest in the game too. Gary coached junior teams, before joining the Junior Committee and later the Board of Directors at Lions. He then took over as President of the club seven years ago after long serving Club President John Morcus stood down. As Club President, Gary's popularity has grown immensely.

Fittingly, the people at Brisbane Lions came up with the following tribute for their much loved President :- "Best wishes on your 50th birthday and Gary, The club is your life and we're proud to know you! Happy Birthday!"

Glamour sides in dour draw

A 1-1 draw between XXXX League glamour sides Rochedale and Brisbane Lions highlighted both clubs' lack of penetration in and around the penalty area, last Friday night at Underwood Park.

In a match that promised much but delivered relatively little in the way of scoring, both teams appeared guilty of not using their strikers very effectively.

Despite this however, the crowd was treated to some extremely fast and skilful midfield play from the likes of Craig Priddy and Darren Hillier, and superb defence at the back by both teams.

Rochedale looked the better side from the kick-off and had the first genuine chance of the match in the 28th minute after Kieran Cooper held the ball down the right before sending an excellent cross for Andy Lees, whose delicate strike, to the despair of the home side, managed to inch itself over the crossbar.

The Pirates were given the opportunity to take the lead with about ten minutes of the first half remaining, after Lions' defender David Hunter brought Cooper down in the penalty area.

Cooper's usual finishing prowess eluded him on this occasion however, as he sprayed his spot kick well over the crossbar.

The deadlock was broken a few minutes after the break, when Craig Priddy was finally rewarded for his earlier midfield runs, with a good goal.

Jimmy McMurtrie sent a nice ball through to Priddy in the middle of the park, who evaded a couple of defenders before slotting the ball past Pirates' Martin Simpson for the 1-0 lead.



Ten minutes later Rochedale got the equaliser after Nigel McClure found Cooper in space on the left, who found himself in a oneon-one situation with Lions keeper Rob Farrow, and made no mistake guiding the ball into the net.

Lions stepped up a gear after this, with McMurtrie and Zeljko Vrbanjac coming alive and stringing together some promising plays, to trouble the Rochedale defence.

However the absence of David Munn, who was out with a shoulder injury, proved costly as the visitors were unable to capitalise on their good lead up work.

Rochedale too, had their chances late in the match, with Craig Collins and Andy Lees not only testing Farrow, but also contending with the posts.

Thistle thumping gives Bris City sweetest revenge

In the battle of this seasons two new XXXX League teams, Brisbane City defeated Grange Thistle 5-2 at Spencer Park on Sunday.

City's win made it 12 points out of 12, and consolidates their position at the top of the table.

In a highly entertaining game, the aerial dominance City's Mark Battistin, Stephen Glockner, and Warren Cooley, proved too much for the Grange defence.

It took only four minutes for Battistin to give the home side the lead, executing a beautiful chip from the edge of the box over oncoming Grange goalkeeper Nathan Higgins.

The visitors hit back, somewhat against the run of play, through Darren Bender 16 minutes later. He took advantage of an excellent Brian Webster cross to slot the ball past Daniel Duke in the City goal.

Bender should have given his side the lead one minute later when all alone with only Duke to beat. The young keeper showed courage to deny the one time City striker in the one-onone situation.

It was City who took the lead through Warren Cooley in the 29th minute, after a stinging Battistin drive crashed against the post, leaving the burly striker to clean up the crumbs.

Battistin posted his second and City's third one minute before half-time, capitalising on a Mark Greer shot which fell for him in the box to guide home.

Thistle would not lie down however, and

pulled a goal back five minutes after the break. Bender scored his second after beating City's offside trap, and then rounding Duke to make it 3-2.

Glockner replied for City three minutes later, regaining their two goal buffer, with a smashing volley from 20 yards which custodian Higgins barely saw.

The veteran striker rounded out the scoring in the 74th minute, taking advantage of Battistin's laid-back header from a Cameron Pearse cross, to hit the target from six yards.

City coach Bobby Hamilton was pleased with his side's ball play and support.

"The players are working hard at using width, which creates space for people in the box," Hamilton said.

He put down his side's defensive lapses to the attacking style of play he wants them to pursue.

"It's not nice to concede two goals at home, but it's a consequence of pushing players forward. Sometimes we are going to be exposed."

Thistle spokesperson Paddy Higgins thought City were a no better side than the visitors.

"They played how we thought they would. We just didn't follow instructions," Higgins said.

"We're annoyed at the moment, but we'll talk about it at training."

DIVISION 7


