Emotions set to rise as traditional rivals do battle

Soccer fans will be spoiled this Easter Weekend, with a full round of XXXX League matches being scheduled over the four day break, including two absolute "crackers".

Traditional rivals Rochedale and Taringa are set to clash in the battle of the Rovers at Underwood Park on Saturday night, while the match of the round has long-time foes Brisbane City and Brisbane Lions doing battle at Spencer Park on Monday afternoon.

All four of these teams represent the best of the XXXX League and have been embroiled in rivalries that go back many years.

Certainly the City versus Lions match will draw a big crowd as both clubs have a history extending into the early days of the National Soccer League and beyond.

Brisbane City have set a stunning pace in this year's competition with five wins and 15 goals from their first five encounters, while Lions have been patchy to say the least.

Lions will be after a good win here, but will also be without long-serving captain Frank Mengotti, who suffered a severe knee injury

1994 Gold Medal winner Frank Mengotti has been ruled out of this week's match against City after suffering suspected knee ligament damage



during his side's match with North Brisbane last weekend.

The veteran looks set to be out for at least two to three weeks.

In other matches this weekend, North Star take on Pine Rivers at home, Coalstars play host to Wynnum, North Brisbane take on Easts at Lanham Park, and Grange Thistle travel to Willowburn.

Last week saw no real surprises, except perhaps for the 0-0 draw between Brisbane Lions and North Brisbane.

North Brisbane were left a man short after defender Danny Cox was sent from the field in the 60th minute, however managed to hold a lacklustre Lions scoreless.

In the other match of the Perry Park double-header, Pine Rivers were unlucky not to salvage at least one competition point from their encounter with Brisbane City.

Grange Thistle squandered a 1-0 half-time lead, allowing North Star to take the match 3-1, Taringa disposed of Coalstars 2-1, while Wynnum took the three points with a 1-0 victory over cellar-dwellers Willowburn. *

QAS girls boast fifty per cent of Australian youth squad

The Queensland Academy of Sport has shown other states exactly how strong they are with an unprecedented number of National team selections in the pre-season.

Eight members of the QAS girls team are currently in the United States with the Australian U19 women's squad to contest the Dallas Cup, while Louise McMurtie, another QAS product is currently in South America with the Australian Senior team.

Nine National representations is an amazing statistic for any elite program, but eight in a squad of just 16 has shown just how well the QAS is working for Queensland's talented young female soccer players, according to coach Connie Selby.

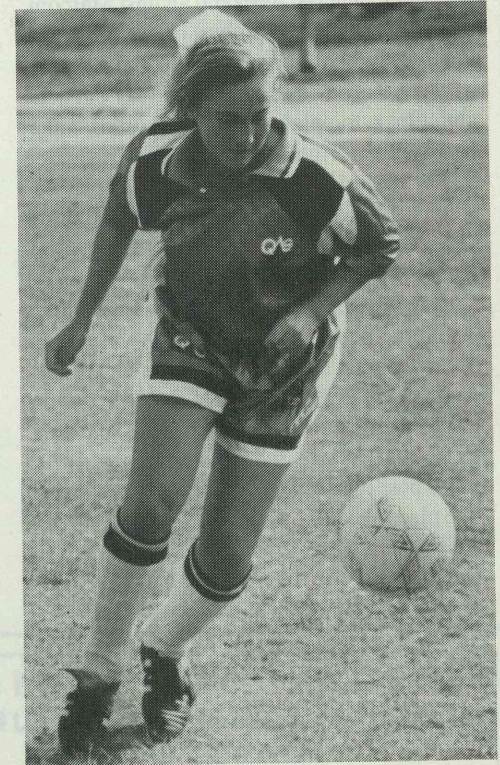
Selby said the Soccer program at the QAS began in 1992 and was designed to assist the State's elite young players, both on and off the field, in their quests to represent their country.

She said the program offered a wide variety of benefits to players, from advanced coaching and training programs, to the development of girls' social and communication skills.

"We're able to provide extra benefits to our players that some other clubs are unable to," Selby said.

"These include guidance in nutrition and weight control, home development programs, and physiological tests for all of our players to determine aspects such as speed, agility and so on.

"The QAS is leading the country in women's soccer, development and research, and it is a credit to the Academy and the girls that such a large number have been selected to play for Australia. *



Selby said players ages ranged from 14 to 19 years to enable a constant development of players throughout the National programs and back into the local club environment.

She said it was envisaged these young QAS players would at some stage return to their clubs to pass on their knowledge and experiences gained from their international exposure, to others in the sport either through playing or possibly coaching.

EDITORIAL



While it was disappointing to see the Brisbane Strikers bow out of the National Soccer League last weekend against Marconi, the side deserves the highest praise for such a highly successful season. To miss the play-offs by less than a hair's breadth was such an anticlimax for players and supporters alike, however the fight-back the team provided during their 3-3 draw with Marconi was admirable to say the least. At 3-0 down, I know I thought that would be it for another season. However the boys displayed a truly Queensland characteristic when they came "from the dead" to force a draw and almost secure a spot for Queensland in the finals. Even though it is easy to look back at what might have been, we should take heart and reflect on a season that was highlighted with many positives. For a start the Strikers finished one place ahead of where they did last season, and were in with a chance to make the top six right up until the final whistle had blown. On a scoring note, the Strikers found the net 34

times this season as opposed to 28 last year, which also included two more games. This represented a 30 percent increase in scoring on a per game basis, with Rod Brown and Chris Slater topping with 9 goals each. Off the field, increased promotions were met with a subsequent increase in the Gate, as crowd records were set at both the Adelaide City and Melbourne Knights matches. Considering 1994-95 was only the second season in the NSL for the Strikers, supporters have got a lot to look forward to for future years. With this in mind it is important that we get behind the boys in the QAS side, who fought hard all season to earn a place in the National Youth League finals. These youngsters are possibly the Strikers' stars of tomorrow and deserve all the support they can get. Greg Brown's side will take on Parramatta this Sunday in Sydney in their first match of the finals series. We would like to wish the boys all the best for their sudden death match this weekend.

Willoburn's concerns mount

In a game which never really reached any great heights, Wynnum defeated Willowburn 1-0 at Carmichael Park last Sunday.

Swirling wind conditions did not help either team, in a battle of two of the XXXX League's less glamorous sides.

Worries must be beginning to mount for Willowburn, who have only one point to show after five rounds.

Poor finishing proved costly for them, as they dominated in various stages of the game.

The lack of strike power was evident in the very first minute when Brett Patterson squandered a golden opportunity to give his side the lead, shooting wide with only Kevin Tatton to beat in the Wynnum goal.

Wynnum had the chance to go ahead eight minutes later through much maligned striker Wayne Corbett, who headed straight into the arms of Willowburn goalkeeper Trevor Gilliland.

The home side were also troubled by inadequate finishing in front of goal, with Simon Graham not troubling Gilliland in the 28th minute, after good lead-up work from Corbett and Billy McDermott.

They finally did manage to take the lead on the stroke of half-time through an unmarked Duncan Andrews, who took advantage of Malcolm Van Basten's cut back from the left to guide the ball past Gilliland.

The Willowburn custodian showed his prowess in the 63rd minute, firstly denying McDermott, and then recovering to save from Corbett.

It was Tatton's turn to show his talent 18 minutes later, doing well to parry away a

powerful Anthony Brown drive from the edge of the box.

The home side could have twice extended their lead in the last five minutes. Firstly Graham chose to shoot from an acute angle instead of looking for an unmarked Tony McKinless at the far post in the 42nd minute.

Then a minute later McKinless was the villain shooting wide from just outside the six yard box, after receiving a pinpoint McDermott pass.

Wynnum coach Wayne Gracey was relieved to get the three points.

"We made it a lot harder than it should have been," Gracey said.

"We've still got improvement in us. We haven't really had much time together."

Willowburn coach Steve Pennells lamented his sides' poor finishing.

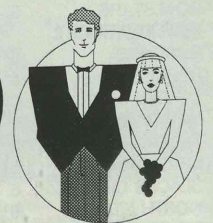
"For 75 percent of the second half we were pressing forward but we couldn't score," Pennells said.

"We've just got to keep going. There's no sense in hitting the panic button yet."

National plan in pipeline

The Australian Soccer Federation Board of Commissioners has confirmed that it is moving to develop a National Soccer Plan.

As part of the early stages of the development of the plan it is proposed that a Soccer Summit be held in May 1995 following the National Soccer League Grand Final.

George Negus, ABC Television journalist and soccer enthusiast has been invited by the Australian Soccer Federation to facilitate the summit, which will form the basis of the National Soccer Plan.

The summit will involve the entire Australian soccer community and will include State and Territory Federations, National Soccer League Clubs, referees, amateur bodies, players, coaches, and soccer administrators.

The summit will discuss all of the issues relevant to the future of Australian soccer including Australia's competitiveness as an international soccer nation, the viability and standing of the National Soccer League, the progression of soccer to a higher degree of professionalism and the continued development and training of junior players.

Newley appointed Chairman of the Australian Soccer Federation, David Hill, said: "We want to address, in a positive way, the opportunities and challenges facing Australian soccer. It is important that the Australian Soccer Federation doesn't develop the national plan unilaterally, but harnesses the creativity and energy of the entire soccer community.

"Before developing a detailed plan it is important that we provide an opportunity for people with an interest in soccer to make a contribution *

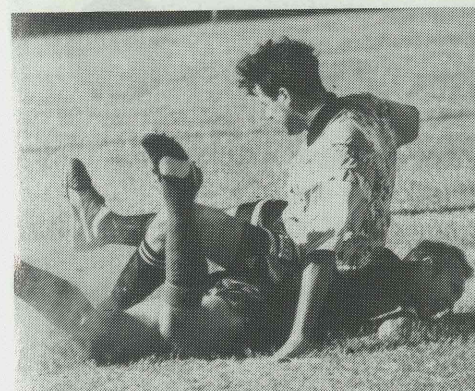

The Australian women's soccer team has made an extremely promising start to their campaign in South America with an emphatic 7-0 victory in their first ever match against Argentina. After an horrific 8 hour bus journey through Brazil, the Aussie girls played out of their skins in front of 15,000 spectators at Uberlandia Football Stadium. The match was their first in the Uberlandia International Tournament which involves sides from around the globe, including the Brazilian National team, who Australia will face later this week.

An Australian Soccer Federation Board meeting held earlier in the week ratified the nominations for the two vacant positions on the Board. Peter Gray will take his position on the Board as the representative of the State Federations, while George Vasilopolous is the new Commissioner representing the National Soccer League Clubs.

Still on the national scene, Sydney United captain and Soccerro Tony Popovic has been awarded the 1994/95 Soccer International PUMA NSL Player of the Year Award. The award recognises the most outstanding player of the NSL season, and is the most prestigious media award in Australian soccer. Popovic edged out Matt Horsley (Wollongong) and Danny Tiatto (Melbourne Knights) to win the award.

SBS Television has announced it will telecast exclusive coverage of the 1995 World Youth Championships focusing particularly on the Young Soccerroos attempt to win Australia's first ever medal in an international competition. SBS will screen the Young Soccerroos' first match against Costa Rica early Friday morning beginning at 2.30am. The Network will be telecasting more than 50 hours of coverage including live matches and highlights.

Back on the local scene, the first matches of the Queensland Cup were played last week with the following results: Lions 4 d Wynnum 1, Rochedale 7 d North Brisbane 2, Brisbane City 2 d Pine Rivers 1, Coalstars 4 d Grange 0, Taringa 3 d Easts 0, Gold Coast 4 d Sunshine Coast 0. One match is set down for next Wednesday April 19, when Taringa travel to Beerwah to do battle with the Sunshine Coast.

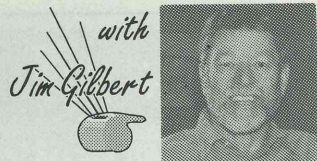

These trips are excellent for team bonding with forages around the nightclubs of North Queensland ensuring some good stories come back with the players.

One player currently training with Taringa actually met his current girlfriend of two years on a trip to Cairns.

Unfortunately for every trip to the northern towns, there's also trips to Toowoomba, the Gold Coast and the Sunshine Coast.

The worst part of this deal is these games are usually played midweek and are about as popular as a snakebite.

However, it's important for the game's popularity that these venues are included in the Cup competition, with the usual few upsets indicating how competitive the country sides are.

This leads to the yearly call for a return to the old State League competition, including most sides playing in the Queensland Cup.

With crowd numbers at XXXX League games floundering, the game in Queensland certainly needs a kick-start.

The improved efforts of the Brisbane Strikers has provided some exposure, but at state level, their is little return on their popularity.

If the Strikers allow their players to return for a short stint in the XXXX League, this may provide some sort of short term improvement, but little long term benefit.

There's no easy answer to the current dilemma, so I'll let someone else find a cure, it's too difficult for me.

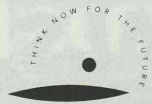
