City v Pirates at Perry Park

This week sees a split round of competition for the XXXX League as the XXXX State side embarks on its tour of New Zealand and the quest for the Sir Robert Muldoon Memorial Trophy.

Because of this mass-exodus of XXXX League players, only three Round 8 fixtures have been set down for the weekend, including a double header at Perry Park on Saturday night.

After a strenuous Queensland Cup campaign last weekend, the local XXXX League sides would no doubt be looking forward to refocussing their efforts towards the Premier competition.

The double header at Perry Park sees Willowburn take on Lions in the first match with City and Rochedale contesting the Match of the Round in the second game.

Willowburn had a fairly successful round of Queensland Cup matches, defeating Grange Thistle and Toowoomba and only going down 1-0 to Coalstars. They should be coming into the match with Lions quietly confident of an upset result.

Lions had an easy 4-1 Cup win over Tropical Far North Queensland but went down 2-1 in a gruelling encounter with the North Queensland Razorbacks over the weekend.

Brisbane City Coach Bobby Hamilton should be quietly confident going into this weekend's match.



With only two wins to their credit so far this season, Lions need maximum points here to consolidate their position in the top five.

Injuries could disrupt Gordon Arrowsmith's plans for victory however, with three key players all in doubt following the match against the Razorbacks.

Goalkeeper Rob Farrow (torn quadricep), Wayne Hinton (dislocated shoulder), and Zeljko Vrbanjac (knee ligaments) could all miss the match.

A saving grace could be the return of former Queensland representative Warren Allen from injury. Allen played two full matches over the long weekend and is ready to get back into the XXXX League.

In the late match at Perry Park undefeated teams Brisbane City and Rochedale Rovers will do battle, complete with their XXXX State team representatives. Both sides have three players in the Queensland squad and will be looking to gain the upper hand for future clashes.

In the other Round 8 match, North Brisbane take on a Taringa side that has enjoyed a week off, at Lanham Park, while Brisbane Lions take on Grange in their Round eleven clash on Wednesday night at Richlands.

Qld Cup finals spots hinge on local derby

A successful weekend of 1995 XXXX Queensland Cup matches throughout the State has not yet finalised this year's quarter finalists.

One match remains in the preliminary rounds in Group One, and two teams must await the result to see if they are to progress.

The local derby between Tropical Far North Queensland and the undefeated North Queensland Razorbacks to be played on Sunday is the game in question.

Currently Brisbane Lions are on top of the group with six points and a plus five goal difference, with the Razorbacks on four points with a game in hand.

A win for the North Queensland side would see them qualify first in their group and see Lions qualify with a superior goal difference to some of the other second placed teams.

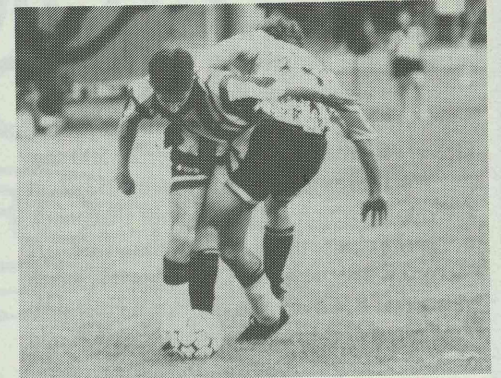
Should the Razorbacks draw or lose, Lions would win the group but Willowburn in Group Four would find their way into the quarter finals.

Only three of the country sides had wins over the teams from the XXXX League.

The Razorbacks upset Brisbane Lions 2-1 in Townsville, Toowoomba thrashed Grange Thistle 4-0, while the Gold Coast edged out Eastern Suburbs 2-1.

None of the other country sides were completely outclassed however, with Rockhampton being the heartbreak story of the Cup weekend yet again.

For the second year in a row, the Rockhampton boys went through the preliminary rounds undefeated only to miss out on a quarter finals berth.

The Sunshine Coast, despite copping a couple of hidings were unlucky not to come away with any points from the weekend's matches after narrowly going down 4-3 to Easts.

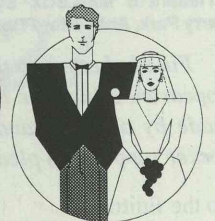
The most disappointing team in the Cup was Grange Thistle.

EDITORIAL

Last weekend's Rugby international between the Australian Wallabies and Argentina again made me draw comparisons between crowd attendances, this time with two different football codes. Just over 20,500 saw the Wallabies crush Argentina 53-7 at Ballymore, which was really not that many more than attended the recent one-off Socceros match against Colombia. It is worth noting that Rugby seems to place a great deal of its efforts on its representative season and as such ensures a series of international matches are played at Ballymore each year. It appears continuity in the representative season has maintained crowd stability in terms of numbers for Rugby, and this is something the ASF would hopefully consider when allocating future international matches. In only our second international match in ten years Brisbane achieved a healthy 13,500 attendance. There is no doubt in my mind that 20,000 plus crowds could be attracted to future international games if the ASF allocated a set

number of matches to Brisbane every year.

Still on the representative scene, the XXXX State team takes off for New Zealand on Tuesday for their first match against Canterbury the following day. Three days later the side will contest the Sir Robert Muldoon Memorial Trophy against current holders Auckland. Queensland has never held the trophy despite coming perilously close last year only to lose on penalties at Perry Park. This year the squad has been bolstered by a number of NSL players and hopefully their added experience will help the side to a couple of wins against these New Zealand provincial sides. Rochedale goalkeeper Clint Del Santo is also a late inclusion to the side following the withdrawal of Brisbane Strikers and Olyroo custodian Clint Bolton.

One goal enough for United

One goal was enough for Olympic United to defeat a battling Acacia Ridge side at Goodwin Park last Sunday night.

A 65th minute strike from Steve Savvakis proved the difference between the sides, and lifted the home side to within touching distance of the top five.

Worries are beginning to mount for Ridge, who have only recorded two wins from seven games since their relegation from the XXXX League last season.

Player-coach Tim Brown conceded the pressure was starting to mount, saying the club was looking to bolster their squad.

"We're in the market to buy a couple of midfielders," Brown said.

While looking to purchase players, he also said the club was in the rebuilding stage.

"We've lost seven players from last year's side."

Neither Ridge or Olympic looked the goods early. It was 33 minutes before there was a genuine chance, and it was one Olympic should have taken.

Peter Apolakiatis latched onto a great through ball from Nick Contoudios but flayed his shot wide with only Steven Evans to beat in the Ridge goal.

Olympic keeper John Pappas showed his wares seven minutes later saving well at the near post from a Michael Butchard strike.

It was appropriate that Olympic's winner should be set up by their two best players, Contoudios and evergreen Cheetah Vosuga.

Vosuga found Contoudios with a beautiful through ball which the speedy youngster latched onto, before cutting it back for an unmarked Savvakis to guide home.

The game came to life seven minutes later following the dismissal of Acacia Ridge striker Adrian Thomson for what appeared to be dissent.

The ten man Ridge outfit showed great fight after the setback, and were probably unlucky not to equalise.

Ridge favourite Davey Richardson could have given his side a point in the 84th minute, when the ball fell invitingly for him on the right hand edge of the box. His shot went just wide though, with Pappas beaten.

With Ridge pushing forward and leaving their defence exposed, an unmarked Contoudios had a golden opportunity to double his side's lead in the 91st, after getting on the end of a Steve Konstantinou cross.

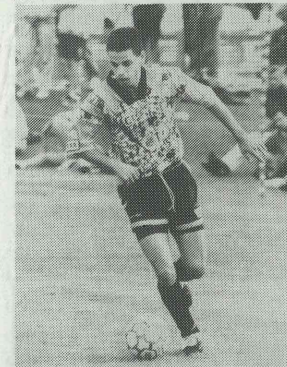
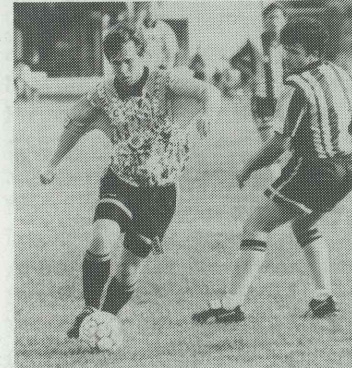
He missed, however, from six yards. It did not have a great effect though, with the final whistle coming seconds later.

Olympic coach Frank Campbell was pleased with the performance of his side.

He felt the win could be the start of a run for Olympic, after their tough start to the season, which saw them on only seven points before the win.

"We are playing most of the bottom teams in the next four or five weeks," a confident Campbell said.

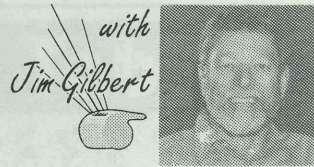

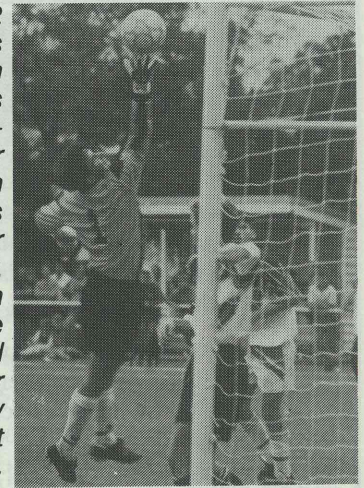
