

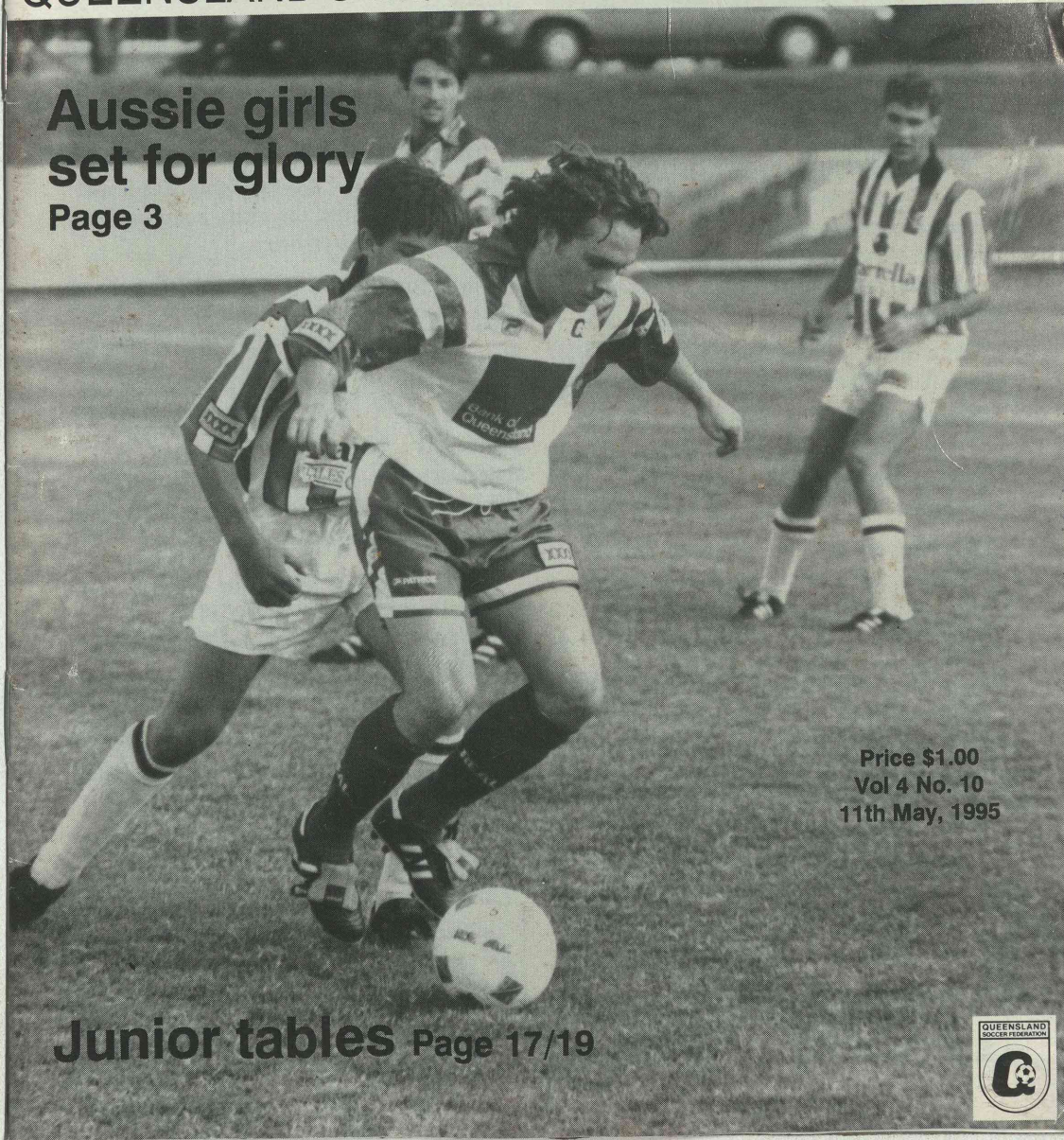

Our Cups runneth over - Qld, QSC and Qantas Cup news

Willowburn have edged into the quarter finals of the 1995 XXXX Queensland Cup following the North Queensland Razorbacks' heartbreaking loss to Tropical Far North Queensland on the weekend.

In front of their home crowd in Townsville, the Razorbacks, who seemed odds on to be the only country side to make the next stage of the Cup, went down in the local derby 3-2.

This ensured Brisbane Lions finished on top of Group 1 and Willowburn would gain safe passage into the quarter finals as the next best qualifier. However, it also meant no country team would make the Cup quarter final cut this year.

The quarter finals for the 1995 XXXX Queensland Cup have been set down for the weekends of June 10-12 and June 17-18.

Aussie girls set for glory

Three Queensland girls have taken off for Sweden with the first Australian team to reach the World Cup finals for women.

Eastern Suburbs duo Kayleen Janssen and Sonia Gegenhuber, along with QAS defender Louise McMurtrie were included in the squad.

Both Centre-Backs, Sonia and Louise could be fighting against one another for a spot in the top team.

Eye On Soccer met with Sonia and Louise prior to their departure, to discuss their World Cup campaign.

Australia were extremely unfortunate to miss out on making the inaugural women's World Cup after going down on goal differences to New Zealand four years ago, and Sonia used the agony of this defeat to spur her on during the qualifying rounds for this year's Cup.

"It really means a lot to me making this World Cup after coming so close to qualifying last time," 24 year old Sonia said.

"Personally, I've put so much effort into making the side, with extra training making it impossible to keep a full-time job or have a social life."

Sonia left her home state of South Australia two years ago in her pursuit for World Cup glory and believed the move was very worthwhile.

"Playing in Queensland has made me a better player and the extra training with the QAS girls and guys has helped me considerably.

At just 19, Louise is one of the youngest members of the squad and also believes the extra training with the QAS boys under Greg Brown and morning sessions with assistant coach Connie Selby have given her an edge over other women throughout the country.

"Training with the boys is a lot more intense, you have to focus a lot more and your skills improve heaps," Louise said.

The young defender said she was excited at the team's prospects over in Sweden but was quick to point out Australia's tough draw.

"We've drawn the toughest group with Germany, Denmark and China, but we have a pretty balanced team so I'd like to think we can get through to the next rounds," she said.

"It's really quite overwhelming for me, considering this is the first Australian team to make the World Cup finals. I didn't want to wait for the next one."

Sonia too is quietly confident of a solid result for Australia.

"We've played a lot of games together now and have had a good preparation," Sonia said.

We've got a good chance to make it into the quarter finals and confidence is right up after our win against Brazil last month."

The girls travel to Vancouver to play Canada, and move onto Scotland to play the national team before entering Sweden, where they meet a club side then the Swedish national side before the actual World Cup.

City boys plunder Pirates

Brisbane City continued their dominance of this year's XXXX League with a strong 2-1 victory over Rochedale Rovers at Perry Park last Saturday night.

It was a game of two halves however, with the League's newcomers falling asleep in the second half and allowing a determined Rochedale back into the match.

In front of a healthy crowd City came out with guns blazing in the first period, and put on the entertaining style of football people associate teams under Bobby Hamilton with.

Midfielder John Schiavo, making a rare appearance in City's starting line-up, proved dangerous early on with some neat passes creating a host of opportunities for strikers Mark Battistin and Warren Cooley.

In fact it was the combination of Schiavo and Cooley that created City's first goal in the 19th minute, Cooley rounding Rochedale and Queensland keeper Clint Dal Santo after great lead-up work from his midfielder.

City continued to pepper Rochedale's young custodian, mainly through Cameron Pearse, who had a number of chances but was unable to finish.

The Pirates came close to equalising twenty minutes later however, after a tireless John Weatherby turned Shane Haddow and Pearse just outside the penalty area on the left to send a perfect cross to a flying Craig Collins, whose bulletlike header was denied by the crossbar.

A minute later City made it 2-0 when Battistin found space on the right and sent a short cross for Warren Cooley to collect his double.

Rochedale came out a different side after the break, and inspired by some committed play by Andy Lees took advantage of a City side napping.

Lees made some menacing runs in the

second half and was rewarded in the 62nd minute after he was brought down in the penalty area by Mark Greer.

Lees made no mistake converting the spot kick to make it 2-1.

Rochedale, realising they were back in the game at 2-1, kicked up another gear, and had their chances improved even more following the sendoff of City defender Nick Seeley with 15 minutes of play remaining.

Seeley was given his cue for an early shower following an altercation with Rochedale youngster Gavin Wright, which saw him receive his second yellow card for the match.

Rochedale had a host of chances in the dying stages but poor finishing let them down and allowed City their eighth win from as many matches.

City coach Bobby Hamilton was happy to take the victory but expressed concerns about his side's lack of urgency in the second half.

"At the end of the day we got the desired result, and we're continuing to prove to teams that we're going to be hard to beat," Hamilton said.

"I think only complacency is going to beat us this season."

Pirates coach Kim Wishart said it was a game of two halves and was disappointed with his team's lack of intensity in the first half.

"We didn't show enough intensity in the first half and got punished for it," he said.

"In the second half we lifted and were much more positive but you can't give a team two goals start.

"We can play better than we did." *

Injury time goal saves Taringa's run of fortune

A goal in injury time from Paul Worroll gave Taringa a 2-1 away win over North Brisbane at Lanham Park last Sunday.

Joel Douglas' 92nd minute strike was deflected past an outstretched Michael Jones in the North Brisbane goal by Worroll, and has kept an unlucky North in the relegation zone.

It was the fifth time this season that the Aces have been beaten in the dying minutes of a match, and left coach Gary McDowall lost for words.

"We are so close, yet so far away," a disconsolate McDowall said.

"Things haven't been breaking for the boys. It's killing them."

North went into the match without three of their best players in John Stewart, Willie Carter, and Sam Tancred, yet still took it up to their more fancied opponents.

So much so in fact, that after an even opening half an hour, the Aces took the lead in the 34th minute through Michael Lane, who took advantage of Taringa keeper Jason Lucas' fumble from an Aaron Aldridge corner, to smash the ball home from six yards.

Their lead did not last long however, with Brenley Jefferd catching out Jones from about twenty five yards to sneak his shot into the bottom corner only eight minutes later.

North had two great opportunities to regain the lead in the opening twenty minutes of the second half but were twice denied by Lucas.

Firstly in the 53rd minute, Aldridge beat Taringa's offside trap to be left in a one-on-one situation with Lucas. The Taringa custodian saved bravely, however.

Then eleven minutes later it was Aldridge again in the same situation against Lucas, who came out on top, saving at point blank range.

It was Jones' turn to show his wares in the North Brisbane goal in the 70th minute, saving low at his near post from a Worroll header.

One minute before Taringa's winner Aldridge had a goal disallowed for offside. From the next play the ball was sent down the park, leading to Worroll's goal.

Taringa coach Juan Cutillas was relieved to pick up the valuable three points.

"The game was always going to be hard. They close down well, and are very well coached. They were pushing people forward all the time on the break and catching us out," Cutillas said.

He again commented on his side's lack of fire-power up front.

"We had some very good chances, and didn't put them away."

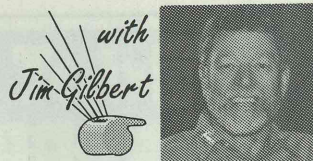

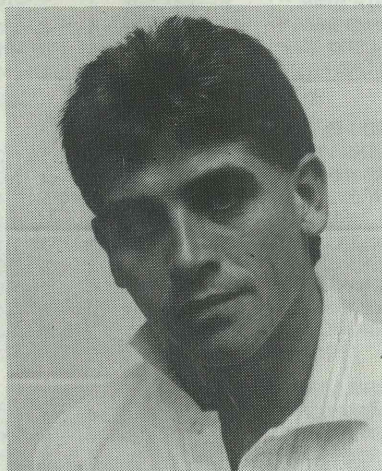
Turns out the player lost more than the shirt off his back and returned to the hotel later that evening wearing only his shoes and socks.
