# The Hammers are here...

The Coca-Cola Olyroos will be coming up against one of the most interesting clubs in the English Premier League when they step out on Suncorp Stadium to meet West Ham United Saturday night.

West Ham has enjoyed a colourful history, winning its fair share of silverware during its 100 year existence.

Originally known as the Thames Ironworks Football Club, West Ham was formed in 1895 and found success as a professional club after moving to Upton Park in 1904.

The Hammers first significant victory was in 1911 when they defeated Manchester United in an FA Cup tie.

Probably the most successful period for the Hammers was the 1960's, when they won an FA Cup final along with the European Cup Winners Cup, and had past legends Bobby Moore, Martin Peters and Geoff Hurst feature prominently in England's only World Cup triumph.

In fact Hurst and Moore scored all four of England's goals in their 4-2 win over West Germany.

Current players striving to maintain the West Ham tradition include prolific goal-scorer and English international Tony Cottee, and goalkeeping legend Les Sealey, just two of the



# Internationals decend on

# Brisbane

Queensland Soccer has a few overseas visitors this week, all of which come from very different backgrounds but have soccer as a common denominator.

Apart from English Premier League team West Ham United, Japanese J-League side Yokohama Marinos are currently using Brisbane's Perry Park as the venue for their midseason Intensive Training Camp, while a US women's team from the College of William and Mary will be in town for two matches.

The girls from the States are affectionately known as the "Tribe" and finished the 1994 season with a 17-4 win/loss record and a national ranking of 5th in the Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America Coaches poll.

The Soccer America magazine ranked the Tribe third in the United States, after the side won its conference championship for the second year running, defeating all six opponents whilst amassing a 49-1 goal difference.

The girls will be playing a Brisbane North representative side 7pm Friday, May 26 at O'Callaghan Park and back up again 7pm Monday night, May 29 at Mt Gravatt's Dittmer Park to take on the QAS.

The Marinos are owned by giant motor company Nissan, and are currently on top of the J-League after the first 16 rounds of the competition.

Japan's J-League is structured so that teams have a month long break in the middle of the season to allow National team representatives to get together for National training camps.

Local teams use this time to hone their skills in their own intensive training camps, with some of the clubs making a trip overseas for this purpose. Marinos' Vice Captain Fumitake Miura who is currently in Australia training at Perry Park

The Marinos have probably the largest support of any Japanese team and have brought over around 60 people, including 35 players and a number of coaches, trainers, strappers, doctors, translators and other officials.

The side has two Japanese National players, who are not on this tour, as well as four international players from Argentina, including 1994 World Cup player Ramon Medina-Bello.

Training sessions that are highly organised, are an eye-opener and are open to the public.

The team will train at Perry Park until June 1, from 10am-12pm and 7-9pm daily, before heading home to continue their campaign. \*\*



## EDITORIAL .....



## City notch up nine in a row

Brisbane City defeated North Brisbane 3-0 in a top versus bottom clash at Lanham Park last Sunday.

The win stretched City's winning sequence to nine, and has kept neighbours North entrenched at the foot of the table with a miserly two points.

This was the first official "Italian Derby" between the two teams in over two years, resulting in North Brisbane's best crowd for the season.

The soggy conditions helped neither side in the opening 45 minutes with the youthful Aces outfit holding the much vaunted attacking force of Mark Battistin, Stephen Glockner, and Warren Cooley at bay.

The best chance of the half fell to Queensland representative Battistin four minutes before the break, who latched onto a Cameron Pearse cross with a spectacular scissor kick, only to see it hit the post.

Battistin turned the supplier three minutes into the second half setting up City's opening goal for Stephen Glockner, who calmly slotted the ball under North keeper Richard Cooper.

The visitors made it two in the 56th minute, this time through Cooley, who got on the end of a Darren Mair cross, to head the ball past Cooper from six yards.

City continued to attack from the flanks with Battistin coming close to making it three after an hour, guiding a Cameron Pearse cross just past the post.

The Aces had a chance to pull one back in the 67th minute through substitute Aaron Aldridge who put his angled shot wide, with only Paul Jabs to beat in the City goal.

The result was sealed for City six minutes



later by the competition's leading scorer Battistin, who made it nine for the season, heading home a Pearse cross from the right.

He could have brought up double figures for the season only two minutes after, but spooned another header over the bar, again from a Pearse cross.

Victorious coach Bobby Hamilton was pleased with his side's second half performance, after a slow beginning.

"It took us a while to get going," Hamilton said.

He had words of praise for the young, inexperienced North Brisbane outfit.

"If they keep playing that way they won't get relegated."

North coach Gary McDowall was very straight forward in his analysis of the game.

"They were too good a side. I have no complaints. They are the best team we've played in the competition," McDowall said.

His side's injury run continued with new QAS signing Ben Woods being carried off.

"I can't remember the last time we've fielded the same side for two weeks running," lamented McDowall.



The demise of North Star comes on top of North Brisbane's pre-season move towards amateurism and the loss of several Queensland lower division clubs to insolvency.

Only a half dozen of the current XXXX League clubs could be considered in a healthy financial state, with the gap between the 'haves' and the 'have nots' getting larger each year.


