Taringa contains City to draw

Brisbane City bounced back from their first loss of the season mid-week to secure a valuable point against Taringa Rovers in their 1-1 draw at Spencer Park on Sunday.

Taringa, who had won six of their last seven games, dominated the first half but struggled to hold a rampant City in the second stanza as the competition leaders moved into top gear.

Taringa converted their early dominance midway through the first half after Anthony McCulloch's cross found teenage midfielder Joel Douglas unmarked in the Brisbane City box.

Douglas coolly bundled the ball into the City net to score his third goal of the year and give the visitors a well deserved lead.

McCulloch had a golden opportunity to extend the lead minutes later but his shot was well saved by City keeper Daniel Duke.

City's best chances in the first half fell to striker Steve Glockner, but he was denied by the crossbar and Taringa custodian Jason Lucas, allowing Taringa to lead 1-0 at halftime.

City coach Bobby Hamilton's half time talk proved the perfect tonic for his lacklustre side and they tied the game only two minutes after the break.

Substitute Ian Hutchison, playing in his first game after a stint with the Brisbane Strikers, played a one-two with Cameron Pearse before finding striker Warren Cooley with an accurate cross.

Cooley volleyed the ball past a stranded Lucas to score his tenth goal of the year and provide the catalyst for a revitalised City onslaught.

City laid siege on the Taringa goal and it was only the outstanding work of Lucas and a stubborn Rover's defence led by Paul Worroll that kept Rovers in the game.

Damien Waugh, Cooley and Glockner all went close for City before Taringa almost snatched the points in the dying minutes when substitute Martin Matula's tame effort was saved by Duke with only the keeper to beat



New faces in State squad

XXXX State team coach Juan Cutillas will be adding another three names to his squad set to take on the New South Wales Soccerblues at Perry Park on June 17.

Cutillas has already announced that NSL players Brian MacNicol of Heidelberg and John Koch from the Parramatta Eagles, would come into the squad to replace injured Brisbane Strikers players Alan Hunter and Chris Slater.

He will also bring in another three players from the XXXX League to help strengthen the squad's depth.

At this stage North Star duo Michael Brockwell and Fraser Cuba, Lions' hard worker Craig Priddy, Rochedale dynamo Andy Lees, and City's leading scorer Warren Cooley would be the frontrunners for the three extra spots.

Hunter and Slater would have been ruled out anyway due to a lack of match fitness, which was also the reason Chay Hews lost his spot.

"The Strikers players are now in the situation where they must follow their Club's program," Cutillas said.

"Because they are not playing in the XXXX League, they are not match fit and are unable to play.

"It's not easy letting them go because they played such an important role on tour in New Zealand, but there is no way they will be in the right sort of condition."

Koch and MacNicol were unavailable to tour last month due to work commitments but both have been playing in the New South Wales and Victorian State Leagues with Warringah Freshwater and Albion Redsox respectively.

Socceroo and South Melbourne star Jason Polak will be unavailable for the Perry Park clash due to the International match between the Socceroos and Ghana in Perth on June 18. Pine Rivers' Striker Lee Scriggins will also be unavailable for the Perry Park encounter due to work commitments in England, but should be on hand for the return match in Coffs Harbour on July 9.

Coming back into the squad will be City's solid defender Mark Greer.

Cutillas said he was not worried by the strength of the Soccerblues squad, which boasted a host of NSL stars from Sydney United and Sydney Olympic.

"I'm not scared," he said. "We put practically a XXXX League rep side against them last year and beat them."

"I have so much faith in my players because what they lack in NSL experience they make up for in courage and determination.

"They want to play for Queensland."

Pine Rivers break drought

After a frustrating opening ten matches Pine Rivers finally recorded their first win of the season with a 2-1 victory over Grange Thistle at Lanham Park last Friday night.

New signing Lee Sriggins' 81st minute header proved to be the winner for Rivers, who battled hard for the three points.

For Rivers coach Gerry Lindsay there was a feeling of great relief at the game's conclusion.

"It didn't come easy. The pressure was there on the lads," Lindsay said.

His side got away to a flying start taking the lead after only eight minutes through Dene Almond, who capitalised on good work from Robert Marschner on the left to slot the ball home from close range past Nathan Higgins in the Thistle goal.


Thistle had the chance to reply in the 16th minute, but Wayne McGauley's shot was well saved by Rivers custodian Peter Underhill.

Scriggins nearly got on the scoresheet in the 34th minute after a Kiely Calleja (pictured) cross. His header went straight to Higgins.

The visitors could have again doubled their lead in injury time of the first half when a Clayton Koch cross was headed on to the bar by Almond, with the rebound falling for the same player whose header was this time cleared off the line.

Grange came out firing after the break against a strangely subdued Rivers side who seemed to leave their best in the locker room.

It therefore came as no surprise to see Thistle get back on level terms in the 54th minute through Damien Lundberg, who got on the end of an Effie Cassar deflected cross, to guide the ball home.



Slowly Rivers got back into the swing of the game as they searched for that elusive winner.

Young Higgins was his side's saviour in the 63rd minute with a great double save. He firstly parried a fierce Scriggins drive, and then recovered to hold on to Calleja's shot from the rebound.

Thistle held on until nine minutes from time before Scriggins' winner. A beautiful first time cross from Graham Eden was powerfully met by the Queensland representative, whose bullet-like header left Higgins with no chance.

The home side had one final chance to equalise in the 85th minute through goalscorer Lundberg, but this time he placed his angled shot wide of the post.

Scriggins' winner proved to Lindsay that the outlay his club made was well worth it.

"He's scoring goals and he's a good target man," Lindsay said.

He conceded, however, there was still work to be done, and was not happy with his side's performance after half time.

"We lost the plot early in the second half."

Wynnum are the rank outsiders to finish in the placings whilst the rest of the field can write their own tickets.


At the bottom, the battle for relegation looks to be a race of five, with Grange Thistle in a dangerous rut that has seen them slip back to the backmarkers.
