Qld Cup quarters underway

The quarter-finals of the 1995 XXXX Queensland Cup started last night, with Pine Rivers and Brisbane City clashing and Taringa up against North Star at Perry Park.

The focus now turns to this Saturday night at Soccer Headquarters when the second double header takes place, with Willowburn and Coalstars meeting at 5pm and Brisbane Lions and Rochedale in the late match at 7pm.

Willowburn were a little lucky to get this far in the Cup after riding their way into the quarter-finals on a favourable result in the Group One match between the North Queensland Razorbacks and Far North Queensland.

The Razorbacks looked certain to win that game to take the victory in Group One ahead of Brisbane Lions, who would have qualified on goal differences in any case.

However a shock 3-2 result to underdogs Far North Queensland put paid to the Razorbacks' finals hopes and allowed Willowburn, who qualified second in Group Four to move into the quarters.

Magpies' coach Steve Pennells is putting all of that aside however and seemed confident his side could do the job this Saturday night.

"If we go out with the same attitude we had

against City last week, then I can see no reason why we can't make the semis."

Brisbane Lions will have a tough assignment in attempting to put a halt to last year's winners Rochedale in their defence of the Cup.

Lions have been playing well under new coach Miron Bleiberg, who made it clear at the time he took control of the side a couple of weeks ago, that one of his major goals was to win the Queensland Cup.

They were unable to secure the services of the experienced Frank Pimblett, who earlier in the week indicated he was considering switching clubs.

Nevertheless, Rochedale coach Kim Wishart knows his side will be tested this Saturday night.

"Our guys are in a positive frame of mind, but you can be sure Miron will have his side fired up and well prepared," Wishart said.

"Lions are one of three teams this year that have taken points off us so we'll be looking to set the record straight there.

"The other thing you have to remember is that we are the current Cup holders and we're pretty determined to keep a hold of it."



Results highlight closeness of competition

Last week's round of matches in the XXXX League showed just how close this competition can be, with a number of teams coming close to upstaging their more fancied opponents.

Cellar-dwellers Willowburn could not capitalise on a 1-0 half-time lead against Competition leaders Brisbane City at Spencer Park on Sunday, and succumbed 4-3 late in injury time, which proved to be a point of contention with coach Steve Pennells.

The highlight of the match was three goals from the boot of Willowburn's Craig McConnell, who returned a fortnight ago to the Magpies after a twelve month stint at the Sunshine Coast.

Eastern Suburbs pulled a little further away from the relegation zone following their 2-0 victory over Grange Thistle at Heath Park.

Goals by Paul Georgiou and Stein Grodum sealed the result, making the battle to escape relegation very interesting, with five teams still not clear of the danger.

Grange Thistle in particular would be looking for a change of fortune, with their last win way back in Round Six.

Coach Danny Docherty believes all that is needed however is a bit more commitment from his players.

Taringa continued their good run of form last Saturday night with an Andrew Brayshaw hat-trick setting up a 5-2 win over North Star at O'Callaghan Park, while Rochedale had a strong 2-0 win over Wynnum at Underwood Park.

Rochedale are now only two points behind City on the table and look to be hitting the sort of form they were in at the end of last season, when they were unlucky not to make the finals.

Brisbane Lions dominated in front of their home crowd with a 3-2 win over Pine Rivers.

Craig Priddy scored a double for the home side, with Lee Scriggins again proving what a valuable acquisition he was for Rivers, scoring his third goal in two matches for his new team.

In the final match of the round North Brisbane, who defeated North Star earlier in the week, were again out of luck, going down 2-1 to Coalstars, courtesy of another double by the in-form Troy Hews.

Aces coach Gary McDowall said he was getting very frustrated with his young side's inconsistency.

Only two XXXX League matches will be played over the Queen's Birthday weekend due to the quarter-finals of the 1995 XXXX Queensland Cup.

Both matches are on Sunday, with Pine Rivers set to clash with Eastern Suburbs at Wendy Allison Park, in a relegation zone battle sure to bring the best out of both sides, while at Carmichael Park Wynnum and North Brisbane are set to meet.

EDITORIAL

Some clubs have queried the necessity of investing in player insurance. Clubs are required to take out the cover recomended by the Queensland Soccer Federation and agreed to by the Council of Clubs. The benefits include Legal (Public) Liability, Coaches Professional Indemnity, Non-Medicare Medical Expenses, and loss of income.

It also appears some clubs are not happy paying out the required premium, which is difficult to understand given the risks that are associated with such a stand. Just last week we saw a player in the Rugby Union World Cup, from the Ivory Coast, become paralysed after damaging vertebrae at the base of his neck. On the local soccer front we had a similar scare with a player from a lower division club taken to hospital with temporary paralysis after falling awkwardly in a challenge. Fortunately he was released soon after his admission, however the point is that accidents do happen and if clubs are not covered, they could be liable to legal action. Other examples of



injuries on the weekend in the local competitions included a broken leg and broken ribs, illustrating that our sport is not injury free.

Clubs must know they are responsible for making the players aware of the amount of cover they have and the benefits to which they are entitled.

Individuals take out insurance cover for their own personal belongings such as the house and contents, the car, and even their own lives, and do not seem to complain about those premiums. Why is it then wrong, paying a premium for sports insurance? Are the players and officials not worth it? I think they are.

On the National front, David Wooley has been appointed Chief Executive of the ASF. Mr Wooley is currently the Chief Executive of Basketball Australia, a position he has held since August 1989. He has played a leading role in the high profile basketball has enjoyed in Australia in recent years.

also saw the North Queensland Razorbacks play an exhibition game against National League team Marconi, and although beaten, they did not let themselves down.

The whole point of my letter is we recently had the "Queensland" squad play New Zealand in the Sir Robert Muldoon Cup. How can we have a "Queensland" squad when not one player from outside a Brisbane club is selected? Why can't the Queensland Cup competition be taken also as a State selection for the "Queensland" squad? From players we saw in North Queensland, including Far North Queensland, there are certainly players of top calibre who should be selected. In my personal opinion, I was very impressed with the Razorbacks defence. Perhaps the Coach of the Oueensland squad should be free of club commitments so he can travel around the State and make his selections of a "wholly" Queensland squad. >

Nerang - a contender for promotion to the big one

Following their brief stint in the XXXX League back in 1991, Nerang have threatened to move back into the Premier League after a solid start to their 1995 Second Division campaign. Nerang are sitting in second position on 25 points, four points shy of leaders Beenleigh, and three points clear of their nearest rivals Rocklea. It has taken a bit of time, but player/coach Paul Cockbain is quietly confident his side can put in the performances in the second round of the competition to make the step upwards.

"I'm very happy with our start," Cockbain said. "We slumped a little in the middle part of the first round but hit back with some solid wins towards the end.

"As to our promotion prospects, we'll have a better indication in the next four to five weeks, but I think we are a definite possibility."

After being relegated from the XXXX League at the end of the 1991 season, Nerang struggled for two years in Division Two, before suffering a further setback when they were again demoted to the Third Division for the 1994 season.

Last year's Division Three Premiership rocketed the side back into Division Two and appears to have given the boys from the Gold Coast the confidence to enter the XXXX League ranks yet again.

"The sides we probably have to look out for would be Beenleigh, because they've already got four points on us, and Acacia Ridge are also a good side," Cockbain said.

Cockbain, himself part of the ill-fated Nerang XXXX League side of 1991, believes the Club lacked depth during its first Premier

"If we do go on to the XXXX League then obviously we may have to fish around the local league down here to help strengthen the Club's depth even more.


"But we're going along pretty well. The local people are behind us more than ever and the media have taken a huge interest in the Club.


"The Gold Coast Bulletin has always given us good coverage, and Prime TV, the local television station down here, has begun to feature us every week."

If there is anyone in this category can the clubs please get in contact with the QSF to notify us about the situation.

Frank Farina will come out of representative retirement to play his farewell match when the Coca-Cola Socceroos take on Ghana at the Sydney Football Stadium on June 18. The game will be a tribute match to Frank for his services to Australian soccer. The ASF will hold a special tribute luncheon for Frank in the week leading up to the game. Frank's last match for the Socceroos was against Argentina in Australia's ill-fated attempt to qualify for the 1994 World Cup and following that match Frank decided to retire from international soccer. Frank was one of the first players to come through the Australian Institute of Sport system and go on to play at all levels of the national teams, including 65 senior caps.

The 1994/95 National Soccer League Champions the Melbourne Knights are currently in Japan for a historic challenge between the Australian Champion soccer team and two of the most prominent J-League clubs. The twomatch series is known as the Nikkei Challenge, with the Knights receiving \$US100,000 as well as all meals, air fare and accommodation expenses for making the trip. The matches are to be played against Jubilo Iwata, who are currently running 4th in the J-League, and last year's Emperor Cup winners Yokohama Flugels.

Before The Whistle


The remaining two games are on Monday with both the home sides expected to be far too strong for their visitors, Margate over Kingsridge and Taringa over Pine Hills.
