Blues too slick for Maroons

The New South Wales Soccerblues proved far too strong for the XXXX Queensland team in the first leg of the NIB Challenge series, defeating the Maroons 3-0 at Perry Park last Saturday night.

In what proved to be a one-sided affair, New South Wales took the game to Queensland from the outset and never looked like faltering.

The Soccerblues, made up of predominantly National League regulars, showed they were a cut above a Maroon side dominated by local XXXX League players.

Queensland keeper Graham Ross was tested twice in the first ten minutes of the match, as the Soccerblues' midfielders, led by Sydney United's Eric Hristodoulou, outplayed their opponents for skill and pace.

New South Wales finally opened the scoring in the 17th minute when captain David Barrett made inroads down the right before sending a pin-point cross for Ante Moric at the far post.

The Olyroo made no mistake driving his low shot past an outstretched Graham Ross.

The Blues continued to pressure the Queensland goal, with shots from Matt Horsley, Ante Milicic, and Matthew Bingley all saved by Ross.

Queensland captain Stein Grodum, playing in his 21st match for his State, remained solid at the back, stopping a host of New South Wales' chances with some invaluable last ditch defence.

A minute before half-time, the Blues went two up courtesy of a Matthew Bingley finish.

Horsley made a run into the Maroons' box before cutting his pass to Bingley to slot home.

With Queensland lacking creativity up front, coach Juan Cutillas gave 29 year old Fraser Cuba his first cap after the break.

The former Uruguay Youth representative added a bit more bite to Queensland's attack, as he combined well with Parramatta Eagles' striker Andrew Brayshaw.

The pair created a couple of chances early on for the Maroons, but were foiled by good defence from Mark Babic and Peter Tsekenis.

Sydney Olympic's latest signing Orlic, sealed the result for the Soccerblues in the 65th minute, following an Eric Hristodoulou free-kick just out from the corner post.

A team mate knocked the free kick on to find the youngster unmarked at the far post, in perfect position to tap the ball in for a 3-0 lead.

New South Wales coach David Ratcliffe said his side was technically superior to the Maroons.

Queensland coach Juan Cutillas agreed with Ratcliffe's sentiments.

"They were just too good for us."

Cutillas made it clear he would not be making a lot of changes to the squad for the return match in Coffs Harbour on July 9. *

Capalaba aim has purpose

After thirteen rounds of competition one of the few teams to remain undefeated in local soccer competitions is Division Three side Capalaba. Currently with eleven wins and two draws, Capalaba are seven points clear of their nearest rivals Albany Creek and seem destined for promotion into Division Two.

The Club's success this year is not by accident either. According to Capalaba President Paul Lonton, promotion this year is vital to the Club's longer term goal of providing an avenue so younger players do not have to leave the club to continue playing soccer at a higher, more competitive level.

"Basically we're sick and tired of losing our younger players to other clubs in divisions above us," Lonton said.

"That's why we believe it's imperative that we get into Division Two, where there is a Youth League and our junior players can move onto a higher level of play.

"Ultimately we would like to be able to provide our juniors with the chance of playing at the highest level possible."

Lonton said a big part of this goal was being achieved by the Club's Division Three team.

"We're currently undefeated and we intend to stay that way. But I think you can put our current success down to a couple of things.

"Firstly, we have a Management Committee, which has instilled a sense of professionalism in the Club and is committed to improving the Club in all areas, on and off the field.

"Secondly, at the beginning of the season we were at the stage where we were demanding promotion into the Second Division, so we asked the senior coach which players he needed to do the job and we got those players.

"We specifically wanted to buy a name player to attract other quality players, so we targeted Alan Prentice.

"We then got some of our old juniors back

like Denny Whitfield, Chris Banner and Deon Haynes, as well as a couple of bonus players."

These players included North Star duo Jason Parkes and Reece James, and last year's leading scorer for Brisbane City's Division Two Premiership winning side, Jeremy Woodger.

Capalaba now has nine players with XXXX League experience and looks set to attain its pre-season goal of promotion.

"Our original aim at the start of the season was to finish number one or two and gain promotion, but now I believe the Championship is a real possibility," Lonton said.

"In saying this, it is still a tough League and there are no easybeats, so we've had to keep our team focussed, hence the change of goals to an undefeated season.

"This year we're playing to win and there's no room for passengers." *

Rivers ready to roll Rovers

Following their confidence-boosting Queensland Cup quarter final victory over Brisbane City, Pine Rivers coach Gerry Lindsay believes his side can upset the inform Rochedale Rovers this Saturday night at Perry Park.

The two sides will feature in the early match of the Round 14 Perry Park double header at 5.00pm before North Star and Coalstars clash in the 7.00pm game.

The match is of significance to both teams, as Rochedale strive to overtake competition leaders Brisbane City, and Rivers battle to stay clear of the relegation zone.

"We can play football," Lindsay said, "... and we enjoy playing at Perry Park."

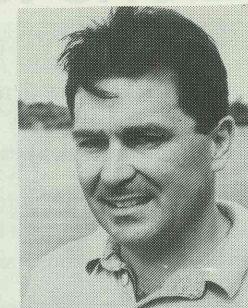
"But Rochedale are the form side of the competition and they will be tough.

Lions topple Taringa Rovers

Brisbane Lions firmly entrenched their top five standing by defeating Taringa Rovers 3-0 at Jack Speare Park last Sunday.

The win also halted Taringa's recent undefeated streak, with their last loss coming at Rochedale in round six.

It now sets up a tense battle for the all important double chance third spot between both sides, as well as North Star, who currently look shaky at fifth.

Lions coach Miron Bleiberg was pleased with the result, citing obstacles his side had to overcome.

"The ground is no good and Taringa are a better soccer side, so we played accordingly," Bleiberg said.

The match also marked the return to the XXXX League of Cheetah Vosuga, who had previously been languishing in the second division with Olympic. Bleiberg was happy with his new player's polished display.

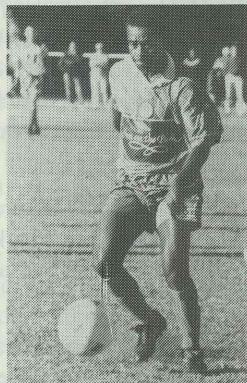
"He hasn't played at this level for a while, so it's a bit of a gamble, but today he did well."

The whole Lions side did well against a somewhat lethargic Taringa side, who had three players backing up from the previous night's State of Origin match.

The visitors took the lead after 15 minutes when a Taringa defensive lapse resulted in Fotis Skordou picking up the ball on the right, before finding an unmarked Craig Priddy, who calmly guided his shot past Jason Lucas in the Taringa goal.

Lions came close to doubling their lead six minutes before half-time with Skordou again the supplier. His cross was met by David Munn, whose header went wide of the post.

Things became worse for Taringa six minutes after the break when State representative Andrew Brayshaw was sent off for dissent, leaving his already weary side with only ten men for the remainder of the match.

Their job became that much harder when Munn made up for his earlier miss, giving his side their second in the 54th minute after Lucas fumbled a through ball, leaving the veteran striker an open goal to slam the ball into.

The home side almost pulled one back in the 74th minute, when Paul Worroll met a John Ogden free kick. His header, however, looped just over the bar.

Lions sealed the three points five minutes later when substitute Warren Allen set up an again unmarked Craig Priddy who skilfully slotted the ball past an oncoming Lucas.

Taringa coach Juan Cutillas said his side played much better than Lions and only had themselves to blame for the loss.

"We gave them three goals. They won because of our mistakes," Cutillas said.

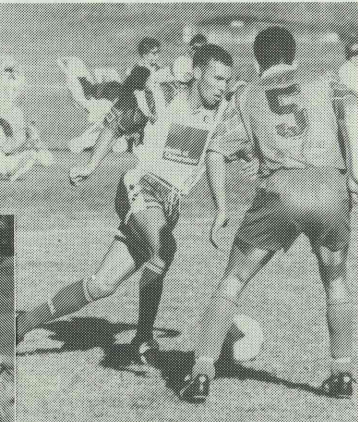
He was also critical of having to play the day after the State of Origin.

The local players will then face a void in relation to representative commitments. As a result of last year's game, several were offered National League contracts. This may not happen if local players are robbed of the chance to represent.

It's important to learn from other sports as we progress through some uncharted waters on the representative scene.

When the Queensland rugby league faced this similar dilemma, they developed a Queensland Resident's team to face their New South Wales counterparts.

The Queensland Cricket Association regularly plays Second XI games against the other states and the rugby union has a second team.

The formation of a so-called Resident's side or a Second XI would maintain some semblance of representative opportunity to local players.

The games could be played as curtain-raisers to the State of Origin series (which will be played at the end of the National League season, when the local league has already kicked off), ensuring they receive some profile.
