Revamped NSL competition leaves players wondering

The changes to the structure of the NSL which have seen Parramatta, Melbourne SC, and Heidelberg United ousted have left many players without any idea as to their futures.

Chairman of the ASF, David Hill, said the decision not to admit the three established NSL clubs had been a very tough one for the ASF to make.

However it is players like Queenslander Andrew Brayshaw, who have been put in the toughest situation.

Currently on loan to Taringa for their XXXX League campaign, Brayshaw said Parramatta's exclusion had left him in a big dilemma.

"I really don't know where I stand at the moment," Brayshaw said.

"The Club has left me and many other players in the lurch.

"I'd signed for another season with Parramatta just before I got back to Queensland, but now I'm a little disappointed because the Club signed players on the assumption that they would be playing in the NSL next season.

"I think it is unfair how they've worked it."

With three Clubs excluded, more than 50 players would currently be without an NSL team for next season, despite the fact that two teams from Canberra and Newcastle have been admitted to the competition.

"I'm absolutely gutted, because I was very happy with my performances last season and I was hoping to stay with Parramatta and build on that effort," Brayshaw said.

"Legally I don't know where I stand either.

"I don't know whether our contracts are void now because of these latest developments or not.

"I spoke with Parramatta when I heard the news and they said they would contact me within the next few days.

"In the meantime I guess I'll just have to sit tight and wait for someone to tell me something."

Brayshaw said he was unsure what he would do if he was unable to play in the NSL with Parramatta.

"I'd like the phone to be ringing off the hook with offers, but I'll just have to wait and see."

Our Frank is back!

Brisbane Strikers star signing Frank Farina has two goals to fulfil before he says he can rest easily. The first is to make the NSL play-offs with the Strikers and the second is to lift the profile of Queensland soccer.

Chairman of the Brisbane Strikers Ian Brusasco announced Farina's signing at a packed Press Conference last week and made it clear the Socceroo legend was to be the "Face of Queensland Soccer" for years to come.

Farina too believes his overseas and International experiences could help raise the profile of the game throughout the State.

"I want to try to help Queensland soccer in general and bring the profile of the game back up to the level it should be at.

"For too long New South Wales and Victoria have led the country as far as Soccer goes and it's about time that situation changed."

Farina said he thought the Strikers were the obvious avenue to bring about such a change.

"There are a lot of possibilities we could explore with the Strikers to help give the game a boost in Queensland."

Farina played down the hype surrounding his signing.

"People are going on about how I've been the biggest signing in Queensland Soccer and all the rest, but you don't think of it that way.

"You do what you do and that's it. The decision to come home was tough in one sense as there was a lot of pressure to sign over in Belgium with big money being floated around.

"However the decision was made by my wife and I, and we're happy to be back home.

"We're close to our family and friends again and as far as I'm concerned Queensland is the best place to be in Australia."

The International star has built a career many would dream about, with stints over in Belgium, France and with Italian Serie A club Bari.

"People must understand, I'm not coming back to build a career. I've signed for two years because I think I've got something to offer.

"In that time I'd like a win with the Club and to generate a bigger interest in Queensland."

EDITORIAL

The revamped National Soccer League announced earlier in the week, is one of the first steps the ASF is taking to help make soccer one of Australia's more prominent sports. While there is no doubt the new 12 team, three round competition will ensure a stronger, more appealing, and more commercially viable National Soccer League, it will also have several major implications on each of Australia's respective State Leagues. Currently the NSL season runs in the Summer months, out of season with the XXXX League and the other State Leagues throughout the nation. While this would still be the case with the new competition, three rounds means there would be 33 home and away fixtures plus a finals series, which would take the total length of the NSL season to somewhere around 40 weeks. This is very appealing to spectators and corporate sponsors alike, but it also means the NSL season would almost certainly overlap with the XXXX League season, which means there may well have to be some added

restructuring done by each of the State competition heads. Further changes may have to come about.

Of course, the subject on the lips of most Queensland soccer fans is the signing of Socceroo star Frank Farina, probably the biggest signing ever for Queensland soccer. Frank played all of his junior soccer around Cairns and left the Sunshine State in the early 1980's to further his career with the AIS. From there he played with NSL teams Canberra and Marconi, before moving overseas, where he played in the Belgian, Italian, and French First Divisions. It has almost been a case of the Prodigal Son returning home as Frank has signalled his intentions to help raise the profile of Queensland Soccer and assist in a Brisbane Strikers historic finals berth. The unassuming International legend is sure to add that extra something to the Strikers, and will be a role-model for Queensland's younger players. Welcome home Frank. ■

North Star back on track

North Star overcame an early one goal deficit to defeat Coalstars 3-1 at Perry Park last Saturday night.

The win has eased the mounting pressure on North, and has created a four point buffer between themselves and 6th placed Wynnum, who only managed a point at Brisbane City.

For Coalstars the loss has severely dented their chance of making the finals, with the Ipswich side probably having to rely on other teams to get fifth spot.

The win was pleasing for North Star coach Billy Williamson, after the disappointing loss to Willowburn a week earlier.

"The last couple of weeks have been pretty traumatic for the club. After getting a couple of breaks tonight we've hopefully turned the corner," Williamson said.

With matches against Wynnum and Grange Thistle in the next two weeks Williamson is hopeful of a resurgence.

"It's a chance to pick up points. Our aim is to finish in the top three."

Early on, though, it seemed the tough times were set to continue for the current XXXX League Champions, after Coalstars took the lead in the 9th minute.

Richard Hilli cut through North Star's midfield before supplying Adam Daly with a beautiful ball, which the youngster belted past an unmoved Robbie Harrison in goals.

David Guest should have doubled Coalstars' lead eight minutes later after excellent work from Troy Hews on the left. With an open goal beckoning, however, Guest put the ball over the crossbar from six yards.

North Star had an excellent chance to equalise in the 36th minute after a Michael

Continued pressure after the break saw North Star finally take the lead in the 64th minute when a Brockwell cross beat Coalstars keeper Kevin Farrar, before being inadvertently turned into the net by Coalstars defender Clint Scott.

Rosenthal had an excellent chance to seal the result in the 79th minute, but was denied by Farrar who produced an excellent low save in the one-on-one situation.

The result was sealed three minutes into injury time when substitute Brendon Hayward made it 3-1, after excellent interpassing between Brockwell and Rosenthal.

Coalstars coach Wayne Warren conceded his side played poorly, but cited his club's mammoth injury toll as some reason for their disappointing form.

"I defy any other team in the competition to play as we are without seven players, five of which are first team regulars," Warren said.

In its 50 year existence, Annerley has been the sporting home of thousands of players, not only in soccer but also in other sports.

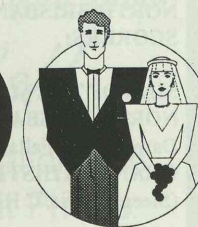

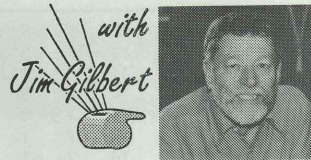

Former socceroo Robbie Dunn played on the weekend for the embattled club and another former socceroo, Greg Brown, is expected to play for the club this weekend.

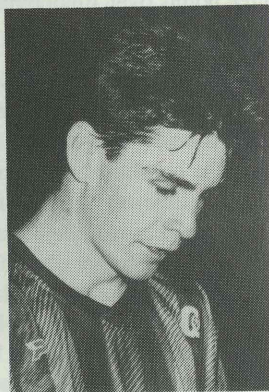
Even Brisbane Strikers captain Alan Hunter made a journey to the club on the weekend to catch up with Dunn, his former socceroo team mate and National League adversary.
