Magic Maroons hit back as Cutillas' tactics foil Blues

The XXXX Queensland team for the second year in a row, denied the New South Wales Soccerblues a clean sweep in the NIB Challenge series, with a determined 1-0 win at the Coffs Harbour International Stadium last Sunday.

Played before an enthusiastic crowd of 3,300 on a pitch the envy of most National League clubs, the Maroons turned around their disappointing 3-1 loss to the Blues at Perry Park, through the tactical genius of coach Juan Cutillas.

"New South Wales did a lot of damage to us in the midfield last time so we had to change our tactics," Cutillas said.

"We decided on putting one forward up front to try to catch them on the break.

"By doing this we really took control of the game and caught them on the break so many times, which gave us three or four open chances.

"I was a little surprised at how tactically naive New South Wales were."

A seemingly over-confident Blues outfit showed little desire in attack and lacked creativity up front to really trouble Queensland's defence.

The Maroons on the other hand looked more enthusiastic, but struggled to penetrate the strong New South Wales defence in the first half.

The second half began at a frantic pace, with New South Wales' keeper Mike Gibson saving a fierce Michael Brockwell strike and Blues' striker Norman Tome going just wide of the right upright a minute later.

With Queensland gaining the momentum, the New South Wales' defence finally cracked in the 52nd minute following a world-class XXXX Queensland Coach Juan Cutillas' tactics helped steer the gutsy Maroons to a memorable 1-0 victory over New South Wales in Coffs Harbour

volley from Stephen Starr which left Gibson with no chance.

The Blues appeared to get frustrated at being unable to penetrate the Maroons' defence, pumping long balls into the box, which keeper Clint Dal Santo pulled in with relative ease.

Queensland continued to fight hard in the last 15 minutes following Darren Hillier's send off, with Brenley Jefferd almost sealing the result with a minute to go, but for a fantastic finger-tip save by Gibson.

Coach Cutillas rated the win as the best performance ever by a Queensland side.

"When you consider the strength of that New South Wales side and that there were five new faces in our squad, you can see what a tremendous win that was," Cutillas said.

"Nobody gave us a chance of wining away but these players played their hearts out and New South Wales got the shock of their lives." *

Pine Rivers, and Eastern Suburbs all set for some tough matches in the remaining half dozen rounds of the season. Only time will tell which of these sides will be in Division 2 next year.

Don't forget the Perry Park double header this Saturday night, where three of the top five teams will be on show, including Taringa and Rochedale in the late game at 7.00pm. The early match at 5.00pm between Coalstars and Wynnum should be a cracker too. Still on local action, the Brisbane derby between Lions and City is on this Sunday July 16, 2.45pm at Lions Stadium, Richlands. A huge Promotional Day has been organised, featuring a free Jumping Castle, Steam Train rides, Trikes, Moon Buggy, the Australian Skydiving Display team, Brisbane Bullets star Robert Sibley, who will be handing out free tickets to the next Bullets match, and Strikers' stars Alan Hunter and Steve Jackson. It should be a great weekend of soccer.

Queensland selections farcical

With reference to H L Parry of Kallangur's letter and a call for a true Queensland team, your reply was pathetic.

Were the RDOC's instructed to nominate players worthy of selection, or is it taken for granted that they would. Having been around North Queensland soccer for a number of years, I think not. It is painfully obvious to us here in the North, that the game does not exist outside of Brisbane. There is an abundance of evidence to support this belief, should you look back over the years. On the May Day weekend, there were two rounds of Queensland's (farcical) Premier competition played in Townsville and Cairns. The results of the Brisbane XXXX league games were telecast on the Sunday night news, but Queensland Cup results weren't important enough to warrant a mention.

It is about time that those in control of the game in Queensland got off their backsides and looked past the northern suburbs of Brisbane. The game is played in the North and there are some very good players up here. There are at least two who deserved a place in the



"Queensland Team", but no one thought it worth their while to look outside Brisbane. Your attempt to "pass the buck" onto the RDOC's won't work with anyone who knows the true situation. It is the responsibility of the QSF to supply and organise a decent state competition to allow country players to be seen by selectors. If that means some of the QSF officials have to get off their butts and find a suitable sponsor, then this is what they should do. Until this happens, soccer in Queensland will always be the second rate sport that it is.

Secondly, selections are a matter of opinion and the two players "who deserved a place in the Oueensland Team". did so in your opinion and maybe the opinions of many others, but not so in the opinions of those who mattered most, the State Team selectors. 

Call for more referees

As Referees Development Officer, I run Referees Courses in many areas, including Redlands United and Brisbane Lions, where the quality and enthusiasm of participants was quite searching and motivating. The players that took part all passed the examination on the Laws of the Game, and going through such a course can only make them better members of the club and team, because discipline is so much a part of knowing the Laws and understanding the Referees dilemmas in certain situations.

Because many clubs had over the years always said to the QSF and Referees body, "Why don't you come to us and run courses instead of us having to come into Perry Park", I decided to write to 23 clubs, who I knew ran a substantial number of teams in all age groups. They were... Acacia Ridge, Annerley, Beenleigh, Brisbane City, Capalaba, Coalstars, Easts, Grange Thistle, Ipswich St Helens, Logan City Kings, Mitchelton, Mt Gravatt, North Star, Pine Rivers, Rochedale, Slacks Creek, South Star, Souths United, Southside Eagles, Taringa Rovers, The Gap and Wynnum.

I have not received one acknowledgment to my letter, let alone a consideration of the content. We are talking here about a course which will benefit ALL players of whatever age group. You and I know that players, some in very senior football, have no idea on certain Laws or their interpretation. Players who have a poor disciplinary record would benefit immensely by such a course.I just wonder at the apathy of the clubs here in Brisbane. **Murray Jesson** (Development Officer ASRF Qld Div).

Anniversary win well timed

Annerley celebrated the launching of their 50th Anniversary souvenir book in style last Saturday, defeating North Pine 2-0 at Elder Park.

The victory has also kept Annerley in the hunt for that elusive fifth and last finals spot.

For North Pine it meant the continuation of a dismal season, which has seen them only record one victory in sixteen league matches.

The home side dominated early and should have taken the lead after only five minutes when Craig Menere beat the offside trap to be left in a one-on-one situation with North Pine keeper Simon Newton. His attempted chip, however, went wide of the post.

Dave Melville wasted another great opportunity for Annerley twenty minutes later. After cutting in from the by-line, his final shot from six vards went straight to Newton.

Menere's finishing let him down again five minutes before half-time with a poor shot hit straight to Newton. Seven minutes after the break, however, he redeemed himself to give Annerley the lead.

The young striker got onto the end of a quickly taken free-kick from Andrew Kinsella to calmly slot the ball past the totally exposed Newton.

Queensland legend and now Annerley player/coach Alan Niven gave his side their second goal, expertly chipping a free-kick into the far corner of the net, leaving what appeared to be an unsighted Newton stranded.

The visitors fought back in the last half hour and were unlucky not to pull a goal back in the 71st minute when a header from sub Andrew Rooke was cleared off the line after beating Annerley custodian Dave Forsyth.

Substitute Nick Kingston could have made it three for Annerley in the 81st minute, but hit the post from a difficult angle after a fumble from Newton in the North Pine goal.

For Niven, only in his second week of the coaching role, the three points were very pleasing.

"It was hard to win today. It is a very bumpy pitch, and rock hard," Niven said.

He commented on how his side sometimes toil when they are expected to win.

"We seem to play better against the top sides and struggle against the lower sides.

North Pine coach Tony Smith saw the result and the whole season as a learning experience for his youthful side.

"We're improving but haven't got that experience vet. They're only a young bunch of guys," Smith said.

He hoped the knowledge gained from two years in division three, would hold them in good stead for their inevitable stint in division four next season.

"Hopefully we'll gain promotion and restore a bit of confidence."



With three quarters of the season having been played, it's timely to have another review. In Division 2 Beenleigh, were once runaways, but since their 4-4 draw with Souths have suffered two losses and have now been bought back to the field, it is far too tight to attempt to predict promotion and semi-final positions.

Uni picked up a rare win last week, it may be a case of too little, too late, Souths still struggling to get out of the bottom two places. The promoted teams from Division 3 now look to be secure with Capalaba and Albany Creek, but again an incredibly tight battle for semi placings with five teams vying for the remaining two spots. At present it looks as if Latrobe and North Pine may well be playing in Division 4, where it is, yet again, an incredibly tight battle at the top. Two locked in poll position, Moggill and Eagles close behind, with Redcliffe waiting for a slip-up to take out another semi placing, Oxley have found the step up too big, Pine Hills may also find that they are running out of time.
