## Rochedale hopes fade

Taringa have all but dashed Rochedale's XXXX League Premiership hopes following their strong 2-1 win over the Kim Wishart coached side at Perry Park last Saturday night.

Rochedale came into the match needing the three points to keep the pressure on League leaders Brisbane City, who have now stretched their lead to five points, after accounting for Brisbane Lions on Sunday.

Taringa coach Juan Cutillas was confident prior to the match that his side could defeat Rochedale, suggesting the wide open spaces of Perry Park would suit his team's style of play.

His side, led by Man of the Match Brent Read, proved him right as they systematically went about Rochedale's demise.

It was Read in the 12th minute, who gave Taringa the lead, after he expertly dispossessed Eddie Lees to combine with Martin Matula on the right, before knocking a sensational volley past Clint Dal Santo in goals.

Read continued to wreak havoc in the midfield, creating huge problems for a seemingly flat Rochedale outfit.

Rochedale clawed their way back into the match just before half time with an equaliser

from youngster Sean Carey, which came about from a goal mouth melee.

Rochedale came out and immediately attacked the Taringa goal, but keeper Jason Lucas was equal to the task on all occasions.

Brent Read matched his attacking form with some equally decisive defence.

A second half substitution by Taringa coach Juan Cutillas proved to be the difference. Just after half time, Cutillas replaced Queensland representative Stephen Starr with Joel Douglas, who immediately had an impact on the game.

The youngster took control in the midfield and put away the winner ten minutes before full time, with a great strike from just outside the penalty area which gave Dal Santo no chance.

■ In other matches on the weekend, Coalstars halted Wynnum's recent run with a 1-0 win, North Star downed Pine Rivers 2-1, a four goal haul by Darren Bender helped Grange to a 6-2 thrashing of Willowburn, City held off Lions 2-1, and Easts fought off North Brisbane 4-3.

## Perry Park to remain HQ

President of the Queensland Soccer Federation Wallace Dann has strongly backed the Brisbane Strikers' move to Suncorp Stadium and maintained Perry Park would remain the home of Queensland Soccer.

Mr Dann said the decision by the Strikers' Management Committee to play the Club's home matches at Suncorp Stadium would understandably be received with mixed emotions.

"I am confident that in the main however, the vast majority of soccer supporters will see the wisdom of the move," Dann said.

"Despite recent improvements, the existing facilities at Perry Park will not accommodate the larger crowds expected at future NSL games, and the move is justifiable for that reason alone.

"Nevertheless, Perry Park will retain its importance and will continue to be developed as Soccer Headquarters in Queensland and as the Strikers' optional base.

"The Brisbane Strikers team is our sole representative in the National Soccer League and is likely to remain so for some time to come.

"The success of the Strikers is absolutely vital to the future of soccer in Queensland, and obviously the Club cannot afford to ignore a significant opportunity to gain wider support and enhance its future prospects.

"I support the Strikers' decision as a matter of commercial reality and on the basis that it will have a positive effect on the game in Queensland as a whole.

"In the end I have no doubt the move to Suncorp Stadium will help the Strikers in their efforts to achieve wider public appeal, a great deal more corporate sponsorship, and record attendances through the turnstiles."

QSF General Manager Alan Vessey agreed with, citing Suncorp's first rate corporate facilities as an added bonus in the Club's search for sponsors.

"We need to offer the best in order to receive the corporate backing we require," Vessey said.

"The top rated lighting also means we will be able to offer our sponsors greater exposure on television. Coupled with the signing of Frank Farina, we expect this move to make us one of the higher profile clubs in the League."

At a packed Press Conference at Perry Park last week, Brisbane Strikers' Chairman Ian Brusasco said the decision to move came after much thought and after an examination of all stadiums throughout Brisbane.

"We didn't think that it was in our best interests to develop our own ground when a facility such as Suncorp Stadium was available," he said.

"A good team like the Strikers needs a top facility to play at so that the supporters can watch in comfort.

"No longer will people accept second class facilities, and Suncorp Stadium is a first class ground, with FIFA even classifying it as one of the best facilities around."

## Sports insurance vital

As you well know, the importance of having insurance premiums paid cannot be overstressed. This is not only important for personal domestic insurance, but also for Clubs when insuring their clubhouses and their players.

This year, as in past years, there are a number of Clubs that have fallen outside the terms agreed upon in having their premiums paid in the QSF Sports Insurance Scheme. Previously, we have allowed Clubs to extend their outstanding premiums for some considerable time. A handful of Clubs have made contact with us this year to discuss the possibility of having these extensions once again, however, these extensions unfortunately cannot be provided.

We do appreciate that Clubs have many costs to outlay during the season, which is why an instalment plan is made available, however it is imperative that Clubs make these payments on time to ensure the continuity of their cover, as well as the continuity of processing claims. In our litigious society, one can see the legal implication looming from where a Club is late in making payments, or at worst, defaulting all together. As I mentioned earlier, the importance of having any premium paid is vital.

# City spoils Lions' party

**Brisbane City spoilt arch rivals Brisbane Lions' huge promotional day last Sunday, defeating them 2-1 at Richlands.**

The victory has meant City has extended their lead to five points on the ladder, following Rochedale's loss to Taringa the previous night.

The often heated clash saw Lions on the attack early, but unable to take their opportunities. City made the most of their limited chances in the first half.

After only six minutes Lions were awarded a penalty after a Mark Greer foul on Jimmy McMurtrie. Captain Frank Mengotti strode forward to take the spot kick against his old club, but was denied by the feet of City goalkeeper Daniel Duke.

Lions again had an opportunity to go ahead in the 24th minute, when a Fotis Skordou corner found an unmarked Cheetah Vosuga. The veteran midfielder was wide with his header.

City attacked Lions on the counter five minutes later to take the lead. Stephen Glockner's long through ball found Warren Cooley in the box. The tall State representative's shot was fumbled by Lions custodian Robbie Farrow, leaving Ian Hutchison with an easy tap in.

The visitors doubled their lead in the 36th minute with Hutchison again involved. The nippy striker ran to the by-line before cutting the ball back to Simon Eslick, who found the corner of the net with his well placed shot.

The second half paled into comparison with the first. Lions pushed the attack, and City sat back catching the home side on the break.

City could have grabbed another after eleven minutes but Cooley's free header was directed straight at Farrow.

The final five minutes of the match were hectic, with Lions desperate to score and City equally as desperate to hold on.

In the 88th minute Lions defender David Hunter was sent off for his second bookable offence. He brought down young City defender Anthony Scodellaro, resulting in the 18 year-old being carried from the field on a stretcher with a knee injury.

Lions finally grabbed a goal one minute into stoppage time when a powerful Wayne Hinton shot from a short Vosuga free-kick sneaked past the wall and inside the post. In diving for the ball Daniel Duke damaged his shoulder and had to be carried off.

Replacement keeper Paul Jabs came on and faced the music straight way when Frank Mengotti floated a high ball into the box. Jabs punched the ball away but damaged his ribs in the process. Mengotti received the ball again with Jabs still holding his side. But instead of doing the same thing, he tried to take on the defence and was dispossessed.

City coach Bobby Hamilton was happy with the way his side battled throughout the match.

"I'm pleased with the win. It was never going to be an easy game. Things are getting tougher," Hamilton said.

"Today's win was a morale booster for the players."

Lions coach Miron Bleiberg was at a loss to explain his side's lack of fortune in the first half.

"Soccer is a cruel game. We played much better than them early but went in at half-time 2-0 down," Bleiberg said.

"That they hardly played soccer was a credit to our boys."

## Slacks Creek come of age

Celebrating their 21st Anniversary, Slacks Creek have taken a bold step in seeking expressions of interest for the position of senior coach for next season.

Bob Ford, who has held the position for six of his seven years at the Club, recently announced he would be standing down and approached the Club's committee about taking a new direction in 1996.

"We are hoping to attract a high profile quality coach," Ford said.

"Funds will also be made available for the purchase of three or four quality players, to help our cause next season.

"It's a decision the committee agreed we had to take, and with the help of a sponsor who has pledged a five figure sum, we are looking forward to some positive changes.

"We have a magical set up at Usher Park, having just completed four new dressing rooms, and with one of the best playing surfaces in South East Queensland.

"We're the envy of most visiting clubs and it seems a waste for us to linger in the lower divisions."

Ford said the Club was financially very sound thanks to some hard work put in by past and present committees, but was losing a lot of the quality players it had developed over the years, to some of the bigger clubs in town.

"We want to stop this and give our junior players a reason firstly to come to the Club and then stay here."

## State Director calls for unity

**Australian soccer must become more unified and a higher level of competition should be made available to players, claims State Director of Coaching Jim Selby.**

Selby's comments follow his recent trip to Europe to take in the Women's World Cup and finalise arrangements for the forthcoming European Soccer Coaches Tour.

"Part of the reason for this trip was to see what we need to do to get our women back in Queensland competing and being successful at the highest level," Selby said.

"After seeing the Women's World Cup I don't really believe the soccer has improved in quality since the last time we looked at them several years ago. It is still a high standard of play, but I don't think it has gotten any better.

"The things we must continue working on with our players is developing individual technique, developing this technique under pressure, developing fitness levels to be able to physiologically compete at the top level, and developing strength to withstand the physical challenges sustained at the highest level."

Selby also visited Europe's top soccer complexes, taking in the qualities which have helped the European countries develop into the strongest soccer nations in the World.

These same complexes will be visited by the Australian coaches on the European Soccer Tour later this year, the French Football Federation National Training Complex at Clairefontaine, the Hennef Sports College in Germany, and the AC Milan Soccer Complex in Italy.

"The one thing evident in all the countries we visited was that soccer was controlled by one body with one united front, which is totally the opposite to Australia," Selby said.

"At the moment there are too many bodies in Australia going in too many different

directions, and clubs don't seem to have a common philosophy that's carried from juniors through to the senior level.

"The other thing I believe needs to happen is that players must be given the opportunity to play at a high level of competition all the time.

"This means a reduction in the number of teams in our domestic competitions so quality teams go up against one another every week.

The European Soccer Coaches Tour departs November 18 and has the full support of the National and State Federations and the ACC.



The value of the tour is illustrated by the fact that it is worth a massive 60 updating points or the equivalent of four years of accreditation points.

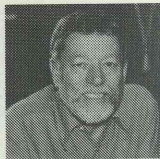

**With only five rounds to go before Finals, lower grade and lower Division teams with aspirations to play in the final, now need to look closely at player eligibility.**
