



An ill wind blows no favours

Strong westerly winds wreaked havoc and as results showed, appeared to even out most games on the weekend.

In the XXXX League, North Brisbane produced the upset of the competition with a tough 1-0 win over Rochedale at Lanham Park.

The Aces' win virtually rules out any hopes of Rochedale taking out the Premiership, with the Rovers needing to rely on City dropping two of their remaining matches to have any chance.

In the other upset of the round, a late goal by Chris Fegan saw Eastern Suburbs share the points with City at Spencer Park, giving Rochedale a minor reprieve.

Taringa made Wynnum's chances of a finals spot a little harder after defeating the Baysiders 1-0 at Carmichael Park, while Coalstars continued their recent run of good form with a 1-0 win against Grange at Bundamba.

With just four Premier League matches remaining, Coalstars' coach Wayne Warren still has high hopes of a top five finish.

"We've had a fairly horrendous run with injuries and sickness this year, but we're hanging in and coming good at the right end of the season," Warren said.

Coalstars and Rivers not to be underdogs

The coaches from Coalstars and Pine Rivers, the teams set to do battle in the first Queensland Cup semi final this Saturday night at Perry Park, are not daunted at the prospect of facing Rochedale or Taringa in next month's Cup final.

Both Wayne Warren and Gerry Lindsay believe their sides have a terrific chance to move into the final and upset their opponents to take out the 1995 Queensland Cup.

"We have respect for every team in the competition, but we approach every game knowing that if we play well we can beat anyone," Warren said.

"We're not at all phased by the prospect of meeting Rochedale or Taringa in the final.

"First thing's first however, and we must get over the top of Rivers before we start talking about the final."

After a shocking run of injuries and illness, Warren was excited at the prospect of having several of his first team players returning for the match.

Peter McKendrick looks set to come in from Reserve Grade and Fred Stone and Matthew Fairclough appear to be recovered from injuries sustained earlier in the season.

"Realistically, this is our best chance to take home any silverware, but it's also Rivers' best chance, so they have a lot to play for this Saturday night," Warren said.

"It's going to come down to who's more determined on the night and who takes their chances."

Rivers coach Gerry Lindsay agreed with Warren's sentiments.

"Scoring's been our biggest problem this season, and if we can be on target right from the start then we're definitely in with a chance," Lindsay said.

With Lee Scriggins ineligible to play for Rivers in the Cup, Lindsay said he would be looking for a lot more from Dene Almond and Clayton Koch.

A doubt also remained on young striker Joel Hale, following a knee injury last Sunday at Willowburn, but Lindsay is quietly confident the youngster will be fit by Saturday night.

Meanwhile, Rochedale coach Kim Wishart is looking for a huge form reversal when his side meets Taringa in the late Queensland Cup semi final at Perry Park this Saturday night.

"I've been really disappointed with our last two games and the last time we played against Taringa at Perry Park I felt we were well below our best," Wishart said.

"We've got a couple of guys returning, Darren Hillier and Gary Brattan, so hopefully this will strengthen the side a little." *

Still on the local scene, finals time is already here for some of the lower division sides, with the Division 9 semi finals being conducted this coming weekend at The Gap Pastime Soccer Club and Annerley Soccer Club. Taringa topple Wynnum

Taringa Rovers overcame breezy conditions to defeat a gallant Wynnum side 1-0 at Carmichael Park last Sunday.

The win has seen the Juan Cutillas coached side move to within one point of second place Rochedale, who suffered a shock 1-0 defeat at the hands of North Brisbane.

For Wynnum, the loss deprived them of the opportunity to move into outright fifth spot, following North Star's loss to Lions the night before.

Things could have been different for the Wolves, however, if luck had gone their way early on.

Geoff Maltby hit the crossbar after only seven minutes, with a stinging shot that had Taringa goalkeeper Jason Lucas well beaten.

The visitors took advantage of this misfortune, taking the lead after 16 minutes through defender Paul Worroll, who slid in a Joel Douglas shot at the far post.

It appeared Wynnum had the equaliser after 34 minutes when a Billy McDermott header found the back of the net. Joy turned to frustration for the Wolves, when the veteran striker was deemed to be offside.

The frustration continued for the home side two minutes from half-time when Darren Hindes' header from a McDermott ball found the crossbar.

Immediately after the break Wynnum continued to attack with Maltby again in the action. His 46th minute shot, however, was wide of the post.

The game fell away somewhat after that, with neither side really being able to come to terms with the strong winds that made

controlled play extremely difficult.

Martin Matula had two chances late in the match which would have shown an unfair indication of Taringa's dominance had he capitalised.

The first, in the 71st minute, was a good effort, with his shot going across the face of the goal, before sliding by the post.

Then, in the 93rd minute, the nippy forward weaved his way into the box, only to have his shot well saved by Wynnum, and ex-Taringa custodian Kevin Tatton.

Coach Cutillas was pleased with the way his side handled the difficult conditions.

"There was no way we could play good football. We were a little bit lucky, but at the end of the day we deserved the win," Cutillas said.

He also praised the effort of the tough Wolves side.

"We knew it was going to be hard. Full credit to Wynnum, they did very well."

Wynnum coach Wayne Gracey lamented his side's lack of fortune in the opening stanza.

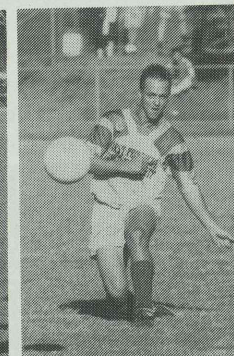
"We did everything right in the first half, but the ball didn't bounce our way," Gracey side.

He said his side only had to learn to finish to make sure of a final five finish.

"The defence is still sound, but we have to keep working on our shooting."

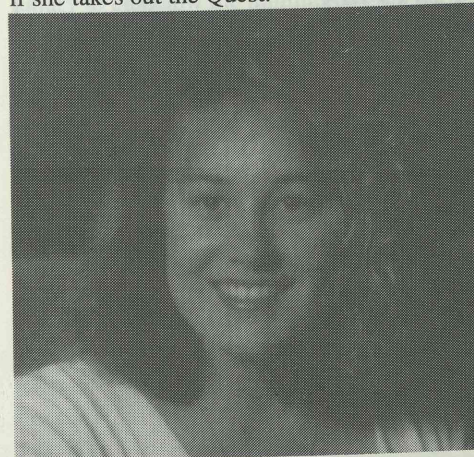

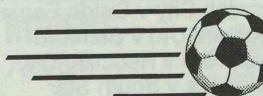
