## Stunning form reversal sees Rivers, Rovers final

In an amazing turn around, Pine Rivers moved into the final of the 1995 XXXX Queensland Cup with a solid 3-1 win over pre-match favourites Coalstars, last Saturday night at Perry Park.

They will come up against Taringa Rovers on August 12, who also had a 3-1 win over their opponents, Rochedale Rovers, in the late match.

Many people had written Rivers off following their midweek 4-1 loss to the Coalminers in a XXXX League fixture, but Gerry Lindsay's boys proved the sceptics wrong.

Inspired by some committed play from veterans Frank Pimblett and Graham Eden, Rivers pulled back a 1-0 deficit at half time, with three second half goals to former National League striker Clayton Koch, giving them the victory.

Koch's goals included two expertly taken penalties and a cracking left footer from just inside the 18-yard box, that left Coalstars' keeper Kevin Farrar floundering at the near post.

Taringa made sure of an appointment with Rivers after soundly defeating defending Cup holders Rochedale in the other semi final.

Rochedale looked to have Taringa's measure in the first half, with an Eddie Lees' goal giving them a 1-0 lead at the break.

Taringa finished the stronger however, Mark Bennett equalising a quarter of an hour after the break, and Martin Matula and Brent Read scoring two very classy goals to make the final score 3-1.

Read's goal in particular, stunned the Perry Park crowd as the midfielder took possession of the ball just outside his own 18-yard box, dribbled the length of the field, and cut through some ordinary Rochedale defence, before drilling a powerful right foot shot past Rochedale keeper Clint Dal Santo, into the top right hand corner of the net. \*

## Aces' coach short of trumps

A telling year of misfortune seems to have taken its toll on disgruntled North Brisbane coach Gary McDowall. The former Soccerroo said he did not think he would be staying on with the Aces next year, but in the meantime wants desperately to keep them from being relegated to Division 2.

"It's been a tough year and at this stage I really don't think I'll be back next season," McDowall said.

"I know that I'll be doing something in soccer, because I love the game, but at the moment my coaching future is up in the air.

"My priority right now though, is to keep North Brisbane in the XXXX League. I don't want my name on a team that's been relegated."

North Brisbane have been arguably the unluckiest side in the competition this year, with two wins, four draws, and 12 losses, ten of which were by just one goal.

Lacking any depth at all, McDowall has had to work with a young side, with an average age of 18 years, and has had to rely on the experience of Queensland player Danny Cox at the back, and the flair of Willy Carter in the midfield.

"We've never had a striker or a first rate keeper, and this has cost us dearly in the end.

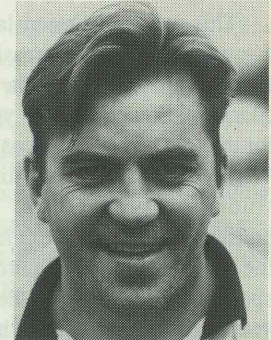
"Many of our matches have been lost due to pot luck and as I keep saying to the lads, we've never been disgraced."

To add to McDowall's problems, his two regular keepers, Michael Jones and Richard Cooper, walked out on him last week after being dropped, leaving him with just one keeper.

This comes not long after veteran John Stewart walked out following a disagreement with one of the players.

"I was a little disappointed when John walked out, because he is a quality player and

ideally I would still love to have him here," McDowall said.

"But the fact is he's not here so I have to keep battling and working with what I've got.

"I'm confident we can avoid relegation. We have to take it one game at a time and I think it will go right down to the wire, but I'm fairly optimistic." \*

## North Star nine hold for draw

**An eventual nine-man North Star outfit picked up a valuable point against Easts last Sunday, drawing 1-1 at Heath Park.**

John Filewood's 85th minute strike has maintained North's perilous hold on fifth place, with Wynnum and now Coalstars breathing down their necks.

While happy with the escape, North must be ruing the send offs in the latter stages of the match of the Cuba brothers Marcello and Fraser, who are certain to at least miss one match.

The boys from Zillmere have their goalkeeper Robbie Harrison to thank for the point. The veteran made five great saves in the second half, when all seemed lost.

What made his efforts even more amazing, was that Harrison had played a whole match on the field in the reserves game, in which North ended up with only eight fit players on the field.

The player drain is such, that the current XXXX League Champions were forced to use their 42-year-old coach Billy Williamson in the vital sweeping position in the main game.

The former National League player did not let his troops down, proving the rock at the back on a number of occasions.

It was Williamson's side who had the first genuine chance of the match in the 19th minute through Fraser Cuba. After some wizardry on the edge of the box, the State representative was confronted by Easts' keeper Chris Roche, who did well in saving the eventual shot.

Roche's brother Anthony had a great chance to give Easts the lead in the 33rd minute, his header hitting the post of what was an open goal.

The home side should have again taken the lead ten minutes later through Rowan Tollenare who spooned a Chris Fegan corner over the bar.

They finally did take the lead 19 minutes after the break, with Fegan again involved. The burly midfielder's far post cross was beautifully met by Anthony Roche, who's bullet like header left Harrison with no chance.

Harrison, however, was the hero, pulling off brilliant saves that kept his side in the game. He saved his best for Shane Tollenare who looked certain to score on three occasions.

That lack of finishing would come back to haunt the Tigers with Filewood's equaliser minutes from time. He latched onto a Glenn Archer flick at the near post to guide the ball into the corner of the net.

Easts coach Walter Oldenberg cited his team's poor finishing as costly.

"We had two one-on-one's which we didn't score from. We've got to put the ball in the back of the net," Oldenberg said. \*

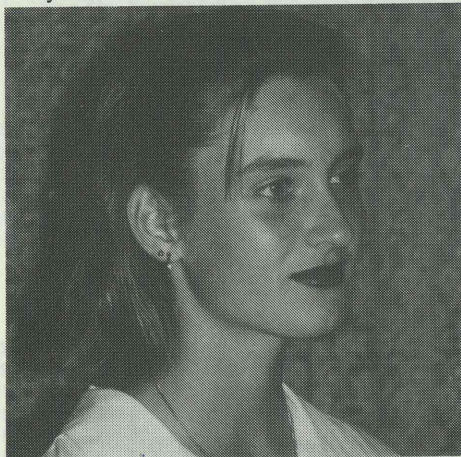

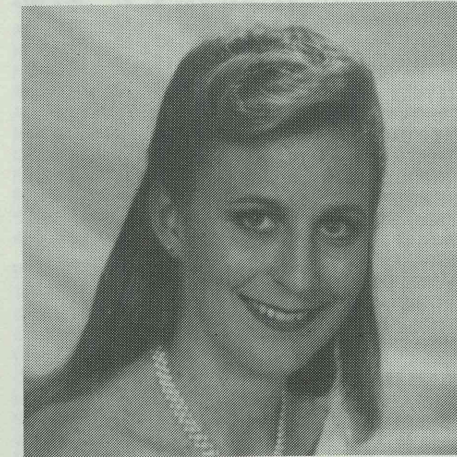

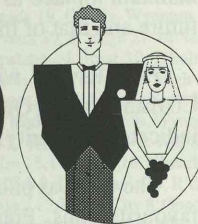
