# Extra time victory to Rovers

Taringa Rovers collected their first piece of silverware since their 1993 Premiership win, with a 3-1 extra time victory over Pine Rivers at Perry Park last Saturday night.

The Rovers, who came into the match as favourites, started the game in top gear with midfielder Brent Read opening the scoring after just 49 seconds.

Rivers defender Graham Eden failed to clear the ball and Read pounced on it to slot home for a 1-0 lead.

Rivers dug their heels in and worked hard to no real advantage until just before half time, when Jeff Scott's 40th minute header found home.

Midfielder Clayton Koch sent a perfect cross for Scott in the penalty area, whose first header was knocked down by Taringa custodian Jason Lucas, but equalised with his second effort.

Rivers came out after the break a different outfit, holding Taringa at bay, keeping them locked down their end of the field.

Resistance did come from Taringa striker Glen Kolpak however, who came alive in the second stanza, making several inroads in the Pine Rivers' defence and forcing keeper Peter Underhill to make some telling saves.

Indeed it was, as Taringa scored just two minutes into extra time through Cup specialist Martin Matula.

Matula brilliantly worked his way into the box, rounding two defenders before knocking his tenth Cup goal of the year past a stranded Underhill.

The young striker was again in the action seven minutes later, when he put Stuart Collins through to knock a shot around Underhill for the 3-1 victory. \*

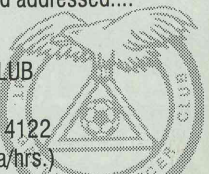

# Clem Jones etched in gold

The Queensland Soccer Federation's Gold Medal award will take on a more prestigious nature following its renaming as the Clem Jones Medal earlier this week.

The Gold Medal, which has been awarded since 1974, is an illustrious honour to recognise the best and fairest player in the XXXX League.

The QSF made the announcement regarding Clem Jones' sponsorship of the award at a special VIP Luncheon at the Queensland Soccer Club on Monday.

QSF Vice President Guido Canale was given the honour, in the absence of President Wallace Dann, who was representing Soccer Australia overseas.

In making the announcement, Mr Canale said the QSF was recognising the immense contribution Clem Jones had made to the code for a period well in excess of 30 years.

He said the award was being further enhanced by being renamed in perpetuity as the Clem Jones Medal.

"The name Clem Jones is synonymous with soccer," Mr Canale said.

"As Lord Mayor of Brisbane, Clem was instrumental in providing the lease for Perry Park for the establishment of soccer headquarters in Queensland.

"His commitment can be further measured by his appointment to the initial Board of Trustees, a position he still holds today.

"Further evidence is the emergence of the Brisbane Strikers, where Clem's contribution has been crucial to the team's success."

Mr Jones said he hoped through his group of companies to give the award the prestige it deserved and had when it was known as the Rothmans' Medal.

"Rothmans did so much for this award and it was an absolute tragedy when the Government brought in its anti-tobacco sponsorship legislation," Mr Jones said.

"I just hope that now the medal has a sponsor, it will take on an added prestige and will become a more desirable award for players in the XXXX League." \*

### Thank God For Suncorp

I am sure that every soccer supporter in Brisbane would agree, that we supporters have had enough of the Perry Park "rip-off".

Perry Park is supposedly the Home of Soccer in Queensland for the Clubs, players and supporters. The QSF Committee is elected by the Clubs to promote and foster the game of soccer. A part of promoting the game is to get people through the gate, especially families, as the kids are the future of the game. The days of a family outing to watch soccer at Perry Park

have gone thanks to the charges set by the QSF. This was shown on July 29 for the Queensland Cup games where the crowd was an utter disgrace. Why?

The gate entrance fee was \$5 per person over 14, a dried up hot dog \$2.60, dried up chips \$2.40, so to watch one game of soccer, a family of five would have paid out \$50, not including a drink. What happened to the \$8 family entrance that every other Club charges? The competition (Qld Cup) is a competition between XXXX League Clubs so why do we get hit with a "No Family Entrance Fee" by the QSF?

Those who visited Perry Park on July 29 expecting to dine in the restaurant, were shown a Closed sign, which shows they did not expect anybody to watch the semi finals of the Queensland Cup. Those who wanted to eat were forced to go to the \$2.60 Hot Dog stand. At half

time in the second game, supporters of each Club swarmed to the bar to find one bar person in attendance, half time had come and gone and people walked out in disgust, without a drink!

It is about time the outdated management of the QSF realise that Perry Park under their control is no longer a viable proposition. With your charges you are demoting not promoting the great game of soccer. Clubs like Brisbane City, Rochedale, Brisbane Lions and Taringa get larger crowds at their home games than Perry Park and there is an \$8 family pass, fresh food, good service, and a competitive atmosphere.

There are some XXXX League clubs struggling for survival, playing at grounds which do not meet the QSF criteria, these clubs I'm sure would love to have Perry Park as their Home Ground, and run the Club at a financial gain. The other alternative is to play major fixtures at either Rochedale, Brisbane City or Brisbane Lions, and we all go to Suncorp Stadium to care for our families, watch soccer at its best, eat at the right price, be served by professionals, and know it will be a great family

night out at the right price. Good Luck Strikers, Well done Ian, Clem and Frank

*A couple of points I think you should consider Bob. Firstly the \$8 Family Entrance fee only applies to XXXX League matches, not Queensland Cup games, which involve many of the provincial areas as well as the XXXX League teams. The admission prices for Queensland Cup fixtures are standard right throughout the State and even though only XXXX League teams contested the finals, the standard charges could not be changed. Secondly, the QSF deals with football administration matters only and has nothing to do with the running of the Licensed Club. Thirdly, the caterer at Perry Park is an outside contractor, with its own prices. Your complaints will nevertheless be passed on to Club Management. Finally the move to Suncorp Stadium has been well publicised and will be great for Queensland Soccer. I hope to see you there when the season starts. Ed*

Just when all seemed lost for Coalstars, McFarlane senior came back on and pulled one back. This was followed by a Kevin Caldwell equaliser, before Kibbler hastily blew for full-time.

Brent Diflo proved to be the hero for Coalstars saving two of the penalties and scoring one himself. The final score after penalties proved to be 6-3 for Coalstars. What else could it be? McFarlane, who has been a winner for all of his career, was always going to be a winner on the day set aside to honour him, even if he can't take penalties!

## Yeppoon schoolboy champs

An enthralling two nights of soccer saw **Yeppoon State High** the winner of the **Queensland section of the Commonwealth Bank Bill Turner Cup in the school's first year in this Under 15 competition.**

The win qualifies Yeppoon for the National semi finals to be held in Newcastle on September 5 and 6.

The finals of the Queensland section were contested on the excellent playing surface at Chris Green Park, Beenleigh before good crowds appreciative of the skills of each of the final four teams.

Yeppoon started well in the final but struck a very physical and committed Brisbane Grammar.

Grammar goalkeeper David Moran was outstanding, making a series of crucial saves early on to deny Yeppoon.

Eventually the Grammar defence cracked, conceding a goal just three minutes before halftime to Ben Cummins.

The second half was again closely contested but Grammar could not break down the Yeppoon defence, and the Central Queenslanders held on to record a well deserved win.

Darryl Anderson, newly recruited to the QAS took out the star player award of a watch and a \$100 account with sponsors, Commonwealth Bank.

Anderson was a very strong presence both in defence and attack and was well supported by Joel Bendall, a nippy midfielder with great dribbling and passing ability, and Doug Cook, who gave a no-nonsense performance at sweeper.

# Newmarket win entertaining QSC Cup final

Three goals in extra time allowed Newmarket to topple Olympic United in the final of the QSC Cup at Perry Park.

In an exciting Division Two v Division Three clash, the underdogs looked the goods from the outset, creating numerous scoring opportunities but failing to convert through a combination of good keeping from Olympic's Danny Correas and ordinary finishing.

Olympic's best chance came in the first half when they were awarded a penalty, but were unable to score, with last reports placing the ball somewhere near "Side Show Alley".

Correas kept his side in the match with some magnificent saves in normal time, as Newmarket's attack, led by Antoni Di Trappani and Shane Thornton wreaked havoc.

In contrast, Olympic was relatively quiet up front and did not fire up until replacement striker Dean Drakos took the field late into normal time.

He immediately added a spark to Olympic's attack, combining well with Paul Georgiou.

In fact just before time, it was a short ball from Drakos that almost gave Olympic the Cup.

Drakos found Zac Mina in the penalty area, whose looping header beat Newmarket's keeper David Bryett, only to be denied by the post.

With the scores locked at 0-0 after normal time, Newmarket gained the upper hand early in the first period of extra time when Thornton knocked one passed Correas.

The Third Division side had one hand on the Cup following a second goal from Peter Johansen just minutes later. The striker made a superb run down the right, beating several defenders before rifling a shot passed an outstretched Correas.

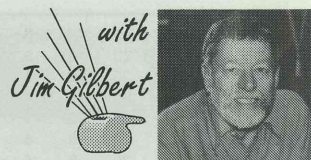

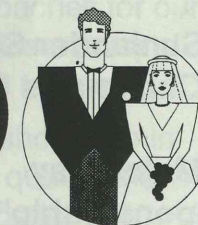
