The Division 2 Premiership race is well and truly alive, with three sides still in the hunt for the spoils with only the one match remaining for the season.

Nerang, Beenleigh, and St Helens could all take out the Premiership depending on results this weekend.

Naturally with just two promotion spots on offer, one of these sides is set to remain in Division 2 by what could very well be the smallest of margins, just one or two goals on differences.

Nerang, who currently lead the competition on 43 points, following last week's matches, would have to be favourites, coming up against bottom placed University of Queensland at St Lucia.

The students have been playing well though and an upset is a definite possibility.

Beenleigh, who have led for the majority, are one point behind Nerang and must play fifth placed Rocklea, in what is also the clash for the Intermediate Cup, as these two sides finished one and two after the first round of competition.


Ridge too are not out of finals contention, just two points shy of fifth place and needing a win and some luck to keep them in the race.

Williamson was confident of defeating City in the midfield.


"I think this (the midfield) has been City's downfall of late and with Battistin out as well, things are looking good for us," he said.

be made up of the best teams in Queensland regardless of the number. My suggestion for revamping the competition is as follows:

The QSF gives 12 months notice to all clubs affiliated with the Federation to apply if they wish to participate in the Premier competition. Clubs are graded on four criteria, Finance, Facilities, Support Base and Soccer Ability, which incorporates things such as the strength of their junior base. The QSF must then nominate four independent sub-committees, each of which grades all clubs on one of the above criteria, using a points scale from 1-10 for example. The QSF will then make a summary of the points from all four categories and the best qualified clubs should be allowed to enter the top competition. In this way the competition will be made up of the best clubs.

As far as relegation and promotion go, if the clubs fall down in any of the four criteria then they are relegated, meaning clubs in the and although the XXXX team showed their class with a solid victory, some of the inmates showed they had a fair grasp of the game.

Cooper hits ton in 5-0 rout

Veteran striker Kieran Cooper brought up a century of goals for Rochedale Rovers, as his side demolished Willowburn 5-0 last Saturday night at Underwood Park.

As well as celebrating Cooper's ton, the Pirates had other reasons to be joyous with Brisbane City losing two points at Taringa on the following day. The gap between first and second is one point going into the last fixture.

Nothing could overshadow Cooper's milestone, however. He followed his 100th in the 27th minute, with his 101st in the 90th minute, and could have had more if not for some poor finishing, and top goalkeeping from Willowburn's Trevor Gilliland.

It was a special moment from the former Irishman, who also scored many goals for Brisbane City before linking with Rochedale.

"I was pretty nervous before the game," Cooper later admitted.

He also hinted that rumours of retirement were premature.

"If I can win the scoring title, I think I'll go around again. I just need to have a good off-season, and a good break."

Cooper was well supported by his teammates in the victory, which has condemned the Magpies to at least one year in the second division.

Craig Collins got the ball rolling in the 20th minute, albeit through a lucky deflection which saw his 18 yard shot ricochet into the net.

The Pirates' second came seven minutes later through Cooper, after excellent lead-up work form Darren Hillier and John Weatherby, who unselfishly laid the ball off when he could have easily taken the opportunity himself.

Weatherby proved to be a constant menace

Cooper's nose for goal came to the fore last week when the veteran notched up 101 goals for his club

on the left throughout the match, often tormenting the Willowburn defence with his blinding speed and polished skills.

The home side continued on after the break, with Andy Lees making it 3-0 in the 74th minute, when he calmly slotted the ball underneath an oncoming Gilliland.

Lees picked up his second in the 81st minute, after good lead up work by Cooper, who set up his unmarked striking partner with a deft ball.

The roles were reversed nine minutes later with Lees the provider and Cooper the finisher, leaving the final deficit at five goals. For Willowburn coach Steve Pennells it was another fruitless outing in what has been a tough season for the Toowoomba side.

"We lost seven players from last year's squad and haven't had the players to replace them," Pennells said.

One of those players lost was Darren Hillier, now at Rochedale. Pennells conceded it was this type of player that the side needed this season.

"In close games we didn't have a leader in the side. It was always going to be a hard year.

Out of the two big guns of the league, he saw Rochedale as just in front of the Brisbane City side.

Club Championships is going to the wire between Taringa and Rochedale. Both on equal points with 1 goal the difference to Taringa.



Before The Whistle

Casting my eyes back to this column in Issue one back in early March, it's interesting to compare my long range predictions to the current facts. It was indeed a year of fluctuating fortunes for many clubs in Division 2, with the majority of my comments appearing to bear out the club's positions on the current table.

The only reference made to Division 8 was with Kingsridge and the thought they should do well, despite the higher grading.

So many things now hinge on this last weekend's fixtures, both promotion - Semi-Final placing's - relegation issues, Telecom will have a field day this weekend.





DIVISION 2

Only one match on the Saturday night with Saints to hang on to their slim chance of promotion by downing Acacia Ridge. On Sunday 12 V 1 at St Lucia, look for the boys from the coast to cement both Premiership and promotion in this one, St Albans will hang on to their Semi-Final place with an away win over Inala who themselves can't really expect to have two big ones in a row. Mt Gravatt will be in for a tough struggle to avoid relegation when they host Logan City Kings, away win forecast in view of the King's desire for a Semi position.

The key match is at Dunn Road between Rocklea and Beenleigh with each side playing for the Intermediate Cup, Rocklea need a win to stay in the Semi's. Beenleigh need a win to ensure promotion, let's hope the football match is up to the potential. In the twilight match at Yeronga, Souths will know exactly what they have to do to avoid relegation when they meet Olympic, look for an away win in this one.

Already there has been suggestions of mergers with two north side clubs, one in the XXXX League, rumoured to be considering amalgamation.


Talk of a combined Toowoomba side is also a positive move in the development of the code in that region. Surely it's better to have one combined team in the XXXX League than two teams in Second Division.
