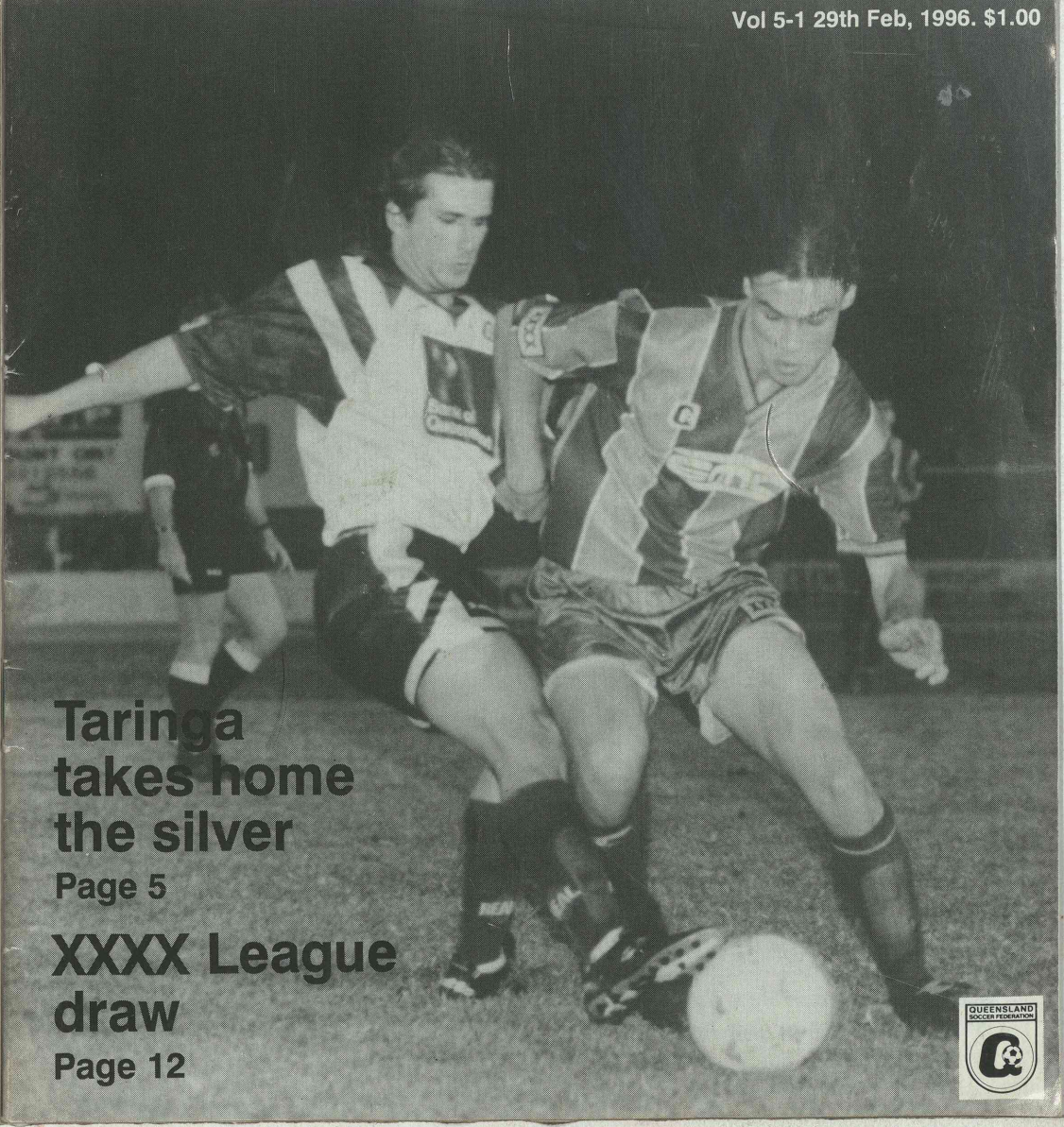

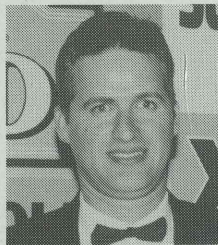


New coaches in XXXX league

A City stalwart, Tokesi comes into the XXXX League ranks for the first time, after coaching City's reserve grade team last year.

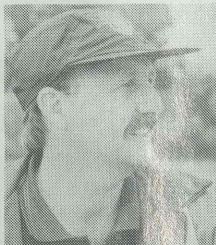

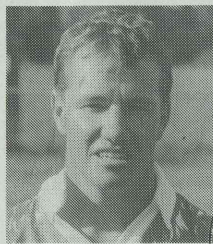
League coaching stints are Beenleigh's Steve Dolan, Nerang's Paul Cockbain, and North Star's Michael McEvoy.

Cockbain has been player/coach of Nerang for the past few seasons, and did well to also gain promotion for his team last year.



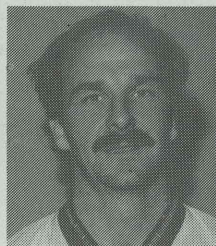

Ampol Cup down to the wire Thistle victorious in shootout

Grange Thistle have taken out the 1996 Ampol Colts Youth Cup, with a penalty shootout victory over Brisbane City last weekend at Wynnum Soccer Club.

The sides finished the match at 0-0, but Thistle took out the Cup with a 6-5 shootout victory.

Wynnum, who were beaten in the semi-final by City, won the playoff for third and fourth place, again with a penalty victory, this time over Pine Rivers, who went down to eventual winners Thistle the previous week.

With the scores again locked at 0-0 after normal time, Wynnum's keeper Nick Edwards made two great saves to give his team a memorable 4-2 penalty win.

John Wood from Wynnum took out the Best and Fairest award for the tournament, as selected by the referees.

Ampol Refinery General Manager Mr Steve Parker, after presenting the Cup, cheque and medals to Grange Thistle, said his company's sponsorship of the competition, now in its 15th year, would continue next year.

The Ampol Colts Youth Cup is the only competition of its kind for Brisbane's talented young players.

QSF NOTICE BOARD - EXTRAS

By now all players and certainly all club officials would be aware of the requirements of the Player Insurance program. The new registration cards and the delay in having them printed, certainly did cause clubs some problems in having players registered, but the overriding factor was the advice included on the card advising the player of his insurance cover whilst participating in our game.

Whilst on the surface it did cause some minor hiccups, the long-term effect of this advise makes it well worthwhile for both club officials, and the participating players. It is most important that all players are aware of exactly how much cover is provided under the scheme. Many players take advantage of the "top up", that is to say, they can provide extra cover for themselves as individuals upon enquiry through the Brokers.

☐ Many have been the rumours abounding about the shortness of the Fixture Season this

year. It's time to put all those rumours to rest once and for all.

Whilst it may appear that the season is drastically shorter due to the earlier start/finish, upon perusal of the Fixture Program, it will be noted that XXXX League and Division 2 clubs have a season that is only two week-ends shorter than 1995, whilst in Division 3 and lower, their Fixture week-ends are of an identical length to that played last year. Many have been the rumours abounding with copious mid-week matches etc. The underlining factor here is, "never believe rumours"!

If any player, official, supporter or other interested party does have a query in relation to administrative matters, a simple phone call to the offices of the Queensland Soccer Federation would help dismiss most fears. Sizzling Silver performance

Even a heavy half-time downpour failed to cool a sizzling performance from Taringa Rovers as they stormed to a 4-2 victory over Rochedale in the Silver Boot Final on Saturday Night.

The game was a thrilling preview of what promises to an exciting season with some excellent football coming from both teams.

And it was Rochedale who took the lead in the 24th minute when a Craig Collins cross was fumbled by Taringa goalkeeper Andrew Hall leaving last season's top marksman Kieran Cooper with the simplest of tap-ins.

But the Pirates held the lead for less than a minute, as Taringa's new recruit from North Star, Fraser Cuba, broke clear and his miss-hit shot was turned in at the far post by Des Hughes.

The quickness of the equaliser was a sign of things to come as the speed of Taringa's midfield on the counter-attack would prove the decisive factor in the match.

In the 37th minute Taringa hit the front when Cuba rose above the defence to head firmly against the post and was able to scramble in the rebound to take his side to the break with a deserved 2-1 lead.

The players returned to driving rain at the start of the second half but it failed to quell the fire of the Taringa attack.

With the half only four minutes old, and with most players struggling to adjust to the slippery conditions, Taringa's Stuart Collins picked up the loose ball and glided past several defenders before cleverly bending the ball past Rochedale goal keeper Clint Dal Santo at the near post.

But Rochedale were not about to give up without a fight and John Weatherby came close when he turned well on the edge of the box and sent a rising shot just over the crossbar.

Rochedale coach Kim Wishart then sent on Brenley Jefferd, freshly returned from trials with a number of clubs in the UK, and his clever touches and good passing began to open cracks in the Taringa defence.

And it was Weatherby who was able to capitalise on a defensive lapse soon after as he cut inside from the right and hit a fierce 25 yard drive which arrowed into the top corner of the Taringa goal.

The goal signalled a resurgence from Rochedale and they came close to finding the equaliser with chances from both Gavin Wright and Martin Matula.

However, with Rochedale continually pressing forward they were always going to be exposed at the back. In the final minute Taringa's Brent Read sealed the victory when he raced on to a perfectly weighted pass from Cuba and stroked the ball past Dal Santo for a 4-2 scoreline.

Taringa Coach, Juan Cutillas, said he was happy with the form of his team leading up to next weekend's start to the XXXX League.

"It was a good performance and I was very pleased with the efforts of the younger players".

Cutillas will hope his youngsters can continue to perform as he has a number of injury and suspension concerns with his senior players leading into the start of the league season. *

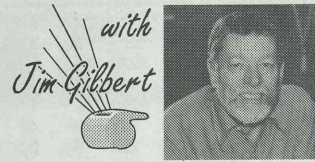

Olympic United could not possibly have such a disappointing season again, whilst Inala City would probably be happy sitting in mid-table. Mt Gravatt missed relegation by a mere

few goals, and will look to do better, however all eyes will be on the three new Clubs this year.

Premiers from Division 3 Capalaba, have acquired a lot of new faces both on and off the park and will be out to consolidate their new-found status.

Runners up Albany Creek may find the going a little tougher, as a step up in Division is always difficult at first. The amalgamation of North Brisbane and The Gap gave the latter club a boost up to Division 2, where they, like Albany Creek, may find it a bit tougher, notwithstanding their respective performances in 1995.

DIVISION 3

If they have put their off-season worries behind them, Souths United could give this Division a big nudge to regain promotion, likewise University, despite the fluctuation in registrations, will look to do the same.

The big movers in this Division will no doubt be the ambitious Mitchelton, however they like Slacks Creek and Redlands United, may well find it an extremely competitive Division this year, however all of the above should do well.

Newmarket may well find mid-table is their position, likewise for Goodna and Annerley who have both had fluctuating fortunes in the last 1 - 2 years.

DIVISION 4

DIVISION 6

Oxley will be looking to repair the wrongs from 1995 and at least go back to Division 5, whilst the perennial battles between Park Ridge and Margate will be a feature of this Division yet again. Mooroondu may find this is their level for 12 months, but a semi-final

placing certainly would not surprise.

All other teams in this Division are the lower grades from Divisions 2 and 3.

DIVISION 7

The only Club with this as their first team is Kingsridge, and the recent decimation of their ranks may cause Kingsridge to suffer somewhat, particularly in the early part of the season.

DIVISION 8

There are a lot of new teams in this Division, many of whom did not exist in 1995, so predictions would be nigh on impossible, however teams expected to do well would be Acacia Ridge (new ground), Redlands and Rocklea. Whilst new chums Mitchelton and Annerley will go along for the ride.

DIVISION 9A

This Division appears to be a XXXX Third Grade by a different name, which makes it all the more strange that the clubs voted to disband the Third Grade between the seasons. Brisbane Lions have two teams in this Division as do Taringa, thus showing the depth that abounds in player membership within these clubs.

DIVISION 9B

Two teams participate in this Division from Wynnum, with Capalaba, Park Ridge, Slacks Creek and Mt Gravatt "the odd" teams out. In most cases the Divisions 9A and B would be classified as social competitions, lets hope it remains that way!

ADDENDUM

It is to be sincerely hoped that all clubs are aware of the minor changes in venues for teams in some Divisions, and that as much as possible club Officials adhere to the rules of competition, unlike in 1995 when many teams lost points, and clubs were fined! Good hunting in 1996.
