With the season well and truly under way, the first of this year's Perry Park double headers takes place on Sunday.

This year's double headers have been moved to Sunday afternoons and with the Strikers matches being played on Saturday nights on a fortnightly basis, the move gives soccer fans a full weekend of football action.

It is the first time in ages that the double headers have been played on Sundays, a day which proved to be to the satisfaction of many soccer supporters in the past.

Taringa Rovers and Eastern Suburbs will contest the first match at 12.30pm, with Coalstars and Nerang fighting out the second fixture at 2.30pm.

The double headers are a great afternoon of soccer entertainment for the entire family and also provide supporters the opportunity of witnessing two matches for the price of one.

The diehard soccer fanatics will be treated to an added bonus this weekend, a third game at no extra cost, when the Queensland Academy of Sport plays St George in a National Youth League fixture commencing shortly after the completion of the second XXXX League match at 5pm.

Perry Park is therefore hosting a true soccer-fest this Sunday.

Following on from last week's statistical information on the average number of goals scored in each XXXX League match, another interesting statistic has come out of last weekend's round of fixtures.

It has taken four full rounds of the XXXX League to produce the first drawn match of the season.

Marc Flemington's goal for Taringa during stoppage time at Carmichael Park gave his side a valuable competition point but also produced the first drawn XXXX League match for 1996.

This speaks volumes for the entertainment being provided by the XXXX League teams, with supporters being treated to three point matches rather than dour draws.

Round Two had 20 send-offs and by Round Three that number increased to a staggering 28 players having an early shower. Included in this last statistic were four goalkeepers! Is this another (unwanted) record?

Whilst it is appreciated that this item has been mentioned previously in this column, it nevertheless seems as though it bears repeating.

Clubs' responsibilities at the conclusion of their matches is to phone their results to the QSF office. Inaccurate scores and no scores at all, are unfortunately more the norm than the unusual at present. To provide accurate scores to the newspapers and to keep points tables upto-date and correct, requires more attention by those club officials responsible. With Soccer Pools about to recommence, some clubs are about to receive a hefty shock when the \$50 fines start to be recorded.

The latest decree from Soccer Australia is to the effect that the two referees' bodies, the Australian Soccer Referees Federation (ASRF) and the Affiliated Australian Soccer Referees Federation (AASRF), are to be merged into one organisation nationally. The object is to pool all resources, both human and administrative, to make for a more proficient affiliate. On the surface this appears to be a good move.

Farrar's superb keeping efforts in vain Rochedale striker Andy.

A sensational goalkeeping effort from Kevin Farrar was not enough to prevent Rochedale taking maximum points from Coalstars when the two sides met at Underwood Park last Friday night.

Despite the 3-0 loss, Farrar was nothing short of superb for the Coalminers, who defended bravely but were overcome by a Rochedale outfit that appeared to be a touch fitter than their Ipswich counterparts.

Rochedale dominated territory for most of the match, hounding and eventually breaking the Coalstars defence with three second half goals.

Both sides had limited opportunities in the first period, Coalstars sitting back in defence to shut down a number of Rovers' raids and content to catch the home side on the break when the opportunity arose.

Andy Lees and Darren Hillier created several first half chances for the home side but poor finishing denied the Rovers an early lead.


Coalstars' best chance came courtesy of midfielder Andrew King, who caught the Rovers defence napping to take the ball just outside the box and knock a curling shot across the face of goal.

Rochedale's persistence paid off 15 minutes after the break however.

Crafty midfielder Darren Hillier chipped a ball down the right flank for Kieran Cooper to cross to an unmarked Andy Lees, whose close

range shot was blocked by Farrar but deflected to Cooper who slammed the ball home for a 1-0 lead.

The home side found the net again in peculiar circumstances just ten minutes later, this time through Andy Lees.

Lees' scoring partner Cooper found himself in a one on one situation with Farrar and slotted the ball under the advancing keeper for what appeared to be a fair goal, only to be recalled by referee Mark Shield, who to the astonishment of the crowd, proceeded to award the home side a penalty.

Andy Lees took the spot kick which was again superbly stopped by Farrar but deflected back to Lees, who made no mistake cleaning up from just a few metres out.

The home side sealed the result ten minutes from time with a set piece from a corner.

Lees flicked Cooper's corner kick onto Craig Collins, who was ghosting at the far post and headed home for the 3-0 win.

Coalstars were unlucky not to go away with a consolation goal in the dying stages, after midfielder Jason Reinhardt hit a cracking shot from the edge of the box that looked certain to find the back of the net but was well saved by Rovers keeper Clint Dal Santo.

Another first for the Selby's

Queensland Academy of Sport Assistant Coach Connie Selby has been appointed to the position of Head Coach of the New South Wales ITC Women's program.

Her appointment is the first of its kind for a woman, Selby becoming the first female ever to take over as a Head Coach for any soccer program in Australia.

Selby will return to her place of birth, Sydney, to take up the position which officially begins next month on April 22.

The news comes not long after Selby's husband Jim was named as Soccer Australia's National Coaching and Development Manager.

Selby takes over from Tony Walmsley, who vacated the position to fill a new post as the Regional Director of Coaching for Wide Bay, and was thrilled at her appointment.

"It's something I've been striving for since these appointments came up twelve months ago," Selby said.

"It's also pleasing to see a woman take up such an important coaching position.

"No doubt it will be challenging as I've never been in a Head Coaching position before, but I more or less ran the QAS program for 18 months before Greg Brown took over, so I'm sure I will be able to cope."

Selby expects her role to be similar to the one she has played over the last three and a half years with the QAS.

"Obviously our main concern will be to develop young players to National standard and to ensure the successful development of women's soccer in New South Wales," Selby said.

A former Australian Womens' captain, and skipper of New South Wales, Northern New South Wales and Oueensland, Selby's distinguished playing career developed naturally into a successful coaching career, highlighted by her years at the QAS as well as stints as assistant coach of the Australian Youth Women's and Junior Women's sides.

Selby is quick to recognise the contribution the QAS has made to her career.

"I've had a good nurturing period in Oueensland and I must thank Wilma Shakespeare and the QAS for their support throughout my time up here," she said.

Meanwhile Nerang staged the best comeback of the season to date in a high scoring affair at Glennon Park against Pine Rivers.



Tigers turn tables on Lions

Grit versus flair was the order of the day at Heath Park on Sunday when a fighting performance from Eastern Suburbs earned them a 2-1 victory over Brisbane Lions.

The Tigers' first win of the season was the result of a policy of tough defending which saw them out-muscle their more fancied opponents.

Easts coach Walter Oldenburg was happy his team had followed their game plan of spoiling tactics and got the result they desperately needed.

"We know Lions play good football and our aim was to stop them playing it today," he said.

The signs were not good in the opening minutes however, with Lions creating numerous chances, the best falling to Anthony Brown with just 10 minutes gone.

Lions midfielder Chris Della Rocca picked the ball up on the halfway line and glided past two defenders before delivering a pass inside to Brown but his firm shot was straight at Easts keeper Robbie Harrison.

It was 20 minutes before Easts produced a serious attack on the Lions goal but they made no mistake when the chance presented itself.

Shane Tollenaere broke free wide on the left and measured a perfect cross on to the head of Chris Fegan (pictured) who gave Robbie Farrow no chance in the Lions goal.

It was a fine goal and no one appreciated it more than Tollenaere's brother Reece, on hand to watch after playing in the Brisbane Strikers win over Newcastle the night before.

Lions continued to dominate in possession but dogged defending forced them to resort to long range efforts, the most notable a ferocious 30 yarder from Warren Allen which shook the frame of the goal before being cleared to safety.



They did manufacture an equaliser just before the break when Roy Huth rose uncontested to send a header into the top corner.

It took Easts only five minutes to restore their lead after the break when a rare error from Lions skipper Frank Mengotti cost his team possession just outside the box.

The ball fell invitingly to first half scorer Fegan and his rasping drive was too hot for Farrow to handle. The Lions keeper took the pace off the ball but it still ballooned overhead and into the vacant net to give Easts a 2-1 lead.

Lions fought for the equaliser but despite all the flicks and tricks of Warren Allen and the languid skills of Cheeta Vosuga neither could conjure a chance as East's defence stood resolute in protecting their first points of the year.

Walter Oldenburg was full of praise for his Easts team after the final whistle saying he was particularly pleased with the determination they showed in defence.

Lions coach Miron Bleiberg on the other hand was annoyed with another sub-par effort from his players.



Having commented the past few weeks on teams at the top of tables, this week we will look at some who are in the nether regions.
