

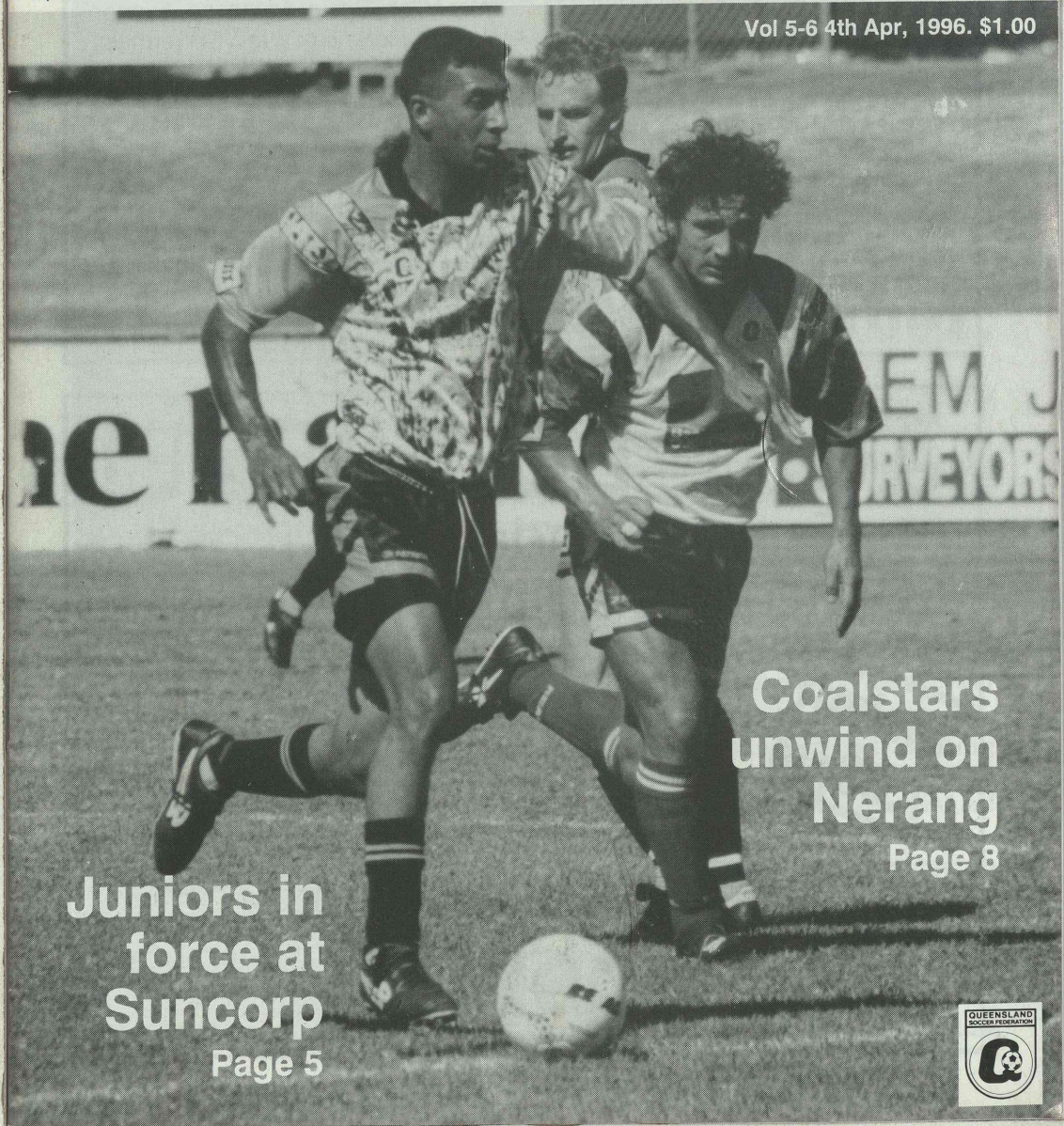

Editorial



The first rounds of the 1996 XXXX Queensland Cup kicked-off on Wednesday night with three matches played throughout Brisbane.

For the first time in the Cup's history, teams from Division Two will be included in this year's competition.

The top three second division sides at the end of April will gain the right to contest the cup.

The format for this year's Cup will be similar to that adopted in previous years, with the series played on a Round Robin basis, the first rounds concluding over the Labour Day weekend in May.

Five groups consisting of four teams each will battle it out to play in the Cup Final on the weekend of July 20-21.

Each group winner and the best performed runners-up following the preliminary matches will move onto the quarter final stage in June, with the semis to be played in July.

Prizemoney for this year's XXXX Queensland Cup is \$7,000 for the winner and \$3,500 for the runner up.

Another exciting concept, which will take shape in a basic junior format later this month, is the Mitre Golden Goal competition.

The Golden Goal concept is a competition played over a day consisting of a Round Robin series of 20 minute matches, where the first team to score wins the match.

The QSF will test the waters with a pilot competition being played amongst junior sides at Perry Park on Sunday April 21.

The concept has enormous potential and could bring soccer in line with other entertaining concepts from the other football codes such as rugby union's "sevens" and the AFL's "Lightning Cup".

Players, Coaches and Officials Be Warned.

An official crackdown on foul and abusive language will be enforced by the referees at the direction of the QSF as of this weekend.

Annerley delight in first win

Annerley brought the Redland devils down to earth with a convincing 3-0 victory when the two sides met at Elder Oval last Sunday.

For the locals, "young" player/coach Alan Niven led by example and seemed to be everywhere to give the necessary inspiration to his team mates.

In the 70th minute Niven supplied a great ball to Craig Menere, whose cross found an unmarked Colldy, who headed into the net.

Six minutes later Craig Menere scored the second goal for Annerley and Craig Boland made it 3-0 after Redlands' keeper Mark Haynes had thrown himself courageously to the feet of the goal scorer and almost brought off the save of the match. *Story by Anna Leigh*

2300 Juniors turn out in force

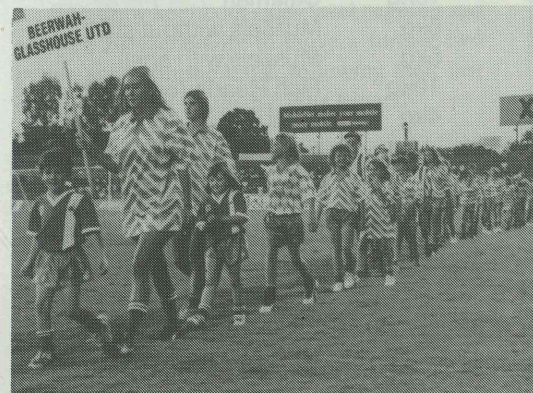
The Junior Soccer Season opened in spectacular fashion last Saturday night amidst some pomp and pagentry at Suncorp Stadium, when more than 2,000 youngsters paraded in all their glory in front of a huge record Brisbane Strikers home crowd of 8,516.

The parade was part of a joint promotion between the Strikers and the Queensland Olympic Council, designed to raise funds for Queensland athletes representing their country at this year's Atlanta Olympic Games.

In all, some 2,300 junior soccer players turned out dressed in their complete strips, from places as far away as Towoomba, Tweed Heads and the Sunshine Coast.

Sadly, a number of the larger well known clubs did not make it to the event.

The highlight of the juniors parade was the obvious effort made from many of the smaller clubs such as Kingsridge and Maleny, who had five marchers each and those from places far away, including Nambour, Towoomba and Tweed Heads.

The march past complemented a superb fireworks and gymnastics display as well as a motorcade of past Olympic legends including sprinter Marlene Matthews, swimmer Justin Lemberg, members of Australia's 1956 Olympic Games soccer team Col Kitching and Graham McMillan, and current sprint sensation 18 year old Sharon Cripps who is herself Atlanta bound.

Strikers players Frank Farina and Alan Hunter also accepted special awards for their participation in the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games.

The whole affair was a sight to see and if you weren't there, then you missed an evening that did soccer proud. The event had to be the biggest turn out of the soccer fraternity in years and to see the faces on the children was a pure delight... the Strikers won too. ▶

■ Clubs are reminded to keep up to date with their player insurance payments. By arrangement with the brokers, payment is to be made in three instalments, with 25 percent upon application, 50 percent prior to April 30 and the balance by May 31. The big payment, whilst not yet due, is also to be made when clubs are most viable with their income. Therefore for the sake of your players and officials, stay on time.

■ Much has been spoken of late (the last three months in fact) on the revamping of the competition for 1997. The good news is that the criteria and application forms for the semi-

professional and amateur divisions are ready and will be sent upon application, from Perry Park. The bad news is that it is a rather lengthy (of necessity) document and should be very carefully read before returning by the due date of June 30.

■ Our highly successful Art Union is ready to kick off again with outstanding prizes. Clubs fund raising incomes benefited substantially, as nearly all monies raised went to the selling club. The QSF only requires a minimum amount to cover Government charges and costs. Everyone should become involved in this fundraiser. ▶

The draw kept both sides level pegging and allowed Brisbane City to move a further two points ahead on the table, following their last minute 2-1 victory against Pine Rivers.

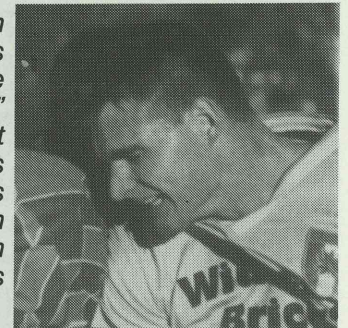

Coalstars unwind on Nerang

Nerang were on the receiving end of a 6-1 thrashing on Sunday as Coalstars showed the Gold Coast team what XXXX League football is all about.

Last week's gallant comeback against Pine Rivers was a distant memory as Nerang were outplayed in every department by an outstanding Coalstars side.

The Ipswich team took no time to assert their authority with Rick Brown blasting in their first goal after only five minutes.

Coalstars midfielder Richard Hilli responded by producing the definitive moment of the match, conjuring what must be the goal of the season so far.

Hilli received the ball inside his own half, glided past one defender and exhibited tremendous speed before finishing the run with a fierce bending drive from 20 yards which gave Nerang keeper Eddie Dixon no chance.

On the stroke of haltime Coalstars made it 4-0 when an Eastwell cross was deflected in for an own goal.

Coalstars were hungry for more goals after the break and nearly scored right from the kick off with an Eastwell strike well saved by Dixon.

It was Cockbain who finally took advantage for Nerang when he struck a firm shot past Kevin Farrar in the Coalstars goal.

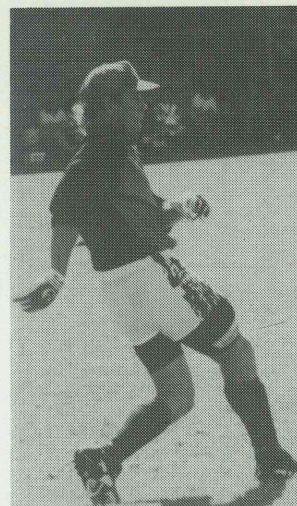
Coalstars made sure they had the final word, with Wes Park jumping well to head in his team's sixth in the last few minutes of the match.

Wayne Warren was very pleased but not about to get carried away with the performance of his Coalstars outfit.

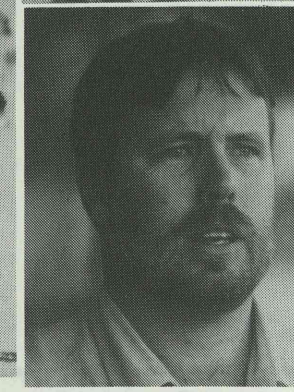
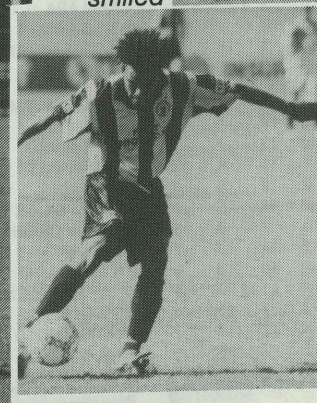
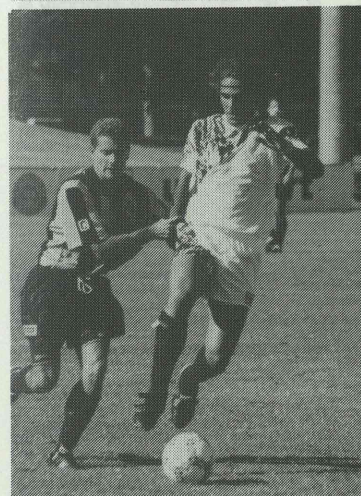
"It was good to get a result like that particularly with players like Troy Hews and Peter McKendrick out through injury" he said.

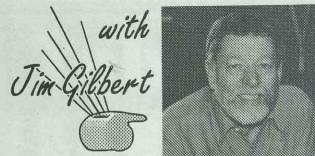
