Editorial



Well it appears the referees are really taking this crackdown on foul and abusive language very seriously as evident by the post weekend reports that have arrived to date.

Around 40 players were sent from the field during last weekend's round of matches for foul and abusive language, a statistic which has been the subject of many conversations amongst the Queensland soccer fraternity in the last week.

It seems one of the glaring problems with the OSF directive on the issue of foul language is the lack of consistency and common sense being used when referees are enforcing the law.

The directive was brought down by the QSF last week in an attempt to clean up a problem that was growing in cancerous proportions and turning spectators away from the local competions.

Since the weekend's crackdown, concerns have been expressed by club officials over the way the law is being enforced.

It appears at some of the grounds around Brisbane, a number of players were sent from the field for cursing their own poor play under their breath and out of earshot of the specators, while at other grounds players in similar circumstances were given numerous warnings and were not automatically dismissed.

Obviously the quietly muttered curse under the breath. which would travel no more than two feet through the air, is totally different to the loud statements that float right across the park and offend the ears of the spectators.

Two observations should be made here. Firstly, no matter how frustrated players get, they are grown men who should be able to control their tounges, and secondly the referees must develop some consistency in their application of the law.

Surely "Law 18" of the Rules of the Game must prevail in this instance... the law of common sense.

- From the Sideline -

The inaugural Mitre Golden Goal competition gets underway next Sunday, April 21 at Perry Park. The Golden Goal concept is a competition played over a day incorporating a Round Robin series of 20 minute matches, where the first team to score wins the match. Next weekend's Mitre Golden Goal competition will be a pilot contest involving U14 junior sides from clubs throughout Brisbane. It is envisaged that should the concept take off, it may also be incorporated at the senior level in the near future. The concept has enormous potential and is designed to bring soccer in line with other entertaining concepts from the other football codes, such as rugby union's "Sevens" and the AFL's "Lightning Cup".

The 1996 XXXX Queensland Cup competition commenced last week, with three matches played. Wynnum defeated Taringa Rovers 2-1, Pine Rivers had a comfortable 4-1 victory over North Star and Nerang downed Beenleigh 1-0. Another match was played last night between Coalstars and Eastern Suburbs at Bundamba. There are two XXXX Queensland Cup matches next week. Grange Thistle play host to the Gold Coast next Tuesday April 16, while Brisbane Lions will meet the highly fancied Toowoomba side at Richlands the

following night, Wednesday April 17. The competition will get into full swing during the Labour Day long weekend which is on the 4th, 5th and 6th of May.

Capalaba reserves' coach Chris Beswick got more than he bargained for when he turned up for the first of three matches against Olympic on Monday. Youth team coach Doug Prentice was ill so Beswick took his place in the first match. He followed up with his own reserves match and then took the reigns again in the absence of first team coach Eric Thompson for the final game of the day. Apparently Chris slept very on Monday night.

Soccer Australia last week announced the restructuring of the Ericsson Cup top six Championship series, which will see the Grand Final played on Sunday May 26, 1996. As quoted in last week's edition of Australian and British Soccer Weekly, the Ericsson Cup Executive, together with club representatives, including Alan Vessey representing the Brisbane Strikers, met over the weekend the decision was made and voted in favour of the rescheduling. Interestingly, Alan Vessey was absent from the meeting and Brisbane was the only club to oppose that option. Talk about railroading!

Lions keelhauled by Pirates

Rochedale gave league leaders Brisbane City something to think about with an emphatic 6-0 thrashing of Lions on Saturday night.

The Pirates knocked in five goals in the second half to put themselves back in the title race following last week's frustrating result against Beenleigh.

Lions were competitive for the opening half hour and actually had the first chance when Anthony Brown shot narrowly wide.

But two minutes later Kieran Cooper set Rochedale on the way to victory when he latched on to a Brenley Jefferd through ball and buried his shot in the bottom corner.

Rochedale nearly found a second goal just before the break but Lions defender Jeff Lombardo was perfectly positioned to clear Andy Lees shot off the line.

The second half belonged to Cooper though, as he turned from scorer to creator and made three goals in the space of 15 minutes.

Andy Lees was the first to benefit as he beat the offside trap and ran on to an inch-perfect Cooper pass before rounding Robbie Farrow in the Lions goal and side-footing in from a tight angle.

Next Cooper showed surprising pace to run down a speculative through ball before holding it up and waiting for Darren Hillier whose swerving shot flashed into the top corner.

Three minutes later Cooper made a third goal when his measured pass inside to Hillier was deflected into the net by Lions substitute Anthony Cotton in trying to stop the Rochedale onslaught.

With the scoreboard reading 4-0 even Rochedale's defenders were getting goal hungry

and Damian Harris made it five with an awkward looking, but effective bicycle kick, ten minutes from time.

But it was Jefferd who drove the final nail into a battered Lions coffin. That man Cooper again found space in the box and laid the ball across the goal for the late arriving Jefferd to finish the scoring at 6-0.

Rochedale coach Kim Wishart couldn't have been happier after the match saying his team was starting to play the way he wanted.

"We had a slow start but we're getting back to somewhere near our best".

"The Cooper/Lees combination is starting to work very well for us and they are starting to look to make chances for each other" he said.

Miron Bleiberg was at a loss to explain Lions' performances so far this season but said he believed there was still time to mount a challenge for a finals berth.

"Manchester City had a terrible start in the English Premier League but have turned it around. Hopefully, if the luck starts going our way we can do something similar".

State Coach true blue maroon

As a born and bred Queenslander, new state coach John Stewart knows what it takes to represent Queensland in the cauldron of intertstate football.

The eight cap veteran, now captain-coaching Slacks Creek in the third division, has been involved in Queensland soccer for over a decade at senior level.

During that time he has captained the Maroons, represented Brisbane Lions in the National Soccer League and led Rochedale Rovers to grand final success in 1993.

Stewart said he was looking forward to taking over the reins from former state coach Juan Cutillas.

"My ideas on the game are very basic," the 36 year old said. "Work hard, play the game very simple and let the players enjoy it."

"If they don't enjoy it, they don't express themselves."

With the proposed interstate series up in the air subject to financial viability, the program for Queensland this year remains in limbo.

However, the side will meet traditional rivals New South Wales in a home and away series, continue its yearly clash with Auckland and face a one-off game against the Northern Territory.

Stewart has a decided advantage over his predecessors with the availability of Queensland's NSL stars subject to their finals itinerary.

"I'll liaise with Bruce (Strikers coach Bruce Stowell) on the subject of his players," Stewart said.

As in the past, the side won't be limited strictly to National League players and Stewart will be heavily reliant on his yet to be appointed assistant when it comes to local talent.

On the subject of country players, while not



denying the talent existed in the remote areas, Stewart believes those with ability generally gravitate to XXXX League clubs.

"Clubs themselves have been bringing people down and they get looked at for the Queensland side," he said. "It's very unusual that a quality player remains in the country."

With his club facing a series of Friday night clashes over the next seven weeks, the newly appointed coach is free to probe the local league for quality players.

"I'll listen to people's opinions," he said. "If Stowell wants to look at a player I think should be looked at I'll use him."

"It's a learning experience at that level. It's my goal to have the team play entertaining soccer, particularly in the one off friendlies where the entertainment value is the most important thing."

Stewart remains committed to helping Slacks Creek earn a place in the streamlined XXXX League next year, but his long term ambition remains to coach at the highest level.

A successful season in charge of the mighty Maroons would be the perfect springboard.
