## Taringa Golden Goal Champs

Taringa Rovers took out the inaugural Mitre Golden Goal competition with a thrilling extra time victory over Beenleigh at Perry Park last Sunday.

The golden goal in the grand final was scored just a few seconds before the end of the second period of extra time, and was a fitting climax to what proved to be a very successful junior trial. The fastest goal of the day took only 27 seconds to score.

Not only did the day show that fourteen year old soccer players could entertain crowds, but that the concept of Golden Goal has the potential to move well beyond the junior ranks.

More than 500 people witnessed the trial, involving 12 junior teams and coordinator Ron Bradley was pleased with the response.

"For clubs wishing to conduct Golden Goal competitions in the future, all the indications from Sunday's trial were golden," Bradley said.

## History books re-written

The Hyundai Brisbane Strikers have made Queensland soccer history by becoming the first side from the Sunshine State to make it to the finals of the Ericsson Cup.

The Strikers sealed their finals spot last weekend with two sensational goals by Frank Farina giving the side a 2-0 win over South Melbourne and rocketing them into the playoffs.

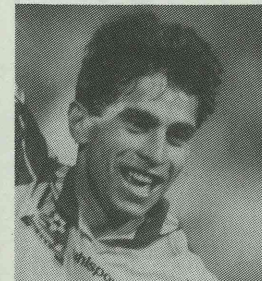
The team now has the chance of securing the minor premiership should they defeat UTS Olympic at Leichhardt Oval this Sunday night.

A win in the final round of the Ericsson Cup this weekend would at the very least keep the Strikers in the top two and present them with the chance of hosting next month's Grand Final.

If the Strikers win and Marconi Fairfield either draw or lose their match with fringe finals contenders West Adelaide in Sydney, the minor premiership crown will fall to Brisbane.

It has been a remarkable season for the Strikers, who last year acquired the services of scoring whiz Frank Farina, secured a three year sponsorship deal with major automobile company Hyundai, and moved to the luxurious Suncorp Stadium.

Season 1995/96 has seen all of the club records tumble.



Frank Farina's 19 goals to date has shattered the previous record for the most number of goals scored in a season, which was held by Rod Brown and Chris Slater, who both scored nine last season.

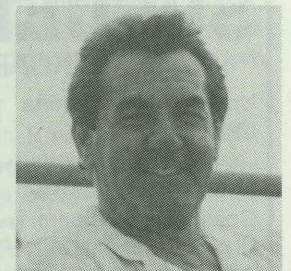
The attendance record for a match, which was 4957 for the match against the Melbourne Knights last season, has been smashed on



numerous occasions at Suncorp Stadium, with the record now standing at 8516, which was attained against Morwell Falcons a few short weeks back.

The side also set a new club record for the biggest undefeated streak for the Strikers, playing 12 matches without loss, which included going through an entire round undefeated.

Strikers coach Bruce Stowell said he was extremely pleased with the way the side has performed this season, and hoped they could push on for a win this weekend in Sydney and a top two spot.



"It really has been a remarkable season, one where the Strikers have established themselves as one of Australia's premier soccer clubs," Stowell said.

"In saying that, it has also been a testing season, with numerous injuries throughout. But the side's determination to make the playoffs has come through and now that we have achieved this, our next objective is to win against Olympic this Sunday to move into the top two and possibly take out the Premiership."



## QSF NOTICE BOARD - EXTRAS

■ Although a small number of Queensland Cup matches have already been played, the competition gets underway in earnest next week. The big disappointment is the lack of participation by a number of regional Federations, thus taking a little of the "global" aspect away from a competition bearing the name of our state. However this may turn out to be a plus for the Division Two sides drawn into the Cup. The three sides, Rocklea United, Olympic United and Acacia Ridge, by plying their wares against their XXXX League counterparts, will have an inside running into how they may compete in next year's new restructured competition. How does the old saying go? "One person's misfortune is to another's benefit" or something like that.

■ Clubs are reminded their second premium on the Player Insurance program is due before

April 30. A check of the QSF Board Minutes on April 9 will note that teams will be withdrawn from fixtures if the insurance cover is not up to date. The warning is clear!

■ The statistics from Disciplinary Committee minutes continue to make "fascinating" reading. Since the original crackdown on foul and abusive language, they read: April 10, 48 sendoffs, 32 foul and abusive language; April 17, 39 sendoffs, 22 foul and abusive language. But in the latter, an incredible nine red cards were issued to teams in Division Seven alone, including three from Mooroondu and two each from Darra and Clairvaux. Surely these clubs and their team officials must heed the warnings.

## Teenager's effort all in vain

**A Kieran Cooper hat-trick sealed the points for Rochedale in a lopsided contest with North Star at Underwood Park on Friday Night.**

The 6-1 result showed the gulf in class between the two sides but it might have been a lot worse if not for a host of fine saves by North Star's teenage keeper Paul Deranja.

Rochedale's John Weatherby had a number of chances early on but the athletic Deranja was equal to the challenge on each occasion.

In fact it took the Pirates nearly half an hour to find a way past the young North Star custodian.

A glancing Craig Collins header from a Weatherby cross finally found the net and seemed to open the floodgates for Rochedale with Kieran Cooper scoring two in the next 10 minutes.

The first was a simple tap-in from a rebound, the second a delicate flick over the advancing Deranja and into the vacant net.

Cooper completed his hat-trick just after the break with a shot on the turn which rolled just inside the far post.

But to their credit North Star never gave up and captain Brendan Rogers in particular showed a lot of character as he continued to make probing runs into the Rochedale half.

In the 55th minute they found the goal their efforts deserved much to the appreciation of their small, but extremely vocal band of travelling supporters. Paul Schloss challenged well on the edge of the area and Ben Dwyer smashed the loose ball into the top corner for a 4-1 scoreline.

The goal seemed to fire North Star up and Rogers nearly added a second only have his shot

kicked away by Rochedale's Wayne Evans.

Rochedale responded to the challenge and restored their four goal buffer soon after as Craig Collins scored his second with a clever deflection from a driven Jefferd cross.

Five minutes from time John Weatherby made it 6-1 and crowned a great personal performance with a deflected goal which gave Deranja no chance.

After the match Rochedale coach Kim Wishart applauded a resolute performance from his team's North Star opponents.

"I was impressed by their determination and I think they could pinch a couple of results in the remainder of the season."

North Star's Michael McEvoy said this was the last of the really tough games for his side and they were confident they would take points against some of their fellow strugglers in the weeks to come.

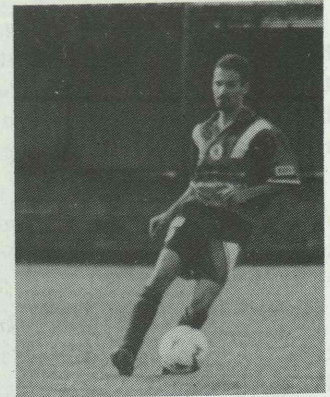
Meanwhile at Goodwin Park, Olympic continued their good run of form with a 7-2 trouncing of Willowburn.

And while the fans held up cards awarding him points ranging from 8.5 to 10, with a sole Beenleigh supporter giving him a zero, Gibbs' card had no number on it and was yellow.

Coalstars were reduced to ten men shortly after Hilli's goal when midfielder Jason Reinhardt was sent from the field for his second offence.

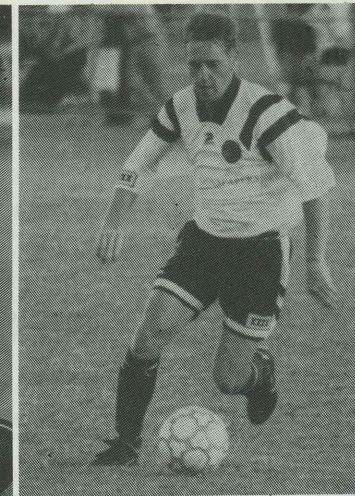
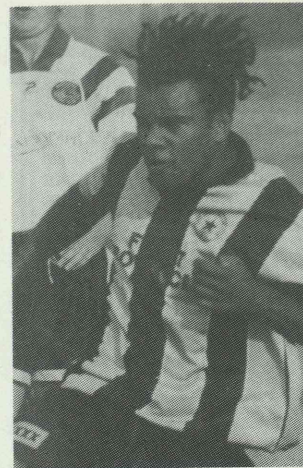
Beenleigh rallied to take full toll of their extra man advantage and Alan McFarlane began the recovery with 20 minutes remaining.

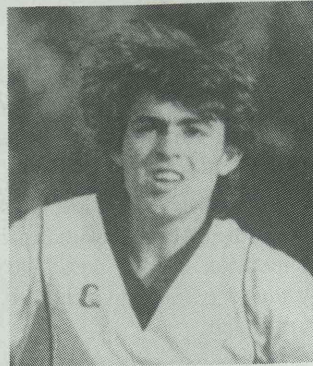
Injuries and suspensions weakened Capalaba for its match against the Ridge, with the loss of two key defenders and a defensive midfielder compounding their woes.
