





Editorial



It appears as though a definite top five is starting to take shape following Wynnum's 4-3 victory over Taringa at Jack Speare Park last weekend.

That match was a six point game for the Rovers. A win would have moved them into the top five, but the loss has now left them six points or two wins out of the money.

I've never been one to rule Taringa out of any top five but I must say that my faith in the Rovers to make the play-offs this year, has dwindled somewhat recently.

Although rocked with numerous injuries over the past few months, the form of Juan Cutillas' boys has been indifferent to say the least.

Time to go out on a limb! I believe the sides that currently make up the top five in the XXXX League will be the sides that play off for the Championship at the end of the year.

A brief glance at the season so far and a look at the current makeup of the XXXX League table, suggests a number of sides could already be ruled out.

To rule out North Star would be to state the obvious, while Eastern Suburbs, Pine Rivers and Coalstars will be purely nuisance value for the remainder of the season.

It's unfortunate Pine Rivers have taken this long to show their true potential, because I think they are a better side than their position on the ladder indicates.

Despite finishing on top of their group in the Queensland Cup, Thistle have conceded a massive 23 goals in their last six XXXX League outings and have scored just once, indicating to me that they just don't have what it takes to cut it this season, and Nerang's away form should mean that they will remain in the middle of the table.

Visiting teams should beware of Glennon Park though, with Nerang holding Rochedale, City and Lions to draws at home in the past few weeks.

As far as the Premiership is concerned, it's extremely tight at the top after City squandered what once looked to be an insurmountable eleven point lead.

But my gut feeling says that the title could be decided in the final round of the season at Spencer Park when Brisbane City host Brisbane Lions.

Aussie top guns in Brisbane

More than \$50 million of talent will be on show when Australia's international soccer stars currently playing overseas and here at home, clash at Suncorp Stadium on Sunday June 23.

Multi-million dollar megastars such as Aston Villa goalkeeper Mark Bosnich and striker Aurelio Vidmar, will return home for the unprecedented two-match series to be known as The Superstars of Soccer 1996 Challenge.

Soccer Australia intends for the Superstars of Soccer Series to become an annual event each June when Australia's stars playing in the UK and Europe will meet our local heroes head on.

The first match of the series will be played next Wednesday evening at the Sydney Football Stadium, with the return leg set down for Suncorp Stadium the following Sunday, June 23. Future series will rotate throughout the country's capital cities and soccer centres.

Soccer Australia Chairman David Hill, in announcing the series said: "This is an unprecedented and exciting football innovation. Never before in the history of the game in this country will there have been a greater accumulation of local soccer skill, speed and class on the pitch at the same time."

"It's the most expensive Australian soccer talent ever assembled - valued at over \$50 million on the international market.

"This is the very best of Australian soccer. It's the clash millions of Australian sports fans have been hoping for. Just how good are our million dollar exports? Are our Australian-based players good enough to beat them?"

Hill said the Superstars of Soccer Series would become Australian Soccer's answer to the successful State of Origin series in Rugby League and Australian Rules.

In a major breakthrough for soccer coverage, the two-match series will be supported exclusively by the Nine Network.

English club Leicester's Zeljko Kalac ioins the Aussie International Travellers along with Mark Bosnich from Aston Villa for the clash at Suncorp Stadium Sunday June



Bosnich, rated by many as the best goalkeeper in the world, was extremely excited by the series concept.

"This series will be a shot in the arm for soccer at a time when the greatest game in the world is growing in popularity in Australia," Bosnich said.

"The timing is just right. For years, everyone associated with Australian Soccer has been arguing about who is best - the full time professionals playing overseas or the boys back home, part-timers playing largely for love? They'll certainly be out to prove a point."

Australia's Olympic coach Raul Blanco and Sydney United coach Branko Culina will handle the overseas side, wich will be called the "International Travellers", while UTS Olympic and Newcastle Breakers coaches David Ratcliffe and John Kosmina will take charge of the homebased team to be known as the "True Blues".

Home and away rules will apply to the series. Each team will have a designated home game, with "Golden Goal" time and penalty shoot-out if needed, to decide the Challenge winner.

It was disturbing to note last week of a Brisbane sports writer who was banned from the Queensland Rugby League team's dressing room, following comments he made in a story a few days prior to last Monday's State of Origin match in Sydney.

The subsequent meeting of the Rugby League Writers Association condemned the ban, suggesting it was against all principles underlying a free press society.

Ironically, one of Eye On Soccer's intrepid reporters was afforded the same (dis)courtesy last weekend, when attempting to obtain a comment from a high profile 7th Division coach.

The reporter was refused entry into this team's dressing room after the match because of some obscure comment made in *From The Sideline* a few weeks ago.

The Soccer Writers Association (SWA) had their monthly meeting last week in the telephone

box at the corner of Creek and Anne Streets, to discuss this latest development.

Again the SWA condemned the actions of the Division 7 club and also decided they may have to find another meeting place after keeping prospective phone users waiting for just over an hour. Telstra is investigating.

Chief Petty Affairs Officer for the SWA, Mr Dick Noall, released the following statement after the meeting.

"An incident such as this one has far wretching consequences not only for the media but for society at large.

"The Soccer Writers Association can not and will not tolerate such blatant acts against the free press, which has served our society so diligently in modern times.

"You can be rest assured, we will fight Telstra all the way!"

Upsets highlight Qld Cup

Upsets dominated last weekend's round of XXXX Queensland Cup matches, and yet again, only XXXX League teams have progressed to the quarter final stage.

All five regional areas and the three second division teams were knocked out but did manage to show their XXXX League counterparts that they could cause a few headaches on their day.

In Group One, Bundaberg and Maryborough were easily accounted for by Wynnum, who finished on top of that group after winning all three of their matches, and Taringa who qualified for the quarter finals with six points and a plus nine goal difference.

Last year's Queensland Cup runners-up, Pine Rivers, cruised into the next round with impressive wins over the Sunshine Coast, Olympic United and North Star in Group Two.

North Star also notched up their first win of the year when they defeated Olympic 3-2 on Monday.

The out-of-sorts Grange Thistle were surprise winners of Group Three, with a 1-1 draw against the Gold Coast, a 2-0 win over Acacia Ridge and a shock 1-0 victory over XXXX League leaders Brisbane City, giving them a total of seven points.

City also qualified for the quarters after defeating the Gold Coast and Ridge to finish on six points.

Beenleigh were a huge disappointment in Group Four. They failed to score a single goal in any of their opening round matches and were humiliated by Toowoomba to the tune of 4 goals to nil last Saturday.

In the end it was Lions' crushing 6-0 defeat of Toowoomba which allowed them to sneak to the top of that group with seven points and a plus seven goal difference, five more goals than Nerang who also finished on seven points, enough for them to appear in the quarter finals.

The final group proved to be an intriguing contest with underdogs Eastern Suburbs storming home after three mighty wins against Coalstars, Division Two leaders Rocklea and glamour side Rochedale. Indeed Rochedale struggled to come to terms with Cup football and failed to win a match.

The Rovers were shown up by Rocklea 1-0 last week, could only manage to take a point from Coalstars last Saturday and were 2-1 losers to Easts on Monday.

Wynnum scotch Taringa

Two fantastic goals from Wynnum striker Jamie Macpherson decided the match as the visitors snuck away with the points in a 4-3 goalfest at Jack Speare Park on Sunday afternoon.

The two clubs seemed determined to make up for providing the only XXXX League entertainment of the weekend by trying to score as many goals as would normally be scored in a full round of fixtures.

If attacking flair was then to be the order of the day, no one exhibited it more spectacularly than Wynnum's new Scottish import Jamie Macpherson.

He showed his class from the outset, demanding a fine save from Taringa keeper Andrew Hobbs after only eight minutes.

But soon after Macpherson gave Hobbs no chance when he had time and space to produce an acrobatic volley which rocketed into the top

The lead was short lived however, a Brent Read corner finding the head of Paul Worroll at the farpost and Fraser Cuba first to the knock back to level the scores just four minutes later.

Macpherson was again in the action moments later, controlling the ball and laying it off for big Geoff Maltby to arrow a stinging drive past Hobbs and put his side back in front.

It was to be Maltby's last involvement in the match as he suffered a facial injury in a heading duel with Des Hughes and was replaced by Malcolm Van Basten.

Wynnum then extended their lead when Macpherson picked the ball up in midfield and tried a speculative strike from some thirty yards. The ball's late dip clearly deceived Hobbs and he could only watch as it dropped just under the crossbar, much to the jubilation of Macpherson and his teamates.

Scottish Jamie Macpherson notched up two classy goals. One, a quality overhead, then a 30 vard missile during his side's triumph over Taringa



The goal seemed to compound what had already been a shaky performance from Hobbs and he was nearly beaten again when he failed to reach a far post cross. Wynnum's Danny Valle got his head to the ball but Hobbs' blushes were saved by a goaline clearance from John Ogden.

The goals continued to rain in at the start of the second half with three in a four minute spell.

Firstly Cuba scored his second, an awkward looking but effective header from a Marc Flemington cross.

Three minutes later Hobbs' nightmare was complete when he was dispossessed following a backpass from Gavin Freier and Paul Wilkins rolled the ball in to give Wynnum a 4-2 lead.

Demetri Theochari kept Taringa in the game a minute later with an impressive shot on the turn which gave Wynnum custodian Kevin Tatton no chance.

It was all Taringa in the last twenty minutes as the home side tried everything to conjure an equaliser.

A shot from Flemington grazed an upright and two further chances to Cuba went close but it was not enough to stop Wynnum going home with a hard fought three points.
