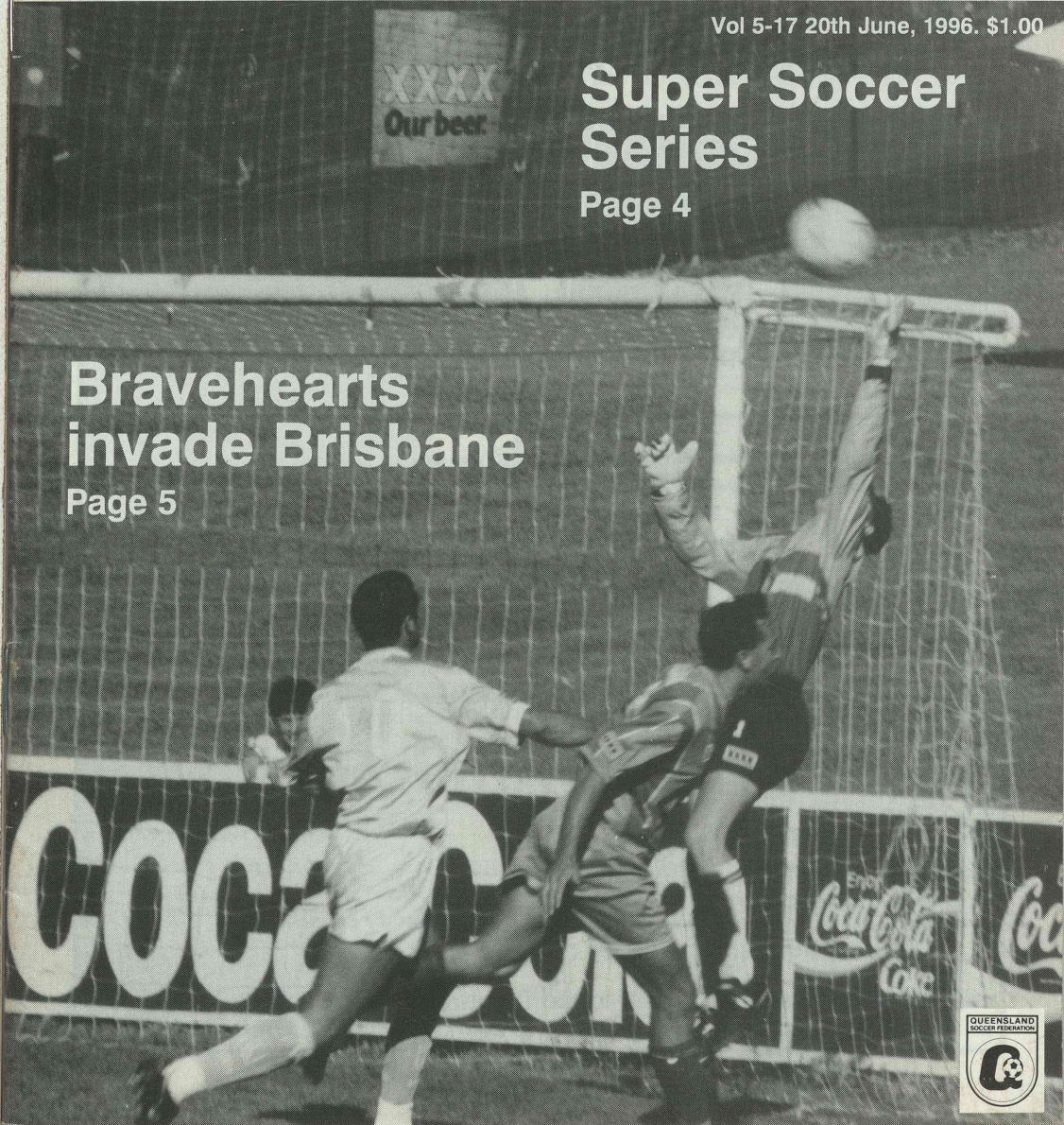

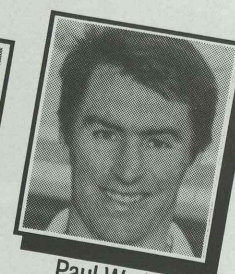

Editorial



The exciting Superstars of Soccer Series kicked-off last night in Sydney and the players arrived in Brisbane today for the second leg at Suncorp Stadium this Sunday afternoon.

The match represents a fantastic chance for kids and autograph hunters to meet their soccer heroes in the flesh... players like Mark Bosnich, Aurelio Vidmar, Mark Viduka, Steve Corica and the "Sultan of Suncorp", Frank Farina.

Never before has such an assortment of Australian soccer talent been on show to the Brisbane public, and with admission prices very reasonable in comparison to other major footballing events, the opportunity to witness the *best play the best* should not be missed.

Conservative estimates have it that more than \$50 million dollars of talent will be on the Suncorp Stadium turf come Sunday afternoon, a figure that easily eclipses the figure of \$46 million, the rugby league State of Origin players were bragged to be worth.

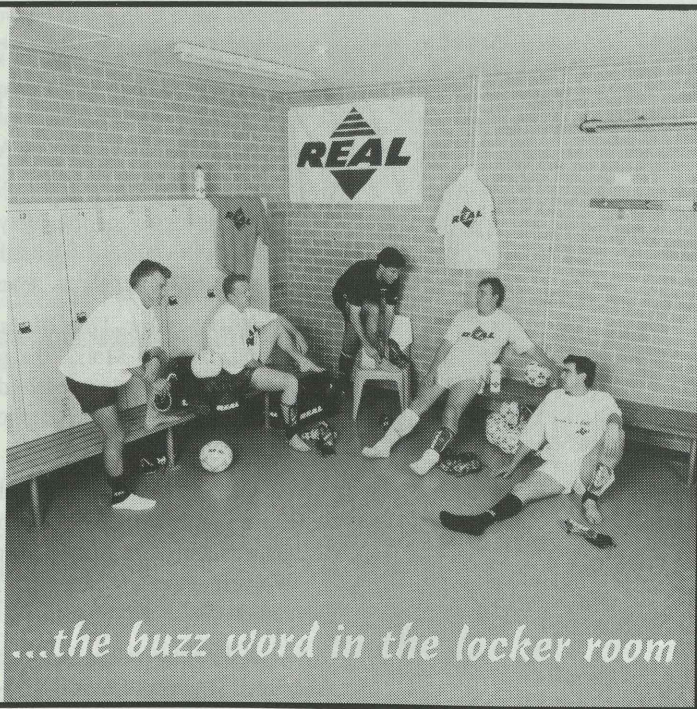

Bravehearts invade Brisbane

The local soccer scene has been boosted by the arrival of two Scottish imports, who are in Brisbane for the remainder of the season.

Wynnum's latest addition, striker Jamie Macpherson, has already impressed local fans with his abilities, following two spectacular goals against Taringa a fortnight ago, and Division 3 side Newmarket have picked up the other import, Mark Holmes.

Both players have come to Australia on one-year visas, and had originally planned to follow leading Scottish coach George Cowie out, after he signalled his intentions to take over the coaching role at Wynnum prior to the start of the season.

Cowie is still eager to coach in Australia and is currently sorting out personal details prior to his departure.

Macpherson, 25, was actually born in Sydney and his Australian passport allows him to play in the top division, however 20-year-old Holmes is out on a tourist visa, which makes him ineligible to play in the XXXX League.

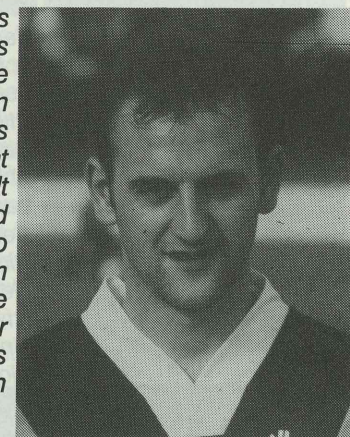
But the young midfielder, who has been with Scottish Third Division side Caledonian Thistle, has been setting the third division alight, and there is little wonder why after stints as an invitational player with junior Wales' sides.

Holmes said he would like to have trials with a couple of National League sides while he was over here, especially after knocking back a trial with the Vancouver Whitecaps in Canada, to visit Australia.

Macpherson, who has spent the last four years with Ross County in the Scottish Third Division, said he had not come to terms with Brisbane's heat as yet.

"The heat seems to make the game a lot slower over here," Macpherson said.

"The major difference between the game here and the game over in Scotland, is that here you tend to have a lot more time on the ball.

"I haven't seen any National League teams yet but that is just something I've noticed in the XXXX League."

Macpherson is confident Wynnum will make the top five this year but played down thoughts his inclusion could be the difference between finals glory or just another season.

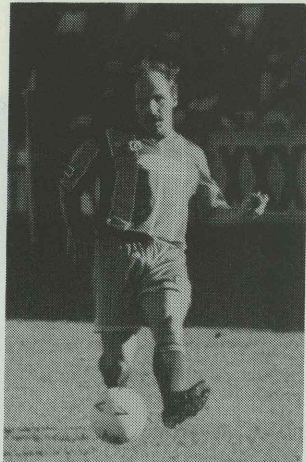
"I don't think one person can make a difference, but as long as we stay in the top five, I think we're as good a chance as anyone else for the title," he said.

Although only 25 years of age, Macpherson has had a great deal of experience, including several years in the Highland League in Scotland, a competition which has boasted names such as current Scottish International Colin Hendry.

Both Macpherson and Holmes hope to continue pleasing local soccer crowds with their fine skills and knack of scoring goals. □



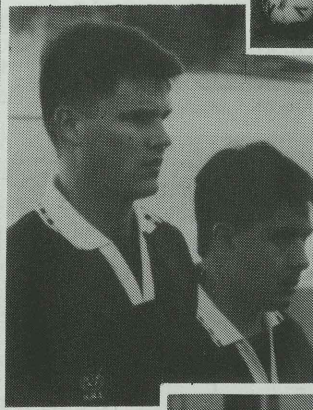
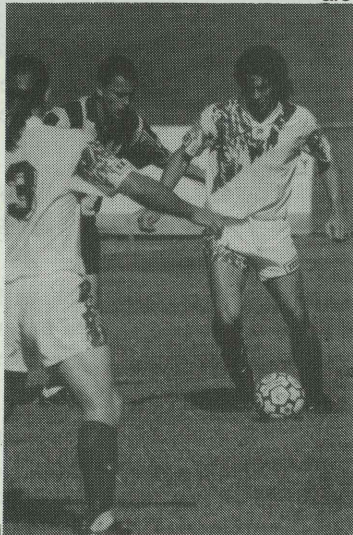
ACTION REPLAY

Pirates prove derby point

A drenched Underwood park greeted Rochedale and Beenleigh for their big derby on Saturday night, but the Pirates made light of the conditions to secure a workman-like 2-0 victory.

It was always going to be difficult playing in a mire under several centimetres of water, but the standard of play by both sides remained surprisingly high in the early stages.

Rochedale's Craig Collins in particular seemed to thrive in the wet skipping away from his marker on several occasions to deliver quality crosses into the frontmen.

But the first serious attempt on goal came from Beenleigh striker Brett Druery. Richard Duffy picked the ball up inside his own half and showed great pace to burn off Rochedale speedster John Weatherby before his deflected cross looped up for Druery to test Rochedale keeper Clint Dal Santo with an overhead volley.

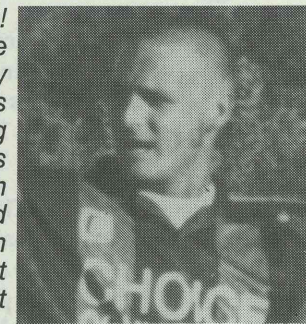
Surface water made for some wayward passing from both teams at times, but Rochedale utilised the conditions to the fullest with the opening goal on the half hour. A skidding long ball wrong-footed the Beenleigh defence, falling perfectly for Kieran Cooper to control and dispatch the ball into the bottom corner.

The goal signified the start of an all out assault by Rochedale, which saw the ball barely leave Beenleigh's half before the break.

The Pirates took complete control of the midfield and sprayed the ball around at will looking for an opening.

The slippery conditions should have provided Cooper with his second of the night, when Beenleigh defender Corey Fisher lost his balance allowing Andy Lees to race towards goal. He drew two defenders before rolling the ball into Cooper's path but the big striker uncharacteristically shot well wide.

Further clear cut chances were wasted by Gary Brattan and Brenley Jefferd before Lees produced a second goal for his side just before the break. Cooper atoned for his earlier miss by heading down perfectly for his striking partner to smash the ball in for a halftime score of 2-0.

Rochedale continued to dominate after the break against fourth placed Beenleigh, showing why six of their players have been named in the preliminary Queensland squad.

Cooper should have had a second in the opening minute of the half but again his normally deadly touch in front of goal let him down as he stumbled over the ball, the miscue welcomed by Beenleigh keeper Chris Roche.

John Weatherby flashed a shot across the face of goal and two more chances fell to Lees, but Rochedale were unable to add to their tally.

In what seems to be becoming a regular event, goalscorer Lees lost his cool again and was sent off for the second time in three weeks.

With Rochedale down to ten men, Beenleigh's pacy substitute Jason Eacott began to cause havoc and the visitors took control of the match in the final quarter of an hour.

But they had left their run too late and Jarrod Austin came closest to a consolation goal just before fulltime, when he ran at the heart of the Rochedale defence before flashing a powerful strike just wide. □

Wolves struggle to victory

The Wynnum Wolves face a tough week with two matches to play in four days, as their campaign for berths in the XXXX Queensland Cup final and XXXX League semis, intensifies.

Wynnum meet Grange Thistle tonight at Perry Park in a quarter final match in the XXXX Queensland Cup and are confident of victory against a side that is at present enduring a mid-season slump.

The last time the sides met in the League, Thistle escaped with a draw when the Wolves conceded two late penalties after leading 3-1.

Wynnum's XXXX League aspirations received a further boost on the weekend when they defeated North Star 1-0 to remain in fifth spot in the competition.

With Beenleigh losing to Rochedale last weekend, the Wolves are now only one point away from fourth position.

A Reece James clearance went straight to Kalaba, who worked a one-two with Cosi La Frenz before setting up Schloss.

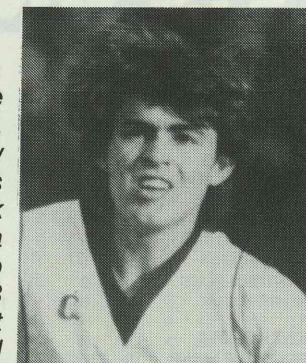
They teamed again with Inns to force some tremendous defence from the Hawks' backline.

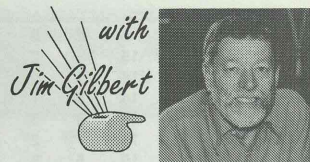
