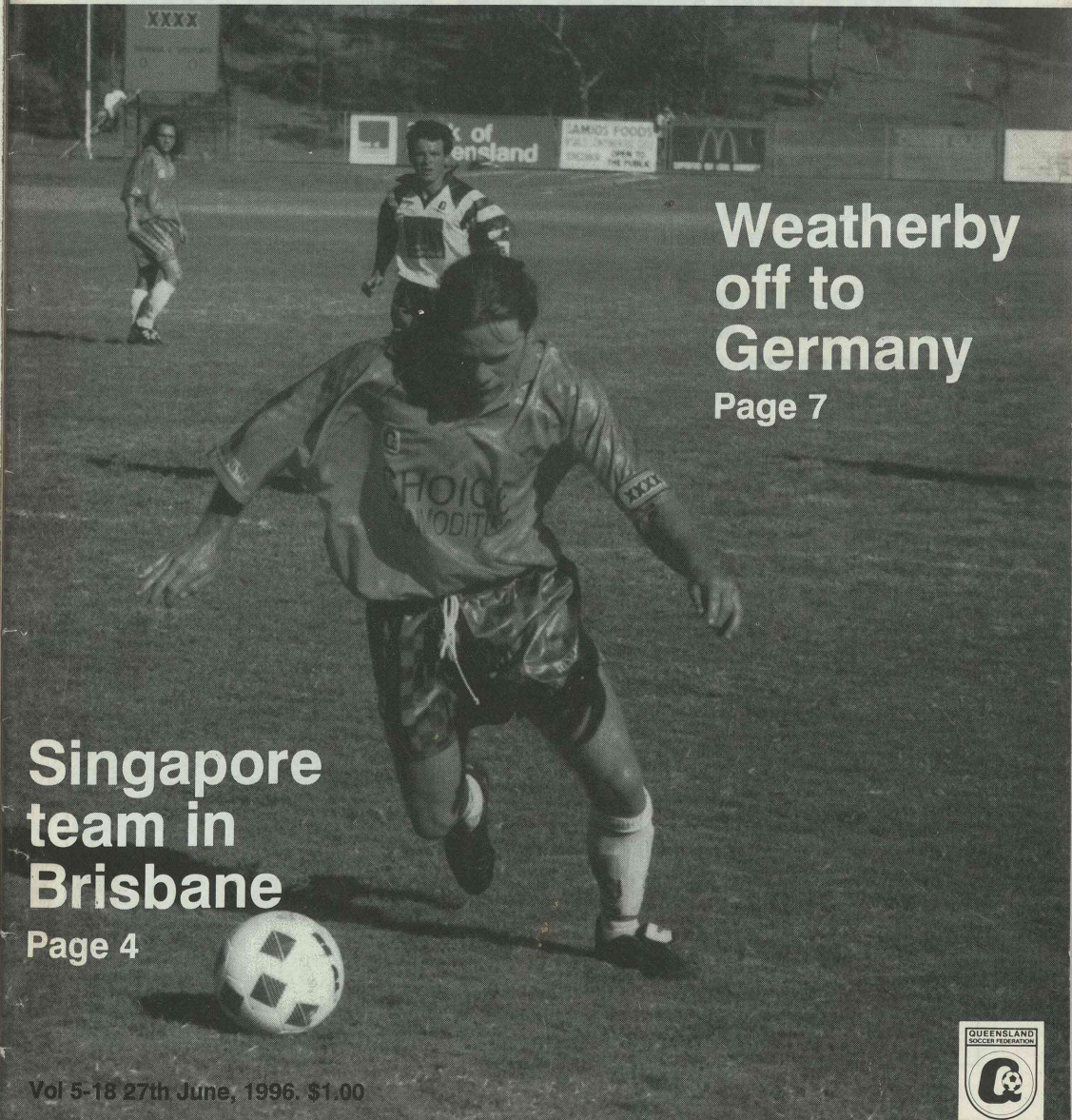

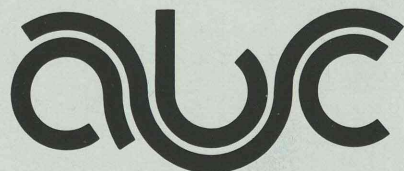

Editorial



A huge success! That's the only way to describe last week's Superstars of Soccer Series in Sydney and Brisbane.

The two-match series, which was won by the International Travellers, showed that it does have the potential to rival the other football codes and be accepted as Australian soccer's flagship event.

Last Wednesday night's match at the Sydney Football Stadium topped the ratings in Sydney with a peak of 17 and came second in Brisbane, peaking at 13.

Sunday's return leg at Suncorp Stadium attracted a crowd of 8,300, a testimony to the efforts of those involved with the promotion, and a quality turnout when you consider the match was being televised live in Brisbane on the Nine Network.

To cap it off, the television ratings in Brisbane for Sunday's game were nothing short of fantastic.

Attracting an average audience of 71,500 people in Brisbane, the match won its time slot for Channel Nine.

It was disappointing to see the negative comments come out of the southern media following the first match last Wednesday night. It appears as though some sections of the media didn't want the concept to work from the outset.

In Brisbane though, the game was very well received and the local media must be congratulated for their efforts.

The concept of the Superstars Series is in its infancy but with the first series completed, a solid foundation has been laid for Australian soccer to build on for future series.

So many positives have come from the exercise and apart from a few ill-fated words out of Sydney last week, the criticisms have been minimal.

Surely the future of Australian soccer is looking brighter and one can only hope that our game can move into commercial television and take hold of the massive advantages of such a move. □

Singapore team hits town

High profile Singapore First Division team Tiong Bahru visits Brisbane next week, with two matches set down against Taringa Rovers and a Queensland XI.

The S-League side boasts four Australian exports, former National League players David Miller, Pedro Ricoy and Ivan Kelic and former Socceroo Vlado Bozinoski.

Bozinoski leapt to fame back in the late 1980's when he accompanied Brisbane's Frank Farina to Belgium's First Division and Club Brugge.

From Belgium, Bozinoski moved to Portugal for a three year period with Sporting Lisbon, before travelling to England to meet up with Ipswich Town.

Like Farina, he also competed for Australia at the Seoul Olympics in 1988 and has appeared for the Socceros in seven full Internationals.

The team will be in Brisbane as part of their

mid-season training schedule and will face XXXX League side Taringa Rovers next Tuesday night, July 2 at Jack Speare Park, Indooroopilly, beginning at 7.30pm.

Then at the same time on Thursday night, July 4, the side will back up to take on a Queensland XI coached by State coach John Stewart, again at Jack Speare Park.

There will be no admission price for Tuesday night's match, however Thursday night's game is being played to help raise funds for the Royal Children's Hospital Appeal.

Entry to Thursday night's match will be by a gold coin donation (or a paper one if you feel so inclined), and there will be terrific raffles, food and beverages on sale at the club.

Both nights are sure to be good value in terms of on-field entertainment and Thursday night's charity match is something that Queensland soccer enthusiasts should get out and support. □

Lions shape for new comp

Queensland's top soccer competition will undergo a major face-lift in the off-season, returning in 1997 as the XXXX Premier League.

Applications are currently being prepared by clubs throughout the state for admission to the new competition, which will feature both semi-professional and amateur leagues.

Brisbane Lions are one of the most well known and successful clubs in Brisbane and the club's management have been at the forefront of the push for the new competition.

Winners of the XXXX League competition in 1987, '90 and '91 as well as 1981 winners of the Philips Cup during their stint in the National league, Lions enjoy a profile the envy of most clubs in the existing league.

However, club officials believe a lot more can be done to return local football to the healthy position it held in the 60's and early 70's, when thousands attended matches played at the RNA showgrounds.

Lions Promotions/Marketing Manager Les Moodley says it is beyond individual clubs to raise the profile of the game in Queensland and this can only be achieved via a more professional structure and marketing strategy for the state's top competition.

"We've spent a lot of money on promoting home games this season, particularly against City and Rochedale, but we can't do it all ourselves," he said.

He says from a marketing perspective he often finds businesses are more likely to have heard of Brisbane Lions than of the XXXX League.

Lions President Gary Wilkins, one of the great names of Queensland soccer, also believes the local competition is in need of a publicity boost if it is to keep pace with the growth and



increasing popularity of the game in this state.

Mr Wilkins is part of a committee which has been planning the new competition for some time and says if he'd had his way the new league would have been up and running this season.

"We've wasted 12 months by not starting this year," he said.

Lions management maintain that under the current league format the main source of revenue for XXXX League teams is via their licensed club activities. They regularly feature cabaret and comedy performances and the money raised is largely put back into their football activities.

To this end the club is planning multi-million dollar expansions to the club house and playing facilities. Mr Moodley says Lions aim to compete with the likes of the Broncos by providing top class dining and entertainment facilities for people in the western suburbs.

He says the real estate boom in the new estates of Forest Lake and Springfield has brought thousands of new residents to the area and Lions are intent on making the most of a burgeoning demand for entertainment both on and off the pitch. -Andrew van der Beek □



Wolves through to cup semis

The Wynnum Wolves safely negotiated a passage through to the semi finals of the Queensland Cup with a convincing 4-1 defeat of Grange Thistle in the quarter finals at Perry Park last Thursday night.

Geoff Maltby opened the Wolves account with a goal from an acute angle after 19 minutes and Ben Wood put them in the box seat shortly before half time when he steered home a shot from Paul Wilkins.

Immediately after the break Scottish import Jamie Macpherson made sure of victory when he found the net with a well placed drive from the edge of the box.

Wynnum eased off in the second spell and some casual defence gave Troy Percival the opportunity to reduce the arrears late in the match. However Macpherson had the final say for the Wolves when Thistle were penalised for a back pass infringement and the Wynnum striker made no mistake from five metres out.

Wynnum will now meet Brisbane Lions in the semis at Perry Park on Wednesday, July 10, with City and Taringa meeting in the late game.

In their XXXX League match against leaders Brisbane City, the Wolves went down 2-1 at Spencer Park on Sunday. □

Auf wiedersehen Johnny

Rochedale midfielder John Weatherby (pictured) has surprised all, including himself, after being snapped up by German third division club Magdeburg.

The speedy flanker was spotted by Magdeburg's coach and former Brisbane soccer identity, Karl Herdle, when he was holidaying in Brisbane last September.

Herdle followed the 24 year old's progress in last year's two preliminary finals right up to the Grand Final against Brisbane City at Perry Park.

Nothing further came of Herdle's visit until six weeks ago, when Weatherby received a phone call from the coach, who expressed an interest in the left-sided player.

A builder's labourer, Weatherby said he was quite shocked by the initial approach.

"My first reaction was one of disbelief," Weatherby said. "A few days after the first phone call I told Rochedale about the approach and they were also quite astonished, and to be honest, we didn't think too much of it after that.

"But then a couple of weeks ago Karl got in contact with me again and told me the offer was genuine and they would set me up with a flat, a car, my playing kit, and because it's fully professional, a full-time wage."

It's a long way from the relative obscurity of the XXXX League, and indeed Rochedale's Reserve side 18 months ago, to Magdeburg, situated 120km outside of Berlin.

A promising football town, Magdeburg has a stadium with a capacity of 30,000 people... a stadium they were reported to be very close to filling late last year.

"It sure beats working in the hot sun for ten hours and then running around the park with 'Kimmy' Wishart barking instructions at you for another couple of hours," Weatherby said.



"The thought of playing in front of a crowd of 30,000 is also a big buzz."

Rochedale coach Kim Wishart said the club would miss Weatherby, but would never stand in the way of him furthering his career.

"This is a once in a lifetime opportunity and I'm really happy for John," Wishart said.

"When you get an inquiry in the XXXX League by an overseas club, it's always a surprise, but quality left-footed players are a rarity in football, in general, so I guess in that respect it's not so surprising."

Weatherby, who was born in Sydney but played all of his junior soccer in the Logan area, departs for Germany on Monday, where he will link up with Magdeburg for a one year loan period.

During that time the German club will monitor his progress and decide whether or not they wish to keep him on.

"In that year, I'd like to establish myself in the squad over there and improve my skills so that other overseas clubs may take an interest," Weatherby said.

"I'll just give it my best shot and who knows what will come of it?" □

Bulldogs fall to experience

Greater experience proved the vital ingredient in Olympic's hard-fought 3-2 win against Capalaba in Saturday's second division match.

The hard, physical play became even more intense after the halftime break, with Contoudios and Effie Cassar particularly dangerous in midfield.

The equaliser came after an Olympic forward was brought down in the box and Contoudios converted the penalty.

The pace and pressure continued to mount with Whitfield and Contoudios almost matching strike for strike.

But finally, Ganatios gave Olympic the lead, and although both sides maintained the attack, the score remained 3-2. **- Alan Watson** □

Voice of Qld soccer says thanks

The voice of Queensland soccer, Trevor Himstedt (pictured), made his final call on Sunday at Suncorp Stadium, when the True Blues played the International Travellers. Trevor is setting out to further his media career in Melbourne at radio station 3UZ.



Originally from Brisbane, Trevor began his career in radio at Burnie in Tasmania with 7BU and has spent 15 years as an announcer since.

Trevor has worked with a number of radio stations throughout Australia, including the more local, 4GR in Toowoomba, 4BC in Brisbane, and recently 4TAB where he was the host of the breakfast show for four and a half years. 4TAB also led him into PA announcing for the races at Eagle Farm.

Trevor began announcing sport when he was working for 4BC. Having been a fan of soccer since primary school, he got in touch with QSF Secretary Jim Gilbert and soon began hosting events such as season launches and the Miss Soccer Quest. He then went on to do the ground announcing at Brisbane soccer matches.

During his eight years of ground announcing, Trevor's voice has been heard through the public address systems at all of Brisbane's National League matches, Interstate and International games, including the 1993 Youth World Championships.

"One of the joys of doing the job here, is that it has given me the chance to be involved in top level soccer," Trevor said.

'The Voice' remarked that one of the highlights of his career as a PA announcer was the 1993 Youth World Championships.

"Grand final days were also good. The Media Challenge Match was great... I scored a goal against the QAS girls when they let me take a penalty. Playing was always good fun, if you could call what I did playing!"

One of the more difficult aspects of announcing has been the hurdle of pronouncing the names of International players.

One particular event that Trevor remembers well was a match held at Perry Park between Australia and Tahiti, where he was given the list of names 'cold' and had no time to learn their correct pronunciation.

Trevor also made headlines during his career as 'Soccer Boy,' a failed Soccer mascot created in a bid to get more people along to the games.

"I had to roll around the field and act like a dill," Trevor joked. "It was Soccer Boy's first and last appearance and to this day I still get the odd kid calling out 'Hey Soccer Boy' at games."

Poor crowds at matches, despite increased promotion, is a thing that frustrates Trevor, although he feels crowd numbers are on the rise. He also feels that soccer is heading in the right direction, despite the lack of crowds.

Trevor said that the privilege of being a PA announcer at soccer matches had helped him fulfil some of his childhood dreams.

"I'd like to thank everyone up here. I think the soccer mob are terrific."

'The Voice of Queensland Soccer' has promised his continuing support of the Brisbane Strikers and said he would be getting out to their Melbourne matches to cheer the boys on. □

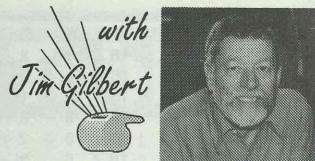

North Star has been ridiculed in many circles, but they've been threatening a win for weeks. Everyone at the club should be proud of their players' performances.

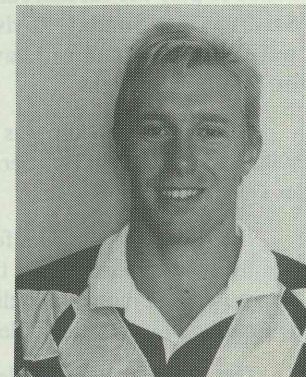
In other results, Lions victory over Rochedale on Sunday signalled the death knell for Rovers chances of winning the premiership this year.
