Editorial



The QSF has come under criticism this year with respect to what some believe to be a far shorter season than usual, and the rescheduling of matches. Maybe it's time yet again, that some things are set straight!

Firstly, this season has not been any shorter for clubs in amateur divisions and was shortened by just two weeks from last year, for the XXXX League and Division 2.

Secondly, Queensland soccer lost its scheduled split rounds for 1996 because of increased pressure from the clubs, who wanted continuity in home and away fixtures.

The importance of these split rounds could not have been illustrated more clearly this year, following two disastrous weekends of washed out fixtures, which included the May weekend of Queensland Cup matches.

As no split rounds could be utilised, the fixtures have been in turmoil ever since the rain-affected weekends. Only last weekend, did the tables start to make any real sense in terms of the number of matches played by teams.

Thirdly, to complicate matters further, you have clubs insisting their matches be postponed because they have three or more players on State duties, a subject which I have previously touched on.

With regard to the State team, it should be realised that the calender set down in the 1996 QSF Year Book was planned months in advance and certain events decimated the original calendar. It was the other bodies that withdrew from these representative matches at the last moment, not the QSF.

Finally, if like some other groups the QSF failed to look at the bigger picture, do you think a XXXX League team would have the opportunity to play against the Brisbane Strikers and have a chance of gaining national recognition in the Johnnie Walker Cup? I don't think so!

The only way the QSF could accept the invitation to have a local team participate in the Johnnie Walker Cup, would be if the XXXX League was completed in time for the Cup which will be the case come September.

Wolves howl at 75th party

Excitement ran high last Saturday afternoon down at Carmichael Park, when Wynnum District Soccer Club celebrated its 75th anniversary.

Old friendships were renewed and players who had not seen one another for years, met up again to talk of past glories and disappointments on the field.

Semi-pro ranks highly sought

Applications for entry into next year's semi-professional competitions closed two weeks ago, and it appears as though only one thing is certain... the QSF Board is going to have a tough time deciding on the final format.

In all, 21 applications for entry into the XXXX Premier League were received by the QSF, with a further 10 applications for entry into the next semi-professional division also hitting Queensland Soccer Headquarters.

Of the 21 applications for the top competition, eleven are from clubs currently in the XXXX League, five from the current second division, two from Division 3 and three from provincial areas throughout Queensland.

The country areas include a Gold Coast team still to be formed, Bundaberg club Across the Waves, and Rockhampton's Frenchville.

Interestingly, no teams from Toowoomba or the Sunshine Coast have applied for the XXXX Premier League. It is believed the Gold Coast club would be formed in the same fashion as

the now defunct Brisbane United, with current Gold Coast clubs contributing to form the side.

Across the Waves and Frenchville both participated in the State League, in the late 70's and early 80's, and no doubt would be very keen to return to the premier competition in the State.

The only XXXX League club not to apply for the top league was North Star, which has applied for entry into the next semi-pro division.

Speculation this year has pointed to three competitions, each involving eight teams, however the list of applicants suggests that the formation of a premier league involving at least ten teams, may not be out of the question.

The final decision on the format of next year's competitions should be known by September 30. The list of applicants for the semi-professional competitions is as follows:

Grange Thistle made Beenleigh work hard for three vital Premiership points, when the two sides met at Chris Green Park last Saturday night.

This was just one of a string of fine saves by the young keeper, who showed a massive reversal of his poor form of recent weeks.

The Thistle custodian was again in the fray straight after the break, making two brilliant saves in the 65th minute.

Beenleigh's Sam Pryce worked himself into a one-on-one with Hartzenberg, but could not pass the youngster with his close-range strike, which was deflected onto the head of Druery, Grange

The intriguing battle between Hartzenberg and Pryce continued throughout the second half, the keeper making several more impressive one-on-one saves.

Troy Schmidt tried hard to pull the score back for Thistle and came close in the 74th minute after strolling through the vacant midfield and chipping just wide of the post.

Thistle finally pulled a goal back with just four minutes of normal time remaining, after Colts player Alistair Yabsley was brought down in the penalty area, along with his team mate Matthew Banberry during a goal-mouth melee. Sean Armstrong stepped up to the spot to make the final score 2-1.




