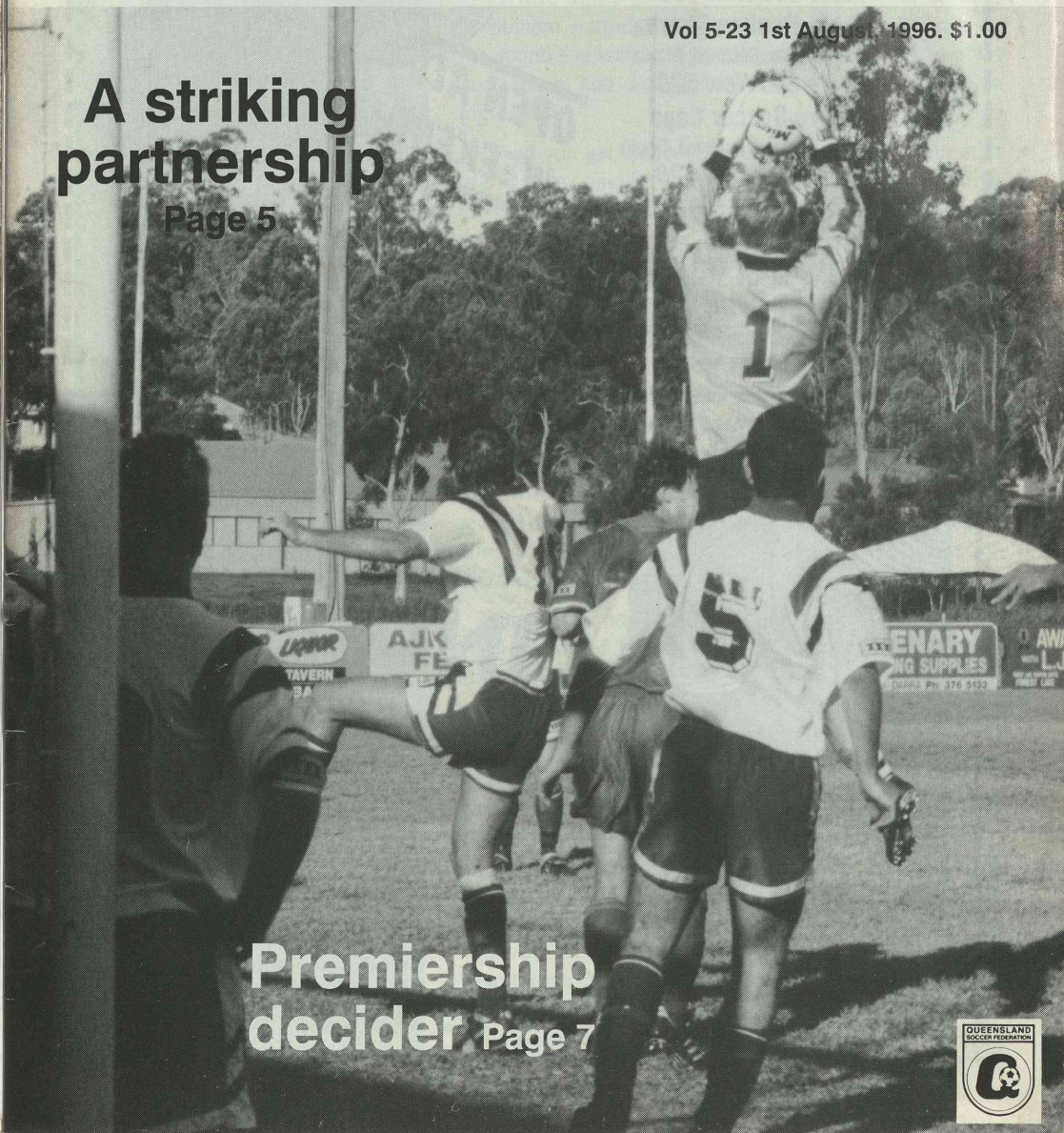

A striking new partnership

Months of speculation have ended and it is now official... Frank Farina will coach the Hyundai Brisbane Strikers in the upcoming Ericsson Cup season, and current Brisbane City coach Peter Tokesi, will be his assistant.

Farina came to the Strikers twelve months ago following a highly successful stint with some of Europe's top clubs.

In that time, he has forged a reputation in Queensland as one of Australia's most talented sportsmen, becoming a household name and lifting the profile of the Strikers and Queensland soccer immeasurably.

But Farina believes his new role as player/coach of the Strikers will be one of the most challenging things he has ever had to do.

"It won't be easy at all," Farina said. "We've lost three of our first eleven from last year and really, when you look at it like that, I'm in a no win situation.

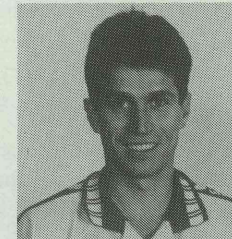
"But this is what I want I want to do and a window of opportunity has opened up earlier than I expected and I'm going to dive right through it.

"I'll be going with youth because I don't believe the quality is currently there on the Australian transfer market. But I honestly believe we will remain competitive and there will be a fantastic atmosphere in the squad."

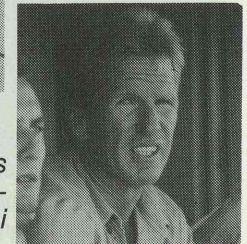
A former Queensland representative with four caps to his name, Farina's assistant Peter Tokesi, has coached Queensland junior sides for several years and has been involved in coaching at the senior level for the last two years, initially with Brisbane City's reserve team and this season with the XXXX League side.

Tokesi's job as Assistant Coach could however, be more hands on than what the title indicates.

"I was never the type of person to take on an assistant coaching position," Tokesi said, "...but with Frank still playing, I think that I will

have to become very involved in the coaching of the side."

"Obviously Frank will have the overall say in the way things are done, but after meeting with Frank a while back, we found out we had very similar views on the game so I think we'll complement one another quite well." □

Wolves reach first ever finals

Wynnum made certain of their place in the XXXX League semi-finals when they comfortably defeated Nerang 2-0 at Perry Park last Sunday.

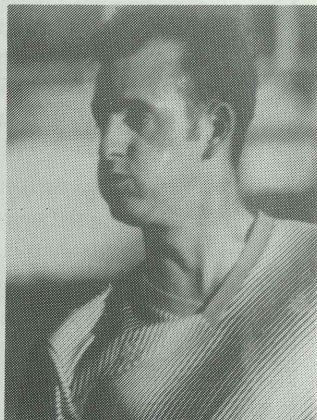
The win elevated the Wolves to fourth place on the ladder and they cannot be dislodged from the top five with just the one round of fixtures remaining.

But the win came at a cost for the Wolves, skipper Tony McKinless sustaining a hamstring strain in the closing minutes which will rule him out of this week's match against Pine Rivers.

Scottish striker Jamie Macpherson again underlined his value to the Wolves when he opened the scoring in the 17th minute.

A fine through ball from Tony McKinless put Macpherson in the clear and he made no mistake with a right foot strike from 15 metres.

Paul Wilkins almost added a second goal shortly afterwards but Nerang keeper Eddie Dixon made a fine save in the one-on-one situation.

Wynnum sat back after securing their early lead, allowing Nerang to dominate the game territorially, but despite having the majority of possession Nerang could not penetrate a tight Wolves defence.

On the stroke of half time Ben Wood made it 2-0 after a fine solo run had placed him in a second one-on-one against Dixon.

Having missed his first attempt along the ground, the young midfielder kept his head to calmly chip the ball over the falling keeper.

Wynnum missed a couple of golden opportunities to seal the match immediately after the break with Macpherson and Dennis Eilmann pushing shots wide with the goal at their mercy.

Nerang became more involved in the latter stages of the match however long range shots from the Gold Coast side proved no problem for Wolves keeper Kevin Tatton.

Wayward shooting from both sides left the half-time score of 2-0 unchanged, giving the Wolves the three points and a long awaited shot at semi-final football. □

Spencer Park to decide title

The 1996 XXXX League Premiership has come down to one match and even Steven Spielberg could not have written the script any better.

Many people predicted a Brisbane City v Brisbane Lions Premiership decider several months ago, and now D-Day has finally come for these traditional rivals.

And it will be a case of what could have been for the losers, when the winning captain holds aloft the Bill Waddell Trophy at Spencer Park this Sunday.

Both teams could have already sealed this year's title, City giving away an eleven point lead half way through the season and Lions missing an opportunity to claim the Premiership after only managing a 2-2 draw with Beenleigh last week.

City coach Peter Tokesi said he was happy to have another opportunity at making it back to back Premierships, after a disastrous mid-season slump.

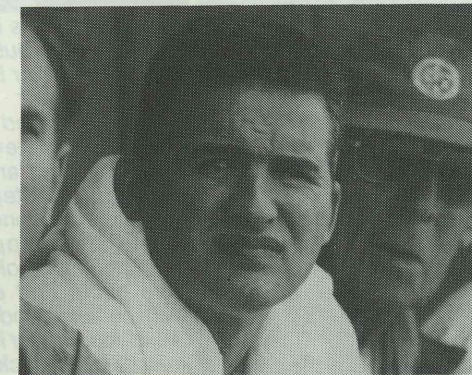
"We let Lions back in the hunt in the middle of the season. To their credit though, they have been in great form but they've given us a second chance after last week," Tokesi said.

Tokesi likened the clash to a rugby league State of Origin match, suggesting the passion and rivalry of the local derby would make the Premiership decider an absolute corker.

"We have everything to gain and nothing to lose. We've all been looking forward to this game and in a lot of ways I wish I was playing again," he said.

Lions coach Miron Bleiberg (pictured) believed the odds were evenly stacked for what he described as the match of the year.

"We have the advantage in that we only need a draw, but they have the home ground advantage," Bleiberg said.



"But sometimes a big home crowd can work against a team because of the extra pressure placed on them by their supporters."

Bleiberg suggested there was also more than the Premiership up for grabs on Sunday, with the Club Championship still on offer, a week off during the finals and a chance to play the Strikers in the Johnnie Walker Cup. □

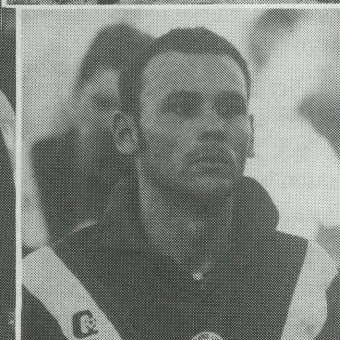
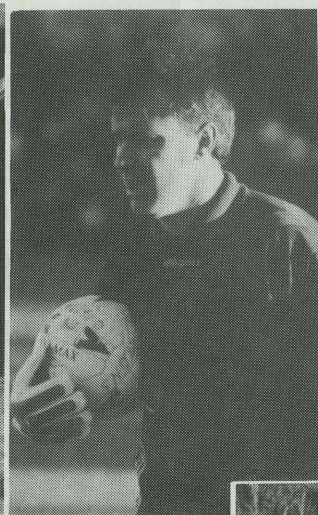
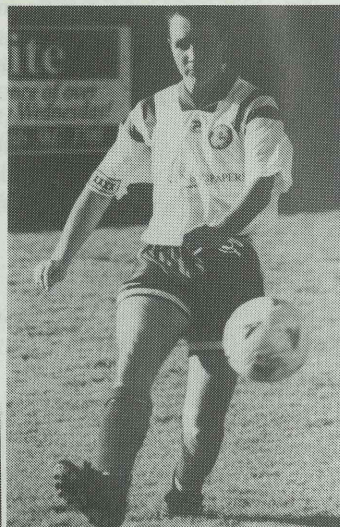

B'leigh create scare for lions

Next week's match at Spencer Park looms as the premierships decider after a disappointing Lions side struggled to a 2-2 draw at home on Sunday afternoon.

Lions went into the match with a 5 point buffer over City at the head of the table and a win would have seen them secure the premierships for the first time since 1991.

However, Beenleigh had their own end of season priorities, a win would have guaranteed them a top five finish and a finals berth in their first season back in the XXXX League.

In the opening minutes Lions looked anything but a team vying for its sixteenth consecutive win as the visitors tried to capitalise on some below par defending.

Alan Gordon's dipping strike as early as the third minute was turned around the post by Lions keeper Rob Farrow but proved a sign of things to come as Beenleigh went on the offensive.

Ten minutes later an exquisite Brett Druery pass sliced through the Lions defence to find an unmarked Gordon who slipped the ball past Farrow to take Beenleigh to a 1-0 lead.

After the goal, Lions began to dominate possession but wasted chance after chance to equalise, with Cliff Tuck the main offender.

With a host of chances going begging for Lions it was not surprising to see Beenleigh find the net at the other end on 25 minutes, but a linesman's flag saw Druery's farpost effort disallowed for offside.

Fifteen minutes later Beenleigh extended their lead, with another hole opening up straight through the middle of Lions defence and Druery the beneficiary. A sliding tackle from David Lonsdale nearly stopped the danger but Druery was able to regain his footing in time to knock the ball past Farrow to make it 2-0.

Lions finally got the goal all their offensive pressure deserved in bizarre fashion just before the break. As the Beenleigh defence attempted to clear on the edge of a box, Tuck stuck out a leg and the ball rebounded off his knee, wrong-footing Chris Roche in the Beenleigh goal and striking a post before finishing in the net.

After the break the misses continued before Anthony Brown replaced young defender Brett McPaul to immediate effect. With his first touch of the match Brown worked a tight one-two with Steven Starr who fired in Lions equaliser with a swerving effort from the edge of the area.

Lions had the chance to secure their first premierships in five years minutes later when a questionable decision saw them awarded a penalty.

But the men in orange seemed determined to set the scene for a last round thriller at Spencer Park next week with Allen blasting his shot into the diving Roche.

In fact Beenleigh might have won it with a penalty of their own but Farrow produced a fine save to secure the draw for the homeside.

Going into the last round Lions now hold a three point lead over City who will fancy their chances of pinching the title from their bitter rivals after crushing Grange 6-0 on the weekend.

Far North Qld looking good

The Far North Queensland Soccer Federation has expanded its Premier League competition this season with the addition of newly formed club Cairns Olympic.

The addition of an eighth club was seen to be a bold move by the Federation, but a necessary one to balance the League and provide more avenues for players in the growing area.

Although Olympic have struggled this year, administrators are confident that they will be in a far stronger position in 1997.

After 16 rounds of the League, Leichhardt head the table and have proved to be extremely tough opposition with the superb playing skills of former Red Star and Real Madrid player Milan Jankovic. Only Dimbulah and Yorkeys Knob have managed to extract points from them.

Reigning Premiers Innisfail are not out of

contention, but with the loss of some regular experienced players, they have not been as consistent as last year, which could have a bearing on the final outcome. Traditionally strong clubs Mareeba and Edge Hill have relied heavily on youth players this season, which should also hold them in good stead next year.

On the representative front, the FNQ Taipans have struggled to date in the newly formed Coral Coast League. Competing against the Mackay Devils and the North Queensland Razorbacks, the Taipans have recorded one win, three draws and one loss.

The win fortunately came at the expense of the Razorbacks, which managed to keep the competition open with two matches remaining. The competition could be decided in a fortnight's time in Townsville when the two traditional rivals meet. □

Final finals spot up for grabs

While Brisbane City and Brisbane Lions will be fighting it out for the Premiership this weekend, Taringa and Beenleigh will be embroiled in their own do or die match to decide the last finals spot.

It will be a case of deja vu for Beenleigh, who in the past few years have had similar crunch games in the second and third divisions. Last year they met Rocklea in the last match of the season, needing only to draw for the Premiership, but went down.

Beenleigh, currently in fifth just three points ahead of Taringa, have been in the top five all year and had a chance to wrap up a finals berth last weekend with a win at Brisbane Lions, but Steve Dolan's outfit only managed a 2-2 draw.

"The boys did very well to get a draw last week," Dolan said. "You must remember Lions have been undefeated in the last 15 rounds."

With both teams expected to field their strongest eleven, people are questioning whether or not Beenleigh will be up to the task.

Taringa defeated the XXXX League newcomers in the first round 4-1, after trailing 1-0 with just ten minutes to go. And Dolan agreed that it was inexperience that cost his side on that occasion, but he maintained his team would be up to it this weekend.

"The pressure won't be a problem. If we weren't up to it we wouldn't be in this position right now," Dolan said.

But Taringa coach Juan Cutillas said a lack of experience could be Beenleigh's downfall.

"Beenleigh will be very difficult to beat at home but they don't have much experience in finals situations like this," Cutillas said.

"We are in a very positive frame of mind. For the first time this year I will be able to put my best eleven on the park and we have a lot of experience in that eleven, which I think will allow us to qualify for the five."

Beenleigh coach Steve Dolan believes his side will be up to the task when they meet Taringa for the vital fifth position on Sunday



A draw would be sufficient for Beenleigh to progress to the finals, but both coaches made it clear their teams would be going all out to win.

"We won't be changing our normal game plan," Dolan said. "We'll be going out there to score goals because if we can score then it will make it extra hard for them." □

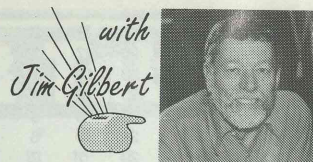

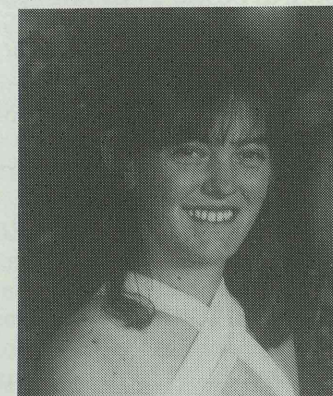
