

Defence back to strength

The Strikers will welcome the return of several key players tonight when they attempt to take their first win of the 1996/97 season against the Newcastle Breakers.

Last week's 0-0 draw with Adelaide City gave the Strikers their first point of the season and this was achieved without the services of player/coach Frank Farina, new signing Jeromy Harris, and defenders Mark Battistin and Glenn Gwynne. Three of these players should make it on the park tonight.

Farina should resume his role up front, while Battistin will return from a one-match suspension and Gwynne appears to be fully recovered from a knock he received at training last week.

Brisbane supporters will not see Harris for at least another six weeks. The attacking midfielder underwent surgery on an abdominal injury on Thursday, following an awkward fall at training a couple of weeks ago.

Former Young Socceroo Brad Ditton remains sidelined with an ankle injury, while Matt Bell is still in South America with the current Young Socceroos.

Farina said he was pleased to have two regular defenders back in the squad after having to thrust midfielders Danny Wright and Chay Hews into the defence last Sunday night.

"Danny and Chay did a superb job on Sunday night but it will be good to have 'Batts' and 'Gwynnie' back on board, for no other reason than that it will give us a few more options against Newcastle," Farina said.

The Strikers coach made it clear the Breakers would be very formidable opposition, particularly in the wake of their 6-1 victory against West Adelaide last weekend.



Mark Battistin will return tonight after serving a one match suspension which he incurred in the Johnnie Walker Cup


"They will be extremely bouyed by their first round win and 'Kossie' (John Kosmina) will have them really fired up for this one," Farina said.

"We're expecting a very tough game, but I'm confident if we play like we have been, we will come out on top after the 90 minutes."

Farina maintained Newcastle's combination of youth and experience would make them a better side than they were last season.

He suggested young striker Jason Bennett, who knocked in four of his side's six goals last week, along with former Socceroo David Lowe and former Kiwi International Robbie Ironside, could be players to watch for in the Breakers side tonight.

He set Suncorp Stadium alight last season with 20 sensational goals and gave Queensland soccer a new lease of life with his professional attitude and riendly demeanour. Yet when he was announced as the coach of the Brisbane Strikers several months ago, the cynics came out in numbers. Incredibly. It seems Frank Farina, a man with 67 Socceroo caps to his name, still has something to prove to Queensland soccer fans.

Since signing with the Strikers a little more than a year ago, Farina has become the face of Queensland soccer and a household name throughout the state.

His achievements through the years will mark him down as one of Australia's finest sporting heroes and arguably the greatest soccer player this country has produced.

But the pressure has fallen squarely on Farina's shoulders since his acceptance of the coaching position in July. It seems past glories could fade into nothing if the Strikers do not match their outstanding performances of last season.

"I'd be lying if I said I didn't feel under pressure to emulate last season's achievements." Farina said.

"But the player/coaching role presents a fresh challenge to me and a new opportunity, so I am looking forward to ensuring the Strikers remain a force in the Ericsson Cup.

"We have a great squad this year, despite losing a few players, and the atmosphere in the side is the best I've seen it since my time at the club.

"There is no doubt in my mind that we are finals material."

Farina knows he has a huge task in front of him, but his confidence and determination are qualities that Strikers administrators are hoping will flow down to the rest of the squad.

Already the side has displayed glimpses of brilliance in the leadup to the Ericsson Cup season.

The Strikers progressed as far as the semifinals of the Johnnie Walker Cup, their best ever result in the pre-season tournament.

The appointment of Alan Hunter as captain of the team is also proving to be a master stroke by Farina. The experienced defender is looking the best he has for a couple of seasons, with renewed enthusiasm and a look of fierce determination in his eyes.

Farina would not make any solid predictions for the Strikers as they enter their Ericsson Cup campaign, but you get the feeling that anything this man touches, turns to gold.

"Everything is pointing towards a fantastic season for the Strikers," Farina said.

"I think we built a magnificent foundation last year.

"The Queensland public really warmed to the team last season and I believe we have established ourselves as one of the state's higher profiled sporting outfits."

New blood for club's future

In the last 12 months the Strikers have built a fantastic reputation. A umber of key player losses during the off-season though had left a gap in the eam's depth. However a new crop of players is emerging to fill this void.

The QAS has proved to be the breeding primary ground for the new Strikers

Three new recruits this year, Matt Bell, Wayne Knipe and Kasey Kasey Wehrman Wehrman, all 19 years

of age, takes the total number of QAS graduates to the Strikers to seven. Other Strikers to emerge from the Academy include

Socceroo Sean Cranney, former Young Socceroo Brad Ditton and voungsters Chav Hews and Reece Tollenaere.

The addition of three more squad players, 23 year old Vedran Becirbegovic, Damien

Waugh 22, and 21 year old Jeromy Harris, has helped bring the average age of the squad down from 28 to a spritely 24 this season.

And according to Frank Farina it's all part Wayne Knipe of a youth policy

Breakers still seeking glory

In 1951 a group of migrants from the Greta camp in Newcastle came together to form a football team. Arriving from all parts of Europe, these men were itching to apply their footballing skills developed back in their homelands, in their new nation. And so the Austral club was born.

Originally accepted into the North NSW second division, the club won their first Northern NSW first division grand final in 1966, repeating this triumph in 1969.

Continuing to thrive throughout the 1970's and 80's, Austral searched for higher ranked company. In 1988 Newcastle Austral entered the NSW state league first division, reaching the semi-finals at their first attempt.

In 1990 a major sponsorship deal with BHP Steel was announced and Austral's playing headquarters was vastly upgraded courtesy of a substantial loan from the NSW government.

In that same year, the Bradley Report, commissioned by the National League Executive, determined it was imperative that a team from the NSW Hunter region be included in the National League, if the competition was to continue successfully.

A hard working committee and the recommendations of the Bradley Report ensured the Breakers - direct descendants from Austral - set foot in the 1991-92 National League.

At the same time, north of the boarder, Brisbane United was born. In both teams' debut National League seasons, Newcastle finished several places below Brisbane, despite the Breakers winning both league matches. And despite being in the league for one year less than most of the Ericsson Cup clubs, the Breakers have the impressive record of scoring more goals in Brisbane than any other visiting team.

Previously, soccer fever hit the Hunter region in the form of Newcastle KB United, which was formed in 1977. Crowds at KB

United's games regularly surpassed 10,000, peaking at 18,367 against Sydney Olympic in April 1979.

British football legend Bobby Charlton played for the club in 1978, and in that same year, and again in 1982, one of Newcastle's favourite sons - FA Cup goal scorer Craig Johnston - came home to play with KB United.

The Breakers are unlikely winners in the ARL/Super League war. In 1995 the Newcastle franchise, Hunter Mariners, chose the magnificent Breakers Stadium as their headquarters. Subsequently, several hundred thousand extra dollars have been pumped into the new ground to help make it one of the most impressive Ericsson Cup bases.

Last year the Breakers management scored another coup when they signed Socceroo legend John Kosmina. Together with a set of locally bred, young and enthusiastic players, led by experienced David Lowe, Newcastle are again looking to become a hotbed of soccer in Australia.

The Academy looked certain to hold the AIS to a 1-1 draw, but the home side scored twice in injury time to take the match.

Andrew Packer scored the QAS' goal in their 3-1 loss to the AIS last weekend in Canberra
