

Brown joins exclusive club

Brisbane's likeable goalscoring genius Rod Brown will join an exclusive club of players who have reached 300 Ericsson Cup matches tonight.

Brown joins Gary Phillips (359 games), Danny Wright (330) and Alan Hunter (320), who are all members of the "300 club".

But it is not this achievement that will place the former Socceroo in Australian soccer's record books for years to come.

Following his three goal haul against Newcastle last weekend. Brown has moved into second place on the all time goal scorers list with a whopping 122 career goals.

His efforts last week allowed him to leap past Marshall Soper's 120 goals and Brown now finds himself just eleven goals away from knocking off John Kosmina's mark of 133.

And this is something Brown said he was aspiring to achieve this season.

League record in sight...

"I definitely have the scoring record in the back of mind and I know that I'm not getting any younger, so I'd like to achieve it this season," Brown said

The Brisbane striker has had an illustrious career which includes seven Socceroo caps, stints with top clubs Marconi Fairfield and Apia Leichhardt, and a year overseas with Malaysian side Penang.

And there is not one goal nor one highlight that sticks to mind in a career which has spanned 14 seasons.

"Playing for Australia, winning the Championship with Apia in '87, and just the people I've met through the game would be the highlights of my career," Brown said.

"As far as goals are concerned, they all count the same and they all feel just as good."

The Sydney born Brown said he and his wife Lisa had decided to remain in Brisbane to



see out his playing career.

And it seems a fitting way to end a career, which took off in Mexico in 1983 with the Young Socceroos, when Brown's Australian striking partner was none other than Frank Farina.

Wolves - A brief history

In 1981 the number of teams in the National League was increased from 14 to 16. The National League executive was also intent on expanding the geographic base of the league, with a team from south of Sydney an obvious candidate. The Illawarra region had a large population base, rich soccer tradition and was separate, although still close to, established soccer areas like Sydney and Canberra.

In the early 1960's big name player Jim Kelly arrived from England to join South Coast United. Kelly attracted previously unheard of crowds to games. In what is still probably Illawarra's biggest achievement in the domestic soccer scene, the Kelly-led South Coast United defeated APIA in the grand final of the 1963 NSW Premiership in front of a massive 30,158 crowd. No team from the Illawarra region was strong enough to fill the void after South Coast United's demise in the early 1970s.

A budget start

Wollongong City was formed specifically for entry into the 1981 season of the National League. Although having the strong support of the Wollongong Leagues Club, starting a National League team from scratch was in reality a risky undertaking. Added to this was the fact that Ken Morton, player-coach of the Wolves in its first year, had a budget of just \$70,000 from which to buy an entire squad. In that same year, Sydney Olympic spent \$120,000 on just four players! Wollongong's first ever National League game was against Olympic, on 15 February 1981. Of course, every Australian soccer pundit was predicting Wollongong to dip out to their richer first-up opponents... everyone except the 8,000 who turned out that day at Wollongong Showgrounds! The history books read that Wollongong won that game 3-1, and went through their first eight games undefeated.

After a promising first couple of years, the Wolves had a lean period in the mid-eighties. Along with two Brisbane teams, the Wolves were relegated when the league was drastically cut from 24 to 14 teams for the 1987 season. Wollongong soon returned, after winning the 1987 NSW First Division. This new found form

continued in the Wolves first year back in the National League, where they finished the home-and-away season on top of the ladder.

Despite never really being one of the glamour sides of the National League, Wollongong is now one of the most stable clubs in Australia. Strong and sensible management, a traditionally steady on-field performance, impressive local media coverage and a magnificent home ground has ensured a high level of acceptance by the Illawarra community.

Seeking a trophy

All the Wolves need now is a major trophy to capture the underlying support that exists on the 370,000 person-strong region. With the likes of smart and tactical coach Nick Theodorakopoulos, and an infusion of fresh playing talent, the Wolves' first Ericsson Cup trophy may not be too far away.
