Knights down but not out

Strikers coach Frank Farina has warned his players not to underestimate a Melbourne Knights am which is currently sitting in infamiliar territory near the bottom of the Ericsson Cup table.

The Knights are the reigning Ericsson Cup Champions and despite their current 10th placing on the table, boast a formidable lineup, including Socceroo Andrew Marth, former Socceroo target man John Markovski and ex Australian Youth players Tom Pondeljak and Mark Silic.

The Knights have also secured the services of former Ghana Youth representative Ransford Banini, who proved a hit with Melbourne Zebras in the Ericsson Cup two seasons ago.

One of their more interesting players is 18 year old Josip Simunic, who despite being born and bred in Australia, recently refused to tour South America with the Young Socceroos.

It seems the talented youngster, who played with the AIS at the expense of the Australian taxpayers, is considering a move to his parents' homeland, Croatia.

In short, it appears Simunic could be prepared to turn his back on the country in which he learned the game.

Simunic's actions led to a suspension from Soccer Australia, however the youngster should be on the park tonight.

Farina said the Knights were still Championship contenders and would be in the top six at the end of the regular season.

"They have a lot of class and a lot of big match experience, and possibly one of the best youth development policies in the country," the Strikers player/coach said.

"They are the reigning Champions so you would be foolish to right them off. They won't

relinquish their title without a fight and we're expecting that fighting attitude tonight."

Farina said he would be maintaining the same squad that has been doing the job for Brisbane in the opening four rounds.

"Why change a winning line-up? These guys are playing well and it's up to the other players in the squad to displace them."

There's a flip side to Kasey

Two weeks ago, he was just another young soccer player fighting for a spot in the starting lineup. But a couple of goals and backflips later, 19 year old Kasey Vehrman has become a match winner, a hit with supporters and the media, and a agular starter for the Strikers.

Wehrman has just five Ericsson Cup atches under his belt but is already forging name for himself thanks to his top class all and spectacular gymnastics display at Strikers last home match.

The plucky midfielder has scored two match winning goals for Brisbane, which quates to six valuable Ericsson Cup points, but he plays down his achievements.

"It felt great scoring, but in both games the side had to defend strongly for the last 15 to 20 minutes, so the wins have been real team efforts," Wehrman said.

"I realise I've been receiving a fair bit of attention in the past fortnight, but the credit belongs to the whole team."

The youngster seems to be having few problems stepping up to the Ericsson Cup and puts it down to playing "simple football".

However it has been pure determination which has allowed the Queensland Academy of Sport product to make the step up, according to his former coach Greg Brown

"Kasey always had the skill, but what set him apart at the youth level was his fierce determination," Brown said.

"He was the sort of player you had to hold back rather than keep pushing. It's great to see him doing well but he must remain focussed and continue on from here."

Strikers player/coach Frank Farina agrees. "It's very rewarding to see the young guys whom you've instilled faith in, coming through successfully and doing the job for the team," Farina said.

"But it is a very long season and the real




test for Kasey will come midway through the year. That's when he will have to call on all of his enthusiasm and determination."

Incredibly, despite his superb form and the added attention the young midfielder is receiving from the media, Wehrman is still yet to catch the eye of Young Socceroos coach Les Scheinflug.

And this is a sore point with Farina. "I believe Kasey's form has been good enough to warrant consideration from the National selectors," Farina said.

"If he keeps playing and training the way he has, then I see no reason why he won't eventually wear the green and gold. It's just a matter of the selectors taking notice."

Wehrman too believes his time will come, but in the meantime he just wants to keep playing and winning with the Strikers...oh and by the way, expect to see another of his trademark backflips if he finds the net tonight.

Knights - A brief history

Melbourne Knights enter the 1996-97 Ericsson cup as league champions. In 994-95 the club also took out the league title as well as the cup final. These two ophies, both won for the first time in 1994-95, were a long time coming for a which has existed in one form or another for over 40 years.

Essendon Croatia, who changed their me to Melbourne Croatia (1984) and then Knights (1993), were formed in 1975.

A club simply called Croatia entered the ctorian provisional league in 1953. Croatia erged with Preston Croat in 1965 and three ars later took out their first Victorian state ague title. After being expelled from the ctorian Soccer Federation in 1972, the club took over the Essendon Lions in 1975. The Lions themselves were developed from a combination of Victorian clubs - Hajduk and Ukrainian Lions, who merged in 1959. In 1978 and 1979 Essendon Croatia won the state league championship.

With the drastic restructure of the national league in 1984. Melbourne Croatia as they were known, entered the competition. It was this year the national league reverted from a one division, 16 team league, to a dual conference. Each conference consisted of twelve teams. Their national career commenced as the club made it to the preliminary final of the southern conference. Not to mention a narrow loss to Newcastle in the final of the national cup that year.

Croatia were final series' contenders in 1989 and 1989/90, but their first grand final appearance came at the climax of the 1990/ 91 season. In probably the most enthralling national league final ever played, Croatia outplayed South Melbourne only to lose in a penalty shoot-out. The teams drew 1-1 in front of Victoria's biggest ever national league crowd - 23.318. The same scenario occurred the following year, the Knights losing on penalties to Adelaide City. Yet another grand final appearance in 1994 saw another loss,

again to Adelaide City (0-1). It was the club's first grand final played outside of Melbourne, in May 1995, where the Knights were ultimate victors at last. The Knights gained revenge in defeating Adelaide City 2-0.

In their first visit to Knights Park in 1993, the Strikers emerged 2-0 victors. No team has since visited the Knights home ground and topped that winning margin against the 1990s' most successful team.

Season 1994-95 was no doubt the Knights' season. The team were champions, minor premiers and cup-winners - the first time ever that one club has taken out the 'treble'. Knight's teenage sensation Mark Viduka took out all the awards that year. Mirko Bazic was voted coach of the year. Despite the loss of Viduka and fellow Socceroo defender Steve Horvat, the club won the league again in 1995-96.
