Collingwood play soccer? I'd like to see that!

The Brisbane Strikers will be looking to continue their winning ways when they meet Ericsson Cup newcomers Collingwood Warriors tonight.

And while the Warriors may be new to Australia's premier soccer competition, their personnel certainly are not.

With legendary coach Zoran Matic in control, the Warriors are shaping up to be one of the country's top soccer teams.

Matic took Adelaide City to two Premierships in the early 1990's, his efforts in season 90/91 guaranteeing him the "Coach of the Year" award.

The astute manager bought well in the off season, with the majority of his squad having extensive National League experience.

Heading the list is former Socceroo UTS Olympic target man Kimon Taliadoros, whose talents extend beyond the field of play and into the administration areas of the club.

He is joined by Socceroo midfielder Ernie Tapai, who played with Gippsland for the past two seasons.

Matic also used his Adelaide City connections when putting his team together at the beginning of the season.

Turning to the new Collingwood colours were Socceroo flanker Goran Lozanovski and midfielder Carlo Talladira, who became disgruntled with City after Matic left the club.

Perhaps Matic's biggest recruitment coup was luring Olympic goalkeeper Frank Juric from last year's champions the Melbourne Knights.

The timely signing of Juric came just in time for the new club to take out its first piece of silverware in it's first competition, this season's Johnnie Walker Cup.

However, Collingwood have slumped to three consecutive losses following a 3 - 1 defeat in front of their home fans against Adelaide City last week.

Prior to that they were handed an 7 - 0 hiding by league leaders Sydney United.

Desperate for points, they are sure to be in a determined state of mind tonight.

The Strikers have been buoyed by last weekend's turnaround in form, which saw them destroy the Cosmos in Canberra by four goals to one.

A victory tonight will ensure Brisbane stays in touch with ladder leaders Sydney United, with a top of the table clash at Suncorp Stadium in two week's time, a very realistic possibility.

Ross dives out of the shadows

He is currently in his fourth season with the Strikers, yet has only played a handful of matches.

And if he was with another club, the chances are that he would be a regular starter.

But Graham Ross has had to remain in the shadow of the Strikers number one goalkeeper Clint Bolton.

The 28 year old has been forced to warm Brisbane's goalkeeping bench for the overwhelming majority of his time with Brisbane, as the younger Bolton has gone from strength to strength, representing his country at two different levels.

And it has only been when Bolton has been on representative duties that Ross has received the call up to the Strikers starting eleven.

The opportunities have been few and far between for the former Australian Schoolboys representative ... just 12 Ericsson Cup matches to his name.

It's taken a shoulder injury to Bolton to give Ross another opportunity.

With Bolton out for a minimum of three weeks, Ross now has a chance to make the keeping position his and put the pressure right on the Strikers' number one.

"It's a shame to see Clint struck down with injury, especially since he's been performing so well," Ross said.

"But I haven't had too many opportunities, so I plan on making the most of this one."

Ross put in a near faultless display in the Strikers' 4 - 1 victory over Canberra last weekend.

His only blemish, not quite getting to a Norm Kelly penalty.

"I felt good last week and I was very determined to put in a good performance," Ross said.

Coach Frank Farina was also pleased with Ross' performance.

"He did a fantastic job for us last week," Farina said.

"And that's what it's all about, putting pressure on your team mates and taking the opportunities when they come your way.

"If Rossy continues to perform then the shoe will be on the other foot and it'll be up to Clint to force his way back into the starting eleven."

Tonight will be the first time Ross will start for the Strikers in front of the Suncorp Stadium supporters.

If he plays like he did last week, then supporters may get to see a lot more of the Strikers custodian.

Collingwood - A brief history

On March 9, 1996. Soccer Australia chairperson David Hill shocked the nation's sporting fraternity when he announced the Collingwood Warriors would contest the 1996-97 Ericsson Cup. This marriage between an Australian Rules football club (Collingwood) and a former national league soccer club (Melbourne Warriors) was an unthinkable proposition until very recently.

Historically, the relationship between soccer and the AFL (previously known as the VFL) football codes was not good. Way back in 1928 the 'Referee' newspaper reported the VFL wrote "with alarm" of soccer. In 1952 the VFL directed its clubs to secure all available public sporting areas in Melbourne in an attempt to nullify the growing threat of soccer in Victoria.

For a short time in 1996 it seemed the paranoia of some AFL commissioners remained. When AFL chief Ross Oakley heard of Collingwood's soccer proposal he told the Collingwood board the club would be in breach of its AFL licence if they proceeded with the venture. Needless to say, the AFL eventually backed down in its opposition.

Both football clubs have a long and proud history. Collingwood entered the inaugural 1897 VFL season as champions of the predecessor competition - the VFA. Between 1897 and 1939 Collingwood made the grand final 23 times, winning 11 of them. After two more championships in the 1950s, Magpie's fans had to wait until 1990 to win the flag again.

The Alexander soccer club was formed in Melbourne in 1958. They quickly rose to prominence, culminating in a premier league victory in 1975.

The club changed its name to Heidelberg and was one of the foundation teams of the inaugural national soccer league season in 1977. In the first ten years of the national league, Heidelberg was the second most successful team (behind Sydney City).

Their most memorable national league season was 1980, an era when the minor premier was declared champion team. Cruising near the top of the ladder, Heidelberg conceded only 16 goals after 17 games. Their opponent in round 19 was Brisbane City, who then had the league's worst goalscoring record: 14 goals in 18 games. At Perry Park, Brisbane City destroyed Heidelberg 7-0; the club's worst national league result. At season's end. Heidelberg finished a mere one point behind eventual champions Sydney City.

Heidelberg gained some revenge in the 1980 post-season top four series. They won the 1980 top four grand final by thrashing Sydney City 4-0 at Bruce Stadium in Canberra. Gary Cole, Heidelberg's prolific scorer, scored 3 in a game witnessed by 11.126 people.

In the first ten years of the national league, Heidelberg finished in the top half every season. But the club's record since 1987 has not been as rosy. Heidelberg was relegated in 1987, 1989 and 1994/95 after finishing in last place. Its best final placing was ninth in 1991/92. However, one bright spot in this period was when the club won the national knock-out cup in 1993, beating Parramatta Eagles 2-1 in Sydney.

With the merging of such proud traditions and long established supporter bases, together with the astute selection of initial coach Zoran Matic, the Collingwood Warriors experiment is more than likely to be a successful one.

Complacency - no longer an issue

Complacency will not be a problem for the Brisbane Strikers as they set about erasing the memory of their last Suncorp Stadium encounter.

The Strikers were humbled to the tune of five goals to one against Ericsson Cup newcomers Perth Glory in their last Suncorp outing.

It was Brisbane's first league loss at Suncorp since the team's first match there more than twelve months ago.

It was also a dramatic way to end their unbeaten run in this Ericsson Cup campaign.

But coach Frank Farina cited complacency as the major factor for the loss.

"I didn't think complacency was going to be a problem," Frank said.

"We'd put the hard work in at training all year and our performances on the park had reflected this.

"But we did let our guard down and we were punished for it.

"The worst thing about the loss, apart from three Premiership points going west, was that we disappointed our home supporters.

"That was extremely hard to take and the players are eager to make up for that against Collingwood."

Farina also said his assistant coach Peter Tokesi made several positional changes on the night of the Perth Glory match, which "just did not work".

"We had a few injuries on the night which prompted us to make several changes," he said.

"I Infortunately they didn't come off for

us and we suffered, but we've put that match down to a learning experience and I believe that's exactly what we've done."

Last weekend's result in Canberra has justified Farina's words.

An impressive 4 - 1 scoreline in favour of the Strikers, marked a superb turn around in form for Brisbane.

The victory against the Cosmos has kept the Strikers in touch with league leaders Sydney United, as well as maintaining the gaps between themselves and third placed Perth Glory.


If the Strikers regain their old Suncorp Stadium form tonight, it should also guarantee a huge match in a fortnight's time, when they take on United in their next home match.

"It is very important we come away with a win tonight so the supporters will also regain their faith in the team," Farina said.

"But I'm confident their game against Perth was a one-off and every side has those sort of hiccups in a season."
