Chris Slater has joined Brisbane City along with Damian Waugh, and City is set to reap the benefits of these fit and match toughened acquisitions.

Brad Ditton has also been earning plaudits for his performances with Taringa this season, but the former national league player having the greatest impact this season is Steve Jackson.

Captain of the Strikers until last year and a seasoned veteran of the national league, Jackson has slotted comfortably into the midfield at his former club Brisbane Lions.

A Brisbane grand final still remains well within the team's reach and it would be an enormous boost to the game in Queensland if this was to occur.

Coalstars - Rovers slog it out

A heated battle between Coalstars and Rochedale almost went the full fifteen rounds before ending in a flurry of punches on Sunday afternoon.

The score finished 2-2 but the real action was in the sideline punch-up between Coalstars Fraser Cuba and Rochedale captain Gary Brattan.

It was a less than auspicious return to the XXXX top flight for Fraser Cuba who has been serving a four match suspension incurred while playing for Taringa last season.

Tension had bubbled just beneath the surface almost from the opening whistle of the match but it only seemed to spur on the home side, who looked a completely different outfit to the one which disappointed at Lions last week.

However, it was Rochedale who had the best chance to open the scoring when Kieran Cooper helped on a cross only to see it rebound

off the foot of the post.

It was a game of seesawing fortunes throughout and Coalstars soon created a chance of their own when some intricate passing made an opening for Richard Hilli to fire his shot just over the bar.

Some concerted pressure failed to reap any benefit for Rochedale before a pinpoint cross by Coalstars Peter McKendrick was turned in at the near post by Hilli five minutes before half

They took a 1-0 lead into the break much to the appreciation of their rowdy band of supporters but five minutes into the second half Kieran Cooper found an equaliser.

Cooper was perfectly placed to head in a corner at the far post before running over to share his joy with a less than appreciative Coalstars crowd.

The niggling incidents continued to build

Matt Hilli came on as a substitute and immediately made an impact



with off the ball shoving contests becoming more frequent and Craig Collins shown the yellow card for a poorly timed challenge on Wayne Adams.

Matt Hilli came on for Coalstars and caused havoc in the Rochedale defence before laying off for Brenley Jefferd to deliver a far post cross on to the waiting head of McKendrick for a 2-1

But the lead was to last less than five minutes with Rochedale substitute Clayton Koch gliding through two weak tackles before firing a powerful shot into the bottom corner to level the scores.

Fraser Cuba returned from the XXXX League wilderness to blast wildly over from ten vards before his well known temper once again got him into trouble.

While play moved up the field, Cuba became entangled in an off the ball fracas with Rochedale captain Gary Brattan.

Referee John Peacock was given little option but to send both players off, but the trouble continued off the field as the two players began trading blows on the sideline.

Team-mates and support staff from both sides rushed into the melee and it took several minutes before the final few seconds of the match could be completed.

Former Socceroo at Rovers

Gary McDowall was installed as Rochedale coach at the start of this season after distinguishing himself for many years as a player and as a coach. His experience and knowledge of the game will prove invaluable for the Rochedale team as they chase the inaugural XXXX Premier League title.

McDowall was born in Glasgow, Scotland in 1959. He began his senior football career as a 15 year old with Hamilton Accies who fluctuated among Divisions 1 and 2, and the Premier League in Scotland.

However, after eight years with Hamilton, McDowall yearned for a change and in 1983, he and his family migrated to Australia.

"Gus McLeod was a mate of mine from Melbourne who was playing for Footscray JUST at the time and he convinced me to come and play for them," McDowall said.

McDowall played with Footscray for one season before transferring to perennial National Soccer League "top gun" South Melbourne Hellas.

It was during his time with Hellas that the central midfielder attained the honour of playing around 30 games for the Socceroo's.

"In my opinion, South Melbourne were the best club in the country - no question," he said.

"They had a very professional set up and the players were so well looked after."

After five years with South Melbourne, McDowall moved to opposing Victorian NSL club Juventus for a season before settling into a four year stint with Heidelberg.

McDowall got his first taste of coaching at Heidelberg which included stints as Youth coach, assistant first team coach and caretaker coach and admits that he would dearly love to return to the national scene in the future.



"Obviously my goal for this season is to win the flag with Rochedale," he said.

"We've got a solid financial base at the club and hopefully we'll grow and develop to the point where one day we might become a national league team.

"I've had a taste of what it is like to be a player and a

coach in the national league and I want to get back there one day."

Since moving to Brisbane three and a half years ago, McDowall coached North Brisbane for two seasons and then Mitchelton to a narrow loss in the Division 2 grand final last season.

He said his decision to move into the coaching ranks after a long career as a player, was a natural progression for anybody who wanted to maintain a close contact with the sport.

"I just love the game and I firmly believe that if you stop loving the game, then you should give it away," McDowall said.

McDowall said the downside to coaching was that it could be extremely frustrating at times.

"It can be very stressful on game days but really, if things don't go the way you would like them to, you just have to grin and bare it," he said.

"I do a lot of weights to try and release as much of the tension as I can... My family always bring me down to earth after the game."

City share points with Rovers

League leaders Brisbane City and the highly rated Taringa Rovers shared the points in the match of the Round at Spencer Park last Sunday. The game finished 2-2 at full time but numerous squandered goal scoring opportunities cost Taringa the three points.

Taringa's Des Hughes opened the scoring early in the first half when City sweeper Scott Elliott passed an awkward ball across his defence, which was intercepted by the Rovers Ian Hutchison.

Hutchison laid the ball off for Hughes who skinned City keeper Daniel Duke and clinically executed a left foot shot into the net.

Late in the half, Taringa were awarded a free kick for an infringement during a City corner. Midfielder Brad Ditton caught the City defence napping and played a long ball downfield to Hughes.

Hughes utilised his pace and once inside the penalty area, drilled the ball into the roof of the net to give the visitors a 2-0 lead at the break.

Taringa dominated the first half with Ditton, Reed and Britton performing well in the middle of the park.

However, too often Taringa players missed goal scoring opportunities and if some one on ones had been converted against City goalkeeper Daniel Duke, the game might well have been dead and buried by the time oranges were ready to serve.

With Mark Greer watching from the sidelines through suspension and the team behind on the scoreboard, City were dealt another blow at the break when classy defender Warren Cooley succumbed to a virus and had to be replaced.

However, the City players displayed a lot of character in the second half and were rewarded midway through the period when Strikers export Chris Slater made a break down the right and



crossed to an unmarked Mark Lubric.

Lubric managed to dribble the ball into the net off his chest after his initial header had been saved by Taringa goalkeeper Scott Higgins.

Not long after, it was Slater's turn to add his name to the scoresheet. Slater received the ball from fellow Strikers export Damien Waugh and hit a blistering low shot from the right edge of the 18 yard box, which Higgins could only deflect into the goal.

City coach Bobby Hamilton (pictured) said both teams had chances to win the match but admitted Taringa had the better of the game.

"We had a poor first half and were probably lucky not to be three or four goals down at half-time... Had they (Taringa) been able to take one or two more of their chances, the game would have been sewn up by the break," Hamilton said.

"When we went out in the second half, we had nothing to lose and fortunately for us we got our act together and picked our game up."

Taringa coach John Ogden said even though his side had missed out on a swag of goals, he was not too disappointed by the result.

"We're creating a lot of chances and when we get it together, we're going to absolutely punish a team one day," Ogden said.

PREMIER PREVUE - Rochedale v Beenleigh

A top two spot will be up for grabs when Rochedale Rovers meet Beenleigh at Underwood Park on Saturday at 7pm.

Rochedale slugged out a 2-2 draw with Coalstars last weekend, while Beenleigh went down to reigning premiers Brisbane Lions 3-1.

Rochedale's depth will be tested due to the absence of a number of key players.

Nick Seeley is still out due to injury, while Gary Brattan and Steve Dawe will be watching from the sidelines, after being outed for their part in the brawl against Coalstars last week.

Rochedale coach Gary McDowall said he was happy to leave Eric Evans Soccer Reserve with a point.

"It was a typical Coalstars game.... Very hard to play what with the extreme conditions and the state of the pitch," McDowall said.

"Michael Lane had to come off at half-time due to heat exhaustion and there is no way players can be expected to perform in 30 plus degree heat."

McDowall said his side considered all home games this season as a clear three points, but added he expected a tough match from the Lions.

"We played Beenleigh in the pre-season competition and beat them 2-0, but they're playing not too badly at the moment and we'll have to be on our game."

Beenleigh coach Peter Bannon said his side had not given themselves a chance of winning.

"The heat most definitely made things difficult and we were always going to struggle in it having to play more than half of our football with ten men," Bannon said.

On Rochedale, Bannon said it was the match he had been dreading as Rochedale had not been

beaten at home for around three years.

"We're obviously going to have to make changes due to suspensions and injuries," he said.

"They'll certainly miss a player of Brattan's quality, but a side with such depth should be able to cover the loss."

It has been said many times that George Cowie is a well credentialled coach but in the final analysis, it's the players that win matches and not the coach.


Wynnum has a tough assignment with City this week, but it would be absolutely fantastic to see George and the lads spring a surprise on Bobby Hamilton's team.

Bundaberg Waves must reproduce their form of last week against Wynnum when they meet Brisbane Lions at Lions Stadium on Sunday at 2.45pm.

Bundaberg coach Aldo Baretta said last weeks game against Wynnum, illustrated the closeness of the competition.

"It was a good result for us in the end as we really had to battle to take the points against a good Wynnum side," he said.

Bundaberg are performing extremely well at home with emphatic victories against Coalstars and Wynnum, and a draw against league leaders Brisbane City.

However, the team's form playing away has been a little shaky and Baretta said steps had been taken to counter the situation.

"We've reassessed the situation for away games and will no longer be coming down with the youth team but will use our own coach later in the day so the players are fresher come kickoff time," he said.


The match will see the return of Bundaberg's Darren Bender, Steven Starr and Warren Allen to the Lions den and they will be determined to impress in front of their former supporters.

PREMIER PREVUE - Taringa v Coalstars

Taringa Rovers and Coalstars will meet at Jack Speare Park this Sunday at 2.45pm. Both teams will be searching for three points after enduring hard fought draws in the last Round.

Coalstars coach Paul Barry said the draw against Rochedale last week would have to be considered a good result for his side.

"I was very pleased with the result as I thought we played some good, attractive and attacking football, and to be honest, I thought we had the better of the game," he said.

However, Barry said he was disappointed that an incident that occurred late in the match between Coalstars Fraser Cuba and Rochedale's Gary Brattan, had overshadowed what had been a great game.

"Cuba and Brattan got into a scuffel at the end of match and they carried it on after they were sent from the field," Barry said.

"I am very disappointed that it happened, but it has probably been blown out of proportion. All I have been asked about since Sunday was about that incident when all I have really wanted to discuss was the quality of football that we played."

Barry said this week's match against Taringa was likely to be another tough game.

"Rochedale beat them (Taringa) 2-0 when they met earlier in the season, but I think if you look at the ability of players, Taringa are the best team in the competition," he said.

"We're going to take the same approach as we did against Rochedale and take it to Taringa. Our job will be not to let their talented players play that well."

Taringa coach John Ogden said his side could have won their game against Brisbane City three times over.

As can be seen a number of the matches will go right to the death to see if a clear result is there, thus obviating the need for extra time.
