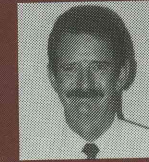

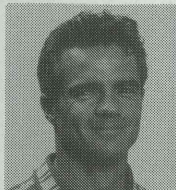

City continue the advance

Late concentration lapses by Brisbane City took the gloss off what should have been a far more comfortable result than their 3-2 win over Wynnum might suggest.

League leaders City quickly signalled their intention to claim the early ascendancy over a Wynnum side who are yet to take a point from any of their XXXX Premier League matches this season.

In fact, the visitors might have taken the lead in the first minute when Simon Eslick came close with a shot which flashed across the face of the Wynnum goal.

The early loss of Warren Cooley with a leg injury was a blow for City but replacement Craig Paulett, had a strong showing.

But it was Chris Slater who was causing havoc for the Wolves defence and with his tireless running and incisive passing, it was only a matter of time before City hit the front.

Slater almost put the visitors in front on 25 minutes but his dipping volley finished just wide of the post.

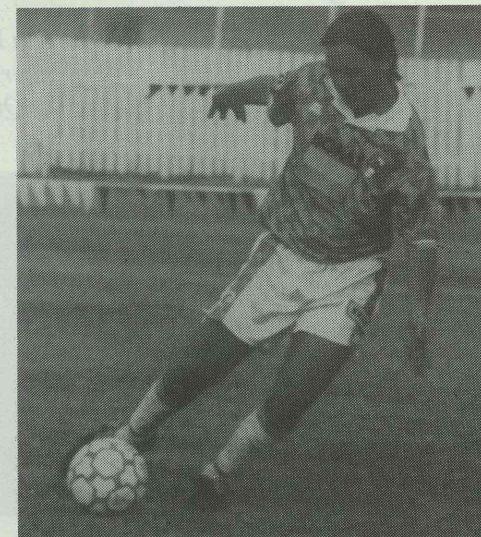
Wynnum could do little but try and soak up the pressure and it finally told when Steve Glockner struck five minutes before the break.

A defensive lapse by Ricky McKinless allowed Wayne Strange to run through before releasing Glockner whose shot went through the hands of Wynnum keeper Peter Underhill.

Slater's personal efforts paid off immediately after the break when he added his team's second in the first minute of the second half.

A minute later City midfielder Dean Almond beat Underhill to a through-ball but was forced too wide to get his shot on target.

Ten minutes later City did add their third when once again Slater found room and

delivered a cross on to Eslick's chest for the midfielder to volley home.

Slater almost made it four for his team when he volleyed acrobatically from 20 yards but saw his shot smash against the upright and away to safety.

With the score at 3-0 City appeared to take their foot off the gas and the Wolves were able to get on the score sheet.

The home side hadn't produced a serious chance on goal for the whole match but a generous linesman finally helped them get on the scoreboard five minutes from time.

A clearly offside Paul Wilkins was allowed to play on and, while the City defenders glared at the linesman in disbelief, he squared the ball for brother Mark, who made no mistake from just inside the box.

Five minutes into injury time the clearly frustrated City players, still smarting after the first goal, allowed Wilkins to add his second and complete the scoring at 3-2.

Barry - it's all communication

Coalstars coach Paul Barry was born in Brisbane in 1962. His father Gerald worked in the Taxation department while his mother Yvonne was a housewife. He played soccer from a young age and was selected in the Queensland under 16 and 19 teams.

Barry had a distinguished playing career with a George Pagan led Grange Thistle team before making the move to the national soccer league with rival Brisbane club Brisbane City.

Barry spent most of his time at City playing in their state league side, although he did make a limited number of appearances with the NSL team.

After City, Barry spent time at Brisbane Olympic and he said that it was during his time with the club that he came into contact with well known former Queensland soccer identity, Juan Cutillas.

"Juan coached me at Olympic for three or four years and I was always very impressed by his knowledge of the game... he had great technical knowledge," Barry said.

"He was heavily influenced by the South American game and he liked to play a total football style.

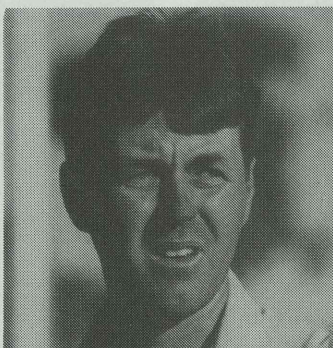
"Juan was one of the biggest influences on me and certainly had a lot to do with the way I think about the game now."

However, tragically, at the age of 27, Barry's playing career was cut short when he injured his knee whilst participating in a training road run.

The repetitive strain injury meant that Barry had to rethink his future in the game.

"Coaching was a natural progression as my job relies on the fact that I communicate well with people and coaching is a lot about communication," he said.

"I became player/coach of Souths United in



Division 3 for quite a few years.

"I wanted to stay involved in the game and since a lot of my friends were at the club, it was a good opportunity to be with them.

Barry said he enjoyed coaching Souths and to this day, believes his greatest achievements in his coaching career were in assisting Souths

to get promoted to Division 2 and then maintain the team's position in that division.

"Clubs were spending big money to try and make it into the XXXX League while we were hanging in there on a wing and a prayer... it was a big effort to get every last ounce of performance out of the team," he said.

Barry made his debut as a coach in the top league this year with Coalstars and has already defined some long-term goals for his team.

"We're a young team with at least 5 players under 20 and we're still developing as a unit," he said.

"I want to try and get the players to look ahead, say 12 or 18 months, and realise that over time, they should have every right to believe that they can compete with the likes of City, Rochedale and Lions."

Barry said he thoroughly enjoyed the coaching side of the game, except for the 90 minutes on match day.

"I love to be able to sit back and watch the game and analyse it, but I usually wear a 15 yard stretch along the sideline and by the end of the game I'm physically and emotionally shattered."

Extra time goal robs Waves

A goal in the fourth minute of extra time by replacement striker Kevin Meacock sealed a dramatic 1-0 victory for Brisbane Lions against Bundaberg last week.

Waves appeared to be on the verge of breaking their away win drought only to be foiled when keeper Michael Bainbridge parried a Greg Di Losa shot into the path of Kevin Meacock, who had little trouble converting from two yards.

Both sides began slowly, taking time to measure each other, but it was the reigning premiers who had the first goal scoring opportunity in the 8th minute when striker Jason Podgi was brought down by Bainbridge inside the 18 yard box.

However, Lions sweeper Steve Jackson failed to convert the penalty, with Bainbridge making a routine save to his right side.

Lions had another opportunity to trouble the scoreboard attendant 10 minutes later, when a defensive error from Bundaberg's Giuseppe Baraza lead to Pudja finding himself in another one on one situation with Bainbridge. However, the young forward was denied by some fine keeping from Bainbridge.

Not long after, former Lions player Warren Allen provided a neat pass down the right for striker Anthony Brown to collect. Brown's ensuing cross evaded the Lions defenders but an unmarked Darren Bender was unable to intercept the cross and a goal went begging.

Bundaberg's build-up play from the back was impressive for most of the first half with Stephen Starr, Tony Roebuck, Warren Allen and Luke Graham displaying some of the form that has made Waves formidable opponents at Thabeban Sports Complex.

Bundaberg were on a mission but were dealt a savage blow in the 39th minute when Anthony Brown was sent off for head-butting.

However, instead of playing a defensive

game, Bundaberg continued to play positive football and were nearly rewarded just prior to half-time when Bender's first time shot in front of goal failed to convert after some excellent work down the flank by Allen.

In the second half, Waves had another opportunity to take the lead in the 55th minute when Bender was fouled on the right side of the 18 yard box.

The Warren Allen free-kick found Stephen Starr at the far post, who's well executed header was denied by Jackson on the goal-line.

This seemed to inject much-needed enthusiasm into Lions who began to dominate possession for the remainder of the match.

However, Lions forwards were consistently ruled off-side which meant many excellent attacking opportunities went begging.

Bundaberg had a little luck in the 84th minute, when another defensive error by Baraza presented Lions skipper David Lonsdale with a shot from around 12 yards out. However, Lonsdale's fierce strike hit Meacock and was cleared by the Bundaberg defence.

Just when it seemed Bundaberg were about to succeed in completing a "Houdini" act, Meacock pounced on a loose ball to steal the match for the home team in extra time.

PREMIER PREVUE - Bundaberg v Rochedale

Bundaberg Waves will be out to avenge their narrow loss to Brisbane Lions last week when they clash with Rochedale Rovers at Thabeban Sports Complex on Saturday at 7pm.

Bundaberg's hopes of obtaining their first away points of the season were dashed by Lions replacement striker Kevin Meacock who pounced on a loose ball inside Waves six yard box and sealed victory for the premiers four minutes into extra time.

It was a cruel blow for Bundaberg who had played some spirited football after being reduced to ten men five minutes before half-time when striker Anthony Brown was dismissed for head-butting.

Bundaberg coach Aldo Baretta said he thought his side was a little unlucky to come away from the match without any points.

"Overall, I think we played quite well... the guys dug deep and performed extremely well and I feel a point is the least we could have got from that game," he said.

"We're building up play well from the back and through the midfield but we could improve a little in the front third of the park.

"We've got a lot of team spirit in our side as I think a lot of the players are new to the competition and feel they need to stand up and prove they can compete with the Brisbane players."

Baretta said he expected Rochedale to come to Bundaberg with all guns blazing after the premiership favourites were upstaged 5-2 by Beenleigh last week.

Rochedale coach Gary McDowall said there were "no excuses for our performance last week, but injuries and suspensions are the type of thing that can carve a team up".

Rochedale will be wanting Kieran Cooper's goal scoring prowess to be evident in "Bundy"



"However, I'm going to put a group of guys on the park on Saturday night that I believe can do the job.

"We'll have to perform to our best to win because their at home and there's no doubt they will come at us."

Barry said his team was matching Taringa around the park at times, but found it difficult to rally after going 3-0 down.

Barry said Brisbane City, despite being the pace-setters of the league, did not hold too many fears for his side.

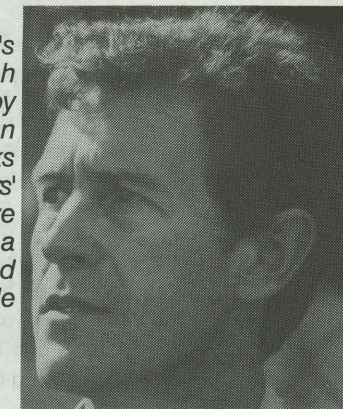
"I expect them (City) to play in a similar fashion to Rochedale and Lions, and I am sure we'll be up for it at home," he said.

"As I've been saying during the pre-season and early in the league season, anybody who takes any of the games lightly this season is a mug."

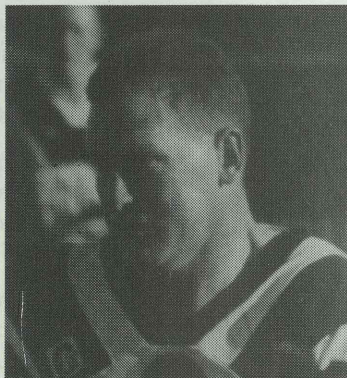
Taringa coach John Ogden said he was obviously pleased that his side secured the three points last week against Wynnum but believed it was not a complete performance.

"I would say that if they can produce that form consistently week in, week out, they will be a good team.

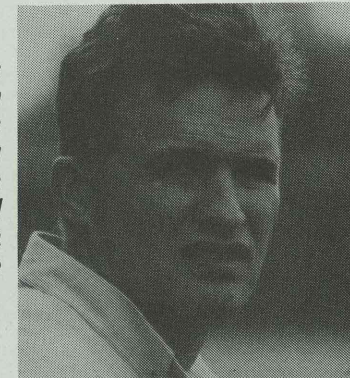

home record, stretching back over three years, but they gave Rovers a thrashing.

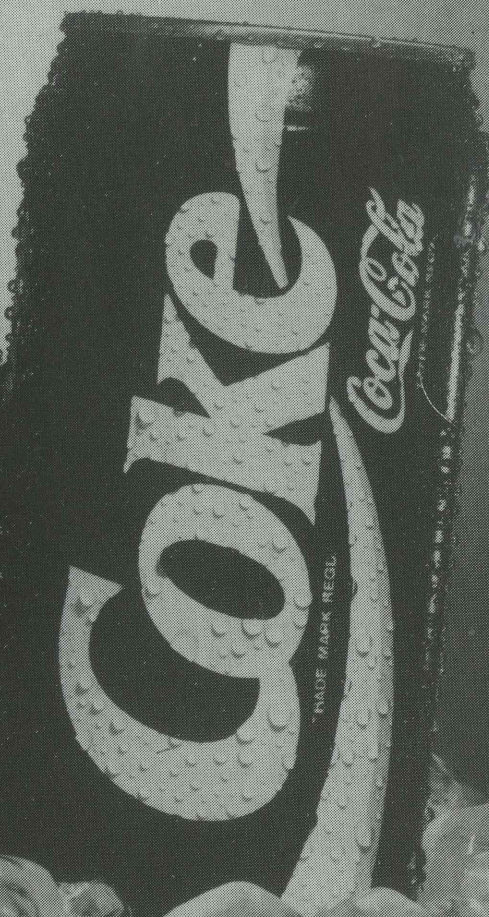
Sitting in outright second, Beenleigh's match with Taringa this weekend should be a be a bottler.

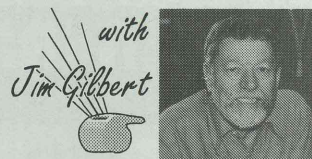
Fraser plans to appeal the severity of the sentence. Not knowing all the facts, it's difficult for me to comment on the suspensions.
